UCLA TO FACE NO. 6 CAL STATE FULLERTON TUESDAY EVENING

Bruins look to finish regular season on a winning note at Fullerton and California

LOS ANGELES — UCLA closes its regular-season schedule this week, playing at Cal State Fullerton on Tuesday evening before opening a three-game Pac-10 series at California on Friday. The Bruins will send left-hander Matt Grace to the hill Tuesday at Cal State Fullerton's Goodwin Field. Earlier this season, UCLA dropped two mid-week games to the Titans.

TUESDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

UCLA plays its final non-conference game of the regular season on Tuesday, facing No. 6 Cal State Fullerton at Goodwin Field. The Bruins lost a 7-1 decision to the Titans in Fullerton on March 4 and fell at home to Cal State Fullerton the following evening, 13-2. Bruin left-hander Matt Grace, who has compiled a 3.24 record in his freshman season, will face Fullerton's Kevin Rath, a freshman left-hander from Las Vegas, Nev. UCLA has registered a 5-6 record on Tuesday's this fall, after having downed No. 12 UC Irvine last Tuesday.

REMEMBER THE TITANS

Cal State Fullerton has won seven of its last eight games, including a three-game sweep of San Diego State last weekend. Entering Tuesday's game, Cal State Fullerton boasts a 35-17 overall record, a 22-7 home mark, and rests in first place in the Big West Conference with a 15-6 record. Cal State Fullerton has logged a .306 team average and a 4.34 earned-run average. Last June, the Titans eliminated UCLA in the NCAA Super Regional at Cal State Fullerton, two games to none.

PUSH FOR THE POSTSEASON

With just four games remaining on the schedule, the Bruins look to make a final push for their third consecutive postseason berth. UCLA won all four games last week (one at No. 12 UC Irvine, three at home vs. Washington State) to elevate its overall record to 29-23 and improve to 11-10 in Pac-10 play. The current conference standings feature six teams all within two games of each other. The Bruins are currently tied for third place with California, who awaits UCLA's arrival for a three-game series this weekend.

BRUIN MVPs

Second baseman Alden Carrithers earned team most valuable player honors and and left-handed reliever Brendan Lafferty captured team most valuable pitcher accolades at the Bruins' annual team banquet on Sunday evening. Carrithers has emerged as a legitimate All-America candidate and leads UCLA with a .378 average in 51 games. Lafferty ranks third among Pac-10 pitchers with 28 appearances (all in relief), and has compiled a 3-2 record and 3.92 ERA in 57.1 innings out of the bullpen.

MURPHY GETS IT DONE

Tim Murphy became a major factor in UCLA's success last week, helping lead the Bruins to four consecutive victories. Murphy earned the save, his first of the year, in a 6-4 win at UC Irvine on Tuesday. Three nights later, the left-hander from Vista, Calif., tossed seven scoreless innings, scattering two hits while striking out eight to notch the victory. The following afternoon, Murphy came off the bench to play center field and knocked home the game-winning run with a pop-fly single to center in the bottom of the 10th inning.

HITTING IT HAERTHER

First baseman Casey Haerther has collected nine home runs and a team-high 43 RBI in 50 games, Haerther leads the team with a .379 average in Pac-10 action. Last weekend against Washington State, Haerther batted .462, going 6-for-13 with three RBI. In the Bruins' Pac-10 series opener at Arizona, Haerther established a Pac-10 and UCLA single-game record, going 7-for-7 in a 20-8 win (March 29). Since then, Haerther has belted eight of his nine homers. Haerther enters the week ranking second in the Pac-10 with 19 doubles.

GETTING ON, GETTING IN

Shortstop Brandon Crawford leads all Bruins with 44 runs after having scored four times in UCLA's sweep of Washington State last weekend. In that series, Crawford was 4-for-9, drawing three walks and stealing two bases (in two attempts). The junior from Pleasanton, Calif., has started in each game (171) since arriving at UCLA for the 2006 season, compiling a career .315 average, including 18 home runs and 124 RBI.

THE REAL DEAL

Junior right-hander Jason Novak earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors on Tuesday, May 6, after having thrown seven scoreless innings in three appearances the previous week. In UCLA's four games last week, Novak earned one save in two appearances, allowing two runs and two hits in 5.1 innings. The Agoura, Calif., resident limited the opposition to a .118 average last weekend and has recorded a .248 opponent batting average in 16 appearances this spring. Novak's 3.45 earned-run average ranks second lowest on the staff.

