### **UCLA'S KEY ACCOMLISHMENTS IN 2012**

- Second-most single-season victories (47), four shy of UCLA's school-record 51 victories in 2010
- First time in school history that the Bruins have won back-to-back conference titles
- UCLA won its second NCAA Super Regional, advancing to the College World Series for the fourth time ever
- Bruins have tallied 133 wins through last three seasons, the best three-year win total in school history
- UCLA has elevated its batting average 46 points in 2012, posting a .309 mark (batted .263 in 2011)

### **ABOUT THE BRUINS**

- UCLA enters the College World Series having won 19 of its last 21 games and rides a nine-game winning streak.
- The Bruins went 5-0 in the NCAA Regional and Super Regional, outscoring their opposition by a 33-9 margin.
- · UCLA shared the Pac-12 title with Arizona, earning the tiebreak by virtue of a series win against the Wildcats.
- John Savage (8th year) is UCLA's only head coach to have led the Bruins to the College World Series twice.
- UCLA has compiled the nation's top record in road/neutral site games, going 20-4 away from home this year.
- The Bruins have advanced to the postseason in six of the last seven years (CWS in two of last three seasons).
- Seven UCLA ballplayers were selected in the 2012 MLB Draft (all within the draft's first 15 rounds).
- The Bruins are tied for ninth, nationally, with 133 wins in the last three seasons (ranks first among Pac-12 teams).
- UCLA is one of four schools to have hosted NCAA Regionals the last three years (Florida, South Carolina, Virginia).

### **WELCOME BACK**

UCLA returns to the College World Series this season after having lost to South Carolina in the championship series of the 2010 CWS. Seven players who contributed on the Bruins' 2010 squad are back in Omaha, Neb., for this season's College World Series (Beau Amaral, Trevor Brown, Jeff Gelalich, Scott Griggs, Tyler Heineman, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis). Six of those players saw action in the 2010 College World Series. The Bruins have compiled a 3-7 all-time record in three previous appearances at the College World Series, securing their first CWS wins in 2010.

### 40-WIN CLUB

The Bruins have posted a 47-14 record after having defeated TCU twice in the NCAA Los Angeles Super Regional. UCLA has totaled at least 40 wins for the second time in three seasons and for the eighth time in program history. The Bruins have won at least 40 games in each of their three previous College World Series seasons (1969, 1997, 2010). Prior to 2010, UCLA had not recorded 40 or more wins since going 45-21-1 in 1997. The Bruins have only reacehd the 50-win plateau during their record-setting 51-17 campaign in 2010.

### **BRUINS OUTLAST TCU**

UCLA limited TCU three runs, all via solo home runs, in two games to advance to the College World Series for the fourth time in school history. The Bruins won, 6-2, on Saturday, June 8, before closing the Super Regional with a 4-1 win on Saturday, June 9. Adam Plutko limited the visiting Horned Frogs to two runs and seven hits through seven innings in Game 1, earning the victory to improve to 11-3. Nick Vander Tuig held TCU to one run and five hits in six-plus innings in Game 2 to pick up the win. David Berg logged seven strikeouts in five scoreless innings of relief between both games.

### **REGIONAL SWEEP**

One weekend after sweeping USC to win a share of the Pac-12 title, the Bruins won three consecutive games in the NCAA Los Angeles Regional (June 1-3). Jeff Gelalich captured Most Outstanding Player honors, going 5-for-11 (.455) with two home runs, seven RBI and two runs in three games. Adam Plutko threw a complete game shutout in the Bruins' first contest, a 3-0 win over Creighton. Nick Vander Tuig allowed one unearned run and one hit in eight innings in a 7-1 win over New Mexico before the Bruins downed Creighton, 13-5, in the regional's final contest on June 3.

### **ALL-CONFERENCE SELECTIONS**

Six Bruins secured All-Pac-12 Conference acclaim, the largest number of selections from UCLA since the 1997 team had seven players chosen. Center fielder Beau Amaral and starting pitcher Adam Plutko earned their second career all-conference team selections. In addition, relievers David Berg and Scott Griggs, outfielder Jeff Gelalich and catcher Tyler Heineman earned All-Pac-12 team honors. Reliever Ryan Deeter was named an honorable mention selection. Berg was one of two freshmen (with Oregon State's Michael Conforto) to earn All-Pac-12 team honors.

