BRUINS TO THE BEACH

UCLA has earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament's Long Beach Regional. The Bruins will face No. 3 seed Pepperdine on Friday, June 1, at 3 p.m. at Long Beach State's Blair Field. UCLA's selection to the NCAA Tournament marks the Bruins' 14th regional appearance and the program's third postseason berth in the last four years.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

- UCLA posted a 30-26 regular-season record and finished third in the Pac-10 with a 14-10 mark.
- The Bruins have earned their second consecutive NCAA Regional appearance, including the team's third berth in the last four years and 14th overall selection (29-27 record in the NCAA Tournament).
- In 50 NCAA Regional contests, the Bruins have recorded a 29-21 record.
- UCLA has advanced past the NCAA Regionals on three occasions – 2000, 1997 and 1969.
- With starts of 8-1 and 12-2 in Pac-10 play, UCLA registered its best conference start since finishing 10-0 in the Southern California Conference in 1924.
- UCLA recorded its first-ever three-game series sweep at USC's Dedeaux Field (April 13-15).
- The Bruins swept Stanford at Sunken Diamond for the first time since 1991, breaking Stanford's streak of 71 consecutive three-game home series without having been swept (since 1997).

SEASON RECAP

UCLA opened the season with an 8-14 mark before winning 19 of its next 23 games. The turnaround began March 25 against Pacific, as UCLA used a 14-run eighth inning to overcome an 8-1 deficit and win the contest, 15-8. The following weekend in the team's Pac-10 opening series at Stanford, third baseman Jermaine Curtis returned to the lineup and became the spark UCLA needed. The Bruins won 12 of their first 14 games with Curtis in the lineup and eventually soared to a 28-19 mark with a 4-1 victory at Pepperdine on March 8. UCLA raced to a 12-2 Pac-10 record by early May, as the Bruins won their first five conference games and eight of their first nine Pac-10 contests.

BRUMMETT ON THE HILL

Senior right-handed pitcher Tyson Brummett has anchored the Bruins' pitching staff since opening night, when he set the tone with a 2-1 victory over Winthrop. The All-Pac-10 selection has tallied a 9-5 mark and a 3.60 ERA, recording 103 strikeouts in a team-high 125.0 innings pitched. Brummett has tossed seven complete games, tied for the third-highest total in the nation, and registered victories in six consecutive starts during the 2007 campaign (March 30 through May 4). His complete game total ranks second, tied with six other pitchers, on UCLA's single-season complete games list.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE

UCLA has 12 players who have competed in an NCAA Tournament contest. Seniors Kevin Brophy, Tyson Brummett, Will Penniall, Paul Schmidt and Tim Stewart, junior Brant Rustich and sophomores Jermaine Curtis, Brandon Crawford, Ryan Babineau, Cody Decker, Tim Murphy and Jason Novak have each played in the postseason. Last season's trip to the NCAA Regionals marked the first postseason appearance for eight of these 12 Bruins. One year ago, Decker hit 4-for-9 (.444) with one double and Brummett limited Missouri to two runs and five hits through 6.2 innings of a 2-1 loss.

RANK THIS

According to Boyd's World, a national strength of schedule ranking service, UCLA faces the third-most difficult schedule in the nation. UCLA's non-conference slate has been ranked the most challenging non-conference schedule in the country. The Bruins played 19 games against teams ranked in Baseball America's top-25 poll. Likewise, 50 of UCLA's 56 regular-season games were against teams either ranked in or receiving votes in Collegiate Baseball's preseason "Fabulous 40" poll.

THROW SOME K's

UCLA's three weekend starters each rank in the top 10 among the Pac-10 Conference's strikeout leaders. Right-hander Tyson Brummett leads the staff with 103 strikeouts in a team-leading 125.0 innings. Brummett leads all Pac-10 pitchers with the most strikeouts looking (45). Left-hander Tim Murphy has registered 88 strikeouts, including his team-best 14-strikeout performance at Arizona State (May 12). Southpaw Gavin Brooks has struck out 79 hitters in 93.2 innings.

EIGHT EARN ALL-PAC-10 HONORS

Senior Tyson Brummett, freshman Gabe Cohen and sophomores Brandon Crawford, Jermaine Curtis and Cody Decker have earned All-Pac-10 team recognition. Ryan Babineau, Alden Carrithers and Tim Murphy captured All-Pac-10 honorable mention accolades. The 2007 squad secured the most All-Pac-10 team selections at UCLA since 2000 (also five players). Cohen earned Pac-10 Co-Newcomer of the Year honors, becoming the first Bruin to gain that award since Wes Whisler (2002).

