BRUINS HEADED TO BERKELEY

UCLA opens a three-game series against California at Evans Diamond on Friday afternoon. The Bruins have won four of the last five series against California, including a three-game sweep of the Golden Bears in 2010, the last time UCLA played at Evans Diamond. UCLA enters the weekend in third place in the Pac-12 standings, 2.5 games behind conference leader Oregon (19-8) and one game back of second-place Arizona (16-8). The Bruins have compiled a 17-3 record on the road and at neutral sites this season, including a 9-3 Pac-12 road mark.

PERFECT 10

UCLA improved its midweek record to 10-0 on Tuesday, securing a 6-3 victory at No. 8 Cal State Fullerton. Scott Griggs struck out three batters in 1.2 scoreless innings to finish the game and pick up his first victory of the season. Kevin Kramer provided a two-run double in the second inning, and Trevor Brown had the game-winning RBI single in the top of the ninth to power UCLA's offense. The Bruins swept the two-game midweek series against Fullerton and has won four of the last five meetings against the Titans.

HEINEMAN SELECTED AS SEMIFINALIST

Tyler Heineman has been named as one of 12 semifinalists for the 2012 Johnny Bench Award, presented at the end of each season to the nation's top college catcher by the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission. The switch-hitting catcher from Pacific Palisades, Calif., has batted .359 with one home run, 24 RBI and 35 runs in 47 games. Heineman has thrown out 15 of 35 attempted base stealers (42.9 percent) and has hit safely in 38 of 46 contests. As a team, UCLA's defense ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in caught stealing percentage (44.4 percent).

GELALICH LEADS OFFENSE

Jeff Gelalich ranks first in batting average (.388) and second in on-base percentage (.473) in the Pac-12, through Tuesday's games. He belted three home runs in four games for UCLA last week and is tied for fourth in the Pac-12 Conference with nine round-trippers. The junior outfielder from La Verne, Calif., is among the conference's top performers in hits (2nd, 73), slugging percentage (6th, .574), walks (t-8th, 26) and runs scored (t-5th, 45).

FRIDAY'S STARTER

Sophomore right-hander Adam Plutko will take the mound for UCLA on Friday afternoon, having compiled a 7-3 record and 3.09 ERA in 13 starts. Plutko has gone 4-2 with a 3.91 ERA in eight Pac-12 starts. Over the last two weeks, he has limited the opposition to one run and seven hits in 15.1 innings, posting a 0.59 ERA. Plutko has thrived in UCLA's starting rotation the last two seasons (2011-12), going 14-7 with a 2.48 ERA in 192.0 innings.

VALUED IN RELIEF

David Berg has established UCLA's freshman single-season appearances record this spring, making a Pac-12-leading 36 appearances (tied for fourth-highest on UCLA's single-season list). Berg enters the weekend at California leading the Pac-12 with a 1.38 ERA and .171 opposing batting average. The right-hander from Covina, Calif., has tallied 41 strikeouts and 13 walks in 52.1 innings, the highest innings total of any UCLA reliever this season. Berg has pitched in UCLA's last 11 contests and in 13 of the Bruins' previous 14 ballgames.

ROAD WARRIORS

Since the start of the 2010 season, UCLA has gone 53-23 in all road and neutral site contests. This spring, the Bruins have gone 17-3 away from home, posting a 9-3 mark on the road in Pac-12 games. Last year, UCLA went 14-13 in road/neutral site games, while in 2010 the Bruins went 15-4 on the road and 7-3 at neutral sites. UCLA has gone 29-10 in Pac-12 Conference road games since 2010. In addition, the Bruins have logged five Pac-12 road sweeps in the last three years (2010 Washington, California; 2011 Oregon; 2012 Washington, Utah).

CENTER STAGE

Beau Amaral has started in center field and in the leadoff spot in UCLA's batting lineup in all 49 games. He enters the series against California sporting a .314 batting average with four home runs, 37 RBI and a Pac-12-best 53 runs scored. Amaral has registered a career .323 batting average in 171 games (164 starts), the most career games played or starts of any player currently on UCLA's roster.

GRIGGS SETS SAVES RECORD

Scott Griggs picked up his 13th save in UCLA's 4-2 win at Washington on Sunday, establishing the school's new single-season saves record. Griggs eclipsed Gabe Sollecito's 12-save total from 1992 after having recorded his fifth save in the last three weeks. He earned the win in relief at Cal State Fullerton on Tuesday. Griggs has scattered 10 hits in 30.1 innings this season, recording 52 strikeouts and 29 walks in 29 relief appearances.

WELL-TRAVELED BRUINS

In their eighth season under head coach John Savage, the Bruins have regularly played non-conference road series against teams away from the West Coast. In early March, UCLA swept a three-game series at then-No. 9 ranked Georgia. Last season, the Bruins played three consecutive extra-inning games at Nebraska. Aside from traveling to Omaha, Neb., for the 2010 College World Series, UCLA played three games in the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi, Calif., that season. In 2009, UCLA spent three consecutive weekends on the road away from the West (at the Houston College Classic, Oklahoma and East Carolina).

