REGULAR SEASON REVIEW

- UCLA established a new school record for most regular-season victories, going 43-13.
- The NCAA Los Angeles Regional marks the second time UCLA has hosted a Regional (first time since 1986).
- The Bruins closed the season by winning 13 of their final 16 contests (including 11 of 12 Pac-10 games).
- UCLA's recent 10-game Pac-10 win streak was the longest such conference streak since 1924.
- The Bruins have advanced to an NCAA Regional in four of the past five years (2006-08, 2010).
- UCLA has not been 30 or more games over .500 since 1969 (going 42-10-1 prior to College World Series).
- This marks the first season in Pac-10 history (since 1979) that UCLA has won all its Pac-10 road series.
- Since opening the season with a program-record 22-game win streak, UCLA has gone 19-11.
- UCLA finished third in the Pac-10 each of the last four years before this spring's second-place finish.

AT A GLANCE

UCLA will make its 16th appearance playing in the NCAA Tournament, hosting a NCAA Regional for the first time since 1986 (second Regional host in school history). The Bruins went 1-1 in two midweek meetings against UC Irvine this season, last facing the Anteaters in the NCAA Tournament in 2006 (W, 3-2 in first game of NCAA Malibu Regional). UCLA lost both games to LSU in the 2000 NCAA Super Regional in Baton Rouge, La., having gone 0-3 in three overall meetings with the Tigers. The Bruins have never played Kent State in baseball.

LATE-SEASON PUSH

The Bruins closed their Pac-10 schedule winning 11 of their final 12 conference contests since getting swept at home by first-place Arizona State (April 30-May 2). UCLA reeled off 10 consecutive Pac-10 wins after being swept, including road sweeps of Washington (May 7-9) and California (May 21-23) in addition to winning each of three home games against crosstown rival USC (May 14-16). The Bruins had not won 10 consecutive conference games since posting a perfect 10-0 record in 1924, playing in the Southern California Conference.

PROMINENT PITCHING

UCLA ranks first in the Pac-10 in ERA (3.02), opponent batting average (.219) and strikeouts (578). The Bruins have averaged 10.2 strikeouts per nine innings Second in the conference with 43 wins (to Arizona State's 47). UCLA has been bolstered by the starting pitching of Gerrit Cole (Friday), Trevor Bauer (Saturday), Rob Rasmussen (Sunday) and Garett Claypool (Tuesday). Cole and Bauer are tied for the Pac-10 lead in strikeouts, with 124 each, while Rasmussen is tied with Oregon's Tyler Anderson (at 101) for fourth place on the list.

STAYING IN SOCIAL

Including this weekend, the Bruins will have played in southern California in each of their last four NCAA Regionals. UCLA went 1-2 at Pepperdine in 2006, the Bruins' second year under head coach John Savage. The following seasons, the Bruins swept the 2007 Regional at Long Beach State before losing consecutive games at Cal State Fullerton in that season's Super Regional. In 2009, UCLA won its first two games at the NCAA Regional at Cal State Fullerton before falling to the Titans on consecutive nights (Regional Final).

ROAD WARRIORS

UCLA has gone 19-4 away from home this season (15-4 road, 4-0 neutral). Road losses have come at No. 17 Oregon State (April 9), No. 17 Arizona (April 25), UC Irvine (May 11) and No. 8 Cal State Fullerton (May 25). Freshman outfielder Beau Amaral has led UCLA in road games with a .361 batting average and .477 on-base percentage (minimum 25 at-bats). Senior right-hander Garett Claypool has gone 5-2 with a 1.35 ERA in seven road games, totaling 36 strikeouts and 10 walks in 40.0 innings.

TALENTED DUO

Sophomore right-handers Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer have packed a formidable 1-2 punch in UCLA's starting rotation. Both players have been named to the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Award's revised watch list, while Bauer has been selected as one of 30 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award. Cole and Bauer lead the Pac-10 in strikeouts (124), entering NCAA Regional action. This marks the first season in school history in which three UCLA pitchers have collected 100 or more strikeouts (Cole, Bauer and Rob Rasmussen).

