UCLA BASEBALL – 2011 SEASON NOTES

Bruins win Pac-10 Conference title, host Regional for second consecutive season

UCLA'S SEASON AT A GLANCE

- UCLA earned its first outright Pac-10 Conference title since 1986 (three-way tie for first place in 2000).
- The Bruins hosted NCAA Regional action at Jackie Robinson Stadium for the second consecutive year.
- UCLA finished the season with a 35-24 record and an 18-9 mark in Pac-10 play.
- The Bruins posted a second-place finish at the NCAA Los Angeles Regional, getting eliminated by UC Irvine.
- UCLA's pitching staff led the Pac-10 with a 2.44 ERA, the third-lowest mark among NCAA Division I teams.
- Trevor Bauer led the nation with 203 strikeouts and 10 complete games, going 13-2 with a 1.25 ERA.
- UCLA's Gerrit Cole (Pittsburgh) and Trevor Bauer (Arizona) were selected No. 1 and No. 3 in the MLB Draft.

TOP MARKS

- Trevor Bauer set the Pac-10 single-season strikeouts record (203, ahead of Mark Prior's 202 in 2001).
- UCLA's 572 strikeouts ranks second-highest in school history, behind UCLA's 700 strikeouts in 2010.
- The Bruins posted a 2.44 ERA, the lowest mark in program history since 1969 (2.40).
- Trevor Bauer became the first player in UCLA baseball history to win the Golden Spikes Award.
- UCLA ranked second in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (9.8) and hits allowed per nine innings (6.61).

ELITE PITCHING

UCLA's pitching staff posted the nation's third-lowest ERA (2.44), behind College World Series participants Virginia (2.24) and Texas (2.35). For the second consecutive season, UCLA led the Pac-10 in strikeouts (572). The Bruins recorded 15 complete games (10 by Trevor Bauer), the highest total by a Pac-10 team since Oregon State hurled 17 complete games in 2001. UCLA's pitchers recorded 10 or more strikeouts in 30 of 59 games and had at least 15 strikeouts in six ballgames.

POSTSEASON PLAY

Backed by their first outright conference title since 1986, UCLA hosted the NCAA Los Angeles Regional at Jackie Robinson Stadium for the second consecutive year. Never before had UCLA hosted postseason play in back-to-back seasons. The Bruins went 2-2 at the NCAA Regional, falling to UC Irvine, 4-3, in the Regional's final game the night of Sunday, June 5. UCLA secured its 17th NCAA Regional berth, advancing to the postseason for the fifth time in head coach John Savage's seven seasons.

CONFERENCE CROWN

With the Pac-10 title on the line during the season's final regular-season weekend, UCLA won the first two of three games at Arizona State (May 27-29), and Oregon State was swept in a three-game series at Oregon. That combination helped UCLA capture its first outright Pac-10 Conference championship since 1986. The Bruins were Pac-10 Co-Champions in 2000 with Stanford and Arizona State. Since the Pac-8's inception in 1967, UCLA has secured a share of the conference crown six times (1969, 1976, 1979, 1986, 2000, 2011).

SEASON TO REMEMBER

Trevor Bauer became the first UCLA player to ever win the Golden Spikes Award. Not only did he lead the nation in strikeouts (203) and complete games (10), but he also went 13-2 with a 1.25 ERA in 16 starts. Bauer had at least 10 strikeouts in 14 of his 16 starts and finished the season having logged nine consecutive complete games. In addition to winning the Golden Spikes Award, Bauer was one of three finalists for the Dick Howser Trophy and earned Player of the Year honors from *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*.

FANTASTIC FRESHMAN

Serving as UCLA's No. 3 starting pitcher behind eventual first-round draft selections Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer, freshman right-hander Adam Plutko earned Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America*, *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA. He finished second in the Pac-10 with a 2.01 ERA, posting a 7-4 record with 92 strikeouts and 24 walks in 107.2 innings. Plutko was saddled with five no-decisions, four of which came in ballgames during which the Bruins led when he exited after the sixth inning.

TOP DRAFT SELECTIONS

Junior right-handers Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer were selected first and third, respectively, in the first round of the 2011 MLB Draft. Cole, chosen No. 1 by Pittsburgh, and Bauer, taken No. 3 by Arizona, became the first teammates from one college program to be selected within the first three picks since 1978, when Arizona State's Bob Horner and Hubie Brooks were taken first and third, respectively. Overall, UCLA had nine players selected in the 2011 MLB Draft. In seven seasons as UCLA's head coach, John Savage has had 51 draft picks.

LEADING HITTERS

UCLA's offense was led by junior Dean Espy and sophomores Beau Amaral, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis in 2011. Espy posted a team-best .320 batting average, belting three homers and finishing second on the team with 40 RBI. Amaral captured All-Pac-10 Team honors, batting .299 with two homers, three triples and a team-best 16 doubles. Keefer batted .303 and led the team with a .408 on-base percentage. Regis collected team-highs with six home runs and 45 RBI, batting .284 with two triples and 10 doubles.