GETTING OFFENSIVE

The Bruins' offense has seen an increase in production over the last 34 games, a span in which UCLA has tallied a 22-12 record. UCLA has compiled a .314 batting average after opening the first 22 contests with hitting at a .263 clip.

MR. CONSISTENT

Junior Alden Carrithers has posted a fantastic first season at UCLA, hitting .351 having started all 56 regular-season games at second base. The transfer from UC Santa Barbara has totaled 74 hits, a team-best 49 runs, 13 doubles, two home runs and 30 RBI. The Portland, Ore., native has stolen seven bases on eight attempts, has led UCLA with 30 walks and has tallied a team-leading .447 on-base percentage. While at UC Santa Barbara, Carrithers earned All-Big West honors as a second baseman in 2006.

UPPER DECKER

Sophomore first baseman Cody Decker has flexed his muscles this season, totaling 13 home runs in 49 games. The Santa Monica, Calif., native has hit two home runs in two games (March 30, at Stanford; May 6, vs. California). He has become the first Bruin to eclipse the 10-home-run plateau since Ryan McCarthy totaled 15 home runs in 2004.

WELCOME BACK

Senior first baseman Tim Stewart returned to the Bruins' lineup Saturday, May 26, against Oregon State after having missed 20 games with an injured hand. In his two games against the Beavers last weekend, Stewart hit 4-for-7 with seven RBI. The Santa Ana, Calif., resident registered a season-high four RBI on Saturday, relieving an RBI-double in his first at-bat since April 15.

CLAYPOOL CAN DEAL

Freshman right-hander Garrett Claypool has tallied a 3.54 ERA in 24 appearances (seven starts). The West Hills, Calif., resident has recorded a 1.82 ERA as a starter, registering 20 strikeouts in 29.2 innings through seven starts. Claypool has posted a 3-0 record as a starting pitcher and earned the victory by pitching five scoreless innings at Pepperdine on Tuesday, May 8.

NIGHT OWLS

Sophomores Jermaine Curtis and Brandon Crawford and senior Will Penniall have played well under the lights this season. Penniall has posted a .404 average at night, Curtis is hitting .370 under the lights and Crawford has tallied a .363 mark in the evening. Freshman Gabe Cohen has hit a team-leading six home runs in the evening, and Crawford leads all Bruins with 21 RBI under the lights. Freshman Garrett Claypool has been most effective at night, limiting opponents to a .198 average while totaling a 2.70 ERA in 30.0 innings.

BEN'S BIG DAY

Former Bruin Ben Francisco made his major league debut on Tuesday, May 1, with the Cleveland Indians. Francisco's major-league stay was short lived, as the former Bruin was optioned to Buffalo (AAA) two days later. Currently, eight former UCLA players are on major league rosters - Garrett Atkins (Colorado), Eric Byrnes (Arizona), Jeff Conine (Cincinnati), Troy Glaus (Toronto), Casey Janssen (Toronto), Adam Melhuse (Oakland), Dave Roberts (San Francisco) and Chase Utley (Philadelphia).

INJURY REPORT

Sophomore Blair Dunlap and freshman Jeff Rapoport are not on the postseason roster due to shoulder injuries.

PAC-10 COACHES PICK UCLA FOURTH

UCLA was selected fourth in the Pac-10 Conference's preseason coaches poll. The Bruins were picked to finish behind Arizona State, Oregon State, and Stanford, respectively. Last season, UCLA was selected eighth in the preseason poll and finished third in the Pac-10 with a 13-10 conference mark (33-25 overall).

AN APRIL TO REMEMBER

UCLA finished 12-4 in April, the most victories in one month since the Bruins collected 14 wins in February 1997. UCLA last won 12 or more games in April in 1982, when the Bruins finished the month with a 13-8 record. Last month, Ryan Babineau led the Bruins offense with a .375 average and four home runs. Cody Decker belted six home runs and totaled 24 RBI in 16 games.

BEST PAC-10 STARTS

The Bruins jumped out to one of their best starts in conference play when they won 10 of their first 11 Pac-10 games. UCLA's best-ever conference start (and finish) took place in 1924, when the Bruins finished their conference slate with a 10-0 mark. After starting 5-0 in the Pac-10 over three weeks ago, UCLA was off to its best conference start since 1977, when the Bruins began their Pac-8 schedule with a 5-0 mark before ending the season 10-8 in the conference.