### **PLUTKO ON THE HILL**

Sophomore right-hander Adam Plutko (11-3, 2.56) has established himself as the ace of UCLA's pitching staff. He allowed two runs and seven hits in the Bruins' 6-2 win over TCU on Friday, June 8. One week earlier, he scattered two hits in a complete game shutout as UCLA blanked Creighton, 3-0. In three career postseason starts, Plutko has surrendered two runs and 10 hits in 23.2 innings (0.78 ERA) while going 3-0. Plutko and former UCLA standout Treovr Bauer are the only pitchers in school history to have logged at least three postseason wins (Bauer notched four). A former standout at Glendora High School, Plutko was a sixth-round MLB Draft selection by the Houston Astros in 2010.

### **ROAD WARRIORS**

Since the start of the 2010 season, UCLA has gone 56.24 in all road and neutral site contests. This spring, the Bruins have gone 20.4 away from home, posting an 11.4 mark in Pac-12 road games. Last year, UCLA went 14.13 in road/neutral site games, while in 2010 the Bruins went 15.4 on the road and 7.3 at neutral sites. UCLA has gone 31.11 in Pac-12 Conference road games since 2010. In addition, the Bruins have logged five Pac-12 road sweeps in the last three years (at Washington and California in 2010, at Oregon in 2011, and at Utah and Washington in 2012)

### **EXPERIENCED OUTFIELD**

UCLA's trio of junior outfielders (Beau Amaral, Cody Keefer and Jeff Gelalich) has compiled a .321 career batting average (570-for-1773) in 502 combined games played the last three seasons. Amaral and Keefer have served as UCLA's starting center fielder and left fielder, respectively, since the start of their freshman year. Gelalich played in the outfield and served as a designated hitter the last two years before starting in right field this season. Amaral, Keefer and Gelalich have started in the outfield together in 59 of 61 games this season and in 77 career ballgames.

### Beau Amaral (CF, Junior - Huntington Beach, Calif.)

- Enters the CWS batting .313 with four home runs, five triples, nine doubles, 45 RBI and 62 runs
- · Was selected in the seventh round of the 2012 MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds
- Ranks second in the Pac-12 Conference with 62 runs, far above his team-leading 37 runs scored in 2011
- Has played in 183 career games, making 176 starts (173 in center field)
- · Became one of just 24 players in school history to have earned all-conference honors twice or more
- · Led UCLA with a .354 batting average as a freshman in 2010, batting .396 in 12 postseason games that year
- Ranks first on UCLA's all-time postseason list for games (21, tied), hits (29) and at-bats (87)

### Cody Keefer (LF, Junior - Davis, Calif.)

- · Enters the CWS batting .339 with 13 doubles, 36 RBI and 42 runs in 60 games (all starts in left field)
- · Was selected in the 15th round of the 2012 MLB Draft by the Miami Marlins
- · Compiled a .321 career batting average with three home runs, 34 doubles, 85 RBI and 100 runs in 163 games
- · Has batted .322 in nine career postseason games, going 9-for-28 with eight walks and a .500 OBP
- Registered a .345 batting average with nine doubles and 29 runs in 31 non-conference games
- · Posted a batting average over the .300 pleateau in each of his three seasons at UCLA
- · Ranks second among all current Bruins with 34 career doubles and 91 career walks

### Jeff Gelalich (RF, Junior - La Verne, Calif.)

- · Had been chosen as one of 30 semifinalists for the 2012 Golden Spikes Award (presented to nation's top player)
- · Was selected as a supplemental first round pick (No. 57 overall) in the 2012 MLB Draft by the Cincinnati Reds
- · Leads UCLA and ranks third in the Pac-12 with a .365 batting average; also has 11 home runs, 46 RBI
- · Reached base safely via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch safely in 57 of 61 games this season
- Entering the CWS, is the only Pac-12 ballplayer to rank among top five in batting average, slugging and OBP
- Has thrived in the postseason, batting .333 (23-for-70) with five homers, 15 RBI and 14 runs in 20 games
- Currently second in the Pac-12 in on-base percentage (.458) and tied for fifth in slugging (.558)

UCLA's bullpen has gone 15-5 with a 2.27 ERA and 16 saves in a combined 181 appearances this season. Four UCLA pitchers rank among the top six in the conference in total appearances. David Berg has pitched in a Pac-12 single-season record 47 games (all in relief). Scott Griggs and Ryan Deeter rank third (tied) in the Pac-12 with 35 appearances, while Grant Watson is sixth on the list this spring with 33 appearances.

