BRUINS IN THE POSTSEASON

UCLA has advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive season and fifth time in the last six years under seventh-year head coach John Savage. UCLA will host the NCAA Los Angeles Regional at Jackie Robinson Stadium for the second straight year after having won the Pac-10 Championship for the first time since 2000 (first outright conference title since 1986). The Bruins have earned their 17th berth to an NCAA Regional. Last June, UCLA advanced to the finals of the College World Series for the first time in school history.

REGIONAL AT A GLANCE

The Bruins open NCAA Regional play against San Francisco, the 2011 West Coast Conference Champion. UCLA swept a three-game series to open the season against USF at home. UCLA will send junior right-hander Gerrit Cole to the hill on Friday. The Bruins split a pair of midweek games against UC Irvine this season and won the NCAA Regional Final at home against the Anteaters last year. UCLA has not played Fresno State since opening the 2006 season against the Bulldogs, the 2011 Western Athletic Conference Champions.

PAC-10 CHAMPIONS

Last weekend, UCLA secured its first outright Pac-10 title since 1986 (none of UCLA's current players were born until 1987). The Bruins entered the weekend trailing Oregon State by one game. Oregon State was swept in a three-game series at Oregon. UCLA's series victory over Arizona State was its first against the Sun Devils since 2006 and first in Tempe, Ariz., since 2003. Since the Pac-10 was established in 1979, the Bruins have won outright Pac-10 titles in 1979, 1986 and 2011, while earning a split of the championship in 2000.

DOMINANT PITCHING

UCLA has relied on its pitching staff this season, as the Bruins have posted a Pac-10 best 2.45 ERA with a conference leading 533 strikeouts, the second-highest total by UCLA in the modern era (dating to 1965). Trevor Bauer has gone 12-2 with a 1.27 ERA and leads the nation with 189 strikeouts. Gerrit Cole has gone 6-7 with a 3.28 ERA, logging 108 strikeouts and 23 walks in 107.0 innings. Adam Plutko has served as the team's third starter, going 6-4 with a 2.16 ERA, recording 86 strikeouts in 100.0 innings.

CENTER STAGE

Sophomore Beau Amaral has batted .307 through the regular season, making 54 starts (50 in center field). The native of Huntington Beach, Calif., has compiled a season-high 15 game hitting streak, matching his longest such streak from his freshman season. Amaral has been among UCLA's sparkplugs at the top of the lineup, posting a .411 slugging percentage with two home runs, three triples, 16 doubles and a team-high 35 runs. Amaral led UCLA in 2010 with a .354 batting average, playing in 64 games (57 starts).

WELL AWARDED

Junior right-hander Trevor Bauer has been named *Collegiate Baseball's* National Player of the Year and the Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year. He has thrown eight consecutive complete games, totaling nine this season. In a 7-0 win at Arizona State last Saturday, Bauer struck out 14 and walked one, scattering just five hits through nine frames. He stands atop the UCLA career record book in strikeouts (446), wins (33) and innings (364.1). Bauer's 14 career complete games is tied with two former pitchers for second place on UCLA's all-time list.

COLE'S IN CONTROL

Junior right-hander Gerrit Cole has notched 108 strikeouts and just 23 walks (two intentional) in 107.0 innings this season. Sporting a 6-7 record and 3.28 ERA as the Bruins' regular Friday night starter, Cole earned the victory in UCLA's 10-3 series-opening win at Arizona State last Friday. He struck out nine hitters, allowing three runs and nine hits through eight innings. The resident of Santa Ana, Calif., ranks second on UCLA's all-time strikeouts list (365) and fifth in career innings pitched (315.0).

POINT BLANK

UCLA has tied the school record for shutouts in a single season with 10. The Bruins' 1969 ballclub also fired 10 shutouts en route to earning the program's first-ever appearance to that season's College World Series. UCLA tallied nine shutouts in 1978, eight in 1967 and five in 2008, 1992 and 1977. Last season, UCLA's staff hurled just one shutout. The Bruins opened this season with six shutouts through their first 18 games. Trevor Bauer has hurled three complete-game shutouts, and Gerrit Cole and Adam Plutko each have one.

