BRUINS PUSH STANFORD TO EXTRA-INNINGS,

DROP TWO OF THREE: Despite forcing the seventh-ranked Cardinal into two extra-inning contests, the Bruins could only claim one victory at Sunken Diamond over the weekend.

Stanford starter John Hudgins, who leads the Pac-10 with 108 strikeouts, stifled the Bruin offense with a four-hit, ten strikeout complete game on Friday night. Wes Whisler scored the Bruins only run as they fell 9-1.

Whisler would return on Saturday to throw nine innings, allowing only eight hits and sending the teams into extra-innings tied at 5-5. It marked the second nine-inning outing by the left-hander in as many starts.

Freshman designated hitter Brett McMillan would lift UCLA to the win with his first career grand-slam in the top of the 12th inning.

Sunday saw the teams go into extra-innings once again as UCLA was led by two home runs from Whisler and a two-run homer from Billy Susdorf. However, Stanford would steal the Bruin magic as Donny Lucy

hit a walk-off home run in the bottom of the tenth for the win.

NINTH-INNING RALLY BRINGS BRUINS A 4-3

WIN OVER PEPPERDINE: Sean Carpenter scored the game-winning run on a wild pitch in the top of the ninth inning to lift UCLA to a 4-3 come-from-behind win over Pepperdine on Tuesday.

Trailing 3-2, a lead-off walk to Ryan McCarthy and infield singles from Brandon Averill and Adam Simon loaded the bases with no outs in the final frame. Preston Griffin drove in the tying run with a sacrifice fly. After a strikeout, Billy Susdorf walked to load the bases again before Carpenter scored during Wes Whisler's at-bat.

Averill homered in the sixth for his eighth of the season which ranks first on the team along with Griffin and Susdorf.

Junior right-hander Mike Castillo picked up his first win of 2003 after pitching three perfect innings. Doug Silva earned his third save with a scoreless ninth inning.

JANSSEN NAMED PAC-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Junior right-hander Casey Janssen was named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 5-11th. The honor is the first of Janssen's career and the second for a Bruin this season (Mike Kunes - March 4th).

The Fountain Valley native struck out a season high 11 batters in seven innings of action in UCLA's 5-4 win over Washington on Friday night. He allowed only one walk and five hits in his appearance to earn his fifth win of 2003.

Janssen currently leads the Bruins with 67 strikeouts on the season, which ranks fourth in the conference. Friday night marked his second double-digit strikeout performance of the season after fanning ten batters in his season debut at Cal State Northridge on February 2nd.

BRUINS FALL IN LAST HOME SERIES, DROP

TWO TO WASHINGTON: Brilliant pitching performances from Casey Janssen and Wes Whisler was not enough to give UCLA a series win as the Bruin lost two of three to the Huskies.

Janssen recorded 11 strikeouts while holding the Huskies to five hits through seven innings to earn the win. Billy Susdorf led the offense going three-for-four on the night.

Whisler hurled a complete game, allowing only five hits, but two home runs from Brent Lillbridge would be the Bruins downfall. A late rally from UCLA fell short, scoring both runs in the seventh inning.

Five homers from Washington would seal their series win. John Otness homered in back-to-back at bats, including a three-run shot in the sixth frame.

McMILLAN LIFTS UCLA TO 8-7 WIN OVER

UC SANTA BARBARA: Brett McMillan's two-RBI double in the bottom of the ninth inning gave the Bruins a 8-7 victory over UC Santa Barbara.

UCLA tied a season-high with four home runs in the contest. McMillan, Wes Whisler, Christian Lewis and Brandon Averill each homered which drove in the first six Bruin runs. The round-tripper from Lewis marked his first of the season.

The Bruin pitching also added to the victory with 11 strikeouts. Bryan Beck earned the win, throwing the final 2.1 innings of the game without allowing a hit while striking out four.