GRAND SLAM

Cody Decker, who has started 42 games this spring (40 at designated hitter, two at first base), belted the first grand slam by a Bruin last Friday since accomplishing the feat in UCLA's 15-8 win over Pacific on March 24, 2007. Decker finished the weekend hitting at a .364 clip, going 4-for-11 with a team-leading six RBI. Decker was 3-for-4 at the plate in UCLA's 7-6, 10-inning victory Saturday afternoon against the Cougars.

WHAT'S AT STAKE

With four games remaining, the Bruins can accomplish more than punching its postseason ticket this week. The UCLA baseball program can earn its third consecutive postseason berth for the first time in school history. Two years ago, the Bruins advanced to the NCAA Regional at Pepperdine. Last season, UCLA swept the NCAA Regional at Long Beach State before falling to Cal State Fullerton in the Super Regional round. The baseball program last logged 30 wins or more in three consecutive seasons from 1999-2001. One more win allows UCLA to reach the 30-win plateau for the third straight year. Two more wins this season will give head coach John Savage his 200th career coaching victory (88 wins at UC Irvine, 110 at UCLA).

PITCHING IN

UCLA's pitching staff has compiled a 4.57 ERA in Pac-10 games (through Sunday), the third-best mark among all conference teams. Stanford entered Monday's game against Arizona with a 4.05 ERA, and Arizona had logged a 4.35 mark. The Bruins' pitchers have registered a .261 opponent batting average, tied with Stanford for the best mark in Pac-10 play prior to Monday's ballgame. Left-hander Tim Murphy's .216 opponent batting average ranks third-lowest among Pac-10 pitchers, in conference games only.

SENIOR LEADERS

Sunday's game against Washington State marked the final home game for UCLA's four seniors. Second baseman Alden Carrithers (.378 avg, 4 HR, 42 RBI), catcher Brent Dean (.277 avg, 1 HR, 8 RBI) and outfielders Brady Dolan (.273, 1 HR, 16 RBI) and Mickey Weisser (.235 avg, 2 HR, 15 RBI) have become major contributors to UCLA's success. Carrithers has led the Bruins in most offensive categories all season and currently leads the team with a .378 average, .473 on-base percentage and 17 stolen bases.

HIT PARADE

Alden Carrithers has registered five four-hit efforts this season. No Bruin has tallied that many games with four or more hits since Brian Baron logged seven four-hit performances in 2001. That season, Baron finished the year with 33 multi-hit games — 19 two-hit efforts, seven three-hit contests and seven four-hit performances. Also, Casey Haerther's seven hits at Arizona (March 29) were the most hits in a game by a Bruin since Ryan McCarthy went 5-for-5 in 2004 against Arizona State (April 18).

GO-TO GUY

Left-hander Brendan Lafferty enters the week having pitched in more games than all but two Pac-10 pitchers. Lafferty leads the Bruins with 28 appearances and earned two victories in a three-game span last week. In UCLA's 6-4, 10-inning win at UC Irvine, Lafferty limited the host Anteaters to two runs (one earned) and five hits in 3.1 innings of relief. Saturday afternoon, before a nationally-televised audience, Lafferty hurled three scoreless innings, scattering two hits while notching two strikeouts to record the victory. Lafferty has logged a 3.92 ERA in 57.1 innings, compiling 51 strikeouts and 25 walks in relief.

EXTRA! EXTRA!

UCLA has posted a 4-2 record in six extra-inning games. UCLA lost a 12-inning game, 3-2, to Oklahoma in the nightcap of a season-opening doubleheader (Feb. 23). The Bruins outlasted UC Santa Barbara, 5-4, in 13 innings (Feb. 27) in a five-hour, 35-minute affair. UCLA edged Arizona, 4-3, in 10 innings (March 28) in the Bruins' Pac-10 season opener. UC Irvine downed the Bruins, 6-5, in 10 innings at Jackie Robinson Stadium (April 8). UCLA used a two-out rally, keyed by Brandon Crawford in the bottom of the 11th inning, to defeat UNLV, 8-7 (April 22). The Bruins defeated Washington State, 7-6, in 10 innings last Sunday.