### David Berg (RHP, Freshman - Covina, Calif.)

- Has gone 5-3 and leads the Pac-12 in ERA (1.58) and opposing batting average (.172) in 47 appearances
- · Currently tied for second on the NCAA's all-time single-season appearances list (with two other pitchers)
- · Had a streak earlier this season where he pitched in 18 consecutive ballgames (April 28-May 27)
- National ranks include second in hits allowed/9 IP (5.4), second in WHIP (0.83) and fifth in ERA (1.58),
- One of two Pac-12 freshmen named to the all-conference team (with Oregon State's Michael Conforto)

### Ryan Deeter (RHP, RS Sophomore - Newark, Calif.)

- · Has gone 1-0 with a 0.94 ERA, 25 strikeouts and 16 walks in 28.2 innings, all in relief
- Named a Capital One Academic All-District VIII selection earlier this season
- · Secured first-team Pac-12 Conference All-Academic honors, having compiled a cumulative 3.89 GPA
- · Among UCLA's best performers in the classroom, is majoring in mathematics-economics
- · Has not allowed more than three hits or more than one run in any relief appearance this season

### Scott Griggs (RHP, Junior - Alamo, Calif.)

- Ranks second in the Pac-12 and ninth in the nation with 15 saves, UCLA's new single-season record
- · Was selected in the eighth round of the 2012 MLB Draft earlier on June 6 by the Los Angeles Dodgers
- Has tallied 64 strikeouts, second-highest total on UCLA's staff, and 31 walks in 36.2 innings
- Secured All-Pac-12 Conference honors for the first time in his career
- · Has recorded three strikeouts in one inning six times this season

### **UCLA'S JUNIOR CLASS**

Led by the team's junior class, UCLA has achieved its highest three-year win total (133). Five of the team's juniors played extensively as freshmen in 2010, helping guide UCLA to the finals of the College World Series and to a record-setting 51-win total that season. UCLA won 120 games from 1967 through 1969 and had multiple three-year stints that featured 113 victories. UCLA's 51 wins in 2010 and 47 wins in 2012 are the two highest win totals in school history.

### ALL-NCAA REGIONAL TEAM

Jeff Gelalich headlined the 2012 NCAA Los Angeles Regional's All-Tournament Team (June 1-3). Joining Gelalich from UCLA on the All-Tournament Team included second baseman Trevor Brown, shortstop Pat Valaika, outfielders Beau Amaral and Cody Keefer, along with right-handed pitchers Adam Plutko and Nick Vander Tuig (UCLA). Amaral, a junior from Huntington Beach, Calif., has earned NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team honors in each of his three seasons at UCLA. Keefer and Gelalich have secured All-Tournament Team acclaim at the last two NCAA L.A. Regionals.

### ATOP THE LEADERBOARD

Jeff Gelalich ranks third in the Pac-12 with a .365 batting average and is fourth in the conference with 11 home runs. The junior from La Verne, Calif., was selected No. 57 overall (supplemental first round) by the Cincinnati Reds in the 2012 MLB Draft on Monday, June 4. Gelalich's draft selection came just 24 hours after he earned Most Outstanding Player honors at the NCAA Los Angeles Regional on a night in which he went 3-for-4 with two homers and four RBI. Gelalich's younger brother, Matt, played center field as a freshman for Pepperdine this season.

### **INVALUABLE BACKSTOP**

Junior catcher Tyler Heineman was the only catcher selected to the All-Pac-12 Conference team. He enters the College World Series second on the Bruins' ballclub with a .343 batting average and ranks fourth in the conference with a .444 on-base percentage. Heineman has struck out just 14 times in 257 plate appearances (5.7 percent). The native of Pacific Palisades, Calif., has started 56 games (49 starts at catcher), batting primarily in the No. 2 slot in UCLA's lineup. Heineman has thrown out 22 of 46 attempted base stealers (47.8 percent clip).

### WELL-TRAVELED BRUINS

In their eighth season under head coach John Savage, the Bruins have regularly played non-conference road series against teams away from the West Coast. In early March this season, UCLA swept a three-game series at SEC opponent and then-No. 9 ranked Georgia. In 2011, the Bruins played played three consecutive extra-inning games at Nebraska. Aside from traveling to Omaha, Neb., for the 2010 College World Series, UCLA played three games in the Whataburger College Classic in Corpus Christi, Calif., that spring. In 2009, UCLA spent three consecutive weekends away from the West. The Bruins played three games in the Houston College Classic before back-to-back weekends on the road playing three-game series at Oklahoma and East Carolina).

