HITTING THE ROAD

UCLA plays its next five games on the road, highlighted by a three-game series at Washington this weekend. The Bruins play a non-conference game at Pepperdine this Tuesday, finishing the two-game home-and-home series against the Waves. The five-game road trip marks UCLA's longest stretch away from home in 2010. Following the three-game series at Washington, UCLA will travel south to play at UC Irvine on Tuesday, May 11. The Bruins have gone 12-2 in 16 games played either on the road or at neutral sites this spring.

TUESDAY'S STARTER

Senior Garett Claypool will start for UCLA at Pepperdine on Tuesday afternoon. The right-hander from West Hills, Calif., limited the Waves to one run (unearned) and two hits in 6.2 innings on March 30, as he recorded nine strikeouts and issued one walk to improve to 3-0 on the season. Claypool has gone 6-1 with a 2.09 ERA, collecting 56 strikeouts and 12 walks in 56.0 innings. Slated to make his 30th career start this Tuesday, Claypool has gone 12-5 with a 3.18 ERA in 68 career appearances (163 strikeouts in 181.0 innings).

ABOUT THE OPPONENT

Pepperdine enters Tuesday's contest with a 13-22 record, having last played a game on Sunday, April 25 (no games due to spring semester finals). The Waves have won two of their last nine games and have gone 3-5 in the West Coast Conference. Washington has gone 24-19 this spring, posting an 8-7 record in Pac-10 play. The Huskies rank ninth in the Pac-10 in batting average (.281) and are 10th with a 5.35 team ERA. Last season, UCLA swept a three-game series against Washington at Jackie Robinson Stadium.

TOP HITTERS

Sophomore Tyler Rahmatulla leads UCLA with a .354 batting average and is followed by sophomore Dean Espy (.351) and senior Blair Dunlap (.347). Rahmatulla stands as the team leader, through Sunday's action, in hits (52), runs (34), at-bats (147) and on-base percentage (.463). Espy leads the group with 33 RBI and a .579 slugging percentage, and Dunlap is currently leading all UCLA players with 16 doubles and is tied for fourth in the Pac-10 Conference with USC's Ricky Oropesa in that category.

ON TO THE NEXT ONE

Slated to start Friday night at Washington, sophomore Gerrit Cole enters the week as the Pac-10 Conference's leader in strikeouts (95) and ranks third in opposing batting average (.190) and eighth in ERA (2.86). Cole struck out nine batters and walked four in a 5-1 loss to Arizona State last Friday. The right-hander from Santa Ana Calif., allowed two runs and six hits in seven-plus innings to absorb his second loss of the spring. Cole has tallied 10 or more strikeouts in three starts this season and accomplished that feat in three starts one year ago.

DYNAMIC DUO

Sophomore Trevor Bauer ranks second in the Pac-10 Conference with 92 strikeouts, just three shy of teammate Gerrit Cole. Bauer and Cole have formed one of the nation's most potent 1-2 punches. Bauer enters the week having gone 6-3 with a 2.81 ERA. Prior to Tuesday's action, he ranks fourth in the conference with 73.2 innings. Last season, his most impressive start came in a 13-0 victory against Washington, as he fanned 13 batters while tossing UCLA's first one-hit complete game shutout since 2000.

SUNDAY SOUTHPAW

Junior Rob Rasmussen has started each of UCLA's 11 weekend finales, going 6-2 with a 3.49 ERA. Rasmussen, who hails from Arcadia, Calif., has registered 78 strikeouts and 22 walks in 57.2 innings, limiting the opposition to a .236 batting average. Through Sunday's games, Rasmussen ranks fourth among Pac-10 pitchers with 78 strikeouts. Rasmussen earned the victory in six consecutive starts (March 14-April 18).

RANKED TERRITORY

In the latest college baseball polls, five Pac-10 teams are ranked among the top-25 by at least one of four publications. *Baseball America* includes Arizona State (3), UCLA (12), Oregon (15), California (21) and Arizona (23). UCLA has gone 7-6 against teams ranked in the top-25 (week of game) by *Baseball America*.