DIGGING THE LONG BALL

While home run totals have dropped around the nation this season, sophomore Cody Regis leads UCLA with six round-trippers and 43 RBI. Regis and Dean Espy led the team with nine home runs on year ago. Regis opened the 2011 campaign hitting .179 through 14 games before heating up, posting a .312 batting average with all six home runs and 38 of his 43 RBI in UCLA's last 51 games. Similar to his freshman year in 2010, Regis has belted four homers in the last 16 games. Last season, he did not hit any of his nine homers until May 7.

NATIONAL WATCH LISTS

Junior right-hander Trevor Bauer has been named one of 30 semifinalists for the Golden Spikes Award, as announced by USA Baseball on May 31. Three finalists for the award will be announced Monday, June 6. The Golden Spikes Award is presented at the conclusion of each season to the nation's top amateur baseball player. Bauer has been named as one of 25 pitchers to the National Pitcher of the Year Watch List, as announced by the College Baseball Hall of Fame. In addition, Bauer has been selected as one of 36 semifinalists for the annual Dick Howser Trophy.

BRUINS VERSUS DONS

UCLA opened the 2011 regular season by sweeping a three-game series against San Francisco during a rainy weekend at Jackie Robinson Stadium. The Bruins outscored the Dons, 8-1, in that series, limiting USF to one unearned run and 12 hits through 27 innings. Jeff Gelalich keyed UCLA's offense, going 5-for-9 (.559) with one triple and one double. Gerrit Cole threw a complete-game shutout, striking out 11 batters and walking only one, in a 1-0 victory on Opening Day. Despite hitting just .233 against USF, the Bruins posted a .327 on-base percentage.

HISTORY WITH THE 'EATERS

John Savage assumed UCLA's head coach position in July 2004 after having spent three seasons as UC Irvine's head coach (2002-04). Savage posted a 4-0 record against UCLA during those three years and has since gone 11-6 against UC Irvine in seven seasons as UCLA's head coach. He arrived at UC Irvine during the 2000-2001 school year to resurrect a previously-dormant baseball program after having spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's pitching coach under then-USC head coach Mike Gillespie, now UC Irvine's third-year skipper.

AGAINST FRESNO STATE

UCLA has not faced Fresno State since opening the 2006 season with three games against the Bulldogs at Jackie Robinson Stadium. The Bruins won one of three contests in that season-opening series, dropping the first two games before salvaging the weekend with a 12-2 victory on Sunday. Since that meeting, Fresno State has earned four trips to the NCAA Tournament (2006-09) and won the title at the 2008 College World Series. Dating back to 1956, UCLA has posted a 26-22 all-time record against Fresno State.

NEWS AND NOTES

UCLA has limited the opposition to two runs or fewer in 31 games (26-5 record) and to one run or less in 18 games (18-0 record) ... the Bruins lead the Pac-10 Conference in ERA (2.45), opponent batting average (.205), strikeouts (533) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.73) ... UCLA's pitchers have limited the opposition to six hits or fewer in 30 of 55 games this season ... UCLA had a season-high 21 strikeouts against Nebraska (March 5) ... junior infielder Tyler Rahmatulla has been suspended for the remainder of the 2011 season (academics).

UCLA'S KEY PERFORMERS (OFFENSE)

Beau Amaral (Sophomore, Center Field)

- Among UCLA's most consistent hitters, has started 54 of 55 games, including the last 50 in center field
- Second on the team with a .307 batting average, ranks first in on-base percentage (.411)
- Posted a team-leading .396 batting average in all 12 postseason games in 2010 as a freshman
- Has hit safely in 15 consecutive games, tying his season-high hitting streak from 2010

Dean Espy (Junior, First Base)

- Espy is the only Bruin to have played in all 55 games, making 54 starts (53 at first base, one as the DH)
- One of UCLA's most powerful hitters, leads the team with a .322 average and is second with 39 RBI
- Batted .529 (9-for-17) in four games last week, going 7-for-14 (.500) with one homer and six RBI at ASU
- Enters the postseason having swatted 12 career home runs and totaled 91 career RBI in 118 games

Cody Regis (Sophomore, Third Base)