### Brandon Crawford - San Francisco Giants (Shortstop)

- Opened the 2012 season as San Francisco's starting shortstop after having played in 66 games in 2011
- Started all 158 games in his three seasons at UCLA (2006-2008), leading the Bruins to the postseason each year
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2008 MLB Draft by his hometown San Francisco Giants

### Ben Francisco - Toronto Blue Jays (Outfielder)

- Was traded to Toronto in the offseason after playing for Philadelphia in 2009, 2010 and 2011
- Helped lead Philadelphia to its second consecutive National League pennant in October 2009
- Selected in the fifth round of the 2002 MLB Draft by Cleveland after his junior season at UCLA

### Casey Janssen – Toronto Blue Jays (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Returned to Toronto's big league club in 2009 after having missed all of 2008 with a shoulder injury
- Totaled a 4.34 ERA and 22-15 record in 54 games (43 starts) through 265.1 innings in four years at UCLA
- Selected in the fourth round of the 2004 MLB Draft by the Toronto Blue Jays

### Josh Roenicke - Colorado Rockies (Right-Handed Pitcher)

- Traded to Colorado (from Toronto) midway through 2011, pitching in 19 games for the Rockies out of the bullpen
- Made his major league debut in Sept. 2008 with Cincinnati, who chose him in the 10th round of the 2006 MLB Draft
- Starred as a center fielder and relief pitcher at UCLA did not pitch regularly until the 2006 season

### Chase Utley - Philadelphia Phillies (Second Baseman)

- Helped Philadelphia win the 2008 World Series and return as the National League Champions in 2009
- Has posted a career .290 batting average and 188 home runs through 10 major league seasons
- Selected No. 15 overall in the first round of the 2000 MLB Draft by the Philadelphia Phillies

This season's MLB Draft marked just the second time in the draft's 48-year history in which UCLA had seven or more players selected within the first 15 rounds. Tyler Heineman became UCLA's highest-drafted catcher since 1990, when Paul Ellis was taken in the supplemental first round (No. 30) by the St. Louis Cardinals. Jeff Gelalich became the highest-drafted UCLA position player since Chase Utley went No. 15 overall to the Philadelphia Phillies in 2000. Over the last 16 seasons (1997-2012), UCLA has seen nine of its players selected in the first round or suppplemental first round.

### HIGHLY DRAFTED

Head coach John Savage has produced 58 MLB Draft selections in his eight seasons at UCLA. Earlier this month, Jeff Gelalich became the fourth UCLA player under Savage's tenure to have been picked in the first round or supplemental first round. Last June, right-handers Gerrit Cole (Pittsburgh) and Trevor Bauer (Arizona) became the first and third overall selections in the MLB Draft. Three of Savage's pitchers have already been promoted to the major leagues (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke). Most recently, three-year UCLA shortstop Brandon Crawford was promoted to the San Francisco Giants in May 2011. Of the 58 draft selections, 21 have been selected in the first 10 rounds.

### **ROSTER BREAKDOWN**

UCLA's 34-man roster features 31 players from California and one from Arizona, Nevada and Washington. The team includes nine juniors, 12 sophomores and 13 freshmen. Redshirt junior Chase Brewer is the team's most veteran member. Brewer, along with juniors Beau Amaral, Trevor Brown, Jeff Gelalich, Scott Griggs, Tyler Heineman, Cody Keefer and Cody Regis, and redshirt sophomores Ryan Deeter, Matt Giovinazzo and Aaron Weimer are the remaining members from UCLA's 2010 College World Series team.

### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

UCLA has gone 15-8 against teams ranked in *Baseball America*'s weekly top-25 poll this season. The Bruins enter this week having played the No. 1-ranked strength of schedule, as ranked by Boyd's World (boydsworld.com, a nationally-respected ranking service). Entering the NCAA Tournament, WarrenNolan.com and BoydsWorld.com had tabbed UCLA with the nation's No. 1 and No. 2 RPI (ratings percentage index), respectively.

### **SEVEN-YEAR COMPOSITE**

In conference games since 2006, UCLA ranks second in wins (111) and win percentage (.610). The Bruins are third in total wins (259) and fourth in overall win percentage (.612) among Pac-12 teams. UCLA and Arizona split the 2012 Pac-12 title, and UCLA won the 2011 Pac-10 championship in outright fashion for the first time since 1986. The Bruins finished second in 2010 and earned a third-place finish from 2006-09.