POINT BLANK

UCLA tied the school record for shutouts in one season with 10. The Bruins' 1969 ballclub also had 10 shutouts en route to earning the program's first-ever appearance to the College World Series after finishing first in the Pac-8 Conference. UCLA tallied nine shutouts in 1978, eight in 1967 and five in 2008, 1992 and 1977. The Bruins opened their 2011 campaign with six shutouts in 18 games. Trevor Bauer hurled three complete game shutouts, while Gerrit Cole and Adam Plutko each had one.

ALL-CONFERENCE SELECTIONS

Junior Trevor Bauer, sophomore Beau Amaral and freshman Adam Plutko were each selected to the 2011 All-Pac-10 Team. In addition, juniors Mitchell Beacom, Gerrit Cole and Steve Rodriguez, sophomore Cody Keefer and freshman Nick Vander Tuig each secured honorable mention all-conference acclaim. Bauer earned All-Pac-10 Team honors for the third time in his career, while Amaral and Plutko were selected for the first time. Bauer was the only honoree on this season's All-Pac-10 Team to have been selected at least three years.

POWER OF THE PAC

In its final season as the Pac-10 (set to change to Pac-12 in July 2011), the conference again established itself as one of the most competitive and deep leagues in college baseball. Six of the conference's 10 teams advanced to NCAA postseason play, with four teams moving to the NCAA Super Regional stage and California representing the Pac-10 at the College World Series. In the final *Baseball America* top-25 poll, five teams were ranked — Arizona State (9), Oregon State (10), California (11), Stanford (13) and UCLA (22). Additionally, Arizona was tabbed No. 25 by ESPN/USA Today, *Collegiate Baseball* and the NCBWA.

NEWS AND NOTES

UCLA limited the opposition to two runs or fewer in 33 games (28-5 record) and to one run or less in 20 games (20-0 record) ... the Bruins' pitching staff led the Pac-10 Conference in ERA (2.44), opponent batting average (.205), strikeouts (572) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.75) ... UCLA's pitchers limited the opposition to six hits or fewer in 32 of 59 games this season ... UCLA had a season-high 21 strikeouts against Nebraska (March 5) ... the Bruins logged 15 strikeouts or more on the mound six times, posting a 4-2 record in those contests.

Brandon Crawford – San Francisco Giants (Shortstop)

- Belted a grand slam for his first hit in his major league debut at Milwaukee on Friday, May 27, 2011
- Posted a batting average over .300 in each of three seasons at UCLA (2006-08)
- Helped lead the Bruins to the NCAA Tournament in each of three seasons with the program

Ben Francisco – Philadelphia Phillies (Outfielder)

- Opened the 2011 season as one of Philadelphia's starting outfielders
- Helped lead Philadelphia to its second consecutive National League pennant in October 2009
- Selected in the fifth round of the 2002 MLB Draft by the Cleveland Indians

Casey Janssen – Toronto Blue Jays (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Has been a major contributor in Toronto's bullpen since returning from an injury in 2009
- Totaled a 4.34 ERA and 22-15 record in 54 games (43 starts) through 265.1 innings in four years at UCLA
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2004 MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays

Chase Utley – Philadelphia Phillies (Second Baseman)

- Utley led the Philadelphia Phillies to the 2008 World Series and 2009 National League Championship
- Has posted a career .295 batting average and 161 home runs through his first nine major league seasons
- Selected 15th overall in the first round of the 2000 MLB Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies

PAST DRAFT SELECTIONS

John Savage has seen 51 MLB draft selections at UCLA in his seven seasons as head coach. Three of Savage's pitchers have been promoted to the majors (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke) and most recently, three-year UCLA shortstop Brandon Crawford was promoted to San Francisco in May 2011. Of those 51 draft picks, 16 have been selected in the first 10 rounds. Over the past two seasons, UCLA had 20 draft selections, including first-rounders Gerrit Cole (2011) and Trevor Bauer (2011) and second-rounder Rob Rasmussen (2010).

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 34-man roster featured two seniors, nine juniors, 11 sophomores and 12 freshmen. The most veteran Bruins on the 2011 squad were Jordan Haver (2007-2011) and Chris Giovinazzo, Mitchell Beacom and Marc Navarro (all on the team from 2008-2011). Three players hailed from a state other than California – Chase Brewer (Paradise Valley) and Dean Espy (Mesa) call Arizona home, and Pat Gallagher (Reno) resides in Nevada.

CHASING HISTORY

UCLA was no-hit by Oregon State's Josh Osich on April 30, the first no-hitter against UCLA (and in a Pac-10 game) since May 8, 1994, when Stanford's Jason Middlebrook no-hit UCLA. This season, two Bruin starters have had a no-hitter intact through six innings. Gerrit Cole had a perfect game broken with two outs in the seventh at Nebraska (March 4) and with one out in the seventh against Georgia (March 11). Trevor Bauer had a perfect game with one out in the seventh at USC (March 26) and allowed his first hit with one out in the eighth.

SIX SEASON COMPOSITE

In conference games over the last six seasons (2006-11), UCLA ranks second in wins (91) and winning percentage (.599). Overall, the Bruins are fourth in total wins (212) and winning percentage (.586).