SENIOR STATESMEN

Seniors Blair Dunlap and Justin Uribe have been two of UCLA's key offensive weapons all season. Uribe ranks third on the team with a .343 batting average and has posted a .423 on-base percentage. Dunlap has batted at a .333 clip, fifth-best on the ballclub, pushing his career batting average to a .299 mark. Dunlap ranks second on the team with 66 hits and 104 total bases. With his team-leading 19th double on Sunday, May 31, Dunlap has moved into a three-way tie for sixth place on UCLA's career doubles list (47).

SUPER SOUTHPAW

Junior Rob Rasmussen has gone 9-2 with a 2.89 ERA, serving as the Bruins' third pitcher in the weekend rotation. Honored as Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week on May 24, Rasmussen has posted a team-best 6-2 record in Pac-10 play, logging a 3.04 ERA and .230 opponent batting average in nine conference starts. Currently tied for fourth place in the Pac-10 with 101 strikeouts, Rasmussen has surrendered just 69 hits in 84.0 innings (.220 opponent batting average). He earned the victory last Sunday in UCLA's 11-1 win over Washington State.

CENTER STAGE

Freshman Beau Amaral has batted .343, second-highest on the team, in 52 games this spring (45 starts, all in center field). Amaral had a 15-game hit streak snapped May 16 in the Bruins' series finale against USC. The former standout at Huntington Beach High School batted .333 in all 27 Pac-10 contests. Since UCLA opened its season with 22 consecutive victories, Amaral has batted at a .348 clip (34-game span). The freshman All-America candidate has tallied six doubles, three homers, 22 RBI and 32 runs.

SHOW STOPPER

Sophomore right-hander Dan Klein leads UCLA with nine saves, third among Pac-10 pitchers, and has posted a 5-0 record and 2.13 ERA in a team-leading 33 appearances (third-most in the Pac-10). Klein was named to the Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List in mid-April by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association (NCBWA). A product of Servite High School (Anaheim), Klein has struck out 48 batters and walked just eight in 42.1 innings. Klein's nine saves are tied for third-most on UCLA's single-season saves list.

STRONG STAFF

UCLA's 2010 pitching staff has had four pitchers record eight or more victories for the first time since 1967 (Rob Kester and Guy Hansen with 10, Bob Boyer 9, Bob Wiswell 8). Sophomores Trevor Bauer and Gerrit Cole and junior Rob Rasmussen have each collected nine wins, while senior Garrett Claypool has notched eight victories. The Bruins lead the Pac-10 with 578 strikeouts, the most ever in a single season by any UCLA ballclub (third Bruins' staff to reach the 500-strikeout plateau). Last season, the Bruins finished their 56-game schedule with 509 strikeouts, while UCLA's 2000 team logged 531 strikeouts in 64 games.

RELIABLE IN RELIEF

Among UCLA's greatest assets has been the team's bullpen. The relief corps has gone 9-3 with a 3.38 ERA, limiting the opposition to a .229 batting average in 160.1 innings. Right-handers Dan Klein and Erik Goeddel and left-hander Matt Grace have been the most utilized pitchers in relief. Goeddel has made 32 appearances, compiling a 2-0 record and 3.48 ERA with 53 strikeouts, 20 walks and one save in 44.0 innings. Grace has made 30 appearances, going 0-1 with a 3.24 ERA, 20 strikeouts and seven walks in 25.0 innings.

RAMMING SPEED

Sophomore Tyler Rahmatulla has started at second base in 55 of the Bruins' 56 games this season. The former standout at Mater Dei High School has batted .337 with team-highs of 70 hits, 47 runs and 35 walks. Rahmatulla ranks second on the the ballclub with 16 doubles and 12 stolen bases. He is currently tied with two other players (including teammate Cody Keefer) for fifth place among Pac-10 hitters with 32 walks. Rahmatulla has started in the No. 3 slot in UCLA's batting lineup in 50 of his 51 starts.

WORTH AN ESPY

Sophomore Dean Espy enters the NCAA Tournament leading UCLA with a .359 batting average (51-for-142). Espy has belted seven homers and leads the Bruins with 45 RBI and a .599 slugging percentage. A versatile player (first and third base), Espy transferred to UCLA last summer after having played as a freshman at South Mountain Community College. The native of Mesa, Ariz., led all Bruins in the Pac-10 play with a .388 batting average in 23 conference contests, going 26-for-67 with three homers and 21 RBI.

