Get After It: The No. 2-seeded UCLA baseball team (32-23, 13-10 Pac-10) opens the 2006 postseason against No. 3-seed UC Irvine (36-22, 11-10 Big West) in the first round of the Malibu Regional on Friday, June 2 at 11 a.m. The Bruins will look to defeat the Anteaters for the third time in three weeks and advance to the winner's side of the bracket to face the winner of the No. 1-seed Pepperdine vs. No. 4-seed Missouri matchup.

Radio/Live Stats: All of UCLA's action at the Malibu Regional can be heard live online at www.uclabruins.com. Danny Lee and Darren Preston will call the action for the Bruins. As always, you can follow the live statistics of the game online with CSTV's Game Tracker.

About the Malibu Regional: Pepperdine University plays host to the 2006 Malibu Regional, as Pepperdine hosts a NCAA baseball regional for the first time in school history. Eddy D. Field Stadium will be the site for all of the first-round action, as four of the top teams in the nation battle it out for a chance to advance to the Super Regionals. Pepperdine is the bracket's No. 1 seed, followed by No. 2-seed UCLA, No. 3-seed UC Irvine, and No. 4-seed Missouri.

How The Bruins Got Here: UCLA finished the regular season with a 32-23 overall record, and a 13-10 Pac-10 mark to receive an No. 2-seed at-large berth into the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The Bruins finished third in the Pac-10 standings by a half game, and own a top-25 RPI rating, and a top-5 strength of schedule.

Good Looking Deal: UCLA makes the NCAA Tournament this season marking a remarkable turnaround from the 2005 season. The Bruins won 32 games this season, 17 more than the team achieved in 2005. Only two other tournament teams can boast a better season turnaround. St. Louis (32-27) and Jacksonville (42-17) won 19 more games this season than they did in 2005.

UCLA's Regional History: The Bruins are making their 12th NCAA Regional Championship appearance since 1975, and their first since 2004. In 2004, UCLA traveled to the Oklahoma City Regional and finished second in the bracket. UCLA has not played in a NCAA Regional Championship located in California since 1986, as the Bruins have made nine-consecutive postseason appearances out of state before this season. Since 1979, UCLA is 2-4 when playing in California during NCAA Regional competition.

Postseason Experience: UCLA has eight players who have played in a postseason game. Seniors Brett

McMillan, Josh Roenicke, Daniel Miltenberger, Garrett White, and juniors Brian Schroeder, Will Penniall and Kevin Brophy all played in the 2004 Regional Championships in Oklahoma City. Junior Dave Huff pitched for UC Irvine in the 2004 Regional Championships under head coach John Savage.

Against The Malibu Regional Field: UCLA played both Pepperdine and UC Irvine twice during the 2006 regular season, going 3-1 in four games against the two schools. The Bruins split a home-and-home series with Pepperdine. UCLA beat the Waves at home 2-0 on Feb. 21, but lost to Pepperdine 6-1 at Eddy D. Field Stadium on March 7. UCLA swept UC Irvine in a home-and-home series, defeating the Anteaters 8-4 on May 16 at Anteater Ballpark, and 10-1 on May 23 at Jackie Robinson Stadium.

UCLA has not played Missouri since March 28, 1985, a 10-7 Bruin win over the Tigers in Riverside, Calif.

Against The 2006 NCAA Tournament Field: UCLA played 10 teams during the regular season that were selected among the NCAA tournament field of 64. The Bruins own a combined record of 15-12 against Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Pepperdine, UC Irvine, Arizona State, Miami, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Stanford, and NC State.

A Look at 2007: Not that UCLA is trying to get ahead of itself, but the Bruins will also have full plate next season. The Bruins will play a total of 25 games in 2007 against this year's NCAA Tournament field. UCLA will play 11 games next season against four teams that are No. 1 seeds in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The Bruins will face Cal State Fullerton, Ole Miss, Pepperdine, and Oregon State, all top-teams in the nation this year. UCLA will also play three-game series against No. 2 seeds in Winthrop, Miami, and Arizona, and against No. 3 seeds Stanford and UC Irvine.

Oregon State Recap: The UCLA baseball finished its regular season at No. 5 Oregon State with a shot at the Pac-10 Title on the line. The Bruins needed to sweep the Beavers in a three-game series to force a first-place tie atop the Pac-10 standings, but came up short. Oregon State beat UCLA 9-2 on Friday to clinch its second-straight Pac-10 Title. After getting rained out on Saturday, UCLA rebounded to beat the Beavers 3-1 on Sunday.

About the Anteaters: The UC Irvine Anteaters make their second Division-I postseason appearance in school history with an overall record of 36-22 and an 11-10 mark in the Big West. UCI made its first Division-I postseason appearance in school history under John Savage in 2004 at the South Bend Regional. UCI is looking for its first win in Division-I NCAA Tournament play. The Anteaters are coming off a three-game series win against UC Riverside, as UCI took the first two games from the Highlanders before losing its regular season finale 8-6 at Anteater Ballpark. As team, UCI hits .280 (536-1912) with 20 home runs, 268 RBI, 302 runs scored and 104 stolen bases in 146 attempts. The Anteater pitching staff owns a 3.47 team ERA with 402 strikeouts in 523.1 innings pitched while limiting opponents to a .266 batting average. Head Coach Dave Serrano is in his second season at the helm of the Anteater program.

The UC Irvine-UCLA Series: UCLA leads the all-time series with UC Irvine with a mark of 37-20-1. UCLA knocked off UC Irvine on the road 8-4 on May 16 and 10-1 on home on May 23. The Bruins swept the Anteaters last year in a home-and-home series, winning 3-1 at home on April 26, and 11-1 at UC Irvine on May 10. When UC Irvine restarted its baseball program in 2002, led by head coach John Savage, the Anteaters were 4-0 against the Bruins. Savage is 4-0 against UCI as UCLA's head coach. UCLA and UCI have never played in the postseason.

Just Can't Get Enough: It seems like UCLA and UC Irvine just can't get enough of each other. On Friday, these two teams will play for the third time in three weeks, as the Bruins and the Anteaters faced off in back-to-back Tuesday games prior to the postseason.

Isn't It Ironic: UCLA Head Coach John Savage will face his former team on Friday, the same UC Irvine team he took to the 2004 postseason in his third year of rebuilding the Anteater program. Oddly enough, it makes perfect sense that Savage will try for his first postseason victory against his former team. In 2002, his first season as the head coach at UC Irvine, Savage earned his first career win against UCLA. In 2005, his first season at UCLA, Savage earned his 100th-career victory against UC Irvine. Furthermore, Savage replaced former UCLA head coach Gary Adams, who coached at UC Irvine before he coached for 30 years at UCLA. Ironically, it was Savage's UC Irvine team that beat UCLA in Adam's final game at Jackie Robinson Stadium in 2004.

Ant Eat This: UCLA put together two solid wins against UC Irvine in the past two weeks. In the two Bruin victories over the Anteaters, UCLA hit .342 (26-76) as a team with three home runs, 15 RBI, while outscoring UCI 18-5. The UCLA pitching staff posted a team ERA of 2.50 against the Anteaters with 16 strikeouts in 18 innings pitched.

