## CROSSTOWN RIVALS

UCLA continues its Pac-10 schedule with a three-game series at home this weekend against USC. The Bruins have won 10 of the last 13 meetings against the Trojans, including three of the last four season series. Most recently, UCLA downed the Trojans, 6-1, before 14,588 fans in a non-conference game at Dodger Stadium on Feb. 28, earlier this season. UCLA snapped a 1-1 tie on a two-run single up the middle by Justin Uribe in the bottom of the seventh inning before adding three more runs in the eighth inning for the 6-1 victory.

## WHAT LIES AHEAD

UCLA enters the weekend tied for second place in the Pac-10 standings (10-8) with Stanford (Bruins own tiebreak by virtue of winning the season series over Stanford, 2-1). UCLA and Stanford each trail conference leader Arizona State by four games. The Bruins have 11 games to play in the regular season, including nine Pac-10 games to take place over the next three weekends – vs. USC (May 14-16), at California (May 21-23) and vs. Washington State (May 28-30). UCLA has finished third in the Pac-10 each of the last four seasons.

## WINNING RECORD

The Bruins have gone 34-11, marking UCLA's highest win total since going 35-29 in 2004, following a 2-2 showing at the NCAA Regional in Oklahoma City. In his sixth season at UCLA, head coach John Savage has reached the 34-win mark for the second time in nine years as a collegiate head coach – he led UC Irvine to a 34-23-1 overall record in 2004, his third season with the Anteaters. No UCLA team has been 24 games over the .500 plateau since 1997, when the Bruins finished 45-21-1 after advancing to the College World Series.

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Center fielder Beau Amaral earned Pac-10 Player of the Week honors Monday, after helping lead UCLA to a 4-0 record last week by hitting .500 (7-for-14). He had one home run, three doubles, five runs and three walks in four games. He reached base safely in all five plate appearances in a 5-1 win at Pepperdine on Tuesday, going 3-for-3 with two doubles. Amaral belted a solo homer in a 1-for-3 effort Friday and went 2-for-3 with one double and two runs Saturday. The resident of Huntington Beach, Calif., has compiled a 13-game hitting streak.

## WATCH LIST REVISED

UCLA sophomore starting pitchers Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer have been named to the 2010 National Pitcher of the Year Award's revised watch list, as announced last week by the College Baseball Foundation. Cole was on the list during the preseason, while Bauer has been added to the revised 25-man watch list. Both Bruin pitchers were named preseason third-team All-America selections by *Collegiate Baseball*. Cole and Bauer are two of four Pac-10 pitchers on the revised watch list, joining Arizona's Kurt Heyer and Arizona State's Seth Blair.

## RANKED TERRITORY

In the latest polls, five Pac-10 teams are ranked among the top-25 by at least one of five publications. *Baseball America* includes Arizona State (3), UCLA (11), Oregon (22) and Stanford (25) in its weekly poll, while California has been included by Yahoo! Sports/Rivals.com and *Collegiate Baseball*. UCLA has gone 7-6 against ranked teams (week of game) by *Baseball America*. The Bruins ascended to No. 1 (week of April 12-18 by *Baseball America* and Yahoo! Sports/Rivals.com) for the first time during the regular season since March 3, 1997.

## TUESDAY'S GAME

UCLA dropped a 2-1 decision at UC Irvine on Tuesday night, losing for just the third time in 27 non-conference games this season. Likewise, Tuesday's setback marked UCLA's third loss in 19 games played away from home. Garrett Claypool was saddled with his second loss despite limiting UC Irvine to two runs and six hits through six innings. The Bruins' offense mustered just four hits, as Beau Amaral extended his season-high hitting streak to 13 games. Matt Drummond and Erik Goeddel combined to pitch 2.1 scoreless innings in relief.

## ON TO THE NEXT ONE

Slated to start Friday against USC, sophomore Gerrit Cole leads the Pac-10 with 104 strikeouts, ranking fourth in opponent batting average (.184) and ninth in ERA (2.79). He improved to 7-2 last Friday, facing the minimum 15 batters through the first five innings in UCLA's 7-2 victory. Cole scattered three hits and allowed two runs in eight-plus innings, notching nine strikeouts and two walks. He has become the first UCLA pitcher to strike out 100 or more batters in consecutive seasons since Jim Parque accomplished the feat in 1996 and 1997.