AGAINST THE BEST

UCLA has gone 9-8 against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* top-25 poll (team ranked in poll on day of game). UCLA defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on March 14 before winning two of three games against No. 19 Stanford, No. 17 Oregon State, No. 17 Arizona. and No. 22 Washington State. The Bruins were swept in three games against No. 3 Arizona State the weekend of April 30-May 2 and dropped a 5-2 decision at No. 8 Cal State Fullerton on May 25 in their final midweek contest of the season.

SUPER SENIOR

Among the most vital members of UCLA's pitching staff this season, senior right-hander has gone 8-3 with a 2.05 ERA in 20 appearances (12 starts), serving as both the Bruins' No. 4 starting pitcher (Tuesdays) and as a go-to right-handed reliever. Claypool, who has totaled 72 strikeouts in 79.0 innings, has posted a 7-3 record with a 2.27 ERA in 67.1 innings through his 12 starts (55 strikeouts, 17 walks, .177 average). In eight relief appearances, he has gone 1-0 with a 0.77 ERA, notching 17 strikeouts and two walks in 11.2 innings.

FRESHMEN QUARTET

UCLA's batting lineup was rejuvenated in 2010 by the presence of four talented freshman left-handed hitters, three of which play in the outfield. Beau Amaral (.343), Jeff Gelalich (.326), Cody Keefer (.318) and Cody Regis (.303) have posted a combined .323 (164-for-208) this spring. Amaral has started 45 games as the Bruins' center fielder, while Keefer has started 43 contests in left field. Regis has made 40 starts at third base and one at second, while Gelalich has played in 29 games, making 15 starts (outfield and designated hitter).

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT

UCLA has won four games in "walk-off" fashion, going 5-11 when tied or trailing after eight innings (3-0 when tied after eight). The Bruins' most thrilling win came in a 2-1 decision over USC (May 16). Trailing 1-0 with nobody on base and two outs, Brett Krill singled before Cody Keefer belted a two-run walk-off homer, helping the Bruins sweep USC. Most recently, UCLA scored three runs with two outs on back-to-back O-and-2 counts in a series opener at California (May 21) and held on in the bottom of the ninth for an 8-7 Pac-10 victory. NOTES ON A STREAK

UCLA opened the season by winning its first 22 games, the Bruins' best-ever start to any baseball season in the program's 91-year history. Prior to going 22-0 in 2010, UCLA's best starts on record took place in 1978 (8-0) and in 1997 (7-0). The Bruins won their first 22 games, outscoring their opponents by a combined 189-59 margin. UCLA posted a .356 batting average during its record streak while the pitching staff logged a 2.22 ERA and 273 strikeouts through 199.0 innings (12.4 strikeouts per nine innings).

- UCLA had 10 players during its win streak post batting averages above .300 (minimum 40 at-bats)
- The starting rotation went 17-0, compiling a 2.20 ERA with 194 strikeouts and 52 walks.
- Tyler Rahmatulla led UCLA's offense with a .451 batting average (37-for-82), 37 hits and 24 runs.
- Gerrit Cole went 6-0 with a 2.49 ERA and 61 strikeouts through 43.1 innings in seven starts.
- Dan Klein tossed 17.2 scoreless innings as the closer, totaling five saves while earning two victories.
- UCLA opened 22-0 and Arizona State started 24-0 – both schools lost their first game on Friday, April 2.

NOT FAR BEHIND

During the Bruins' 22-0 start, UCLA trailed in eight ballgames and was tied (without trailing) in two games. The Bruins twice overcame a deficit of three runs, most recently by scoring two runs in the fourth inning and two in the eighth against Cal Poly on March 26, to secure their 19th consecutive win. The Bruins won two games in walk-off fashion, ironically, in back-to-back games (vs. Nebraska, March 6; vs. UC Riverside, March 9).