Turning Point: UCLA's season has made a change for the better since the Bruins played Long Beach State on Feb. 28. Entering that February game, UCLA was 5-9 overall and fresh off being swept in three-games by Cal State Fullerton. The Bruins knocked off the No. 15 Dirtbags (6-3) that day, and went on to sweep No. 17 NC State on the road. Since Feb. 28, UCLA is 27-14 (.659).

Serie-ous: UCLA won nine of 14 three-game series during the regular season, including six of its last seven



series, and eight of its last 10 series.

California Love: UCLA played 44 of its 55 games during the regular season in the Golden State. The Bruins went 25-19 in California, which included a 19-12 mark at home.

Stay Hot: UCLA enters the postseason winners of seven of the last nine games.

Punch First: UCLA is quite successful when making the scoreboard light up first in a game. So far this season, the Bruins are 19-5 when scoring in the first inning, and 22-7 when scoring before the opposition in a game. UCLA is 10-16 when opponents score first in a game, and oddly enough, is 11-5 record when opponents score in the first inning.

In the Fridge: When UCLA has a lead late in the ball game, the Bruins are pretty consistent at sealing the deal. During the regular season, UCLA is 29-3 when leading after six innings of play, and a perfect 30-0 when owning the lead after eight innings. Five different Bruins have two-or-more saves on the year, led by Senior Josh Roenicke with four. On the other side of things, UCLA is 1-16 when trailing after six innings and 0-21 when behind after eight innings of play.

Rank This: The UCLA baseball team was ranked in the national polls for the week of April 24-30. The Bruins entered the week ranked No. 22 in the nation by Baseball America, and No. 25 by the Rosenblatt Report. This week marked the first time since March of 2001 that UCLA has been ranked in the Top-25 by Baseball America.

Rank That: 18 of the Bruins' first 22 games this season were against nationally ranked opposition, with a streak of 12-consecutive games versus ranked opponents once in effect. UCLA is 12-11 against ranked opposition on the season, and owns a series sweep of then-No. 17 ranked NC State on the road, and home series wins against No. 19 Ole Miss and No. 10 Arizona State. The Bruins also swept Long Beach State in a home-in-home series for the first time since 1995.

Chew On This: UCLA beat the No. 5 Oregon State Beavers at Goss Stadium on Sunday for the Bruins' 12th win against a ranked opponent this season. The Beavers were 22-3 at home before losing the UCLA in the regular season finale.

Speaks For Itself: UCLA ranks in this week at No. 23 in the national RPI rankings, with a second-ranked strength of schedule.

Magic Numbers: So far this season, UCLA is 28-5 when scoring five or more runs in a ball game, and owns a 17-0 record when holding opponents to two runs or less. The Bruins are also 23-5 this season when recording 10 or more hits in a game.

1-2 Step: UCLA has a knack for scoring runs early. So far this season, the Bruins have outscored the opposition 90-47 in the first two innings, outscoring opponents 52-25 in the first inning of games alone.

Ba Boom: The Bruins have ripped 46 long balls in their last 42 games, a stretch that included home runs in 13-consecutive games from Feb. 26-March 19. UCLA has 54 home runs on the season, good for second in the Pac-10. 14 different Bruins have smacked round-trippers so far this season, with eight players already owning five-or-more home runs on the year (Ambriz 5, Babineau 5, Crawford 6, Decker 5, Jensen 6, McMillan 6, Smith 6, Stewart 6). UCLA is 23-9 this season when a Bruin homers in a game.

Big Innings: UCLA likes to score its runs in bunches, as the Bruins have scored three or more runs in an inning 45 times this season. 166 of UCLA's 333 total runs (50 percent) this season have come when posting three or more runs in an inning. Scoring three or more runs in an inning in a game translates into success for UCLA, as the Bruins are 25-2 this season when scoring three or more runs in an inning. UCLA scored a season-high seven runs in an inning against NC State (March 5).

UCLA scored three runs in the bottom of the first inning in Friday's game against Stanford (5/19) to cruise to an 8-1 win over the Cardinal. In Sunday's game against Stanford (5/21), UCLA used a six-run fifth inning to erase a 5-0 deficit. The Bruins also posted a three spot and a four spot on the scoreboard in a 10-1 win over UC Irvine last Tuesday.

UCLA has posted three-or-more runs in an inning nine times in five of the last eight games.

Lotta Action: UCLA has scored eight-or-more runs in six of the last nine games, and has recorded 11-or-

more hits in seven of the last 10 games.

Dealing: UCLA currently owns a 3.82 team ERA. That mark is on track to be the lowest mark at UCLA since 1980 when the Bruins finished the year with a 3.55 team ERA.

Control: UCLA arms don't give up many free passes. Bruin pitchers have not issued more than three walks in the last six-consecutive games.

Good D: UCLA's defense has been superb all year, as the Bruins finished the regular season with the No. 1-defensive mark in the Pac-10 Conference with a .977 fielding percentage, a top-10 mark in the nation.

Don't Rub It: UCLA batters have been more like big targets as of late at the plate. A Bruin has been hit by a pitch in nine of the last 10 games, which included a stretch of eight-consecutive games, and 16 times in 12 of the last 13 games. On the other side, Bruin pitchers have only hit two opposing batters in the last 10 games.

Multi-hitters: UCLA hitters are very efficient at knocking the ball around the park more than once in a game. 13 different Bruins have at least five or more multi-hit games, seven different Bruins have at least 10 multi-hit games, and 16 different Bruins have recorded multiple hits in a game this season a total of 152 times. Freshman Brandon Crawford leads the team with 23 multi-hit games, and senior Chris Jensen is second on the squad with 22.

Four different Bruins had multiple hits against UCI last Tuesday.

Watch 'Um Swang, Watch 'Um Swang: UCLA has knocked an extra base hit in 51 of its 55 games so far this year. The Bruins have smacked 182 extra base hits with 114 doubles, 14 triples, and 54 home runs. UCLA has hit at least one double in its last 26-consecutive games, a season-high, posting 62 two-baggers in that span. UCLA hit two doubles and two home runs against UCI last Tuesday. The Bruins are 24-8 when they post three-or-more extra base hits in a game.

Lineup Trends: UCLA is 16-3 when senior Sean Smith bats in the six spot, 6-0 when freshman Cody Decker starts at designated hitter, and 15-2 when freshman Blair Dunlap starts in left field.

Home Cook'n: The Bruins played their final home game of the season at Jackie Robinson Stadium on Tuesday, a 10-1 win over UC Irvine. UCLA finishes its home schedule 19-12, as the Bruins won 16 of the final 22 games at Jackie Robinson Stadium. In the last 22 home games, the Bruins hit .320 (244-763) as a team with 31 home runs, 163 RBI, and 182 runs scored for an 8.3 runs-per-game average. UCLA will end the year hitting .305 (320-1048) with 38 home runs, 199 RBI, 221 runs scored (7.1 per game), and a 3.84 team ERA at Jackie Robinson Stadium this season.

Six Pack: UCLA defeated Stanford twice in a three-game series this past weekend to win its sixth-straight three-game home series of the season. Since 1975, that feat has never been accomplished.