LEADING OFF

Freshman Beau Amaral ranks fifth on the team with a .339 batting average, having started 36 games in center field this spring. Two weeks ago, he batted .545 (6-for-11) in a three-game series at Arizona. The former standout at Huntington Beach High School belted his second homer of the season, going 2-for-4 with two RBI, in a loss to Long Beach State on April 20. Since UCLA's 22-game win streak was snapped, Amaral has posted a team-leading .345 batting average, going 19-for-55 in that span (18 games).

SHOW STOPPER

Sophomore right-hander Dan Klein was named to the Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List in mid-April by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association (NCBWA). He leads UCLA and is third in the Pac-10 with eight saves. Klein has gone 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in a team-high 23 appearances (all in relief), having tallied 39 strikeouts and seven walks in 31.1 innings. Entering Tuesday's game at Pepperdine, he is tied for fifth on UCLA's single-season saves list with three former UCLA pitchers.

STRIKEOUT KINGS

UCLA leads the Pac-10 with 434 strikeouts and ranks second in the conference with a 3.04 team ERA. The Bruins have averaged 10.6 strikeouts per nine innings. UCLA's weekend starters rank first, second and fourth, respectively among the Pac-10's strikeout leaders – Gerrit Cole (95), Trevor Bauer (92) and Rob Rasmussen (78). Garrett Claypool sits just outside the top-10 strikeout leaders (56). Cole leads all UCLA pitchers in strikeouts per nine innings with a 12.3 average.

WORTH AN ESPY

Sophomore Dean Espy has excelled as a corner infielder in his first season with the Bruins. Currently second on the team with a .351 batting average, Espy transferred to UCLA last summer after having starred at South Mountain Community College in Phoenix in 2009. He leads the Bruins in RBI (33) and slugging percentage (.579). Espy, along with Brett Krill, Tyler Rahmatulla and Steve Rodriguez, is tied for the team lead in home runs with five. The native of Mesa, Ariz., leads UCLA with nine multiple-RBI games this spring.

RAMMING SPEED

Sophomore Tyler Rahmatulla stands as the only player for UCLA to have started all 40 games (all at second base). Rahmatulla enters Tuesday's game at Pepperdine as one of four Bruins (along with Dean Espy, Brett Krill and Steve Rodriguez) to have clubbed a team-high five home runs. He ranks ninth in the Pac-10 with a .463 on-base percentage, is fifth with 29 walks and leads the conference with six sacrifice flies. Rahmatulla has collected a team-best 17 multiple-hit performances, including five three-hit games as a sophomore.

AGAINST THE BEST

UCLA has gone 7-6 against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* top-25 poll (team ranked in poll on day of game). UCLA defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on March 14 before winning two of three games against No. 19 Stanford, No. 17 Oregon State and No. 17 Arizona. The Bruins were swept in three games against No. 3 Arizona State the weekend of April 30-May 2. One year ago, UCLA went 8-13 against top-25 competition, playing more games and earning more victories against top-25 teams than any other Pac-10 program.

CLOSING IN

Gerrit Cole stands five strikeouts shy of 100 this season – if Cole reaches the century mark, he would become the first UCLA pitcher to log 100 or more strikeouts in consecutive seasons since Jim Parque (1996-97). It would mark the fifth consecutive year in which UCLA had a pitcher total 100 strikeouts. UCLA has not had two pitchers record 100 or more strikeouts in the same season since 1997 (Jim Parque had 119 and Tom Jacquez notched 100). Cole's 199 career strikeouts are 50 shy of 10th place on UCLA's career list.

MAKING HISTORY

UCLA's 16-inning victory at Oregon State on April 10 marked the program's longest game (by innings) since an 18-inning game at Arizona State on Feb. 23, 1990. The Bruins lost 6-5 in the series opener at Arizona State that evening before 4,037 fans. The longest extra-inning game in Pac-10 history came in 1972, as Washington and Oregon State played a 20-inning contest (date, score unknown). UCLA's 3-1 win against Oregon State lasted six hours, 23 minutes and featured 12 pitchers (eight by Oregon State, four by UCLA).

FINAL FOUR

UCLA has 16 games (nine road, seven home) remaining on its 56-game regular season schedule. The Bruins will alternate each of their next four weekend series on the road and at home. Following the upcoming five-game road swing, UCLA will host a three-game series against crosstown rival USC (May 14-16). After playing UC Santa Barbara at home on May 18, the Bruins will play a three-game series at No. 21 California (May 21-23). During the final week of the season, UCLA will play a midweek game at No. 10 Cal State Fullerton before concluding the spring with a three-game home series against Washington State (May 28-30).