FLASHBACK TO 1986

UCLA last hosted an NCAA Regional, featuring Loyola Marymount, Hawai'i and UC Santa Barbara, in 1986. That year's field featured nine eventual major leaguers. UCLA's nine eventual major leaguers included Jeff Conine, Bill Haselman, Randy Hennis, Eric Karros, Torey Lovullo, Mike Magnante, Alex Sanchez, Tony Scruggs and Todd Zeile. LMU's three eventual major leaguers included Billy Beane, Tim Layana and Chris Donnels.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 35-man roster features four seniors, six juniors, 11 sophomores and 14 freshmen. Only two of the team's players hail from a state other than California – Chase Brewer and Dean Espy both call Arizona home. The Bruins have 26 players from southern California and eight players from northern/central California.

FIVE-YEAR COMPOSITE

In conference games over the last five seasons (2006-10), UCLA ranks second in both wins (73) and winning percentage (.584). Overall, the Bruins rank fourth in winning percentage (.581) and total wins (169). UCLA finished second in the Pac-10 in 2010, after having posted a third-place finish the previous four years. NEWS AND NOTES

◀ UCLA's 2010 roster features three players with immediate connections in the major leagues. Niko Gallego (son of Mike) and Beau Amaral (son of Rich) both have fathers who played in the major leagues after having excelled at UCLA. Mike Gallego played 13 seasons in the majors (1985-1997), spending the 1985 through 1991 campaigns with the Oakland A's. Rich Amaral played in the big leagues for 10 seasons, spending his first eight with the Seattle Mariners. Dean Espy's father, Duane, played eight seasons in the minors before serving as both a minor league head coach and major league hitting coach (2000-02 San Diego, 2003-06 Colorado).

◀ UCLA defeated USC, 6-1, before 14,588 fans at Dodger Stadium in a non-conference game on Sunday, Feb. 28. Playing in the first-ever "Dodgertown Classic", the Bruins and Trojans played under sunny skies at Dodger Stadium on the final day of the second weekend of the 2010 college baseball season. Vanderbilt defeated Oklahoma State, 7-6, in the first of two games at Dodger Stadium that day. That marked the largest crowd to watch a UCLA baseball game since the 1997 College World Series.

◀ The Bruins' 2010 schedule features 56 games against a total of 25 teams. In all, UCLA has played games against teams from nine conferences. After the Pac-10, the Bruins have played more games against Big West opposition than any other conference. UCLA's key non-conference victories have included a 9-2 win at home against Vanderbilt on Friday, Feb. 26. The Bruins handed the Commodores (then 4-0) their first loss in their first 15 games. UCLA also defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on Sunday, March 14 at the Whataburger College Classic. The Bruins snapped the Sooners' 10-game win streak and gave them their second loss in 17 games.

HEADED TO UCLA IN 2010-11

Sixth-year head coach John Savage announced the signing of eight high school seniors to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period in November 2009. These eight players will enroll at UCLA for the fall quarter in Sept. 2010 in time for the 2011 baseball season.

John Savage - Head Coach

In his sixth season as UCLA's head baseball coach, John Savage helped lead the Bruins to their most successful regular season in 2010, establishing the school's regular-season win record (43) while landing the program's first-ever national seed (No. 6-seed) in the NCAA Tournament. Savage's guidance in 2010 has allowed the Bruins to host an NCAA Regional for the first time since 1986. Additionally, UCLA has finished in second place in the Pac-10 Conference, the Bruins' highest finish since a sharing a four-way Pac-10 title in 2000.

Savage has led UCLA to four NCAA Tournament appearances in the last five seasons after becoming the first coach in program history, two years ago, to lead the Bruins to three consecutive NCAA postseason berths (2006-08). Each of Savage's NCAA Regional trips at UCLA have been to southern California-based NCAA Regionals – at Pepperdine in 2006, at Long Beach State in 2007, at Cal State Fullerton in 2008 and at UCLA in 2010.

Serving as the team's pitching coach, Savage has helped the Bruins' pitching staff post a 3.02 ERA, the second-lowest mark in the nation behind Texas' 2.51 ERA. UCLA's team ERA this spring is the program's lowest average since 1978 (2.75). Additionally, the Bruins' pitching staff has established the school's single-season strikeouts record, logging 578 punchouts in 509.0 innings, equaling the nation's highest strikeouts-per-nine-innings average (10.2).