BRUINS RALLY TO TAKE A SERIES VICTORY OVER OREGON STATE:

UCLA rallied from two consecutive 5-0 deficits to win the first two games of the weekend. However, the magic would not last as they could not comeback from a 6-0 on Sunday, falling 7-6.

After rain delayed the game on Friday night, the Bruins returned to Jackie Robinson Stadium on Saturday behind 4-0. A six-run fifth inning spearheaded the UCLA comeback. The frame was highlighted by a three-RBI double from Brett McMillan and RBI-singles from Wes Whisler, Chris Jensen and Matt Thayer. Ryan McCarthy insured the win in the bottom of the eighth inning with a two-run homer which gave the Bruins a 8-7 victory.

Later in the day, UCLA would find itself in the same situation, trailing 5-0 after five frames. Yet a seven-run eighth inning would give the Bruins a 8-6 lead. A solo home run from Whisler would lead off the inning before Warren Trott added a three-run shot. After the Beavers rallied in the ninth inning, the Bruins won the game, 10-9, in the bottom of the tenth on an RBI-single from Billy Susdorf.

Once again, Oregon State got ahead early on Sunday with six runs in the second inning. Despite holding the Beaver scoreless in the final five innings and posting five runs late in the game, UCLA could not overcome the deficit, falling 7-6. McMillan highlighted the late inning efforts with a two-run homer, while Preston Griffin drove in two runs in the sixth with a single to center field.

BRUINS HOLD LIONS TO FOUR HITS, DEFEAT LMU, 7-1:

Starter Casey Janssen allowed only four hits in five innings, while Chris Cordeiro and Bryan Beck combined for four no-hit frames as UCLA defeated LMU, 7-1. The win marked the first midweek win for the Bruins this season.

Offensively, a home run from Brett McMillan and a two-RBI single Jeff Abney catapulted the Bruins to victory, while a two-run homer from Billy Susdorf sealed the victory. The round-tripper was the eighth on the season for Susdorf, which ties him with Preston Griffin for the team lead. Ryan McCarthy also drove in a run for UCLA with the team's only multi-hit performance of the contest.

BRUINS FALL TO TOP-RANKED CAL STATE FULLERTON, 11-1:

The Bruins returned home on Tuesday after a seven-game road swing to fall, 11-1 to top-ranked Cal State Fullerton. Senior Warren Trott drove in the only Bruin run with the first home run of his career. Trott, along with Billy Susdorf led UCLA with two hits each. Starter Bryan Beck (1-2) took the loss after allowing three runs on four hits in two innings of work.

BILLY SUSDORF NAMED METRX/UCLABRUINS.COM ATHLETE OF THE

WEEK:

Susdorf was named the MetRx/UCLABruins.com Athlete of the Week on April 21st after leading UCLA to its first series victory over fourth-ranked Arizona State since 1999, guiding the Bruins to a 9-8 win on Thursday and an 8-7 extra-innings win on Friday. He hit .375 (6-for-16) over four games this past week and led the team with 11 total bases and a .688 slugging percentage. He had two doubles and a home run.

In Friday night's 13-inning victory over the Sun Devils, Susdorf drove in all three extra-inning runs with a solo home run in the 11th frame and a two-RBI double in the top of the 13th.

The honor was the first of Susdorf's career and the first given to a baseball player this season.

UCLA TAKES FIRST SERIES WIN OVER #4 ARIZONA STATE SINCE

1999:

The Bruins posted one-run wins on Thursday and Friday before losing on Saturday to take their first series win over the Sun Devils since 1999.

Trailing 4-0 after the first inning, the Bruins rallied to defeat ASU, 9-8 in the first game. Chris Jensen and Brandon Averill hit back-to-back doubles in the top of the ninth inning before Jensen score the winning run on a wild pitch. Home runs from Wes Whisler and Ryan McCarthy drove in five UCLA runs.