## THE BAUER FILE

Sophomore Trevor Bauer earned his seventh victory on Saturday, helping lead the Bruins past Washington, 14-6, in what had been a closely-contested ballgame until UCLA scored seven runs in the top of the ninth. Bauer (7-3) recorded six strikeouts and two walks in seven innings, pushing his season strikeout total to 98, the second-most among Pac-10 pitchers. Entering this weekend, Bauer ranks third in the conference with 80.2 innings and is tied with six pitchers for fifth in the Pac-10 with seven victories.

## SUNDAY SOUTHPAW

Junior Rob Rasmussen has started each of UCLA's 12 weekend finales, going 7-2 with a 3.49 ERA. Rasmussen, who hails from Arcadia, Calif., has registered 82 strikeouts and 23 walks in 64.1 innings, limiting the opposition to a .234 batting average. Headed into the weekend, Rasmussen ranks fifth among Pac-10 pitchers with 82 strikeouts and 10th with a .234 opponent batting average. After having not earned a decision in his first three starts, Rasmussen secured the victory in his next six starts (March 14-April 18).

## SHOW STOPPER

Sophomore right-hander Dan Klein leads UCLA with nine saves, tied for the second-highest total of any Pac-10 pitcher, and has posted a 2.02 ERA in a team-high 27 appearances (all in relief). Klein was named to the Midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List in mid-April by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association (NCBWA). A product of Servite High School (Anaheim), Klein has collected 43 strikeouts and issued just seven walks in 35.2 innings. He ranks third (in a three-way tie) on UCLA's single-season saves list.

## STRONG STAFF

UCLA's four starting pitchers (Garett Claypool, Gerrit Cole, Trevor Bauer and Rob Rasmussen) each picked up their team-leading seventh win of the season one week ago. No UCLA team has had four or more pitchers earn seven or more victories since 1967 (Rob Kester and Guy Hansen with 10, Bob Boyer 9, Bob Wiswell 8). The Bruins lead the Pac-10 with 476 strikeouts (67 ahead of Arizona State's 409). UCLA currently ranks third in ERA (3.04) and first in opponent batting average (.219). UCLA's weekend starters rank first, second and fifth, respectively, in strikeouts – Cole (104), Bauer (98) and Rasmussen (82).

## SENIOR STATESMEN

Seniors Blair Dunlap and Justin Uribe have been atop UCLA's hitting charts all season long, as Uribe currently leads the Bruins with a .357 batting average. Uribe has logged a .314 career batting average in 142 games (120 starts), while Dunlap has batted .298 with 16 home runs, five triples and 44 doubles in 180 career games. Dunlap currently ranks fifth on the team with a .335 batting average. Dunlap is second on the team with 54 hits and is tied for third with 30 runs. His 44 career doubles are tied for ninth-most in UCLA's record book.

## RAMMING SPEED

Sophomore Tyler Rahmatulla has started at second base in 44 of the Bruins' 45 games this season. He enters the weekend series against USC game ranking fourth on the team in batting average (.339). Rahmatulla is tied for the team lead (with Niko Gallego) with 35 runs scored and leads all Bruins with 56 hits. His 33 RBI are second to Dean Espy's 34 runs batted in, his nine stolen bases trail Gallego's team-leading 16 swipes, and his 30 walks are one short of Cody Keefer's team-high 31 free passes.

## AGAINST THE BEST

UCLA has gone 7-6 against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* top-25 poll (team ranked in poll on day of game). UCLA defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on March 14 before winning two of three games against No. 19 Stanford, No. 17 Oregon State and No. 17 Arizona. The Bruins were swept in three games against No. 3 Arizona State the weekend of April 30-May 2. One year ago, UCLA went 8-13 against top-25 competition, playing more games and earning more victories against top-25 teams than any other Pac-10 program.

## CLOSING IN

Gerrit Cole stands six strikeouts shy of UCLA's top-10 single-season list. The right-hander from Santa Ana, Calif., needs six to tie Bill Brasher's 110-strikeout total from 1966 and nine to move into sixth place on the single-season list (ahead of Gary Robson's 112-strikeout total from 1972). Pete Janicki owns the Bruins' single-season strikeout record, having logged 150 punchouts in 1992. Cole is currently 41 strikeouts shy of UCLA's career top-10 list (Hector Ambriz, 249 strikeouts from 2003-06).

## MAKING HISTORY

UCLA's 16-inning victory at Oregon State on April 10 marked the program's longest game (by innings) since an 18-inning game at Arizona State on Feb. 23, 1990. The Bruins lost 6-5 in the series opener at Arizona State that evening before 4,037 fans. The longest extra-inning game in Pac-10 history came in 1972, as Washington and Oregon State played a 20-inning contest (date, score unknown). UCLA's 3-1 win against Oregon State lasted six hours, 23 minutes and featured 12 pitchers (eight by Oregon State, four by UCLA).

