BRUINS VERSUS PURDUE

UCLA plays a three-game non-conference series against No. 13 Purdue this weekend, opening with a doubleheader on Saturday afternoon (1/5 p.m.). Purdue has won 14 of its last 16 games, having taken two of three against conference foe Michigan State last weekend. UCLA and Purdue have played just one game against each other in the past, with the Bruins earning a 10-6 victory over the Boilermakers on March 14, 2001, at Jackie Robinson Stadium. This weekend's games mark the final non-conference series for UCLA during the 2012 regular season.

UCLA EDGES LONG BEACH STATE

Freshman left-hander Grant Watson threw six scoreless innings, scattering just two hits, to earn his team-leading eighth win as UCLA defeated Long Beach State, 2-1, at Blair Field on Tuesday night. Trevor Brown drove home both runs for the Bruins, who earned a two-game season sweep of Long Beach State. Watson has become just the fourth pitcher in school history to collect at least eight wins during his freshman season (Trevor Bauer and Pete Janicki each totaled nine wins as freshmen). UCLA has gone 8-0 in midweek games this spring.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

Jeff Gelalich (.383) and Tyler Heineman (.381) enter the weekend ranking third and fifth, respectively, in the Pac-12 Conference in batting average. In addition, Cody Keefer (.362) is ninth in that category. Tyler Heineman (.488) and Jeff Gelalich (.475) rank first and second, respectively, in the conference in on-base percentage. Gelalich leads all Pac-12 players with 14 stolen bases, and Beau Amaral leads the conference with 47 runs.

STARTING ON SATURDAY

Sophomore right-hander Adam Plutko (5-3, 3.65 ERA) will start Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader for the Bruins. Plutko, hailing from Upland, Calif., ranks seventh in the Pac-12 with 62 strikeouts entering this weekend. He has had four starts of six or more innings in which he has blanked the opposition this season. Plutko's most dominant outing came at then-No. 9-ranked Georgia, where he struck out a season-high 11 in his second career complete game, scattering just five hits at the Bulldogs' Foley Field in Athens, Ga.

SATURDAY, PART TWO

Sophomore right-hander Nick Vander Tuig (5-3, 5.32) is slated to start Game 2 of the doubleheader on Saturday. Vander Tuig earned the victory in UCLA's 7-4 win over Stanford last Saturday. He allowed four runs and six hits in 5.2 innings, but had limited Stanford to just two runs and four hits through the first five innings before allowing back-to-back solo home runs with two outs in the top of the seventh. Vander Tuig has issued two walks or fewer in eight of his 11 starts this season. He earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention acclaim as UCLA's closer in 2011.

TALENTED OUTFIELD

UCLA's three outfielders, all juniors who hit left-handed, enter Saturday's doubleheader batting above .325. The trio has played extensively since arriving in Westwood in the fall of 2009. Jeff Gelalich has started all 41 games in right field this year, batting .383 with six home runs, seven doubles and 29 RBI. Beau Amaral has been UCLA's starting center field the last three seasons and is batting .329 with four homers, 31 RBI and a conference-best 47 runs. Cody Keefer has batted .362 with six doubles, 24 RBI and a .441-on base percentage in 40 games.

STEADY AT SHORTSTOP

Entering Friday's conference games, sophomore shortstop Pat Valaika leads the Pac-12 Conference with 140 assists, having started the Bruins' last 48 games at shortstop (dating back to 2011). Valaika has batted .261 with one home run and a team-leading 11 doubles, starting at shortstop in all 41 games this spring. The native of Valencia, Calif., has totaled nine multiple-hit games and five multiple-RBI efforts.

ROAD WARRIORS

Since the start of the 2010 season, UCLA has gone 48-23 in all road and neutral site contests. The Bruins have opened this season with an 12-3 record away from home, posting a 6-3 mark on the road in Pac-12 games. Last year, UCLA went 14-13 in road/neutral site games, while in 2010 the Bruins went 15-4 on the road and 7-3 at neutral sites. In conference action, UCLA has tallied a 26-10 road record since 2010.

LEADING UCLA'S BULLPEN

Right-hander Scott Griggs has totaled 10 saves in 23 relief appearances, posting a 1.11 ERA and .076 opponent batting average in 24.1 innings. Griggs' 10 saves is tied for second place on the school's single-season saves list. Right-hander David Berg enters the weekend leading the Pac-12 with a 1.67 ERA and .170 opponent batting average, having gone 4-2 in a team-leading 28 relief appearances during his freshman season.

WELL-TRAVELED BRUINS

In their eighth season under head coach John Savage, the Bruins have regularly played non-conference road series against teams away from the West Coast. In early March, UCLA swept a three-game series at then-No. 9 ranked Georgia. Last season, the Bruins played three consecutive extra-inning games at Nebraska. Aside from traveling to Omaha, Neb., for the 2010 College World Series, UCLA played three games in the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi, Calif., that season. In 2009, UCLA spent three consecutive weekends on the road away from the West (at the Houston College Classic, Oklahoma and East Carolina).

WHO TO WATCH

Junior outfielder Jeff Gelalich has been selected to the midseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award (nation's top player). He leads UCLA with a .383 batting average and six home runs. Junior catcher Tyler Heineman has been named to the watch list for the Johnny Bench Award (nation's top catcher). He ranks fifth in the Pac-12 with a .381 batting average and first with a .488 on-base percentage. Junior right-hander Scott Griggs has been selected to the midseason watch list for the Stopper of the Year Award (nation's top closer). Griggs has totaled 10 saves, logging a 1.11 ERA with 40 strikeouts and six hits allowed in 23.1 innings.