### **ROAD RULES**

The Bruins have recorded the nation's best winning percentage away from home (.833) going 20-4 in those 24 contests. UCLA completed its midweek schedule with an 11-0 record and went 9-0 against Big West Conference opponents this season. The Bruins' only road losses came at Arizona (April 13), at Oregon State (April 21-22) and at California (May 20).

### **MR. VERSATILITY**

Junior Trevor Brown has emerged as UCLA's most versatile position player. In three years, he has played catcher, first base, second base, third base and right field. This season, he batted .328 with a team-leading 51 RBI in all 61 games. Brown has made 22 career starts at catcher and 39 starts at first base this season. He has started 32 career games at second base (including 24 starts at that position in 2011) and nine at third base. Brown made his debut in the outfield, playing right field, on May 8 in UCLA's 6-2 victory at Pepperdine.

### **SCOUTING THE FIELD**

UCLA has never played Stony Brook on the baseball diamond, but is familiar with Pac-12 opponent Arizona. The Bruins have won the season series against the Wildcats each of the last seven seasons (2006-12). UCLA took two of three games at Arizona in April 2012, allowing the Bruins to win the tiebreak between the conference co-champions. Similar to Stony Brook, UCLA has never before faced Florida State. Opposite UCLA's side of the College World Series bracket, the Bruins played Florida and South Carolina at the 2010 College World Series and defeated Kent State at home in the 2010 NCAA Los Angeles Regional.

### PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

UCLA was selected fourth in the Pac-12's preseason coaches' poll. Stanford, Arizona and Arizona State earned the top three spots, respectively. The remaining seven teams included (in order) Oregon State, California, Oregon, USC, Washington State, Washington and Utah. UCLA has not finished any lower than third place in the Pac-12 or Pac-10 Conference since 2005. The Bruins won the Pac-10 title in outright fashion last spring for the first time since 1986 (three-way tie in 2000).

### **UCLA IN THE POSTSEASON UNDER HEAD COACH JOHN SAVAGE**

### 2006 NCAA Malibu Regional (at Pepperdine)

### Record: 2-2 Finish: 3

In John Savage's second season as UCLA's head coach, the Bruins finished third in the Pac-10 after having being picked to finish eighth out of nine programs in the preseason coaches' poll. UCLA entered the postseason with a 32-23 record and advanced in the winner's bracket with a day one victory over UC Irvine (3-2), as Hector Ambriz surrendered two unearned runs in a complete-game victory. Pepperdine defeated UCLA on its home turf, 6-0, on Saturday. The Bruins dropped a 2-1 decision to No. 4-seed Missouri in an elimination game on Sunday. Missouri defeated Pepperdine on Sunday and Monday to advance into the NCAA Super Regional round.

### 2007 NCAA Long Beach Regional (at Long Beach State)

### Record: 3-0 Finish: 1

Returning the bulk of players from UCLA's 2006 postseason ballclub, the 2007 Bruins used its talented starting rotation to sweep the Long Beach Regional. Tyson Brummett came within one out of tossing a complete game in a 7-3 NCAA Regional-opening win over Pepperdine. Gavin Brooks threw a complete game the next night, leading UCLA past lois-Chicago, 3-1. Tim Murphy tossed a complete game on Sunday evening, as the Bruins overcame early deficits of 3-0 and 4-2 to defeat host Long Beach State, 7-4. Jermaine Curtis was named the NCAA Long Beach Regional's Most Valuable Player, and the Bruins clinched a spot in the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time since 2000.

### 2007 NCAA Fullerton Super Regional (at Cal State Fullerton)

### Record: 0-2 Finish: 2nd

The Bruins lost consecutive games to Cal State Fullerton at Goodwin Field in NCAA Super Regional action. The host Titans jumped ahead, 3-0, in the top of the first and built a 6-1 lead after three frames. Tyson Brummett absorbed the loss in Game 1, surrendering nine runs and eight hits in 4.1 innings. Game 2 featured a pitcher's duel between UCLA's Gavin Brooks and Cal State Fullerton's Jeff Kaplan. UCLA led 1-0 after five innings, before Fullerton tied the game, 1-1, in the sixth. Fullerton took a 2-1 lead in the seventh inning. Brooks finished the complete-game performance with 12 strikeouts and no walks. UCLA stranded the potential game-tying run at third base in the top of the ninth inning.