In Friday night's 13-inning marathon, Billy Susdorf drove in all three extra-inning runs, on a solo homer and two-RBI double, to lead UCLA to a 8-7 victory. Susdorf and Brett McMillan led the Bruins with three hits apiece.

BRUINS SUFFER A SWEEP AT USC: For the first time this season, UCLA suffered a weekend series sweep at USC.

After building a 6-2 lead on Friday night, the Bruins fell 7-6 when USC scored its winning run in the bottom of the ninth inning. Chris Denove and Preston Griffin led UCLA with two hit apiece.

In Saturday's contest, the Trojans scored in each of the first five frames to build a 7-0 lead that was too tough to overcome. Relievers Chris Jensen and Warren Trott highlighted the Bruin attack recording two hits each after entering the game in the fourth inning.

UCLA started hot on Sunday posting a run in each of the first three innings and two in the fourth. However, the powerful Trojan bats hit three home runs to drive in five of its eight runs to take the final game of the series. Denove and Jensen both homered for the Bruins, while Griffin and Brett McMillan each had three hits in the contest.

BRUINS FALL 5-3 IN MIDWEEK MATCHUP

WITH #11 LONG BEACH STATE: The 49ers posted four runs in the top of the eighth inning to overcome a UCLA 3-1 lead to claim the victory. Reliever Chris Cordeiro (0-2) was charged with the loss in only his second decision in 13 appearances.

Catcher Chris Denove blasted a solo home run in the second inning, marking his fifth of the season. Designated hitter Brett McMillan and outfielder Sean Carpenter highlighted the UCLA offense with two hits apiece.

LATE INNING LETDOWNS HELP CALIFORNIA

TAKE TWO OF THREE FROM UCLA: After posting a 10-2 victory on Friday night, the Bruins lost two leads over the weekend to finish 1-2 in the series with California.

Matt Thayer put together a career-night with three hits and five RBI on Friday. Along with Preston Griffin's three hits, the Bruin arsenal gave reliever Doug Silva the cushion he would need to post his fourth win of the season. He struck-out a career-high eight batter, without allowing a run in 5.2 innings.

The Bruins allowed a two-run lead slip away in the top of the ninth inning of which they could not rebound from on Saturday. Thayer once again provided the offensive spark with a third inning grand slam, the first of his career.

UCLA recorded nine runs in the second inning on Sunday, but could not score again as California chipped away to earn a 12-9 victory. Ryan McCarthy added the second grand slam of the series, while Brett McMillan and Brandon Averill also homered in the second frame.

BRUINS TAKE FIRST PAC-10 SERIES OF THE

SEASON, 2-1 FROM ARIZONA: Brandon Averill hit three home runs and drove in a team-high eight RBI over the weekend to give UCLA a 2-1 series victory (W, 6-4, W, 7-5, L, 12-10) over #17 Arizona.

In Friday's win, Averill hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the seventh inning that would prove to be the difference in the game. Reliever Doug Silva shut down the Wildcats in the late innings, allowing only two hits in the final five frames.

The Bruins jumped out to an early lead, posting six runs in the first five innings. Billy Susdorf led UCLA with three hits and two RBI, while hitting his team leading sixth home run of 2003. Starter Wes Whisler picked up his third win of the season, allowing one run on two hits in seven innings of action.

UCLA was unable to complete the sweep with a 12-10 loss in Sunday's slugfest.

PITCHER'S DUEL GETS THE BEST OF THE BRUINS, FALL 2-0 AT #5 LONG BEACH STATE:

UCLA was held to three hits, while 49er starter Jered Weaver struck out ten Bruins in the first six innings to led Long Beach State to a 2-0 victory.

Bruin starter Wes Whisler threw three innings, allowing only one hit. Casey Janssen relieved him and was credited with the loss after allowing one unearned run. Whisler was also the UCLA highlight at the plate with two of the Bruins' three hits.

BRUINS SWEEP #29 WICHITA STATE IN TWO

GAME SERIES: UCLA hit .361 over the two game series to defeat #29 Wichita State 9-7 and 11-10.