RECORD BREAKERS

The Bruins made history on Sunday, March 25 against Pacific. Trailing 8-1 in the eighth, UCLA posted a school-record 14-run inning to defeat the Tigers, 15-8. Sophomore Cody Decker initiated the Bruins' heroics with a grand slam and finished with five RBI. UCLA had previously scored 13 runs in one inning versus Winthrop on Feb. 4, 2007 and against Arizona State on Feb. 28, 1997. The Bruins' 14-run inning not only lifted UCLA to victory, but propelled the team to an 18-4 span over the next 22 games.

MAKING MORE HISTORY

One weekend after the series win against Pacific, UCLA became the first team to sweep Stanford at Sunken Diamond in a three-game regular-season series since Arizona State accomplished the feat in 1997. Stanford had not been swept at home in its previous 71 home series. UCLA had not swept the Cardinal on the road since 1991 and had not swept a series against Stanford since 1997.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD

UCLA plays its best ball when it wins the first inning. The Bruins have posted a 15-6 record when they score in the first inning and have tallied a 17-8 mark when they score first in the game. UCLA has finished 11-10 when its opponent scores in the first inning. The Bruins are 13-18 when their opponents score first in the game. When leading after eight innings, UCLA has recorded a 28-1 record and when ahead after six innings, the Bruins have registered a 21-2 mark.

YOU BETTER WATCH HIM

Sophomore Brandon Crawford has been selected to the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Watch List and the Dick Howser Trophy Watch List. In addition, Crawford has been tabbed on the Brooks Wallace Player of the Year Award "Revised" Watch List. Crawford's late game heroics have included a game-winning grand slam in the eighth inning against East Carolina (Feb. 18) and a two-RBI single on an 0-2 count with two outs in the ninth at USC (April 14).

PRESEASON PROPS

Baseball America selected UCLA as its preseason pick to win the Pac-10 title. B.A. projected UCLA to join Oregon State, Arizona State and Stanford in the NCAA Tournament. Shortstop Brandon Crawford was selected to its preseason All-Pac-10 Team, and right-handed pitcher Charles Brewer was listed as the Pac-10's fifth-best newcomer. The magazine projected Brant Rustich as the Pac-10's ninth-best prospect (2007). In its ranking of "best tools" in the Pac-10, Baseball America named Crawford as the "best athlete," "best defensive shortstop" and infielder with the "best arm." Ryan Babineau was listed as the catcher with the "best arm," Jermaine Curtis as "best defensive third baseman," right-hander Tyson Brummett with the "best changeup" and outfielder Jeff Rapoport as the "fastest runner."

CRAWFO-RED, WHITE AND BLUE

Sophomore Brandon Crawford spent his summer playing for the U.S. National Team and helped lead Team USA to the FISU (International University Sports Federation) World Championship after the club posted a 28-2-1 overall mark. Crawford played in 23 games, starting 10, and hit .257 (9-for-35). He collected two doubles, six RBI, seven runs, three walks and one stolen base.

EXTRA INNINGS

UCLA has not played any extra-inning games this season. In 2006, the Bruins won two of three extra-inning contests. The Bruins defeated Washington, 3-2, in 11 innings and topped Arizona State, 11-10, in 10 innings. Washington State edged UCLA, 4-3 in 10 frames. Under head coach John Savage, the Bruins have compiled a 4-3 record in extra-inning games.

JANSSEN BOLSTERS JAYS' BULLPEN

Former UCLA right-hander Casey Janssen has performed very well in the Toronto Blue Jays' bullpen. In 20 relief outings, Janssen has limited opponents to three runs and has allowed 24 hits while striking out 10 (through Monday, May 28). He has tallied a 1.09 ERA and a 2-0 record in 24.2 innings pitched. The former Bruin earned his first major league save on April 8, striking out one without allowing a hit in 2.0 scoreless innings, and tallied his first major league win on May 14.

ON THE FARM

Five former Bruins were rated as the top prospects in their respective MLB organizations. Dave Huff, last season's ace, has been ranked the No. 10 prospect in Cleveland's organization. Hector Ambriz, a three-year letterwinner at UCLA (2003, 2005-06), has been tabbed the No. 22 prospect in Arizona's farm system. Wes Whisler, a three-year letterwinner at UCLA (2002-04), is rated the No. 29 prospect in the Chicago White Sox organization. Ben Francisco (2001-02) and Paul Oseguera (2005-06) have each earned honorable mention prospect accolades (Cleveland and San Francisco, respectively).