### 2008 NCAA Fullerton Regional (at Cal State Fullerton)

### Record: 2-2 Finish: 2nd

UCLA won the first two games of the NCAA Regional at Cal State Fullerton, defeating Virginia (3-2) on Friday before beating Cal State Fullerton (11-4) on Saturday. Tim Murphy allowed two runs (one earned) and eight hits in 7.2 innings versus Virginia. The next night, UCLA led at Cal State Fullerton by 10-2 margin after four frames. Cal State Fullerton responded with an 11-8 victory on Sunday night, forcing a winner-take-all elimination contest on Monday. UCLA overcame an early 2-0 deficit, tying the game, 2-2, in the fourth inning. The Titans led, 5-3, after six innings. UCLA got one run across in the seventh and stranded the potential game-tying run at third base in the ninth inning.

### 2010 NCAA Los Angeles Regional (at UCLA)

### Record: 3-0 Finish: 1s

The Bruins swept through the NCAA Regional at Jackie Robinson Stadium, UCLA's first time hosting any postseason games since 1986. UCLA defeated Kent State (15-1), LSU (6-3) and UC Irvine (6-2) on consecutive evenings to advance to a home Super Regional against Cal State Fullerton. UCLA led 7-0 after three innings against Kent State, Gerrit Cole threw five shutout innings of one-hit ball, and the Bruins held on for the 15-1 victory. Trevor Bauer struck out 11 batters in eight-plus innings against defending national champion LSU and Dan Klein recorded the save on Saturday night. Cody Regis' three-run homer in the eighth inning iced UCLA's 6-2 win over UC Irvine in the Regional final.

### 2010 NCAA Los Angeles Super Regional (at UCLA)

### Record: 2-1 Finish: 1s

After losing the series opener to Cal State Fullerton, 4-3, Tyler Rahmatulla provided one of the most dramatic moments in UCLA baseball history in Game 2 of the NCAA Los Angeles Super Regional. Down to their final out in the top of the ninth trailing 6-5, the Bruins saw Blair Dunlap draw a two-out walk before Rahmatulla drilled a two-run home run to left-center field. Fullerton tied the game, 7-7, before UCLA broke through with four runs in the 10th to win, 11-7. Rob Rasmussen pitched a complete game two-hitter in Game 3, leading UCLA to a CWS berth-clinching 8-1 win.

### 2010 NCAA College World Series (Omaha, Neb.)

### Record: 3-3 Finish: 2n

UCLA continued its most successful baseball season in 2010 with its third-ever trip to the College World Series, being played that summer at Rosenblatt Stadium for the final year. The Bruins advanced in the winner's bracket by defeating Florida (11-3) and TCU (5-3) in their first two games. Following a three-day break, UCLA resumed its national championship quest by losing to TCU, 6-2. In an elimination game against the Horned Frogs on June 26, Trevor Bauer struck out 13 batters in eight innings in triple-digit afternoon heat to lead the Bruins to a 10-3 win. South Carolina defeated UCLA in both CWS championship series games to win its first NCAA baseball title.

### 2011 NCAA Los Angeles Regional (at UCLA)

### Record: 2-2 Finish: 2

San Francisco's Kyle Zimmer threw a complete game shutout against UCLA in Game 1, as the Dons secured a 3-0 victory over UCLA and Bruins' ace pitcher Gerrit Cole. The Bruins rebounded with a 3-1 victory over Fresno State on Saturday in an elimination game. In his final collegiate start, Bauer threw his ninth consecutive complete game, striking out 14 batters and walking two. Adam Plutko limited San Francisco to one hit in 7.2 scoreless innings the next afternoon, as UCLA secured a 4-1 victory. In the Regional final that night, UC Irvine overcame a 3-2 deficit by scoring two runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to advance to the NCAA Charlottesville Super Regional.

### 2012 NCAA Los Angeles Regional (at UCLA)

### Record: 3-0 Finish: 1st

Outstanding starting pitching performances on back-to-back nights from Adam Plutko and Nick Vander Tuig helped the Bruins push into the winner's bracket of the 2012 NCAA Los Angeles Regional. Plutko scattered two hits in a complete game shutout against Creigton (3-0) on June 1. The following eveing, Vander Tuig carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning as UCLA defeated New Mexico, 7-1. Vander Tuig logged a career-high 11 strikeouts, allowing just one hit through eight frames. Zack Weiss earned the victory in the regional final, allowing three runs and seven hits in five innings as the Bruins defeated Creighton, 13-5. Jeff Gelalich went 3-for-4 with two homers and four RBI in that win.