Savage's work with UCLA's pitchers has been no more evident this spring than with the Bruins' four-man starting rotation. Right-handers Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer enter NCAA Regional action sharing the Pac-10 strikeouts lead (124). Cole, Bauer and left-hander Rob Rasmussen have each collected nine wins and over 100 strikeouts, while senior right-hander Garrett Claypool has gone 8-3 with a team-low 2.05 ERA as the Bruins' "midweek" starter.

This season, Savage and the Bruins are looking to win their second Regional in the last four seasons. In 2007, the Bruins entered the NCAA Long Beach Regional as the No. 2 seed and swept the field. The following season, UCLA advanced to the Regional Final at Cal State Fullerton, before dropping the final two games in the winners' bracket.

Through the last five seasons, Savage's teams have posted the second-most wins (73) and second-highest win percentage (.584) of any Pac-10 team in conference games only. Similarly, UCLA has collected the fourth-most wins (169) and fourth-highest win percentage of Pac-10 teams in all games. A consistent ballclub, the Bruins finished in third place in the competitive Pac-10 from 2006-09 before earning a second-place finish in 2010.

Aside from making strides on the field, Savage and his staff have found success on the recruiting trail. Each of his five recruiting classes have been nationally ranked in the top-20 by Baseball America. Savage's first recruiting class at UCLA was ranked No. 5, and that group lived up to its billing by leading the Bruins to three straight NCAA Regionals for the first time in school history. His second class was tabbed No. 13, his next two classes were ranked No. 7 and his most recent incoming group was rated No. 19.

Additionally, Savage's players at UCLA have seen success in the Major League Draft and in professional baseball. Over the last five seasons (2005-09), UCLA has produced 31 draft selections, including a program-record-tying 12 draft picks in 2006. Three of Savage's pitchers at UCLA, left-hander David Huff (Cleveland) and right-handers Josh Roenicke (Toronto) and Hector Ambroz (Cleveland), have been promoted to the major leagues. Of those 31 selections, 11 have been chosen within the draft's first 10 rounds.

At least one UCLA pitcher each of the past five seasons has collected 100 or more strikeouts – David Huff (100) in 2006; Tyson Brummett (138) in 2007; Tim Murphy (111) in 2008; Gerrit Cole (104) in 2009; Cole (124), Trevor Bauer (124) and Rob Rasmussen (101) in 2010.

In 2009, Savage led UCLA to a third-place finish in the Pac-10 for the fourth consecutive season. The Bruins went 27-29 with a 15-12 mark in Pac-10 play. Facing the third-most difficult strength of schedule for the second straight season, as ranked by Boyd's World, UCLA played 25 games against teams that advanced to the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The Bruins played more games (21) and earned more victories (eight) against top-25 teams than any Pac-10 team (as ranked by Baseball America).

The Bruins' pitching staff in 2009 finished ninth in the nation in strikeouts per nine innings (9.3), 14th in hits allowed per nine innings (8.79) and 21st in ERA (4.28). The team's success on the mound was fueled by Trevor Bauer and Gerrit Cole, who finished the season as two of the conference's three freshmen to earn All-Pac-10 team honors. Bauer captured National Freshman Pitcher of the Year honors from Collegiate Baseball and was named a first-team Freshman All-America selection by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA).

Offensively, Cody Decker became the first Bruin to hit 20 or more home runs under Savage. He finished his senior season with 21 homers, becoming UCLA's first Pac-10 home run leader since 2002, in addition to earning his second of two All-Pac-10 team selections. Decker finished his career with 47 home runs, tied for seventh-most on UCLA's career list, and established himself as the Bruins' premier power hitter in the John Savage era.

In 2008, UCLA became the school's first baseball team to secure a third consecutive trip to NCAA postseason play. The Bruins went 33-27 with a 13-11 Pac-10 record, culminating in an NCAA Regional Final berth at Cal State Fullerton. UCLA's pitching staff recorded a conference-leading 4.29 ERA in Pac-10 action. Murphy guided the Bruins' rotation in 2008 and became the first UCLA pitcher to lead the Pac-10 in strikeouts (111) since 1996, when Jim Parque totaled 116 strikeouts.