MR. VERSATILITY

Junior Trevor Brown has emerged as UCLA's most versatile position player. In three seasons, he has played catcher, first base, second base, third base and right field. Batting .299 with three homers and a team-best 39 RBI this season, Brown has made 19 career starts at catcher and 38 starts at first base this season, after having started 24 games at second base in 2011. He has made nine career starts at third base. Brown made his debut in the outfield (right field) on May 8 at Pepperdine and has played shortstop in summer leagues.

WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

Through 13 weeks, UCLA has had seven Pac-12 Player/Pitcher of the Week award selections. Beau Amaral (March 26, April 16) and Jeff Gelalich (Feb. 29, March 13) have twice captured Player of the Week honors. Adam Plutko (March 13, May 7) has twice secured Pitcher of the Week honors this season. Grant Watson was named Pitcher of the Week (March 20) after logging two wins in three games.

ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Sophomore right-hander Ryan Deeter has secured Capital One Academic All-District VIII team honors, as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Deeter has gone 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA in 24.0 innings. The Bruins' reliever from Newark, Calif., is tied for second among Pac-12 pitchers with 29 appearances (all in relief). Deeter has logged 20 strikeouts and 11 walks, limiting the opposition to a .198 batting average.

NEWS AND NOTES

The Bruins have tallied the nation's best winning percentage away from home (.850, includes 19 road and one neutral site game), going 17-3 in those 20 contests ... UCLA has swept three teams on the road this season (at Georgia, at Utah, at Washington) ... the Bruins' are amidst a nine-game stretch of road games before returning home to close the season against USC (May 25-27) at Jackie Robinson Stadium.

SEVEN-YEAR COMPOSITE

In conference games since 2006, UCLA ranks second in wins (106) and win percentage (.602). Through games played May 15, the Bruins are third in total wins (248) and rank fourth in win percentage (.603). UCLA won the Pac-10 Conference title in outright fashion in 2011 for the first time since 1986 (three-way tie in 2000). The Bruins finished second in 2010 and earned a third-place finish from 2006 through 2009.

John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the finals of the College World Series in 2010, guiding UCLA to a 51-17 record last season. Previously, he became the first head coach in program history to have led UCLA to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has led UCLA to NCAA postseason appearances in five of his seven years in Westwood. Additionally, he has helped the program produce 51 MLB Draft selections.

Brandon Crawford – San Francisco Giants (Shortstop)

- Opened the 2012 season as San Francisco's starting shortstop after having played in 66 games in 2011
- Started all 158 games in his three seasons at UCLA (2006-2008), leading the Bruins to the postseason each year
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2008 MLB Draft by his hometown San Francisco Giants

Ben Francisco – Toronto Blue Jays (Outfielder)

- Was traded to Toronto in the offseason after playing for Philadelphia in 2009, 2010 and 2011
- Helped lead Philadelphia to its second consecutive National League pennant in October 2009
- Selected in the fifth round of the 2002 MLB Draft by Cleveland after his junior season at UCLA

Casey Janssen – Toronto Blue Jays (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Returned to Toronto's big league club in 2009 after having missed all of 2008 with a shoulder injury
- Totaled a 4.34 ERA and 22-15 record in 54 games (43 starts) through 265.1 innings in four years at UCLA
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2004 MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays

Josh Roenicke – Colorado Rockies (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Traded to Colorado (from Toronto) midway through 2011, pitching in 19 games for the Rockies out of the bullpen
- Made his major league debut in Sept. 2008 with Cincinnati, who chose him in the 10th round of the 2006 MLB Draft
- Starred as a center fielder and relief pitcher at UCLA – did not pitch regularly until the 2006 season

Chase Utley – Philadelphia Phillies (Second Baseman)

- Helped Philadelphia win the 2008 World Series and return as the National League Champions in 2009

UCLA's roster features 13 players who have been selected in the MLB Draft at least once. All 13 of those players were drafted following their senior seasons of high school. The Bruins' freshman class includes three players drafted as high school seniors in June 2011, while the sophomore class features six players drafted out of high school.

HIGHLY DRAFTED

Head coach John Savage has produced 51 MLB Draft selections in his seven seasons at UCLA. Last June, right-handers Gerrit Cole (Pittsburgh) and Trevor Bauer (Arizona) became the first and third overall selections in the MLB Draft. Three of Savage's pitchers have already been promoted to the major leagues (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke). Most recently, three-year UCLA shortstop Brandon Crawford was promoted to the San Francisco Giants in May 2011. Of the 51 draft selections, 16 have been selected in the first 10 rounds.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 35-man roster features 32 players from California and one from Arizona, Nevada and Washington. The team includes nine juniors, 13 sophomores and 13 freshmen. Redshirt junior Chase Brewer is the team's most veteran member. Brewer, along with juniors Beau Amaral, Trevor Brown, Jeff Gelalich, Scott Griggs, Tyler Heineman, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis, and redshirt sophomores Ryan Deeter, Matt Giovinazzo and Aaron Weimer are the remaining members from UCLA's 2010 College World Series team.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

UCLA has gone 15-8 against teams ranked in Baseball America's weekly top-25 poll this season. The Bruins enter this weekend having played the No. 1-ranked strength of schedule, as ranked by Boyd's World (boydsworld.com, a nationally-respected ranking service). As of Wednesday, May 15, both websites Boyd's World.com and WarrenNolan.com had tabbed UCLA with the nation's No. 1 RPI (ratings percentage index).