John Savage – Head Coach

In just his third season as UCLA's head baseball coach, John Savage has guided the Bruins to back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances for the first time since 1999 and 2000 and has UCLA looking to advance to its first Super Regional since 2000. Savage has quickly turned the UCLA baseball program into a national power by attracting two top-13 recruiting classes, as ranked by Baseball America, and by playing the most competitive schedules in the nation.

Savage became UCLA's eighth head baseball coach in July 2004 after serving as the head coach at UC Irvine from 2001-2004 and the pitching coach under Mike Gillespie at USC from 1996-2000. The Reno, Nev., native began his college coaching tenure as an assistant coach at the University of Nevada from 1992-96. Savage began his coaching career as the pitching coach for Reno High School during the 1988-89 school year. The 2007 Long Beach Regional marks Savage's third NCAA Regional appearance as a head coach and eighth NCAA Tournament berth overall (two at UCLA, one at UC Irvine, four at USC, one at Nevada). Savage helped USC win the 1998 College World Series and was instrumental in the guidance of current major leaguers Barry Zito, Mark Prior and Anthony Reyes.

This season, Savage helped UCLA overcome an 8-14 start and record a 30-26 overall record, a 14-10 Pac-10 mark and a third-place finish in the competitive Pac-10 Conference. The Bruins won 19 of 23 games midway through the season, marking UCLA's most successful such stretch since 1997, the last season UCLA advanced to the College World Series. Savage guided UCLA to three-game series sweeps at Stanford and USC in the same season for the first time in program history. The Bruins had never before swept USC at Dedeaux Field in a three-game series and had last swept Stanford at Sunken Diamond in 1991 – the Cardinal had not been swept in each of their previous 71 three-game home series (streak dated back to 1997).

UCLA played 29 games against 11 teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament. One year after sweeping N.C. State on the road, Savage and the Bruins played at Miami and Ole Miss and welcomed Conference-USA heavyweight East Carolina to Los Angeles in the season's first five weeks. The Bruins played their first 18 games against seven opponents that were ranked in the top-25 throughout the season.

Savage led UCLA to five Pac-10 series victories, as the Bruins won two of three games against Washington, Arizona and California in addition to road sweeps of Stanford and USC. UCLA faced the third-most difficult schedule in the nation and the No. 1 most challenging non-conference slate, according to Boyd's World, a national strength-of-schedule ranking service. In 2006, Boyd's World rated UCLA's schedule as the No. 1 most challenging schedule in the nation.

Serving as UCLA's pitching coach, Savage's tutelage proved instrumental in the development of All-Pac-10 right-hander Tyson Brummett and the emergence of left-handers Gavin Brooks and Tim Murphy. Under Savage's guidance, Brummett became just the eighth pitcher in school history to have pitched seven or more complete games in one season.

The right-hander from Salem, Utah, won each of his first five Pac-10 starts and recorded wins in six consecutive starts midway through the season.

After having seen limited action due to injury as a pitcher his senior year of high school, Brooks succeeded as the Bruins' No. 3 weekend starter as a freshman. Savage's work with Brooks was no more evident than in the final two weekends of the season. After UCLA dropped the first two games at Washington State and at home versus Oregon State, Brooks took the hill in each series finale and dominated, allowing the Bruins to salvage each of their final two regular-season series. Murphy emerged as a legitimate weekend starter six weeks into the Bruins' season when he made his first collegiate start at Ole Miss. The sophomore left-hander registered 12.2 strikeouts per nine innings in just his first season as a collegiate pitcher and recorded a team-best 14 strikeouts in 8.0 innings before a national-television audience at then-No. 10 Arizona State.

In 2006, Savage led UCLA to a 15-12 mark against 10 NCAA Tournament teams, including Arizona State, Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Miami, Mississippi, N.C. State, 2006 NCAA Champion Oregon State, Pepperdine, Stanford and UC Irvine. The Bruins were the only Pac-10 school to win each home series against Pac-10 opponents, earning series victories over Washington State, Arizona State, USC and Stanford.

Less than one week after the 2006 season ended, Savage's squad tied a program record as 12 Bruins were selected in the 2006 MLB Draft. UCLA's 12 draftees last June marked the highest total for any college baseball team in the nation.

In July 2006, Baseball America hailed UCLA's head coach as one of "10 People to Watch in the Future". The magazine listed Savage along with other distinguished baseball personnel such as New York Mets general manager Omar Minaya, Mets all-star third baseman David Wright and Los Angeles Dodgers assistant general manager Kim Ng.