- Leads UCLA with six home runs and 43 RBI, 31 walks and a .444 slugging percentage
- Has batted .283 overall, posting a .305 batting average with 22 RBI in all 27 Pac-10 games
- Belted a team-leading five homers and notched a team-high 13 RBI in the postseason in 2010
- Has logged a .298 career batting average and team-best 15 career homers and 90 RBI

Cody Keefer (Sophomore, Left Field)

- Has started all but one game in left field for UCLA, batting .305 with one homer and 17 RBI
- Ranks second on the ballclub with 28 walks and a .405 on-base percentage
- Registered 17 multiple-hit games (second-most on the team) with four three-hit efforts
- Missed the 2010 postseason as a freshman with a leg injury (final game was May 16, 2010)

Chris Giovinazzo (Senior, Right Field)

- Enters the postseason batting .254 with two home runs, four triples and 18 RBI
- One of UCLA's two seniors, only current Bruin to have played in the 2008 Regional (at Cal State Fullerton)
- Drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 MLB Draft by the Colorado Rockies as a junior at UCLA
- Athletic player who has the talent and ability to perform at all three outfield positions

Jeff Gelalich (Sophomore, Designated Hitter/Outfield)

- Has batted .259 with a .389 on-base percentage, splitting time between designated hitter and right field
- Started 49 games overall this season, including 28 as UCLA's leadoff hitter
- Ranks second on the ballclub in both runs scored (33) and hit-by-pitches (12)
- Batted .314 in 11 games (nine starts) in the 2010 postseason, notching two homers and five RBI

Steve Rodriguez (Junior, Catcher)

- Started behind the plate in 134 of UCLA's last 179 games (including 43 starts at catcher this season)
- Has batted .206 with five doubles, 17 RBI and nine runs in 45 games as a junior
- Has caught UCLA's talented 1-2 punch of Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer since his freshman year (2009)
- Started as the Bruins' catcher in all 12 postseason games last year, batting .257 with two doubles

Pat Valaika (Freshman, Shortstop)

- Assumed UCLA's starting shortstop role in 2011 with the departure of veteran Niko Gallego (MLB draft)
- Posted a .243 batting average with one home run, 10 doubles and 19 RBI in 49 games (46 starts)
- Has batted .256 with one homer, seven doubles and 10 RBI in 27 Pac-10 ballgames
- Two older brothers are in pro baseball (Chris with Cincinnati, Matt in the St. Louis minor league system)

Trevor Brown (Sophomore, Second Base)

- Among UCLA's most versatile players, can play third, shortstop, second and first base as well as catcher
- Has split time at second base with Kevin Williams, batting .194 with three doubles and seven RBI
- Earned first career start at second base on April 1 (Tyler Rahmatulla, suspended due to academic issues)
- Played in five postseason games last season, going 3-for-8 (.375) with two runs and two RBI

Kevin Williams (Sophomore, Second Base)

- Posted a .213 batting average in 27 games, (19 starts – 17 at second base, two as designated hitter)
- Has split time at second base with Trevor Brown since March 27 (Tyler Rahmatulla, suspended)
- Posted UCLA's first four-hit game of the season (4-for-5 vs. San Diego State, April 19)

Adrian Williams (Junior, Infielder)

- Has made nine starts at shortstop, batting .206 (7-for-34) in 20 games
- Twice recorded two hits in a game (vs. San Jose State, Feb. 27; vs. UC Santa Barbara, May 11)
- Played in four postseason games last season, serving primarily as a late-game defensive replacement

Marc Navarro (RS Junior, Outfield)

- Has served primarily as a left-handed pinch-hitter in addition to playing the outfield
- Batted .205 this season in 24 games (nine starts), totaling three doubles and seven RBI
- Posted a .273 batting average in pinch-hit duty for the Bruins, going 3-for-11 at the plate

SUCCESS ON THE MOUND

Five of the Pac-10 Conference's top 11 career strikeout leaders have been coached by UCLA seventh-year head coach John Savage. UCLA's Trevor Bauer ranks third on the list (446) and teammate Gerrit Cole is fifth overall (365) entering this weekend's NCAA Regional. Savage spent four seasons as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Southern California (1997-2000), where he coached Rik Currier (2nd, 449), Seth Etherton (4th, 420) and Mark Prior (11th, 352).