The Bruins' 2008 regular-season schedule featured 26 games against teams that advanced to NCAA postseason play. UCLA played 18 games against teams ranked in Baseball America's weekly top-25 poll. Savage helped lead the Bruins to series victories in three of the team's four Pac-10 road series.

In 2007, Savage helped UCLA overcome an 8-14 start and record a 33-28 overall record, en route to the program's first NCAA Super Regional appearance since 2000. The Bruins went 14-10 with a third-place finish in the Pac-10. UCLA won 19 of 23 games midway through the 2007 season, marking the team's most successful stretch since 1997, when UCLA last advanced to the College World Series.

The Bruins' road to the Super Regionals that season included 29 games against 11 teams that earned NCAA Tournament berths, including 14 contests against teams that advanced to Super Regionals. Backed by three masterful performances from its starting pitchers, UCLA swept the NCAA Long Beach Regional at Blair Field. Brummett came within one out of tossing a complete game in a 7-3 win over Pepperdine, before Murphy recorded the save. Left-hander Gavin Brooks threw a complete game in a 3-1 victory over Illinois-Chicago, and Murphy went the distance in a 7-4, Regional-clinching victory over host Long Beach State.

Savage's tutelage proved instrumental in the development of Brummett, an All-Pac-10 selection, and the emergence of Brooks and Murphy. Brummett became the eighth pitcher in school history to have pitched seven or more complete games in one season. By season's end, UCLA landed five players on the All-Pac-10 team, the most selections by any Bruin baseball team since 2000. Freshman outfielder Gabe Cohen secured Co-Newcomer of the Year honors, and Decker earned his first of two All-Pac-10 team selections.

The 2007 ballclub earned five consecutive Pac-10 series wins, as UCLA took two of three games against Washington, Arizona and California in addition to road sweeps of Stanford and USC. UCLA faced the second-most difficult schedule in the nation and the No. 1 most challenging non-conference slate, as rated by Boyd's World.

Savage engineered a quick turnaround in 2006, leading the Bruins to a 33-25 overall record and a berth in the NCAA Malibu Regional. UCLA finished third in the Pac-10 that season with a 13-10 conference record. The Bruins faced the toughest schedule in the nation, as rated by Boyd's World, by playing 27 regular-season games against 10 teams that advanced to NCAA Regionals. Savage led UCLA to a 15-12 mark against Arizona State, Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Miami, Mississippi, North Carolina State, 2006 NCAA champion Oregon State, Pepperdine, Stanford and UC Irvine.

The Bruins' 2006 campaign marked the first year in which UCLA won each of its home Pac-10 series, taking two of three games from Washington State, Arizona State, USC and Stanford. The Bruins overcame a 5-9 start by sweeping N.C. State on the road before returning home to win two of three versus Mississippi and sweeping San Diego State.

In just his second year at UCLA, Savage guided the Bruins' pitching staff to a 3.77 team ERA, the lowest mark by any UCLA ballclub since 1980 (3.55). With the addition of Huff and Brummett to the weekend rotation, the pitching staff recorded six complete games, tied with Stanford for the most in the Pac-10. Three players earned All-Pac-10 team honors, and three Bruins secured honorable mention All-Pac-10 accolades.

Much of the college baseball world noticed UCLA's success in 2006 and aimed their praise toward Savage. Following the 2006 campaign, Savage was named a finalist for the National Coach of the Year award by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, marking the second time he has been labeled a finalist for that award.

In July 2006, Baseball America hailed Savage as one of "10 People to Watch in the Future." The magazine listed the Bruins' head coach with other distinguished baseball personnel such as New York Mets general manger Omar Minaya, Mets all-star third baseman David Wright and Los Angeles Dodgers assistant general manager Kim Ng. Baseball America lauded Savage for his winning ways: "UCLA has always been viewed as a sleeping giant on the West Coast, and it looks like Savage has the giant stirring."