REPRESENTIN' RENO

Senior Brady Dolan has logged a .273 batting average, playing in 42 of 49 games this season. Dolan, a proud resident of Reno, Nev., has made 31 starts in the outfield — 14 in left, 10 in right and seven in center. Dolan redshirted as a freshman at UC Irvine in 2004, spent the 2005 season at Sierra College with teammate Mickey Weisser, and has flourished the past three seasons at UCLA. After seeing limited playing time in 2006, Dolan hit .280 in 39 games last season, going 6-for-14 in an eight-game span prior to Super Regionals. This spring, the fifth-year senior has batted .300 in Pac-10 play, scoring nine runs in 14 games.

HEAD OF THE PACK

Several Bruins rank among the league leaders, offensively, in Pac-10 games. First baseman Casey Haerther has belted 10 doubles, the most by any Pac-10 performer in conference action. Haerther is tied with USC's Grant Green and Stanford's Jason Castro for fifth-place on the Pac-10 list with a .379 batting average. Haerther's .667 slugging percentage is tied as the fifth-highest mark with Arizona's Brad Glenn. Second baseman Alden Carrithers ranks fifth in conference action with a .484 on-base percentage.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

UCLA has stolen 73 bases in 52 games this spring, the second-highest mark among Pac-10 teams. Arizona State leads the way with 82 steals, and Arizona follows the Bruins with 71 swipes. The Bruins have attempted 95 steals, the third-highest total in the conference. Second baseman Alden Carrithers leads UCLA with 17 stolen bases in 23 attempts (.739), and shortstop Brandon Crawford ranks second with 11 stolen bases in 17 attempts (.647). First baseman Casey Haerther has swiped 10 bags in 12 attempts (.833).

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

UCLA was selected to finish third out of nine teams in the Pac-10 Conference's preseason coaches' poll. The Bruins, currently tied for third place with No. 15 California, were slated to finish behind Arizona and Arizona State, respectively. Arizona collected six of the nine first-place votes, and Arizona State picked up the remaining three votes. Last season, UCLA was chosen fourth in the preseason coaches' poll and finished third with a 14-10 mark in Pac-10 games.

ROAD WARRIORS

Earlier this spring, UCLA became just the second team in the past two seasons to win a three-game series at Arizona, which currently boasts a 23-4 home mark. The Bruins took the first two of three games at Arizona (March 28-30) to open Pac-10 play. Last season, the Wildcats posted a 28-4 home record, losing one home series to USC. The weekend of April 25-27, UCLA won two of three games at Washington, where the Huskies had previously recorded an 18-5 home record with just one home series loss to Cal Poly.

NEWLY-NAMED STEELE FIELD

The baseball program dedicated the field at Jackie Robinson Stadium in honor of the Steele Foundation prior to a Pac-10 game against Arizona State on May 3. Thanks to a generous lead gift from the Steele Foundation, UCLA was able to renovate its field in the offseason with a major-league caliber playing surface.

2007 IN REVIEW

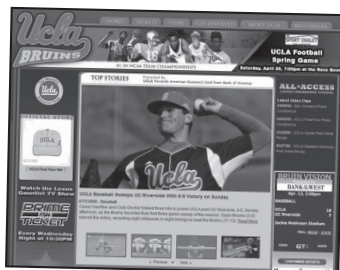
UCLA finished the 2007 season with its first trip to the NCAA Super Regionals since 2000 and totaled a 33-28 record. In the Super Regional, UCLA dropped both games to Cal State Fullerton (12-2 and 2-1). UCLA advanced after winning the Long Beach Regional, defeating No. 3-seed Pepperdine (7-3), No. 4-seed Illinois-Chicago (3-1) and No. 1-seed Long Beach State (7-4) at Blair Field.

INJURY REPORT

Sophomore outfielder/left-handed pitcher Justin Uribe will miss the remainder of the season with a left elbow injury (torn UCL). Freshman right-hander Dan Klein remains inactive with shoulder soreness. Freshman outfielder Jeff Rapoport (shoulder) missed the 2007 season with a shoulder injury and remains sidelined, along with freshman right-hander Erik Goeddel (elbow) and junior right-hander Tim Schlatter (shoulder).

