BRUINS HEADED TO SEATTLE

UCLA continues its Pac-12 schedule with a three-game series against Washington beginning Friday night at Safeco Field (home of the Seattle Mariners). The Bruins and Huskies will play at Washington's Husky Ballpark on Saturday (2 p.m.) and Sunday (1 p.m.). UCLA has won the season series against Washington each of the last five years and carries an 11-game winning streak against the Huskies into Friday night's game. Sporting a 12-9 Pac-12 record, UCLA currently stands 2.5 games behind first place Oregon in the conference standings.

FRIDAY'S STARTER

Adam Plutko has gone 6-3 with a 3.38 ERA in 12 starts during his sophomore campaign. The right-hander from Upland, Calif., earned Pac-12 Pitcher of the Week honors last Monday for the second time this season, after having limited Purdue to one run and two hits in 8.1 innings on Saturday, May 5, in UCLA's 5-1 victory. Plutko's most dominant outing came in an 11-strikeout, complete-game shutout at then-No. 9 Georgia on March 9.

OFFENSIVE LEADERS

Jeff Gelalich leads the Pac-12 with a .388 batting average and .478 on-base percentage. The junior outfielder from La Verne, Calif., ranks first in the conference in stolen bases (15), tied for third in hits (66) and seventh in slugging percentage (.559). Tyler Heineman ranks second in on-base percentage (.475) and sixth in batting average (.369). As a team, UCLA is second in the Pac-12 with a .306 batting average and .394 on-base percentage.

THREE WEEKS REMAIN

UCLA has 11 games remaining with three weekends left in the regular season. The Bruins will play a three-game series at Washington this weekend (May 11-13), with the series opener to take place Friday night at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners. Next week, UCLA plays at No. 8 Cal State Fullerton on Tuesday night before traveling for a three-game Pac-12 series at California that weekend (May 18-20). The Bruins will play at UC Irvine the next Tuesday (May 24) and will close the regular season at home with three games versus USC (May 25-27).

UCLA'S PAST WEEKEND

The Bruins won two of three games against then-No. 13 Purdue last weekend, collecting their fifth series victory this season against a top-25 ranked team. UCLA has gone 8-4 in weekend series this year, compiling a 5-2 series record against ranked teams. Adam Plutko allowed one run and two hits in 8.1 innings in Game 1 of a doubleheader on Saturday, leading the Bruins past Purdue, 5-1. UCLA won Game 2 by a 3-2 margin that evening. In Sunday's finale, Purdue erased a 10-5 deficit with 10 runs in the top of the inning and held on to win, 15-11.

TUESDAY'S WIN IN MALIBU

UCLA earned a 6-2 victory at Pepperdine on Tuesday, overcoming a 2-1 deficit with three runs in the top of the seventh inning. The Bruins took advantage of five Pepperdine errors in the game, cranking 13 hits to improve to 20-4 in non-conference ballgames. Eric Jaffe collected his first win, tossing one-third of an inning in relief of starting pitcher Grant Watson. Jeff Gelalich went 2-for-4 with this team-leading seventh home run, while Trevor Brown and Tyler Heineman each went 3-for-5 with one RBI at Eddy D. Field Stadium in Malibu, Calif.

CENTER STAGE

Beau Amaral has served as UCLA's starting center fielder and leadoff hitter in all 45 games this season. Amaral ranks fourth on the team with a .328 batting average and leads the Bruins with 17 extra-base hits (four home runs, five triples and eight doubles). He has scored a conference-best 51 runs, a total which already eclipses his team-leading 37 runs scored last season. Amaral tallied a career-long 21-game hitting streak earlier this season (March 11-April 21), during which he batted at a .432 clip (38-for-88).

ROAD WARRIORS

Since the start of the 2010 season, UCLA has gone 49-23 in all road and neutral site contests. The Bruins have opened this season with a 13-3 record away from home, posting a 6-3 mark on the road in Pac-12 games. Last year, UCLA went 14-13 in road/neutral site games, while in 2010 the Bruins went 15-4 on the road and 7-3 at neutral sites. In conference action, UCLA has tallied a 26-10 road record since 2010.

REGULAR IN RELIEF

Freshman right-hander David Berg leads the Pac-12 with a 1.50 ERA and .170 opposing batting average, having pitched in a conference-best 32 games. He has become one of three pitchers in school history to have appeared in at least 30 games as a freshman. Rob Henkel (1997) and Chuck Yaeger (1981) hold the freshman season record with 34 appearances. Berg has pitched in UCLA's last seven games and 10 of the team's last 12 contests.

WELL-TRAVELED BRUINS

In their eighth season under head coach John Savage, the Bruins have regularly played non-conference road series against teams away from the West Coast. In early March, UCLA swept a three-game series at then-No. 9 ranked Georgia. Last season, the Bruins played three consecutive extra-inning games at Nebraska. Aside from traveling to Omaha, Neb., for the 2010 College World Series, UCLA played three games in the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi, Calif., that season. In 2009, UCLA spent three consecutive weekends on the road away from the West (at the Houston College Classic, Oklahoma and East Carolina).