Prior to taking over the UCLA baseball program in 2005, Savage's coaching career made stops as a head coach at UC Irvine and as an assistant coach at Nevada and USC. Savage helped lead UC Irvine to the program's first-ever NCAA Division I Tournament appearance in 2004. His ability to soundly recruit first-class student-athletes and to develop them into highly recognized Division I baseball players led UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero to hire Savage on July 1, 2004, to replace the retired Gary Adams.

Coincidentally, Guerrero also hired Savage at UC Irvine three years prior and asked him to re-launch a dormant Anteater baseball program. Savage spent his first season recruiting players and building the foundation for a program that began play in 2002. In their first season, the Anteaters went 33-26 and the team's pitching staff set a school record with 487 strikeouts. Despite injuries to key players the following season, UC Irvine recorded 417 strikeouts and a 3.61 ERA (third in the Big West Conference).

In 2004, Savage led UC Irvine to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I Tournament. Competing at the Notre Dame Regional, the Anteaters finished the year going 34-23-1. Savage's pitching staff recorded 483 strikeouts, four shy of the school record, and compiled a 3.69 ERA (second in the Big West). The UC Irvine offense hit at a .288 clip, averaging 5.7 runs per game.

That season, Savage coached a myriad of talented athletes, including the Big West Conference Freshman Pitcher of the Year, the Collegiate Baseball "Louisville Slugger" Freshman of the Year and the only freshman in the nation to earn All-America first-team accolades from USA Today/Sports Weekly. Savage also led UC Irvine to its highest-ever national ranking at the time -- a No. 7 spot from Collegiate Baseball in April 2004.

Following Savage's historic 2004 campaign, he was tabbed a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors by CollegeBaseballInsider.com. Three of his players were selected in the 2004 MLB Draft, and a total of 12 athletes signed professional contracts under his tutelage at UC Irvine. As a head coach, Savage compiled a perfect

4-0 mark against UCLA. His UC Irvine squads defeated the Bruins twice in 2002 and twice more in 2004.

Prior to taking over the UC Irvine program, Savage served as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Southern California (USC) from 1996-2000. At USC, he helped produce numerous successful athletes, including consecutive Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year selections Seth Etherton, Rik Currier and eventual American League Cy Young Award winner Barry Zito. Ultimately, Savage helped guide Etherton to the 1998 Sporting News National Player of the Year award and was instrumental in his nomination as a Golden Spikes Award finalist. Also under his mentorship was current San Diego Padres right-hander Mark Prior.

As recruiting coordinator, Savage helped facilitate the Trojans' top-ranked recruiting class in 1999-2000, as ranked by Collegiate Baseball, and served as an assistant to Mike Gillespie for the USA Baseball National Team of collegiate all-stars in the summer of 2000. That summer, the U.S. National Team tallied a 27-3-1 record and brought home a gold medal from the Haarlem Baseball Week Tournament in the Netherlands.

Two years prior, Savage earned Collegiate Baseball's Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 1998 after his coaching talents helped USC capture the 1998 College World Series Championship. He also helped guide USC to an NCAA Regional title in 1999 and the NCAA Super Regional title at Georgia Tech in 2000.

Savage served as an assistant coach at the University of Nevada from 1992-96, helping the Wolf Pack compile a 177-82 record in five seasons. During his tenure at Nevada, the baseball program won the 1994 Big West Conference title and strung together its first back-to-back 35-win seasons in school history. In five seasons as an assistant coach at Nevada, 24 Wolf Pack players signed professional contracts.

Savage began his coaching career as the pitching coach for Reno (NV) High School during the 1988-1989 school year.

Savage was a sixth-round draft selection of the New York Yankees in 1983, following his senior season at Reno High, but chose to attend Santa Clara University, where he pitched for three seasons. The Cincinnati Reds selected Savage in the 16th round of the 1986 MLB Draft. Savage played two seasons in the Reds' organization before moving on to help the independent league Salt Lake City Trappers set a professional baseball record with 29 consecutive victories in 1987.

Following his professional career, Savage earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education, with an emphasis in physical education and history, from Nevada in 1991.

Savage, 44, and his wife, Lisa, have four children: Julia (14), Jack (12), Ryan (10) and Gabrielle (9).