As has been a characteristic of UCLA this season, the Bruins used big first innings in both games to lead them to their victories.

After UCLA posted four first inning runs, Saturday starter Mike Kunes silenced the Shockers attack with a career-high nine strikeouts in four innings of work. Home runs from Brett McMillan and Chris Denove, along with three hits from both Preston Griffin and Wes Whisler led the Bruins to the victory.

A seven run first inning, which was highlighted by two singles from McMillan gave the Bruins the edge they needed in Sunday's contest. Freshman Sean Carpenter posted a career-high four RBI, including

three in the first inning to spearhead the Bruinattack.

BRUINS FAIL TO PICK UP MIDWEEK WIN,

FALL TO PACIFIC AND UC RIVERSIDE: UCLA did not complete its quest to nab its first midweek victory of the season with defeats at the hands of Pacific (8-4) and UC Riverside (10-6).

Hector Ambriz allowed five runs in the first five innings in his fifth loss of the season. UCLA was unable to respond as Tiger starter Sergio Silva only gave up two runs in seven innings of work. Brett McMillan led the Bruins, going 2-for-4 with a RBI and a run scored.

On Wednesday, UCLA was held hitless by Highlander starter Julio Fernandez until the sixth inning, while the UCR offense posted eight runs over in the first two innings. The Bruin arsenal scored four runs in the ninth off Preston Griffin's grand slam, but the rally would fall short. Griffin highlighted the day for UCLA, driving in every run of the contest, to set a new career high. Chris Cordeiro managed to quiet the potent UCR attack, striking out a career-high seven in five innings of action.

BRANDON AVERILL NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER

OF THE WEEK: Brandon Averill (Orange/Villa Park HS) hit .417 (5-for-12) over the weekend and led the team with seven RBI in UCLA's 2-1 series win over No. 18 USC. Averill finished the series with a team-high two doubles and 10 total bases. He also added a three-run home run, his second of the season, and scored three runs. The honor was the first of Averill's career.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE...

The Cougars enter the weekend 18-35, 6-15 in Pac-10 action. Last weekend, Washington State claimed a Friday night victory at USC, but fell in the next two games to drop the series in Los Angeles.

Head Coach Tim Mooney is in his 3rd year as the head coach of the Cougars, with a 36-72 mark heading into the season. Last season, Washington State won two of three games at Jackie Robinson Stadium.

BRUINS CLAIM SERIES VICTORY OVER #18 USC:

USC: For the first time since 2000, UCLA won two games in a three game series against crosstown rival #18 USC.

Friday's 7-4 victory marked the first victory over the Trojans in their last 11 meetings. The Bruins posted five runs in the first inning, including three from a Billy Susdorf home run, to build their lead. Mike Kunes earned his fourth win of the season and tied a career-high with seven strikeouts.

Despite hitting three home runs, the Bruins were unable to claim a victory on Saturday, falling 9-6. USC hit three home runs in the first two innings to build a 5-0 lead UCLA could not overcome.

Wes Whisler threw six innings allowing only one hit and UCLA posted 10 first inning runs to rout the Trojans 17-5. It was the largest UCLA margin of victory in the series since 1992. Preston Griffin, Chris Denove, Brandon Averill, and Ryan McCarthy each had three hits, while Matt Thayer led the team with four RBI.

MIKE KUNES NAMED PAC-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK:

Senior left-handed pitcher Mike Kunes was named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week on Tuesday. It was the first such honor for Kunes this season and the second of his career.

Kunes earned his third win of 2003 with a seven-inning performance against defending national champion Texas on Friday. In his seven innings, Kunes allowed two runs on six hits and struck out five Longhorns to lead UCLA to a 13-2 victory.

BRUINS TAKE HOME SECOND AT KIA BASE-

BALL BASH: After crushing defending national champion Texas, 13-2 and 21st-ranked Tulane, 12-2, the Bruins fell short of capturing the Kia Baseball Bash title with 7-1 loss at the hands of second-ranked Cal State Fullerton.