Getting Some Props: UCLA garnered Pac-10 Player of the Week honors five times during the regular season. Every pitcher in the Bruin starting rotation has earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors, as junior Hector Ambriz (March 14), Dave Huff (April 25), and Tyson Brummett (March 7) have each been recognized as the conference's top hurler. Ambriz has also been named the Pac-10's Player of the Week (March 21), and Chris Jensen was named Pac-10 Player of the Week on May 16. Jensen is also a Pac-10 All-Academic First-Team selection.

Getting More Props: The UCLA baseball team had seven players earn 2006 All-Pacific-10 Conference honors, Pac-10 Commissioner Tom Hansen announced Wednesday, May 31. Juniors Hector Ambriz and Dave Huff, and freshman Ryan Babineau each earned All-Pac-10 First-Team honors, the most All-Pac-10 Team selections for UCLA since 2001. Senior Chris Jensen, junior Paul Oseguera, and freshmen Brandon Crawford and Jermaine Curtis each earned All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention accolades.

Freshman Impact: Head Coach John Savage started six freshmen in the lineup on Sunday against No. 5 Oregon State, marking the 17th time this season UCLA has put five or more freshman in the starting lineup.

The Big Four: UCLA would not be in the position it is in this season without the play of its senior class. Four seniors in particular have led the way for a once young and inexperienced Bruin team. So far this season, seniors Chris Jensen, Brett McMillan, Josh Roenicke, and Sean Smith have combined for much of UCLA's offensive production. These four seniors have combined for 187 of the team's 542 hits (35 percent), 113 of the team's 298 RBI (38 percent) and 114 of the team's 333 runs scored (34 percent).

Smith has hit three home runs with 10 RBI in his last 10 games.

Keep Their Headz Ringin: Freshman Brandon Crawford has been a hit machine for UCLA all season long. Crawford has started all 55 games for UCLA up the middle, and owns a .320 batting average with a team-best 74 hits, six home runs, six triples, 29 RBI, and 41 runs scored. The 6-2 shortstop is currently riding a 10-game hit streak into the postseason. In his last 10 games, Crawford is hitting .390 (16-41) with a home run, two triples, three doubles, and 10 runs scored. This is the third time this season Crawford has posted a hit streak of 10-or-more games, as he started the season with a personal-best 11-game hit streak.

Batter Up: All freshman Jermaine Curtis does is get on base. Curtis was impressive in the regular season during Pac-10 play, posting a .390 batting average (23-59), fourth in the conference, with 13 RBI and 14 runs scored. Curtis finished third in Pac-10 play with a .500 on-base percentage. In the last 10 games, Curtis is hitting .394 with a .522 on-base percentage posting 13 hits, six walks, five hit-by-pitches, and eight runs scored.

Everyday CJ: Senior Chris Jensen has been a staple of consistency for the Bruins all year long. On the season, the UCLA right fielder has hit .327 (73-223) with six home runs, and team bests of 35 RBI and 45 runs scored, starting all 55 games for UCLA in right. In the last 10 games, Jensen is hitting .390 (16-41) with two home runs, nine RBI and nine runs scored.

Huff Stuff: Junior Dave Huff has been a workhorse for the UCLA pitching staff this year. In eight Pac-10 starts, Huff has tossed 68.1 innings, with a 4-1 record, a 2.77 ERA, and 49 strikeouts. Huff had gone nine or more inning four-straight Pac-10 outings before a loss against Stanford, and five of his first six Pac-10 starts. On the season, Huff owns a 7-3 record with a 2.82 ERA, three complete-game victories, and 90 strikeouts in 121.1 innings pitched. Huff ranks second in the Pac-10 in innings pitched, third in strikeouts, and fifth in ERA.

Bailamos: Junior Paul Oseguera has been phenomenal out of the bullpen this season for UCLA. During the regular season, Oseguera posted a 3-1 record with a 1.71 ERA and two saves, striking out 46 batters in 47.1 innings pitched. In his last seven appearances, Oseguera has a 0.55 ERA with a win and 13 strikeouts in 16.1 innings pitched.

Bring It: This season, UCLA didn't back down from anyone, which showed in the toughness of its schedule. The Bruins played 32 games scheduled against teams that competed in the 2005 NCAA Regional Championships, with 11 teams listed in this year's 2005 preseason top-25 rankings.

UCLA took on 12 teams that competed in the 2005 NCAA Regional Championships last year (Miami, Pepperdine, Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, NC State, Ole Miss, UNLV, Arizona, Arizona State, USC, Stanford, and Oregon State), and will have 18 games during the season against 2005 NCAA Super Regional participants (Miami, Cal State Fullerton, Ole Miss, Arizona State, USC, Oregon State).

UCLA went 19-12 against those teams.

The Bruins' tough schedule was noted with the No. 1 strength of schedule nod by Boyd's World, a baseball statistics internet site.

Up Next: UCLA will play in the second round of the Malibu Regional on Saturday, June 3. If UCLA wins Friday's game, the Bruins will play at 3 p.m. on Saturday. If the Bruins lose on Friday, they will play at 11 a.m. on Saturday against either Pepperdine or Missouri.

John Savage, Head Coach Second Season Nevada '91

UCLA head coach John Savage has always been known as one of the top pitching coaches in the nation since he began his collegiate coaching career 14 years ago. After leading a UCLA team that finished 15-41 in 2005 to a 32-23 record and No. 2-seed at-large berth in the 2006 NCAA Championships, Savage can now be considered one of the top head coaches in the nation – period.

From being a top-rated pitching coach at Nevada and USC, to rebuilding the baseball program at UC Irvine, to revitalizing the UCLA program, Savage has succeeded everywhere he has been. A huge reason for his success is his proficient ability at recruiting baseball talent – ball players who are athletically gifted and who possess good character. Savage was able to secure the fifth-best recruiting class in the nation last year, with many of those players from that class playing huge roles in this season's turnaround.

Savage is a coach who works very hard at preparing his team to compete, and puts each of his players in position for success both on and off the field. The most impressive aspect of Savage's turnaround of the UCLA baseball program this season is that it has been done against the toughest

teams in the nation.

UCLA has played 10 teams during the regular season that were selected among the NCAA tournament field of 64. The Bruins own a combined record of 15-12 against Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Pepperdine, UC Irvine, Arizona State, Miami, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Stanford, and NC State.

18 of the Bruins' first 22 games this season were against nationally ranked opposition, with a streak of 12-consecutive games versus ranked opponents once in effect. UCLA is 11-10 against ranked opposition on the season, and owns a series sweep of then-No. 17 ranked NC State on the road, and home series wins against No. 19 Ole Miss and No. 10 Arizona State. Savage led the Bruins to a sweep of Long Beach State in a home-in-home series for the first time since 1995. UCLA also won at No. 5 Oregon State, as the Beavers were 22-3 at home before losing to the Bruins.

Savage got UCLA to respond to the challenging schedule, as the Bruins were ranked in the national polls for the week of April 24-30. UCLA entered that week ranked No. 22 in the nation by Baseball America, and No. 25 by the Rosenblatt Report. The week marked the first time since March of 2001 that UCLA has been ranked in the Top-25 by Baseball America.

The Bruins rebounded from a 5-9 start to go 27-14 (.659) since Feb. 28.