NOTES ON A STREAK

UCLA opened the season by winning its first 22 games, the Bruins' best-ever start to any baseball season in the program's 91-year history. Prior to going 22-0 in 2010, UCLA's best starts on record took place in 1978 (8-0) and in 1997 (7-0). The Bruins won their first 22 games, outscoring their opponents by a combined 189-59 margin. UCLA posted a .356 batting average during its record streak while the pitching staff logged a 2.22 ERA and 273 strikeouts through 199.0 innings (12.4 strikeouts per nine innings).

- UCLA had 10 players during its win streak post batting averages above .300 (minimum 40 at-bats)
- The starting rotation went 17-0, compiling a 2.20 ERA with 194 strikeouts and 52 walks.
- Tyler Rahmatulla led UCLA's offense with a .451 batting average (37-for-82), 37 hits and 24 runs.
- Gerrit Cole went 6-0 with a 2.49 ERA and 61 strikeouts through 43.1 innings in seven starts.
- Dan Klein tossed 17.2 scoreless innings as the closer, totaling five saves while earning two victories.
- UCLA opened 22-0 and Arizona State started 2-0 – both schools lost their first game on Friday, April 2.

NOT FAR BEHIND

During the Bruins' 22-0 start, UCLA trailed in eight ballgames and was tied (without trailing) in two games. The Bruins twice overcame a deficit of three runs, most recently by scoring two runs in the fourth inning and two in the eighth against Cal Poly on March 26, to secure their 19th consecutive win. The Bruins have won two games in walkoff fashion, ironically, in back-to-back games. A sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth inning against Nebraska (March 6) and versus UC Riverside (March 9) helped UCLA claim its ninth and 10th wins.

Sixth-year head coach John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has helped UCLA produce 31 Major League Draft selections.

UCLA has collected the second-most wins (55) and second-highest winning percentage (.561) among Pac-10 teams (conference games only) from 2006-09. This spring, Savage has pushed UCLA to its most games over .500 in his six seasons (23 games – previous, 10 games over in May 2006). UCLA has not been as many as 23 games over the .500 plateau since finishing the 1997 season with a 45-21-1 overall mark under former head coach Gary Adams.

NEWS AND NOTES

◀ UCLA's 2010 roster features three players with immediate connections in the major leagues. Niko Gallego (son of Mike) and Beau Amaral (son of Rich) both have fathers who played in the major leagues after having excelled at UCLA. Mike Gallego played 13 seasons in the majors (1985-1997), spending the 1985 through 1991 campaigns with the Oakland A's. Rich Amaral played in the big leagues for 10 seasons, spending his first eight with the Seattle Mariners. Dean Espy's father, Duane, played eight seasons in the minors before serving as both a minor league head coach and major league hitting coach (2000-02 San Diego, 2003-06 Colorado).

◀ UCLA defeated USC, 6-1, before 14,588 fans at Dodger Stadium in a non-conference game on Sunday, Feb. 28. Playing in the first-ever "Dodgertown Classic", the Bruins and Trojans played under sunny skies at Dodger Stadium on the final day of the second weekend of the 2010 college baseball season. Vanderbilt defeated Oklahoma State, 7-6, in the first of two games at Dodger Stadium that day. That marked the largest crowd to watch a UCLA baseball game since the 1997 College World Series.

◀ The Bruins' 2010 schedule features 56 games against a total of 25 teams. In all, UCLA has played games against teams from nine conferences. After the Pac-10, the Bruins have played more games against Big West opposition than any other conference. UCLA's key non-conference victories have included a 9-2 win at home against Vanderbilt on Friday, Feb. 26. The Bruins handed the Commodores (then 4-0) their first loss in their first 15 games. UCLA also defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on Sunday, March 14 at the Whataburger College Classic. The Bruins snapped the Sooners' 10-game win streak and gave them their second loss in 17 games.

HEADED TO UCLA IN 2010-11

Sixth-year head coach John Savage announced the signing of eight high school seniors to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period in November 2009. These eight players will enroll at UCLA for the fall quarter in Sept. 2010 in time for the 2011 baseball season.
