2007 — Played in all 61 games, starting 59 at catcher...gained All-Pac-10 honorable mention accolades...logged a .272 average (56-for-206)...totaled five home runs, 37 RBI and 34 runs...recorded a .996 fielding percentage, committing just two errors in 485 chances (434 putouts, 49 assists)...his .556 average (5-for-9) with the bases loaded was the highest mark on the team...led the Bruins with a .625 average (5-for-8) with four sacrifices in the Long Beach Regional...named to the All-Long Beach Regional Team...had a career-day against Washington (April 5), hitting 4-for-4 with three runs, three RBI and two home runs as UCLA defeated the Huskies, 11-2...posted a .469 average (15-for-32) during one nine-game stretch (April 13-27)...hit .417 (5-for-12) with five RBI, four runs, one home run and two doubles in the Bruins' three-game sweep at Stanford (March 30 - April 1)...hit .545 (6-for-11) with three RBI, three runs and one home run in a three-game sweep at USC (April 13-15)...registered back-to-back three-hit games against UC Riverside (April 24) and Arizona (April 27)...excelled in the Bruins' series-opener at Arizona State (May 11), hitting 2-for-5 with a career-high four RBI and one triple...hit 3-for-3 with one RBI and one sacrifice bunt against Illinois-Chicago in the NCAA Regionals (June 2).

2006 (summer) – Played in 27 games, recording a .197 batting average (14-for-71), for the Brewster Whitecaps of the Cape Cod League...totaled three doubles, one home run, nine RBI, eight runs scored and 12 walks...posted a .340 on-base percentage...the Whitecaps finished the season with a 24-18-2 record at second place in the Cape Cod League's Eastern Division.

High School — Four-year starter at catcher for head coach Shane Moses...also was a two-year football letterwinner (quarterback) for head coach Tom Dineley...drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 13th round of the 2005 MLB Draft...earned All-Baseline League onnors (2004, 2005), All-Inland Valley honors (2004, 2005), All-San Bernardino County (2004, 2005), and Los Angeles Times All-Region accolades (2004, 2005)... named to the Call-Hi Sports All-State team; named Baseline League Outstanding Senior; was a member of the 2004 Area Codes All-Stars and gained All-ClF Scholastic honors...was named a high school All-America selection and earned National Defensive Player of the Year accolades... batted .412 with five home runs and a .706 slugging percentage his senior year; set school records for games played, at-bats, home runs and doubles...established the school's single-season record for batting average (.436) in 2005.




2007 — Made 18 starts as a true freshman...his single-season totals of 110.2 innings and 98 strikeouts are the most in school history by a freshman; also registered a 4.47 ERA and 6-7 record...ended his season having thrown three consecutive complete games...through his final four starts, logged a 3-1 record and a 1.34 ERA; limited hitters to a .167 average in that span, totaling 28 strikeouts and issuing just six walks...limited Cal State Fullerton to two runs and seven hits in eight innings, striking out 12 hitters in a 2-1 elimination loss in the Super Regionals (June 10)...pitched his second of three consecutive complete games in a 3-1 win over Illinois-Chicago in the Long Beach Regional (June 2)...earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors after throwing his first collegiate complete game against Oregon State (May 27), limiting the Beavers to two runs (one earned) and three hits while striking out seven... registered a career-high 11 strikeouts in 8.0 innings against Arizona (April 29), allowing five runs (one earned) and six hits...recorded eight strikeouts one week later at Stanford (April 1), allowing just three runs and seven hits in 8.0 innings; earned the victory at Stanford to help give UCLA its first three-game sweep at Sunken Diamond since 1991...made his collegiate debut as the starting pitcher against Winthrop (Feb. 4).

Notes – An offensive sparkplug for the Bruins, Carrithers hit in either the leadoff or second spots in the batting order in 2007...a difficult out, led UCLA in batting average and on-base percentage while striking out just 26 times in 286 plate appearances...solid defender at second base, forms a potent double-play combination with Brandon Crawford.

2007 (summer) — Played in 30 games, all at second base for the Orleans Cardinals of the Cape Cod League...totaled a .198 batting average (22-for-111) with one home run, nine doubles, five stolen bases and team highs of 29 runs and 28 walks...his .371 on-base percentage was the second highest mark on the club...Orleans finished fourth in the Cape Cod League's Eastern Division with a 23-20-1 record.

2006 (summer) – Played in 37 games, recording a .268 batting average (30-for-112) for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox of the Cape Cod League...helped lead Yarmouth-Dennis to the 2006 Cape Cod League Championship...tallied four doubles, nine RBI, 20 walks, 20 runs scored and a team-best eight stolen bases...tallied a .394 on-base percentage, which ranked second-highest on the team.

2006 (at UC Santa Barbara) — Started 53 of 54 games in the infield for UC Santa Barbara...led the Gauchos with a .342 batting average (67-for-196); also led the squad in runs (60), walks (45) and on-base percentage (.465); tied for the team lead in doubles with 12...finished second on the squad in at-bats (196), hits (67), RBI (30), stolen bases (6) and assists (162)...his .465 on-base percentage ranked second in the Big West Conference to Evan Longoria's .467 mark...also earned All-Big West Conference second-team accolades at second base...led the Big West Conference in runs scored and walks.