Next season, UCLA will play 25 games against the 2006 NCAA Tournament field, with games against Cal State Fullerton, Ole Miss, Pepperdine, and Oregon State, all No. 1 seeds in this year's postseason.

Savage has installed a philosophy in the UCLA program that has been a basis of the team's success this season. That philosophy is "win at least two out of three." UCLA beat Stanford two times in a three-game series for the first time since 1997, marking the six-straight home series win at Jackie Robinson Stadium, a program first in more than 30 years. UCLA won nine of 14 three-game series during the regular season, including six of its last seven series, and eight of its last 10 series.

Another principle of Savage's coaching philosophy is to win with pitching and defense, both of which have been essential parts of UCLA's success this season. UCLA currently owns a 3.82 team ERA. That mark is on track to be the lowest mark at UCLA since 1980 when the Bruins finished the year with a 3.55 team ERA. Also, UCLA's defensive fielding percentage of .977 was the No. 1 mark in the Pac-10 Conference this season, a mark that has been top-10 in the nation most of the year.

UCLA's success this season is just the first step in Savage's goal of making the Bruins a perennial postseason team, and an Omaha contender year in and year out. This season marks Savage's first postseason appearance at UCLA, but it certainly won't be his last.

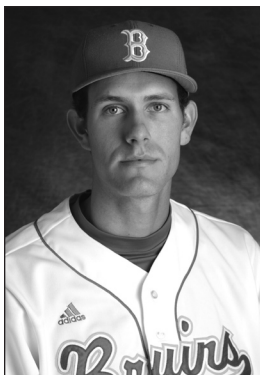

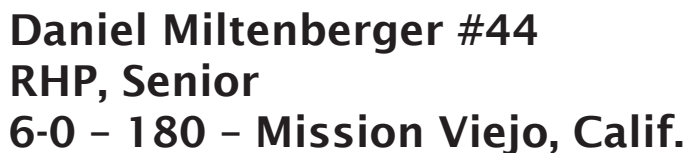

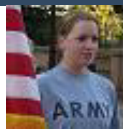

Baseball's season raises eyebrows

The turnaround of the UCLA baseball team is incredible. It was only a year ago that this team was mired in a 15-41 season, with avoiding last place in the Pac-10 the only reason to play.

This year, with only four games left to play, the team has the chance to finish in first place.

A week ago, when I wrote that the baseball team was my dark horse pick to win UCLA's 100th NCAA Championship, it raised a few eyebrows.

It should've – even I will admit that the UCLA baseball team has only a small chance of winning the title.

But the team does have a chance – and that, in itself, is a huge surprise.

I saw the team play this past weekend against Stanford – and it's a different UCLA team from last year. The Bruins have everything a great team needs and are peaking at the right time, playing their best baseball at the end of the season.

All year long, we knew they could pitch. But now they can hit, scoring at least eight runs in five of their last six games – all against teams likely to make the NCAA Tournament.

This team has the right type of players too – players with heart and baseball aptitude – which is very important come tournament time. Sunday, they were down 5-0 after the fifth inning and had only one hit of their own. The Bruins didn't give up, scoring six in the sixth inning to take the lead and scoring two later in the game to regain the lead after falling behind.

"To win like that is incredible. Everyone has been stepping up," redshirt senior Josh Roenicke said. "With our pitching staff and defense, that's what's most important for our baseball team to win. The way we're playing, we have a great chance to win, but we have to take it one game at a time."

Roenicke is among my favorite UCLA athletes to watch. Roenicke is one of those rare players who can play center field and then pitch in a critical situation in relief in the same game. Sunday, Roenicke displayed his range by running down a ball in straightaway left field, and in the next inning, pitching a scoreless ninth and capturing the win for the Bruins.

Another player who has stepped up and shown a lot of heart, hustle and brains on the field is freshman Jermaine Curtis. Most athletes try hard and give their best effort, but some, like Curtis, do even more than that. Curtis is the type of player who sprints to first base after a walk – a rare sight – and gives his all for an infield high chopper when the batter's going to be safe at first anyway. He's speedy in the field and on the bases, forcing the defense to rush what are usually routine plays. But he's not overaggressive, wisely not trying to go from first to third on a ground ball on Sunday. This was a subtle move that went unnoticed, but Curtis didn't take the bat out of his teammates' hands and kept the rally going.

He's talented at the plate as well, with the highest batting average (.352) of any Bruin regular, and he's a patient hitter, especially for a freshman (21 walks and only 15 strikeouts in 125 at bats).

The team is sticking to the "one-game-at-a-time" cliché even though the Bruins probably assured themselves a bid to the NCAA Regionals by winning the series against Stanford. According to Warrenolan.com, UCLA is No. 29 in the Ratings Percentage Index with the 11th-toughest schedule strength in the country.

This week, the Bruins have one game against UC Irvine and three at Oregon State – both of which are highly ranked in the RPI. This means that even if the Bruins were to lose, their RPI won't fall that much, making it likely UCLA will enter into the 64-team tournament field.

"We had a tough nonconference schedule, and the Pac-10 is one of the better conferences in the country," UCLA coach John Savage said. "We're a good team, we have the ability to go deep (in the tournament), but we can't get ahead of ourselves. We have to keep taking it one game at a time because nothing is for sure yet."

Today is your last chance to see the Bruins play at Jackie Robinson Stadium this season. If you haven't seen them yet, you should. You'll thank me later.

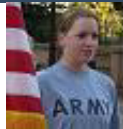

Team hopes to improve with new talent

After last season's dismal record, Bruins ready to increase home runs, pitch winning games

John Savage is looking to take a page right out of the Ben Howland playbook.

Just like Howland, the second-year UCLA baseball coach took over a program and looks to drastically change the direction of the program with a fresh coaching philosophy.

Just like Howland, Savage's first season was defined by long stretches of futility with a talent-depleted roster.

Just like Howland, he goes into his second year on the job with an elite recruiting class that ranks among the top in the country.

When the UCLA baseball team faces powerhouse Miami this weekend, the Bruins will be putting behind them a year that, with the help of a 19-game losing streak, left them with their worst record in 60 years. For the second-year coach, a new season and a fresh start could not be more welcome.

"Once we step between those lines on Friday, it's a whole new season," said Savage, who coached the team to a 15-41 record last season. "We felt it was going to be a challenge last season and it was. This is a new year, and

clearly, we feel we're a lot better."

Considering last season's record and their 2005 recruiting class, which was ranked No. 5 in the country by Baseball America, the Bruins would be hard pressed to be worse than last year. In fact, Savage feels that the Bruins not only have the potential to be leaps and bounds better than last year, but that they should expect to be.

"The bar has been raised, knowing who we have here," Savage said. "We're much better than last year. We have clearly higher expectations, not only from ourselves, but from the baseball community."

Chief among the Bruins' new talent are catcher Ryan Babineau, infielder Brandon Crawford, and pitchers Tim Murphy and David Huff. Huff, a junior college transfer from Cypress Community College who played for Savage his freshman season at UC Irvine, will be the Saturday-night starter against the Hurricanes. Huff, in particular, wants to lead this team to a strong finish after being around the team last season.

"Hopefully, I can pitch well and do my part," Huff said. "I need to keep the guys at the plate with a fighting chance. Our goal is to do better than last year and just show everyone that we're not as bad as last year and not the eighth best team in the conference."