THIS WEEK'S POLLS

The Bruins are ranked among the top 25 in each of this week's updated four prominent college baseball polls. *Collegiate Baseball* has tabbed UCLA at No. 12. The Bruins are ranked No. 17 by *Baseball America* and the NCBWA (Writers' Association). The ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll has UCLA ranked No. 18. Four Pac-10 teams have been ranked by *Baseball America* – Arizona State (10), Oregon State (15), UCLA (17) and Stanford (24). *Collegiate Baseball* has ranked six Pac-10 teams in its top 30 selections.

CHASING HISTORY

UCLA was no-hit by Oregon State's Josh Osich on April 30, the first no-hitter against UCLA (and in a Pac-10 game) since May 8, 1994, when Stanford's Jason Middlebrook no-hit UCLA. This season, two Bruin starters have had a no-hitter intact through six innings. Gerrit Cole had a perfect game broken with two outs in the seventh at Nebraska (March 4) and with one out in the seventh against Georgia (March 11). Trevor Bauer had a perfect game with one out in the seventh at USC (March 26) and allowed his first hit with one out in the eighth.

OPENING IN GRAND STYLE

UCLA currently has four former players playing in the major leagues. Most recently, Brandon Crawford (2006-2008) made his major league debut with the San Francisco Giants on Friday, May 27, belting a grand slam in his third major league at-bat (first hit) to hand his team a 5-3 lead at Milwaukee.

SIX-SEASON COMPOSITE

In conference games over the last five-plus seasons (2006-11), UCLA ranks second in both wins (91) and winning percentage (.599). Overall, the Bruins are fourth in total wins (210) and winning percentage (.587). UCLA finished first in the Pac-10 in 2011, second in 2010 and third from 2006 through 2009.

UCLA's roster features 15 players who have been selected in the MLB Draft at least once. Of those 15 selections, 13 were drafted as high school seniors and two were drafted from UCLA last season (Mitchell Beacom, Chris Giovinnazzo). The Bruins' freshman class includes six players drafted as high school seniors in June 2010.

PAST DRAFT SELECTIONS

John Savage has seen 42 MLB draft selections at UCLA in his previous six seasons at the helm. Three of Savage's pitchers have been promoted to the majors (Hector Ambriz, David Huff and Josh Roenicke). Of those 42 draft picks, 14 have been selected in the draft's first 10 rounds. Last season, 11 Bruins were drafted, with left-hander Rob Rasmussen leading the way as a second-round pick by the Florida Marlins.

MINOR LEAGUE UPDATE

Dan Klein has been promoted to the Bowie Baysox, double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. UCLA's closer in 2010, Klein has allowed just two runs (one earned) in 11.1 innings for Bowie since being promoted from Frederick (high-A, Carolina League) at the beginning of May. Cody Decker is tied with two players for the Texas League home run lead (11). In all, UCLA has 21 former players on minor league rosters this season.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Gerrit Cole and Trevor Bauer were named preseason All-Americans by multiple publications. Cole secured preseason All-America accolades from ESPN (first team), Baseball America (first team), Collegiate Baseball (first team), the NCBWA (first team) and Perfect Game USA (first team). Bauer earned preseason All-America acclaim from ESPN (first team), Collegiate Baseball (first team), the NCBWA (first team) and Baseball America (second team). Both Cole and Bauer secured All-Pac-10 Team honors during their freshman and sophomore campaigns.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

UCLA's 34-man roster features two seniors, nine juniors, 11 sophomores and 12 freshmen. The most veteran Bruins on this year's squad include Jordan Haver (2007-2011) and Chris Giovinnazzo, Mitchell Beacom and Marc Navarro (all on the team from 2008-2011). Three players hail from a state other than California – Chase Brewer (Paradise Valley) and Dean Espy (Mesa) call Arizona home, and Pat Gallagher (Reno) resides in Nevada.

John Savage became UCLA's first head coach to lead the Bruins to the finals of the College World Series in 2010, guiding UCLA to a 51-17 record last season. Previously, he became the first head coach in program history to have led UCLA to three consecutive NCAA Regionals (2006-08). Named the Bruins' head coach in the summer of 2004, Savage has helped UCLA collect the second-most wins (91) and second-highest winning percentage (.587) among Pac-10 teams over the last six seasons (conference games only).