### 2012 NCAA Los Angeles Super Regional (at UCLA)

### Record: 2-0 Finish: 1

Looking to clinch their second trip to the College World Series in three seasons, UCLA earned a pair of hard-fought victories over TCU at home in the 2012 NCAA Los Angeles Super Regional. Adam Plutko delivered a strong start against the Horned Frogs in the opening contest, allowing two runs and seven hits to secure the victory and improve his record to 11-3. Plutko captured his third win in as many career postseason starts. UCLA broke the contest open with a five-run sixth inning, highlighted by Cody Regis' three-run double. Nick Vander Tuig limited TCU to one run and five hits in six-plus innings in the second game to earn the win. David Berg threw three scoreless innings out the bullpen to log his first career save. Berg finished Super Regional with five scoreless innings of relief for UCLA.

### LAST THREE SEASONS

The Bruins rank among the top 10 in the nation in victories over the last three seasons (2010-12). UCLA, Florida, South Carolina and Florida State have advanced to the College World Series in at least two of the last three seasons. UCLA, Virginia, South Carolina and Florida are the only schools in the country to have hosted NCAA Regionals the last three years.

### **POSTSEASON NOTES**

UCLA is making its 18th postseason appearance this season and its fourth appearance at the College World Series (1969, 1997, 2010, 2012). Head coach John Savage has led the Bruins to NCAA Regionals in six of his eight seasons at the helm. The Bruins have hosted NCAA postseason games in five seasons — 1969, 1986, 2010, 2011 and 2012. Over the past three years, the Bruins have gone 10-3 in 13 postseason contests at UCLA's Jackie Robinson Stadium.

### **CW5 PARTICIPANTS**

The Bruins' 2010 team that advanced to the finals of the College World Series featured several freshman (now juniors) that earned considerable playing time in Omaha. Looking at the Bruins' 2010 roster, 11 players from that season's team remain in 2012. Of those 11 ballplayers, six competed in the 2010 playoffs and just five played in that season's College World Series at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha.

### **POSTSEASON BESTS**

Jeff Gelalich became the sixth player in UCLA history to have hit two home runs in a postseason game during his 3-for-4, four-RBI effort against Creighton on Sunday, June 3. His two-home run game sparked the Bruins to a 13-5 win over Creighton in the final NCAA Los Angeles Regional contest. Cody Regis accomplished the feat as a freshman in 2010, belting two homers in UCLA's 11-7 win over Cal State Fullerton in the NCAA Super Regional In addition, Nick Vander Tuig's 11-strikeout effort against New Mexico on June 2 is tied for the fifth-most strikeouts in a UCLA postseason game by one pitcher.

### **PLUTKO EARNS THREE**

Adam Plutko is one of just two pitchers in school history to have tallied three victories in postseason play. Trevor Bauer went 4-0 in five postseason starts for UCLA in 2010 and 2011. Plutko enters the College World Series having gone 3-0 with a 0.78 ERA and a .127 opposing batting average in 23.2 innings. As a freshman last season (June 5), the Bruins' then-freshman starter was masterful in UCLA's 4-1 win in an elimination contest against San Francisco. Plutko allowed one hit in 7.2 shutout innings. He issued one walk in the second inning and did not allow a hit until the fifth inning.

### **IMPRESSIVE RESUME**

Head coach John Savage has posted a 21-12 overall record for the Bruins in six trips to the postseason. The Bruins' eighth-year head coach has gone 14-6 at NCAA Regionals, including perfect 3-0 records at the 2007 Long Beach Regional and at the 2010 and 2012 Los Angeles Regionals. His ballclubs have gone 4-3 in three trips to NCAA Super Regionals. The Bruins posted a 3-3 record at the 2010 College World Series, advancing to the championship series for the first time in school history. Savage served as the pitching coach at the University of Southern California (USC) from 1997-2000. He helped lead the Trojans to the 1998 national title and another apperance at the CWS in 2000.

In eight seasons as UCLA's head coach, John Savage has established the Bruins as a national championship contender. He has guided UCLA to the postseason in six of the last seven seasons, including trips to the College World Series in two of the last three years (2010, 2012).

Savage guided the Bruins to their first appearance in the finals of the College World Series in 2010. Nonetheless, his work with UCLA's program in 2012 may be his finest achievement yet. Savage has led the Bruins to a 47-14 record and its second consecutive conference title after UCLA lost its top two pitchers in 2011 (Gerrit Cole, Trevor Bauer) to the MLB Draft as the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections, respectively, last summer.

Through eight years as UCLA's head coach, Savage has helped produce 58 MLB Draft selections. Most recently, the Bruins had seven current players selected within the first 15 rounds. Jeff Gelalich headlined this year's group of draftees as the No. 57 overall pick (supplemental round).