Though the new recruits raise the profile and general talent level of the Bruin squad, it is the older players who will ultimately decide whether or not this team can shake off the stain of last year's failures. Junior Hector Ambriz, who will start on Friday night's game, will have to play consistently well for this team to succeed.

"It all starts with Hector," Savage said. "The expectations are on him. He needs to have the best year of his career. He needs to go out there and do it from game one."

Ambriz, who had a 3.94 ERA and a .338 batting average last year, started on Friday nights for the Bruins last season and it is hoped that with one more year of experience, he will help set the tone for a team that needs to consistently do the right things in all facets of the game.

"We've been focusing on execution," Ambriz said. "We've got to do a better job of moving guys over, and scoring guys from third base. We've got a bunch of leadership, four great starters, and we're really deep. We expect to go to the playoffs."

After Ambriz and Huff, the starting pitchers for the Bruins will be junior college transfer Tyson Brummet on Sundays, and junior Brian Schroeder on Tuesdays. Both Huff and Schroeder are left-handed, which should provide a different look for opposing hitters that was lacking in the Bruins' rotation last year.

Offensively, this team will be improved. Senior Chris Jensen spent most of last season injured, before coming on strong in the second half to tie the team lead in home runs with seven, while batting .367. Jensen is slated play right field and anchor the lineup from the No. 3 spot. With him playing a full year, the Bruins should expect big things at the top of the lineup.

"He's one of the best hitters out there," Savage said. "A healthy Chris Jensen can put up big numbers.

Just look at what he did last year in (29 games)."

The unexpected return of senior first baseman Brett McMillan gives Savage that much more flexibility. McMillan, who was drafted following his junior season by the Washington Nationals but elected to come back to finish his college career at UCLA, had a relatively disappointing season in 2005. He managed only a .257 average and tied Jensen for the team lead in home runs despite playing in twice as many games.

Nevertheless, his return provides veteran stability for a core of inexperienced players.

"I need to lead by example," McMillan said.

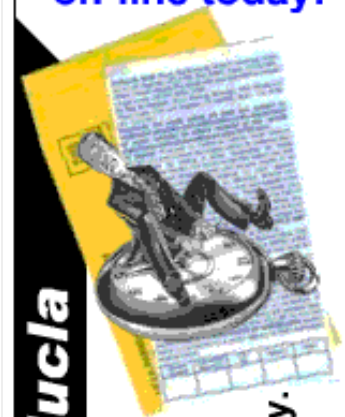
"The older guys need to be open to the younger guys so they're comfortable asking questions. We need to get to that point where everyone is comfortable with each other. And if need be, we have to give the younger guys a kick in the butt now and again."

"There were a lot of factors (for why I returned) but I mostly just didn't want to end my college career on that note," McMillan said. "This way I get to graduate and also it gives us a chance to prove that we're not a losing team."

"I want these freshmen to be sophomores by the time we start the Pac-10. I look at what coach Howland has done with the basketball team, and that is kind of the blueprint you'd like to follow."

Hopefully for the Bruins, Savage will have Howland's second-year touch.

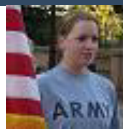

Baseball 'encouraged but not satisfied' after Miami series

Bruins win one of three against No. 21 Hurricanes in games dominated by pitching

Strength up the middle of the diamond is an asset in baseball. But then again, so is seasoned experience in clutch situations.

If the UCLA baseball series against the No. 21 Miami Hurricanes was any indication, it is that coach John Savage has a lot of talent at the core of his baseball club. How much that talent continues to mature in definitive moments will determine the success of his team.

The Bruins (2-4) were clipped by the Hurricanes (5-2) on Sunday 5-2, dropping the second of two losses in a series of three games that at once offered a glimpse into the untapped potential of their young players while still showing how much they have to grow before becoming one of the elite teams.

"Anybody who watched the series could see the positives we can take from the weekend," Savage said. "We are encouraged but not satisfied by any means."

In the opening game on Friday night, UCLA's 3-1 loss to Miami was defined by both team's strength up the middle of the field, as UCLA junior pitcher Hector Ambriz and Miami sophomore Carlos Gutierrez were intertwined in a pitching duel that put

added weight on manufacturing runs. What made the difference in the game was the Hurricanes' experienced players coming through in difficult situations and the Bruins' younger players experiencing some growing pains.

Down 2-1 in the bottom of the sixth inning, UCLA's freshman catcher Ryan Babineau was at-bat with runners on second and third with only one out. A sacrifice fly or well-placed ground out would have tied the game. But Babineau was caught off guard with a series of breaking balls and struck out, stranding the runners and sealing the loss.

Saturday's come-from-behind 7-4 win evened the series and illustrated exactly why Babineau and freshman center fielder Tim Murphy have solidified their starting roles. Both fueled the Bruins' four-run eighth inning rally against reliever Raudel Alfonso, tagging him with the loss. Babineau finished 2-4 with a pair of RBIs.

"I think there are some growing pains with execution situations," Savage said. "But we are excited about our freshmen's progress."

The rubber match was highlighted once again by the dazzling play up the middle, this time by Murphy and Miami junior center fielder John Jay. Murphy had a surefire extra base hit, and possibly even a home run, taken away by his counterpart when Jay made a leaping grab up against the right-center field wall in the bottom of the eighth inning.

"I though it was gone off the bat," Murphy said. "I put a good swing on a fastball – what I was looking for. Jay just made a great play on it."

UCLA's double-play tandem of freshman shortstop Brandon Crawford and senior second baseman Sean Smith kept the Bruins in the game with their stellar defense, as Savage referred to their performance as a "fielding clinic."

Junior pitcher Tyson Brummett gave up five runs (four earned) over 7.1 innings of work.

"The key was just getting ahead and locating my fastball," Brummett said. "When you do that, you'll have success, and when you don't, it can cause trouble."

But the Bruins managed just six hits, and when the few scoring opportunities arose, there was little production. UCLA mounted a ninth-inning rally, loading the bases with one out and the winning run at the plate in Smith. After lacing a line drive down the left field line that was just foul, however, Smith pulled a curveball on the outer third of the plate and grounded into a game-ending double play.

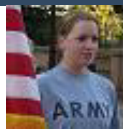

Baseball sweeps No. 17 Wolfpack

The Bruins forgot a lot of things this weekend. They forgot to be intimidated by the No. 17 team in the country, and they forgot to be affected by the long trip across the country.

Luckily UCLA remembered to pack its brooms as it went on to sweep North Carolina State (13-4) in a three-game series. With their first sweep of the season, and their first road sweep since 2000, the Bruins (9-9) are at .500 for the first time this season.

"It was quite a weekend," coach John Savage said. "All three pieces came together. (We had) defense, pitching, and timely hitting. It was a fun weekend in front of big crowds."

Staff ace Hector Ambriz got UCLA off to a great start Friday night, allowing 2 runs in 6 2/3 innings. Ambriz also helped himself out at the plate, going 3-for-5 with a home run and four RBIs.

With the Bruins on top 6-2 in the bottom of the seventh, the Wolfpack had the bases loaded and its star sophomore Matt Mangini stepping up to the plate. Junior Paul Oseguera came on in relief and struck out Mangini ending the inning and the threat.