MR. VERSATILITY

Junior Trevor Brown enters this weekend's series against Purdue batting .309 with a team-high 35 RBI. Brown has emerged the last three seasons as UCLA's most versatile position player. He has made 17 career starts at catcher and 34 starts at first base this season, after having started 24 games at second base in 2011. In addition he has made seven career starts as UCLA's third baseman.

WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

Through 11 weeks, UCLA has had six Pac-12 Player/Pitcher of the Week award selections. Beau Amaral (March 26, April 16) and Jeff Gelalich (Feb. 29, March 13) have twice captured Player of the Week honors. Adam Plutko earned Pitcher of the Week honors (March 13) after throwing a complete game shutout at Georgia (March 9). Grant Watson was named Pitcher of the Week (March 20) after logging two wins in three games.

BULLPEN BRAWN

UCLA's bullpen has gone 10-3 with a 1.83 ERA in 143.0 innings, combining for 123 relief appearances through the team's first 41 games. In fact, the team's relief corps has held the opposition to 13 runs (10 earned) and 49 hits through the last 25 games (5-2 record, 1.02 ERA, with a .168 batting average). In that 25-game span, Scott Griggs has pitched 13.0 scoreless innings, allowing three hits while logging 22 strikeouts and seven walks.

BIG LEAGUE BALLPARKS

UCLA will play Washington at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, the night of Friday, May 11. That game will mark the Bruins' seventh contest played in a Major League Baseball stadium since the start of the 2009 season. UCLA played three games at Minute Maid Park (Houston) in 2009. The Bruins have played one game at Dodger Stadium each of the last three seasons (2010-2012). UCLA has gone 2-4 in those six games.

SEVEN-YEAR COMPOSITE

In conference games since 2006, UCLA ranks second in wins (103) and win percentage (.595). Through games played April 29, the Bruins rank fourth in total wins (240) and win percentage (.597). UCLA won the Pac-10 Conference title in outright fashion in 2011 for the first time since 1986 (three-way tie in 2000). The Bruins finished second in 2010 and earned a third-place finish from 2006 through 2009.

Brandon Crawford – San Francisco Giants (Shortstop)

- Opened the 2012 season as San Francisco's starting shortstop after having played in 66 games in 2011
- Started all 158 games in his three seasons at UCLA (2006-2008), leading the Bruins to the postseason each year
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2008 MLB Draft by his hometown San Francisco Giants

Ben Francisco – Toronto Blue Jays (Outfielder)

- Was traded to Toronto in the offseason after playing for Philadelphia in 2009, 2010 and 2011
- Helped lead Philadelphia to its second consecutive National League pennant in October 2009
- Selected in the fifth round of the 2002 MLB Draft by Cleveland after his junior season at UCLA

David Huff – Cleveland Indians (Left-Handed Pitcher)

- On a rehabilitation assignment with the triple-A Columbus Clippers after making one appearance at double-A Akron
- Led Cleveland with 11 wins on the mound during rookie campaign in 2009 (went 11-8 in 23 starts)
- Served as UCLA's No. 2 starter in 2006 after having transferred from Cypress College

Casey Janssen – Toronto Blue Jays (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Returned to Toronto's big league club in 2009 after having missed all of 2008 with a shoulder injury
- Totaled a 4.34 ERA and 22-15 record in 54 games (43 starts) through 265.1 innings in four years at UCLA
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2004 MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays

Josh Roenicke – Colorado Rockies (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Traded to Colorado (from Toronto) midway through 2011, pitching in 19 games for the Rockies out of the bullpen
- Made his major league debut in Sept. 2008 with Cincinnati, who chose him in the 10th round of the 2006 MLB Draft
- Starred as a center fielder and relief pitcher at UCLA – did not pitch regularly until the 2006 season

Chase Utley – Philadelphia Phillies (Second Baseman)

- Helped Philadelphia win the 2008 World Series and return as the National League Champions in 2009
- Has posted a career .290 batting average and 188 home runs through 10 major league seasons
- Selected No. 15 overall in the first round of the 2000 MLB Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies

UCLA's roster features 13 players who have been selected in the MLB Draft at least once. All 13 of those players were drafted following their senior seasons of high school. The Bruins' freshman class includes three players drafted as high school seniors in June 2011, while the sophomore class features six players drafted out of high school.

HIGHLY DRAFTED

Head coach John Savage has produced 51 MLB Draft selections in his seven seasons at UCLA. Last June, right-handers Gerrit Cole (Pittsburgh) and Trevor Bauer (Arizona) became the first and third overall selections in the MLB Draft. Three of Savage's pitchers have already been promoted to the major leagues (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke). Most recently, three-year UCLA shortstop Brandon Crawford was promoted to the San Francisco Giants in May 2011. Of the 51 draft selections, 16 have been selected in the first 10 rounds.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 35-man roster features 32 players from California and one from Arizona, Nevada and Washington. The team includes nine juniors, 13 sophomores and 13 freshmen. Redshirt junior Chase Brewer is the team's most veteran member. Brewer, along with juniors Beau Amaral, Trevor Brown, Jeff Gelalich, Scott Griggs, Tyler Heineman, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis, and redshirt sophomores Ryan Deeter, Matt Giovinazzo and Aaron Weimer are the remaining members from UCLA's 2010 College World Series team.

John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the finals of the College World Series in 2010, guiding UCLA to a 51-17 record last season. Previously, he became the first head coach in program history to have led UCLA to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has led UCLA to NCAA postseason appearances in five of his seven years in Westwood. Additionally, he has helped the program produce 51 MLB Draft selections.