MR. VERSATILITY

Junior Trevor Brown has batted .304 with three home runs, a team-high 38 RBI and nine doubles. Over the last three seasons, he has emerged as UCLA's most versatile position player. Brown has made 18 career starts at catcher and 36 starts at first base this season, after having started 24 games at second base in 2011. In addition he has made eight career starts as UCLA's third baseman. Brown made his debut in the outfield (right field) on Tuesday against Pepperdine and has played shortstop in summer leagues.

WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

Through 12 weeks, UCLA has had seven Pac-12 Player/Pitcher of the Week award selections. Beau Amaral (March 26, April 16) and Jeff Gelalich (Feb. 29, March 13) have twice captured Player of the Week honors. Adam Plutko (March 13, May 7) has twice secured Pitcher of the Week honors this season. Grant Watson was named Pitcher of the Week (March 20) after logging two wins in three games.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Sophomore right-hander Ryan Deeter has secured Capital One Academic All-District VIII team honors, as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Deeter has gone 1-0 with a 0.76 ERA in 23.2 innings. The Bruins' reliever from Newark, Calif., ranks second among Pac-12 pitchers with 28 appearances (all in relief). Deeter has logged 20 strikeouts and 11 walks, limiting the opposition to a .200 batting average.

BIG LEAGUE BALLPARKS

UCLA will play Washington at Safeco Field, home of the Seattle Mariners, the night of Friday, May 11. That game will mark the Bruins' seventh contest played in a Major League Baseball stadium since the start of the 2009 season. UCLA played three games at Minute Maid Park (Houston) in 2009. The Bruins have played one game at Dodger Stadium each of the last three seasons (2010-2012). UCLA has gone 2-4 in those six games.

SEVEN-YEAR COMPOSITE

In conference games since 2006, UCLA ranks second in wins (103) and win percentage (.595). Through games played May 9, the Bruins rank fourth in total wins (244) and win percentage (.600). UCLA won the Pac-10 Conference title in outright fashion in 2011 for the first time since 1986 (three-way tie in 2000). The Bruins finished second in 2010 and earned a third-place finish from 2006 through 2009.

John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the finals of the College World Series in 2010, guiding UCLA to a 51-17 record last season. Previously, he became the first head coach in program history to have led UCLA to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has led UCLA to NCAA postseason appearances in five of his seven years in Westwood. Additionally, he has helped the program produce 51 MLB Draft selections.

Brandon Crawford – San Francisco Giants (Shortstop)

- Opened the 2012 season as San Francisco's starting shortstop after having played in 66 games in 2011
- Started all 158 games in his three seasons at UCLA (2006-2008), leading the Bruins to the postseason each year
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2008 MLB Draft by his hometown San Francisco Giants

Ben Francisco – Toronto Blue Jays (Outfielder)

- Was traded to Toronto in the offseason after playing for Philadelphia in 2009, 2010 and 2011
- Helped lead Philadelphia to its second consecutive National League pennant in October 2009
- Selected in the fifth round of the 2002 MLB Draft by Cleveland after his junior season at UCLA

Casey Janssen – Toronto Blue Jays (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Returned to Toronto's big league club in 2009 after having missed all of 2008 with a shoulder injury
- Totaled a 4.34 ERA and 22-15 record in 54 games (43 starts) through 265.1 innings in four years at UCLA
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2004 MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays

Josh Roenicke – Colorado Rockies (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Traded to Colorado (from Toronto) midway through 2011, pitching in 19 games for the Rockies out of the bullpen
- Made his major league debut in Sept. 2008 with Cincinnati, who chose him in the 10th round of the 2006 MLB Draft
- Starred as a center fielder and relief pitcher at UCLA – did not pitch regularly until the 2006 season

Chase Utley – Philadelphia Phillies (Second Baseman)

- Helped Philadelphia win the 2008 World Series and return as the National League Champions in 2009

UCLA's roster features 13 players who have been selected in the MLB Draft at least once. All 13 of those players were drafted following their senior seasons of high school. The Bruins' freshman class includes three players drafted as high school seniors in June 2011, while the sophomore class features six players drafted out of high school.

HIGHLY DRAFTED

Head coach John Savage has produced 51 MLB Draft selections in his seven seasons at UCLA. Last June, right-handers Gerrit Cole (Pittsburgh) and Trevor Bauer (Arizona) became the first and third overall selections in the MLB Draft. Three of Savage's pitchers have already been promoted to the major leagues (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke). Most recently, three-year UCLA shortstop Brandon Crawford was promoted to the San Francisco Giants in May 2011. Of the 51 draft selections, 16 have been selected in the first 10 rounds.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 35-man roster features 32 players from California and one from Arizona, Nevada and Washington. The team includes nine juniors, 13 sophomores and 13 freshmen. Redshirt junior Chase Brewer is the team's most veteran member. Brewer, along with juniors Beau Amaral, Trevor Brown, Jeff Gelalich, Scott Griggs, Tyler Heineman, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis, and redshirt sophomores Ryan Deeter, Matt Giovinazzo and Aaron Weimer are the remaining members from UCLA's 2010 College World Series team.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

UCLA has gone 14-8 against teams ranked in Baseball America's weekly top-25 poll this season. The Bruins enter this week having played the No. 1-ranked strength of schedule, as ranked by Boyd's World (boydsworld.com, a nationally-respected ranking service). Likewise, WarrenNolan.com has tabbed the Bruins' schedule as the No. 2 most challenging slate through the first 12 weeks of the regular season.