Oseguera stayed in and finished the game, getting four strikeouts and his first save of the season in the 7-2 victory.

UCLA's regular closer Brant Rustich remains out of the lineup with a blister.

But Saturday's game was all about freshman infielder Brandon Crawford, who had a stellar day at the plate, going 4-for-4 with a triple and a two-run home run.

"I was just trying to get on base and set up the table," Crawford said. "They were throwing a lot of fastballs, but the home run was on a change-up."

With a single, a triple and a home run, Crawford was a double away from hitting for the cycle.

"Someone had mentioned it to me, so I was thinking about it," Crawford admitted. "But at the plate I wasn't."

In a slight change from Friday's game, UCLA clung to a much smaller lead on Saturday.

After leaping to a 5-1 lead in the top of the fifth on the homer by Crawford and another from senior Chris Jensen, N.C. State had shaved the lead down to one by the bottom of the seventh.

The Bruins never let the Wolfpack tie up the game. Junior Dave Huff got the win after 7 1/3 innings of work, and Osegeura tallied his second save after retiring the last two batters in the ninth.

Sunday's game was full of fireworks from the Bruins' bats. The Westwood Nine tallied 13 runs on 18 hits, with home runs from five different players.

"It was definitely something new," Jensen said. "We got more aggressive. We don't want to concede to being in close games."

Jensen made sure that didn't happen, going 2-for-5 with four RBIs, a double, and a three-run home run. Junior Tyson Brummett dominated on the hill, throwing eight innings and recording 12 strikeouts in the win.

With the sweep, the team is on a four-game winning streak going into a midweek game at Pepperdine prior to a weekend series against Mississippi at home.

"We're pretty pumped right now," Crawford said.

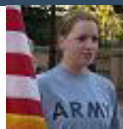

Learning the Savage way to win

The Bruins look ahead to an extended season under their coach's tough-love leadership

There's a little bit of psychology in every coach's repertoire.

UCLA baseball coach John Savage believed that if his club won two out of three from visiting Stanford over the weekend, they would be almost a lock to make the NCAA Regionals.

With an 8-7 comeback win on Sunday, the Bruins (30-22, 12-9 Pac-10) won the season series from the Cardinal for the first time since 1997 and, in doing so, might have clinched a postseason berth only a year removed from a 15-41 debacle.

After Sunday's game, Savage was far more reserved.

"We've put ourselves in a position to extend the season," Savage said. "The season is far from over.

"We haven't accomplished many of our goals, and we want to be a team that is playing well going into next week," Savage said.

Savage's low-key approach is nothing new.

With a core of freshman starters, the coach has gone out of his way to be patient with his players and give them enough room to fail or succeed based on their own play.

Heading into today's game against UC Irvine, the last nonconference game of the year, Savage's

psychology seems to have worked.

In particular, Savage has made it a point to let his pitchers work in and out of trouble with the hope that the experience would pay off at season's end.

On Sunday, junior Tyson Brummett gave up four earned runs in the first inning to put the Bruins in the hole. When Stanford padded its lead to 5-0 in the fourth, Savage left Brummett in the game. Some coaches would have brought in a reliever as soon as it was evident the starter was not using his best stuff, but Savage did not want to overmanage his players.

"We've done it all season," Savage said. "Tyson Brummett got hit around early. You think, 'Hey we need to go to the bullpen.' But it's not the right move."

"The right move is to keep him in the game, and he kind of settled down and fought his way through six innings and kept us in the ball game," he said. "It's a credit to his ability to remain focused and not get rattled."

Savage has repeatedly said the only way to ensure that the UCLA baseball program gets legitimately rebuilt is to give it a healthy dose of tough love.

With a notoriously difficult schedule – statistically the third toughest in the nation – Savage wanted to add a layer or two to the Bruins' collective skin so they wouldn't flounder in the clutch.

"When you have history of (winning), I think it goes to show that he can take a punch and get back up," Savage said.

The results on the field are not the only attributes of the program that have Savage's fingerprints on them. The players he has recruited employ a similar brash penchant for winning.

Freshman infielder Jermaine Curtis was asked earlier in the year where the Bruins had the biggest room for improvement. Curtis quipped that his team had no weakness.

Following UCLA's win on Sunday, Curtis reiterated that he isn't at all surprised by his team's one-year turn around.

"I always had faith in my team," he said. "We have a lot of talent on the team. It shows. Everybody is productive."

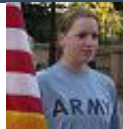

Pitcher playing like a major contender

With his coach, family urging him on to next level, Bruin junior has already come a long way

Dave Huff showed up at the ballpark last December, ready to put in time at another offseason workout. Then he realized who had beat him to the mound for a throwing session.

Tossing in the pen at Jackie Robinson Stadium was Barry Zito, Oakland A's pitcher and Huff's professional role model. Zito, a former USC Trojan, had played for current UCLA coach John Savage when he was a pitching coach at USC.

"At first I was kind of starstruck," Huff said. "Jaw to the floor, 'Oh my god it's Barry Zito.'"

Huff looks up to the Cy Young Award winner because of his success at the pro level and because Zito's formula for success is very similar to his own. The Bruin watched his idol take throws off the mound and tried to mold his mechanics even more to emulate the pro's.

Huff has heard a lot about how similar he is to the major league star, and he had to transfer from UC Irvine to UCLA to continue to get the same baseball education. Both are lefties and exhibit a calm composure while dominating hitters up and down the lineup, and both have played for Savage, an unofficial pitching guru.

Junior pitcher Dave Huff followed UCLA coach John Savage from UC Irvine to assume the No. 2 spot in the Bruins' starting rotation. Huff's success has led to expectations that he will leave school a year early as a high pick in June's MLB draft.

"He reminds me of (Zito) a little bit," Savage said of Huff. "They both have excellent changeups, (and) they both have fluid deliveries."

As the Bruins' No. 2 starter with a 3-2 record and a 2.69 ERA, Huff, a junior transfer in his first year at UCLA, has brought back memories of Zito. The lefty has depended on precise control, successfully spotting his fastball before using his circle change to strike out righties, and breaking stuff to get out lefties.

"Huff is a legitimate Friday guy pitching on a Saturday, and that's good news for us," Savage said.

In his time in Westwood, Huff has exuded a Zito-esque cool – yet focused – demeanor on the mound. In order to do that, Huff compares himself to another pitcher, even if he only plays for Universal Pictures.

"I don't know if you've ever seen 'For Love of the Game' with Kevin Costner, where he 'clears the mechanism' and all he focuses on is that little pitcher, catcher, umpire. That's kinda how I am," Huff said.

"I don't really hear too much what's going on in the crowd. I'm focused on the sign, on the glove. I've always been that way."

"Dave's real funny," older brother and former Long Beach State walk-on Tim Huff said. "It looks like it comes easy, but he's extremely competitive. He hates to lose. A guy'll get on base, whether it was a solid hit or an error, and that's when you see Dave really pitch."

Savage saw that potential early, and by now, the two have been around each other a long time. As the head coach at UC Irvine in 2003, Savage recruited the young lefthander out of Edison High School in Huntington Beach.