In 2012, UCLA won at least 40 games for the second time in three years and for the eighth time in program history. The Bruins hosted an NCAA Regional at Jackie Robinson Stadium for the third straight season. UCLA hosted an NCAA Super Regional for the second time in school history (2010, 2012). UCLA won the Pac-12 co-championship (tied with Arizona), marking the first time in school history that the Bruins had won back-to-back conference titles. Spearheaded by hitting coach Rex Peters, UCLA has elevated its batting average by 46 points in 2012.

Over the past three seasons, Savage has led UCLA to great heights. UCLA has gone 47-14 this season before earning the NCAA Tournament's No. 2 national seed. UCLA won the Pac-12 co-championship in 2012 by winning eight of its final nine Pac-12 games, including a three-game sweep of USC during the regular season's final weekend. The Bruins enter the College World Series having won 19 of its last 21 games and are riding a nine-game winning streak.

In 2011, the Bruins captured their first outright Pac-10 title since 1986. After hosting an NCAA Regional, Cole and Bauer were selected No. 1 and No. 3, respectively, in the first round of the 2011 MLB Draft. No college program had seen two of its players selected within the draft's first three selections since 1978 (Arizona State).

In July 2011, Bauer became UCLA's first-ever Golden Spikes Award winner, earning a coveted award presented annually by the USA Baseball Federation to the nation's top amateur player. Bauer became the first player in school history to earn National Player of the Year honors from either Baseball America or Collegiate Baseball.

Savage has become one of eight head coaches in college baseball history to have led his team to a College World Series, produced a No. 1 overall MLB Draft selection and coached a Golden Spikes Award winner. Savage is joined in that illustrious circle by former head coaches Skip Bertman (LSU) and Jim Brock (Arizona State) and current head coaches Tim Corbin (Vanderbilt), Augie Garrido (Cal State Fullerton, now at Texas), Jack Leggett (Clemson), Mike Martin (Florida State) and Jim Morris (Miami).

In 2011, Savage helped UCLA's pitching staff post the nation's third-lowest ERA (2.44), the lowest mark on record in school history. Likewise, the Bruins' staff finished the year second, nationally, in strikeouts per nine innings (9.8) and hits allowed per nine innings (6.61). In 2010, UCLA logged the nation's second-lowest ERA (3.00). That year, the Bruins' staff ranked first in the country in strikeouts per nine innings (10.2) and second in hits allowed per nine innings (7.31).

In 2010, Savage helped lead UCLA to its most successful season in school history while the Bruins played the nation's most challenging schedule, as ranked by Boyd's World. UCLA set the school record for single-season wins (51) and most wins during the regular season (43) while landing their first-ever national seed (No. 6-seed) in the NCAA Tournament. During the Bruins' run through the College World Series, Savage was named the National Coach of the Year by CollegeBaseballInsider.com.

Savage's work with UCLA's pitchers has been most evident with the development of the strong 1-2 punch in Cole and Bauer. In three seasons at UCLA (2009-11), Bauer established UCLA's all-time records in strikeouts (460), wins (34) and innings (373.1) and set the program's top two marks in single-season strikeouts. Bauer logged a nation-leading and Pac-12-record 203 strikeouts in 2011 after having led the country with 165 strikeouts in 2010. Cole served as UCLA's Friday night pitcher all three seasons (2009-11), logging 376 strikeouts, the second-highest career total in program history.

Additionally, Savage's players at UCLA have seen success in the Major League Draft and in professional baseball. Over the last eight seasons (2005-12), UCLA has produced 58 draft selections, including a program-recorditying 12 draft picks in 2006. Four of Savage's ballplayers at UCLA have been promoted to the major leagues, including left-hander David Huff (Cleveland), right-handers Josh Roenicke (Toronto) and Hector Ambriz (Cleveland) and shortstop Brandon Crawford (San Francisco). Of those 58 selections, 12 have been chosen within the draft's first five rounds and 21 through the first 10 rounds.

### **DID YOU KNOW?**

John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the finals of the College World Series in 2010, guiding UCLA to a 51-17 record that year. He has been UCLA's only head coach to ever lead the program to three consecutive NCAA Regionals, doing so twice (2006-08 and 2010-12). UCLA's No. 2 national seed in this season's tournament is the program's highest-ever national seed. In fact, it's just the second time UCLA has been awarded one of the tournament's eight national seeds. Savage was at the helm when UCLA secured the No. 6 national seed in 2010.