Wes Whisler, who was the only player in the tournament with two home runs took home Co-Outstanding Player of the Week honors after hitting .417 with four RBI and five runs scored over the weekend.

Mike Kunes picked up his third win of the season after lasting seven innings and allowing two runs on six hits to the sixth-ranked Longhorns. He also struck out five batters on the day.

Casey Janssen also earned his third win with the Bruins 12-2 victory over Tulane. He only allowed two runs on five hits in six innings of work.

Along with Whisler, Chris Denove and Hector Ambriz were instrumental in leading the Bruins to post 26 runs over the three games. Denove recorded six hits, including one home run, five RBI and four runs for UCLA. Ambriz hit .500 with five hits and two RBI in his two starts over the weekend.

UCLA GOES 3-3 IN COLLEGE STATION: The Bruins took two from Utah, split with Creighton and dropped two to 16th-ranked Texas A&M, to go 3-3 in the Dominos Pizza Aggie Baseball Classic. The contests were cut to seven innings after the first day of competition was rained out.

Right-hander Casey Janssen threw the Bruins' first shut-out since 2000 against Utah in the tournament's opening game, 3-0. He allowed only five hits in seven innings while striking out seven. Wes Whisler drove in all three runs for UCLA.

The Bruins fell 10-4 to Creighton in the second game of the day as UCLA was held to six hits, which included doubles from Preston Griffin and Christian Lewis. Starter Mike Kunes allowed seven runs in 3.2 innings for his first loss of the season.

The Bruins once again shut-out the Utes, 3-0 on Sunday when Whisler picked up his first win of 2003. The left-hander did not allow a run in six innings and only gave up two hits. Chris Cordeiro closed the game for UCLA to earn his first of two saves in the tournament. Ryan McCarthy gave the Bruins the offensive spark with his third home run of 2003.

The next game pitted UCLA against the Aggies as TAMU starter Logan Kensing shut down the Bruin offense, allowing one earned run on three hits in seven innings to lead them to a 7-2 victory.

The trend of winning the first game of the day continued as the Bruins edged Creighton 2-1 on Monday's opener. Bryan Beck, who was making his first start of 2003, lasted four innings, only allowing one run on one hit. UCLA posted two runs in the top of the sixth to take the lead and the victory. Cordeiro closed once again for UCLA to earn his third save of 2003.

UCLA found itself on the losing side of a 3-0 game as the Aggies closed out the

tournament 5-1. Freshman starter Hector Ambriz threw an impressive 6.2 innings, giving up three runs on six hits, while striking out eight. However, four walks and two wild pitches allowed runners to score and cost UCLA a share of the tournament title.

Whisler, McCarthy and Billy Susdorf were named to the all-tournament team. Whisler hit .375 over the three days with six hits and three RBI. McCarthy hit the Bruins' only home run over the six days and added three RBI. Susdorf led UCLA with seven hits and hit .368 over the weekend. Janssen was named to the squad as a pitcher after his outing against the Utes.

FOUR-RUN FOURTH BRINGS BRUINS SECOND STRAIGHT LOSS: Four unearned runs in the fourth inning from UC Santa Barbara led to a 7-5 loss for UCLA at Cesar Uyesaka Stadium. An error from Wes Whisler started the inning and another from Brett McMillan allowed UCSB to bring four runs across the plate.

Freshman right-hander Hector Ambriz got his first collegiate start on the mound, only allowing two earned runs in four innings of work. The Bruin bullpen shut UCSB down in the later innings with Bryan Beck and Adam Simon combining to allow no runs on four hits in the final four innings. Whisler and Adam Simon led the Bruins, each going two-for-four, with two RBI apiece, in the contest. Matt Thayer hit a pinch-hit solo home run, his second homer of 2003. Billy Susdorf and McMillan each added a double to the Bruin arsenal.