The Anaheim Angels drafted the lefty in the 31st round that year, but he felt he wasn't ready for pro ball.

"I was a stick coming out of high school," Dave Huff recalled. "I didn't throw very hard and I didn't really have a great idea of pitching."

Huff opted instead to play for Savage, knowing the coach had tutored such major leaguers as Zito and Mark Prior. "He's the No. 1 pitching coach. He knows everything there is to know about pitching. The thing that persuaded me was that he was the coach," Huff said.

The respect is mutual. Savage has a lot of faith in Huff to perform when he needs him, and Huff trusts his coach to make him better on the mound. Over the last three years, the two have developed a significant level of mutual trust.

Dave Huff gets his dependable, composed yet competitive nature from his family. Tim Huff credits their mom as a "pistol" brimming with passion, while his dad represented the flip side of the coin,

being more laid back.

"The two sides of the table made him well-rounded," Tim Huff said. "It's why he looks so relaxed when he throws, because he has a lot of Dad's personality. But he also has a lot of drive from Mom."

As a child, Dave Huff would always play sports with Tim Huff and his friends, who were five years older. Playing against the bigger and stronger boys forced the younger brother to play even harder just to stay in the game.

"Growing up you're always dangling the carrot," Tim Huff said. "Keep 'em in the game long enough, and get them to a point where they can see the chance to win, and then make it tougher."

When Dave Huff would play against children his own age, the players seemed small and weak by comparison. Dave Huff, however, didn't get a chance to ease off one bit. Tim Huff wouldn't let him sink back down to a lower level, and was always in his ear to stay one step ahead of the competition.

"It even started with youth ball," Dave Huff said. "He was like, 'In youth ball you need to be ready for the high school guys. In high school, you need to be ready for the college guys. In college, you need to be ready for the pros.' It was almost like I was competing at a higher level than the level that I was at."

Under Savage's tutelage, Dave Huff has been continually pushed to improve. Savage never lost faith in the freshman despite some early struggles, and at the end of the season, when Savage left Irvine to take the head coaching job at UCLA, Huff decided to follow him.

Following his teacher proved to be harder than expected. He applied for a transfer and was originally told he would be granted one, until the school later informed him that he couldn't transfer within California. Acting much like he does on the mound, Huff regained his composure and spent his sophomore year at Cypress College, a local junior college.

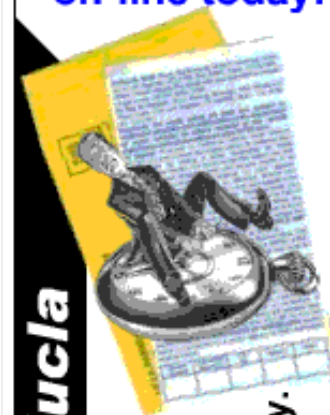
The Huntington Beach native did everything he could to keep up the level of his game while facing a lower level of competition. Huff and Savage stayed in contact throughout the year. Savage went so far as to watch some of the lefty's bullpen workout and give advice. At the end of his sophomore year, Huff was drafted in the 19th round by the Phillies.

Although he was enticed by the opportunity, the prospect ended up turning down the pro team. He was frustrated on signing day when the offer from the organization was lower than what he had been promised. Huff blamed miscommunication within the organization and decided to table his major league plans.

Ultimately, despite the Bruins' abysmal 2005 record of 15-41, he decided to transfer to UCLA so he could learn more under Savage.

The results have been incredible for both sides. Huff stabilized the rotation as a key starter, filling in an important piece of the Bruins' puzzle, and is a big reason for the huge turnaround from last season. The Bruins matched their win total from last season before even entering Pac-10 play this season, and they sit at 3-3 in conference games after their first two series.

Huff has played a unique role in that success. The starter came in for what was and is likely only a one year engagement. Still, he has managed to make a significant impact on the program and has earned the respect of guys up and down the lineup.

"He wants the team to win and he helps out however he can," teammate and roommate Tyson Brummett said. "He's consistent – very consistent."

On Feb. 18 against University of the Pacific, Huff had a standout day, registering 15 strikeouts in eight innings to get the win and be named Collegiate Baseball Player of the Week by the publication Collegiate Baseball.

Despite a strong beginning to the year, Huff is still playing to that higher level of competition. He cites an improvement in velocity as his proudest accomplishment over anything in the stat books.

As always, his brother is right there driving him. "He hasn't pitched as well this season as I know Dave Huff can pitch. There's a few more levels he can go," Tim Huff said.

It won't be very long, however, before the younger brother catches that dangling carrot and reaches the next level. Dave Huff is expected to be taken high in Major League Baseball's June 6 draft.

With what he's picked up from his family and his coach, he'll be ready.

Nothing short of remarkable

Freshman shortstop Brandon Crawford proves to be a valuable asset to a revived UCLA baseball team

At the beginning of the year, UCLA baseball coach John Savage said he wanted his freshmen to be playing like sophomores by the end of the nonconference schedule. At this rate, freshman shortstop Brandon Crawford might be ready to graduate by the end of the season.

How far has he come? In fall practice, he was flustered, trying to prove to his older teammates that he belonged on the team.

Heading into UCLA's game against UC Irvine tonight, Crawford is the catalyst for a Bruin team (27-21, 10-8 Pac-10) that has rebounded from the depths of a 15-41 season a year ago. With an influx of new talent in a top-five recruiting class, Crawford is the freshman phenomenon on a team of rookie standouts.

"In the fall, it looked like he had some trouble transitioning to college," senior Brett McMillan said. "He wasn't playing catch, and he wasn't batting the way he thinks he should."

Crawford was a few months removed from graduation at Foothill High School and had to deal with the newer challenges of college life: harder academics, living away from home, and college baseball itself.

Crawford, knowing he hadn't showcased the potential that got him to Westwood, came back after winter break on a mission to win the starting shortstop job. Those around the program knew he was the shortstop of the future. He was determined to prove to his teammates, and himself, that his time would be now.

"He made a strong statement that he was going to be our starting shortstop," Savage said. "He has earned everything."

Crawford led a youth trend that now has the Bruins starting four freshmen in the field – Tim Murphy in the outfield, and Jermaine Curtis and Ryan Babineau joining Crawford on the infield.

Described by Savage as "very levelheaded," Crawford was able to work himself into the starting lineup as the No. 9 hitter. But he was still not completely satisfied. He batted leadoff throughout high school, he figured. Why should things change in college?

They didn't for long. The season started on Feb. 3 against Fresno State with Crawford in the nine hole. By the time UCLA faced then-No. 19 North Carolina State on March 3, he had secured his place as the team's leadoff hitter. He has become one of the team's most visible players, but has kept a cool demeanor that has earned the respect of UCLA's veterans.

"He's just got a great presence on the field," junior Nolan Rouse said.

Like most first-year starters, Crawford has benefited from having some veteran guidance. Rouse was hoping to get the starting spot that Crawford claimed. Instead of holding a grudge, Rouse has taken the freshman under his wing

"I've just tried to pass on my knowledge and my experience," Rouse said. "I've just tried to help him out in every way I know. You've got to make the team better. He had the starting job, so I tried to teach."

Crawford has learned. His goal for the year was lofty: become the best shortstop in the Pac-10. With the help of fielding coach Brian Green, Crawford has worked on his consistency in the field.