## NOTES ON A STREAK

UCLA opened the season by winning its first 22 games, the Bruins' best-ever start to any baseball season in the program's 91-year history. Prior to going 22-0 in 2010, UCLA's best starts on record took place in 1978 (8-0) and in 1997 (7-0). The Bruins won their first 22 games, outscoring their opponents by a combined 189-59 margin. UCLA posted a .356 batting average during its record streak while the pitching staff logged a 2.22 ERA and 273 strikeouts through 199.0 innings (12.4 strikeouts per nine innings).

- UCLA had 10 players during its win streak post batting averages above .300 (minimum 40 at-bats)
- The starting rotation went 17-0, compiling a 2.20 ERA with 194 strikeouts and 52 walks.
- Tyler Rahmatulla led UCLA's offense with a .451 batting average (37-for-82), 37 hits and 24 runs.
- Gerrit Cole went 6-0 with a 2.49 ERA and 61 strikeouts through 43.1 innings in seven starts.
- Dan Klein tossed 17.2 scoreless innings as the closer, totaling five saves while earning two victories.
- UCLA opened 22-0 and Arizona State started 24-0 – both schools lost their first game on Friday, April 2.

## NOT FAR BEHIND

During the Bruins' 22-0 start, UCLA trailed in eight ballgames and was tied (without trailing) in two games. The Bruins twice overcame a deficit of three runs, most recently by scoring two runs in the fourth inning and two in the eighth against Cal Poly on March 26, to secure their 19th consecutive win. The Bruins won two games in walkoff fashion, ironically, in back-to-back games. A sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth inning against Nebraska (March 6) and versus UC Riverside (March 9) helped UCLA claim its ninth and 10th wins.

## BASEBALL AMERICA'S PREDICTIONS

At the start of the 2010 season, *Baseball America* compiled an in-depth preview of the Pac-10 Conference, including projected standings and a preseason All-Pac-10 Team. ## HEAD COACH JOHN SAVAGE



### Record at UCLA

Sixth-year head coach John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has helped UCLA produce 31 Major League Draft selections.

UCLA has collected the second-most wins (55) and second-highest winning percentage (.561) among Pac-10 teams (conference games only) from 2006-09. This spring, Savage has pushed UCLA to its most games over .500 in his six seasons (24 games – previous, 10 games over in May 2006). UCLA has not been as many as 24 games over the .500 plateau since finishing the 1997 season with a 45-21-1 overall mark under former head coach Gary Adams.

## NEWS AND NOTES

◀ UCLA's 2010 roster features three players with immediate connections in the major leagues. Niko Gallego (son of Mike) and Beau Amaral (son of Rich) both have fathers who played in the major leagues after having excelled at UCLA. Mike Gallego played 13 seasons in the majors (1985-1997), spending the 1985 through 1991 campaigns with the Oakland A's. Rich Amaral played in the big leagues for 10 seasons, spending his first eight with the Seattle Mariners. Dean Espy's father, Duane, played eight seasons in the minors before serving as both a minor league head coach and major league hitting coach (2000-02 San Diego, 2003-06 Colorado).

◀ UCLA defeated USC, 6-1, before 14,588 fans at Dodger Stadium in a non-conference game on Sunday, Feb. 28. Playing in the first-ever "Dodgertown Classic", the Bruins and Trojans played under sunny skies at Dodger Stadium on the final day of the second weekend of the 2010 college baseball season. Vanderbilt defeated Oklahoma State, 7-6, in the first of two games at Dodger Stadium that day. That marked the largest crowd to watch a UCLA baseball game since the 1997 College World Series.

◀ The Bruins' 2010 schedule features 56 games against a total of 25 teams. In all, UCLA has played games against teams from nine conferences. After the Pac-10, the Bruins have played more games against Big West opposition than any other conference. UCLA's key non-conference victories have included a 9-2 win at home against Vanderbilt on Friday, Feb. 26. The Bruins handed the Commodores (then 4-0) their first loss in their first 15 games. UCLA also defeated then-No. 25 Oklahoma, 5-2, on Sunday, March 14 at the Whataburger College Classic. The Bruins snapped the Sooners' 10-game win streak and gave them their second loss in 17 games.

## HEADED TO UCLA IN 2010-11

Sixth-year head coach John Savage announced the signing of eight high school seniors to National Letters of Intent during the early signing period in November 2009. These eight players will enroll at UCLA for the fall quarter in Sept. 2010 in time for the 2011 baseball season.