BRUINS TAKE TWO FROM NC STATE: UCLA returned home to win two out of three over the visiting North Carolina State Wolfpack. Friday starter Mike Kunes held NC State to five hits in the first seven innings to lead the Bruins to a 8-6 win.

A ten-run fourth inning was the key to UCLA's 12-5 victory on Saturday. A grand slam from Ryan McCarthy and a three-run shot from Billy Susdorf highlighted the inning.

The Bruins would fall short of the sweep, falling 9-6 on Sunday. Preston Griffin hit two home runs, including a three-run homer in the seventh inning.

BRUINS DROP TWO IN HAWAII: UCLA's trip to the Hawaiian Islands did not go as planned as the Bruins dropped two games

to Hawaii. On Friday, UCLA posted five runs in the opening two innings, but was unable to score again as the Rainbows won 11-5.

The teams stayed close on Saturday, tied at 4-4 heading into the ninth. However, Sean Carpenter hit a single, advanced to third on a passed ball and scored on a wild pitch to give UCLA the 5-4 win. David Johnson pitched the final 2.2 innings, striking out six in the win.

Hawaii scored six runs in the first four innings and the Bruins were unable respond, falling 8-3 in the series finale.

Second baseman Preston Griffin stretched his hit streak to seven with three multi-hit performances in Hawaii. He went three-for-four on Sunday with a double and hit .538 for the series.

LATE INNING LETDOWN IN RIVERSIDE: Right-handed starter Chris Cordeiro did not allow a run in the first five innings of play in Riverside, but the bullpen could not continue the pace, giving up eight runs in the last four innings.

Freshman hurlers Hector Ambriz and Garrett White gave up home runs against the first batters of their collegiate careers, which brought four runners across home plate and led the Highlanders to the 8-3 victory.

The Bruin offense also suffered a letdown after scoring 30 runs in their two previous games combined, as they could only muster three runs on seven hits.

SUSDORF NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Sophomore outfielder Billy Susdorf was named Pac-10 Player of the Week on February 4th after his performance in the Cal State Northridge series.

The Newhall, CA native hit .533 (8-for-15) with two home runs, one double and seven RBI in the first three games. He put together multi-hit performances at the plate in each game. He notched a 1.000 slugging percentage over the weekend with 15 total bases and six runs scored. His hits, runs, and RBI were all tops among Bruin batters.

CSUN SERIES: After a tough 8-6 opening day loss, the Bruins rebounded to post 30 runs over two games to edge the Matadors 2-1 in the series. UCLA hit six home runs over the course of the weekend to lead them to victory. Billy Susdorf and Preston Griffin


each hit two home runs, while Ryan McCarthy and Chris Denove both hit the first home runs of their collegiate careers.

On Saturday, left-handed starter Mike Kunes allowed only one earned run in five innings of play to post his first win of the season. The Bruin attack was not as kind on the Matador staff as Northridge used seven different pitchers during the 17-6 Bruin victory. Freshman right-hander Adam Simon took the mound for the first time, striking out four in four innings to notch the save.

Sunday was the most productive day for the Bruin offense, posting 13 runs on 19 hits. Starter Casey Janssen recorded 10 strikeouts in 4.2 innings, while reliever Doug Silva only allowed two hits in 4.1 innings of work. Freshman third baseman Sean Carpenter led the UCLA hitters, going three-for-four with an RBI double and three stolen bases.

WHISLER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Sophomore first baseman and left-handed pitcher Wes Whisler, picked up three preseason All-America honors, including a first-team preseason All-American selection by *Baseball America* and second-team nods from Collegiate Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

The Noblesville, Indiana native broke the UCLA freshman home run record in 2002 with 18. The 2002 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year recorded a .328 batting average with 46 RBI's. He also posted a 5-2 record on the mound with a team best 4.06 ERA in 84.1 innings of work last season.