"He just comes every day with the same intensity," Green said. "He's a mature team player. And he's a good

person, like all of our team guys. I just enjoy working with him on a daily basis."

Crawford leads UCLA with 12 errors, but has made only five in his last 23 games. He's an athletic fielder with potential for the occasional spectacular play.

His range allows him to reach more grounders in the "5.5 hole" between shortstop and third base, so the Bruins will happily take his occasional miscues. Especially if he keeps swinging the bat the way he is now.

He is currently batting .313 and leads the team with 97 total bases. Despite batting leadoff for much of the season, he has 26 RBIs, good for third on the team.

"I really had no idea (I'd be doing this well)," Crawford said. "This was a whole new level for me, so I didn't know what to expect."

Coming to UCLA was a decision that took a fair amount of thought for Crawford. Growing up outside of Palo Alto, he was a Stanford fan as a kid. Ultimately, however, he decided UCLA had the right mix of everything for him: good academics, good weather and a rising baseball program under a new coach.

"Knowing that there was this big recruiting class, and knowing that I'd have a good chance to play right away, I thought this was a good fit for me," Crawford said. "And there was a good chance to stop the losing of last year."

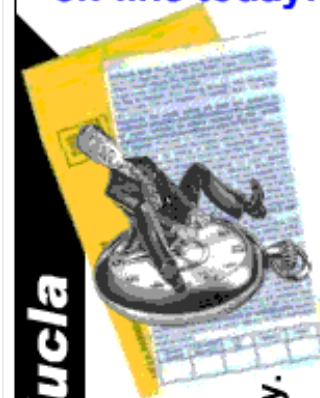
Crawford's improvement this year has played a large part in the change from last year's desolate season. At 27-21, the Bruins could possibly make the playoffs, something which would have been

highly unlikely at the season's beginning. Much of the credit has to go to Crawford.

"It's tough to say (where we'd be without him)," McMillan said. "He's a solid shortstop defensively and a great hitter. You can't really put a value on it. But I don't think we'd be at .500, and I don't think we'd be in the position we're in to possibly make the playoffs."

Crawford himself has set his sights on winning the Pac-10 and making the playoffs this year. Coming from a guy who has realized every goal and surmounted every obstacle thus far in his college career, one has to figure that it is only a matter of time.

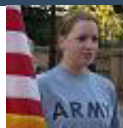

Infielder's versatility is recipe for success

Jermaine Curtis is a nuisance. He's the neighborhood cat that just won't go away.

And UCLA baseball coach John Savage couldn't be happier.

The freshman infielder has solidified his starting job and the No. 2 spot in the lineup with an uncanny ability to get on base. Curtis has done more than just set the table recently. Along with leadoff hitter freshman Brandon Crawford, he has served the middle of the Bruins' lineup a buffet-sized platter of RBI chances.

In the last 16 games, Curtis has batted .431 with a gaudy .529 on-base percentage and 15 runs scored. Whenever the UCLA offense has sputtered, he has been aggravating pitchers with a modest approach that has played bigger than his numbers.

"My job is just to get on base any way I can," Curtis said. "If I am giving the guys behind me a chance to come up with runners on, that's the best sign."

"I try to keep the swing short through the zone and drive the ball the other way," he said.

Curtis did against UC Irvine on Tuesday night. The Bruins (28-21, 10-8 Pac-10) were trailing 4-1 in the fifth inning on the road when Curtis led off the inning with a double down the right-field line. He started what turned out to be a five-run rally that held up in the Bruins' 8-4 win over the Anteaters.

Curtis has split time between second and third base, even trumping senior Brett McMillan for playing time at the hot corner. His flexibility in the field gives Savage options on how to balance the roster. Often Curtis will start at third with senior Sean Smith at second when Savage is looking to get more athleticism and defense in the lineup. Other times, Curtis slides over to second when McMillan, the team's home-run leader, is needed for a power surge.

"He's been fantastic, and he is getting better with each game," Savage said. "He's a high energy guy who loves the game and the other guys feed off his energy."

"For a young player, he understands so much about the game."

MAGIC NUMBER: UCLA is still vying for a bid to the NCAA Regionals, which start on June 2. Much like basketball or football, the NCAA committee disperses at-large bids based heavily on numbers. The Bruins currently rank third in strength of schedule, but will likely need to win at least one more weekend series – either Stanford or Oregon State – to make the postseason.

But Savage isn't doing any number crunching just yet.

"I don't think there's any magic number as far as wins," Savage said. "It's much more important to play well to finish the season and see where you end up."

PAC-10 MAYHEM: As unlikely as it would have seemed at the beginning of the season, the Bruins still have a realistic chance to claim the Pac-10 title. The Bruins are two games behind Oregon State (35-13, 12-6) for first place. But the Bruins close out the season with the fifth-ranked Beavers, who won the Pac-10 title last year.

The Beavers travel to Pullman, Wash., to play Washington State (33-18, 9-9), who will likely earn an at-large bid to the regionals even with a losing conference record.

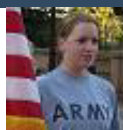

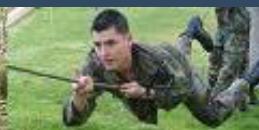
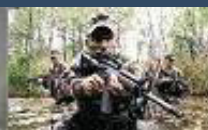

Fresh face in pitching rotation

With two possible losses to the major leagues, baseball sends a young player to the mound

Freshman Jason Novak came in from the bullpen to make his debut as a starting pitcher in UCLA's 4-3 loss to UC Santa Barbara on Tuesday. He earned the opportunity while sharing the closing duties with redshirt senior Josh Roenicke in Brant Rustich's absence due to injury.

Novak will assume the No. 4 job in the starting rotation for the rest of the year, as junior Brian Schroeder moves permanently to the bullpen. The move will give UCLA another dependable left-handed pitcher to go along with Paul Oseguera. But it is what Novak figures to bring the Bruin pitching staff in the long term that has prompted his promotion.

"(Novak) has established himself as our fourth starter," UCLA coach John Savage said. "He's a big part of our future. He has been throwing the ball well and has shown a lot of promise."

Savage has said on several occasions this season that he doubts junior Dave Huff will return to school for his senior year with the chance of being a high pick in the MLB Amateur Draft in June. Junior Hector Ambriz could also forgo his senior year for a

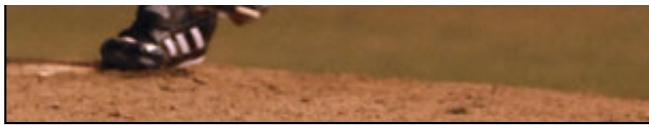

professional career, which would leave the Bruin's rotation barren.

Enter Novak, who will start two more regular season games, both against UC Irvine. The freshman hurler knows he has the chance to help the Bruins make the NCAA Tournament for the first time under Savage. Outside of that, however, he is uncertain.

"I have worked to get to this point all year, and I want to produce," Novak said. "But guys get opportunities all the time, and next year is so far away that I can't even worry about that because I don't know.

"But I can step in and help us win some games now."

Novak worked 3.2 innings on Tuesday, allowing only an unearned run to lower his ERA to 4.48 on the season.
