

# PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

The UCLA baseball program has sent 26 players to the minor leagues since June 2006. In the last four seasons, 11 Bruins have been selected in the first 10 rounds of the major league draft.

▼ **BRANDON CRAWFORD**  
UCLA's starting shortstop in each of his three seasons with the Bruins, Crawford was selected in the fourth round of the 2008 MLB Draft by the San Francisco Giants.

◀ **JOSH ROENICKE**  
Drafted in the 10th round of the 2006 MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds, Roenicke made his major league debut in September 2008 at Arizona.

▶ **TIM MURPHY**  
After starring on the mound his final two seasons, Murphy was selected in the third round of the 2008 MLB Draft by the Texas Rangers. He logged 207 strikeouts in 178.1 career innings at UCLA.

▲ **TYSON BRUMMETT**  
A two-year starter, Brummett was drafted in the seventh round by the Philadelphia Phillies in 2007.

▲ **BRANT RUSTICH**  
After overcoming a finger injury during his junior season, Rustich was selected in the second round of the 2007 MLB Draft by the New York Mets. He totaled 114 strikeouts in 124.0 career innings.

◀ **GAVIN BROOKS**  
A two-year starting pitcher before emerging as UCLA's closer, Brooks was selected in the ninth round of the 2009 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees. He registered 196 strikeouts in 218.0 career innings.

▶ **CASEY HAERTHER**  
A career .305 hitter for the Bruins, Haerther was selected in the fifth round of the 2009 MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim. He concluded his three-year UCLA career having registered 22 homers, 34 doubles and 109 RBI in 147 games.

▲ **HECTOR AMBRIZ**  
A fifth-round draft selection by the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2006, Ambriz starred on the mound and at the plate for UCLA from 2003-2006. A career .311 hitter, Ambriz recorded a 4.41 ERA with 249 strikeouts in 296.0 career innings. He was selected by the Cleveland Indians in the 2009 Rule V Draft.

▲ **JERMAINE CURTIS**  
After helping lead UCLA to NCAA Regionals in 2006, 2007 and 2008, Curtis was chosen by the St. Louis Cardinals in the fifth round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

▲ **DAVID HUFF**  
Chosen as the 39th overall selection in the 2006 MLB Draft, Huff moved through the Cleveland Indians' farm system before making his major league debut in 2009.

# BIG LEAGUE BRUINS



**▲ BEN FRANCISCO**

After being traded midseason to Philadelphia, he helped lead the Phillies to their second consecutive World Series in 2009.

**◀ JEFF CONINE**

Spent 17 seasons in the majors, helping lead the Florida Marlins to World Series titles in 1997 and 2003.

**▶ ADAM MELHUSE**

After a two-year career as an infielder at UCLA, he spent eight seasons as a major-league catcher.



**▲ GARRETT ATKINS**

After helping lead UCLA to the 2000 Super Regional at Louisiana State, he has batted .289 in seven major league seasons. He posted career highs in 2006 with 29 home runs and 120 RBI for the Colorado Rockies.



**▲ DAVE ROBERTS**

A four-year UCLA letterwinner (1991-94), he enjoyed a successful 10-year major league career. After starring in center field for the Los Angeles Dodgers for three seasons, he helped lead the Boston Red Sox to the 2004 World Series title.



**▲ TODD ZEILE**

Among the top hitters in UCLA history, he spent 16 seasons in the major leagues, totaling 253 home runs and 1,110 RBI in the big leagues.

◀ **CHASE UTLEY**

One of the game's top second basemen, he helped lead the Philadelphia Phillies to the World Series championship in 2008. In 2009, Utley guided the Phillies back to the World Series, clubbing five home runs in six games of the Fall Classic.



▲ **ERIC BYRNES**

An eighth-round draft selection by the Oakland A's in 1998, he has posted a .260 career batting average with 824 hits in 10 major league seasons.

▲ **SHANE MACK**

After batting .361 in three seasons at UCLA, Mack helped lead the Minnesota Twins to the 1991 World Series title.



▲ **TROY GLAUS**

Among the premier major league hitters of the 2000s, he helped carry the Anaheim Angels to their first ever World Series championship in 2002, earning World Series MVP honors that fall. In three seasons at UCLA (1995-97), he belted 62 home runs and drove in 180 RBI for the Bruins.




▲ **ERIC KARROS**

One of the Bruins top hitters from 1986-88, he established the Los Angeles Dodgers' career home run record with 284 career round-trippers in 12 seasons in Los Angeles.



▲ **DAVID HUFF**

In his first big league season in 2009, he posted an 11-8 record as a starting pitcher for the Cleveland Indians, becoming the first former UCLA pitcher to log 10 or more wins in one season since 1993 (Tim Lary).



▲ **TOREY LOVULLO**

A four-year UCLA letterwinner, he enjoyed an eight-year major league career before coming a successful minor league coach. In November 2009, he was named the manager of the Pawtucket Red Sox (Boston, triple-A affiliate).