In his fourth season as head coach at UCLA, John Savage has established the Bruins as a perennial national contender. Savage led UCLA to the postseason the past two seasons. In June 2006, the Bruins played in the Malibu

Regional. UCLA swept the 2007 Long Beach Regional before advancing to the Super Regional at Cal State Fullerton, UCLA's first Super Regional since 2000.

Savage has also made significant strides on the recruiting trail, helping UCLA land three recruiting classes ranked in the top-13 by Baseball America. In the fall of 2005, Savage and his coaching staff unveiled their first recruiting class at UCLA, a group ranked the No. 5 class by Baseball America. His last two recruiting classes have been ranked No. 13 and No. 7, respectively.

Aside from featuring winning teams, outstanding recruiting classes, and consistently challenging schedules, Savage has made significant improvements to Jackie Robinson Stadium. Among the latest upgrades include a new grass field surface, a state-of-the-art backstop, the installation of over 1,000 chairback seats and improved hitting facilities and bullpens.

ON THE HORIZON

Head coach John Savage announced on Nov. 14, 2007, that seven student-athletes had signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period to attend UCLA and play baseball. All seven signees have earned all-league honors in high school and were Milwaukee Brewers Area Code Games selections. Cole and Cutter Dykstra have captured preseason first-team All-America honors and Murphy has earned third-team All-America accolades from *Baseball America*.

ON THE FARM

Last summer, 17 former Bruins competed in minor league baseball – 11 of those players were drafted under head coach John Savage. Five former Bruins are playing minor league baseball at the double-A level, and one former Bruin, Wes Whisler, is competing on a triple-A club. Hector Ambriz, Chris Denove, David Huff, Dave Johnson, Paul Oseguera and Kyle Wilson have started their seasons in double-A ball. Two Bruins from last year's ballclub – Tyson Brummett and Brant Rustich – are playing at the single-A level.

DEALIN' IN DOUBLE-A BALL

Former Bruin David Huff, who pitched for UCLA in 2006, has logged a 3-1 record and 2.14 ERA in eight games (seven starts) this season, pitching for the double-A Akron Aeros (Cleveland Indians' affiliate). In his last three starts, Huff has allowed one earned run and nine hits in 19 innings, recording two wins, 15 strikeouts and four walks. Opponents are hitting the left-hander at a .178 clip in 46.1 innings. Right-hander Josh Roenicke, a teammate of Huff at UCLA, has compiled nine saves in 19 appearances for the double-A Chattanooga Lookouts (Cincinnati Reds' affiliate). Roenicke has totaled 23 saves in 19.0 innings.

RECENTLY PROMOTED

Former UCLA right-hander Tyson Brummett, the ace of the Bruins' 2007 staff, was recently promoted to high-A ball with the Clearwater Threshers (Philadelphia Phillies' Florida State League affiliate). In three starts for the Threshers, Brummett has registered a 3.32 ERA, totaling 12 strikeouts in 19 innings. Opponents are hitting the right-hander from Salem, Utah, at a .233 clip in the Florida State League. One year ago, Brummett led the Bruins with 111 strikeouts in 138.0 innings, posting a team-leading 10-4 record.

JOHN SAVAGE'S YEAR-BY-YEAR

John Savage has compiled a 110-117 record, midway through his fourth season as head coach at UCLA. A graduate of University of Nevada ('91), Savage has coached 17 major-league players in his 16-year career as a college baseball coach. Prior to coaching at UCLA, Savage spent three years as the head coach at UC Irvine, where he brought back a dormant baseball program (school did not field baseball since 1992). Savage arrived at UC Irvine after having served as the pitching coach at USC from 1996-2000. With the Trojans, Savage was responsible for the development of current major league pitchers Barry Zito (San Francisco), Mark Prior (San Diego) and Brian Bannister (Kansas City).

Sophomore first baseman sets school record with 7-for-7 performance

Casey Haerther went 7-for-7 in UCLA's 20-8 win at then-No. 6 Arizona on March 29 at Jerry Kindall Field. The hitting performance by Haerther, a sophomore first baseman from Chatsworth, Calif., not only set records at UCLA, but also in the Pac-10 Conference. By game's end, he had posted more than a few memorable numbers.

HAERTHER'S 7-FOR-7 EFFORT:

- marked his career highs in hits and at-bats
- set a Pac-10 single-game record for hits by an individual (previous high, six hits, happened numerous times)
- was the first time a Bruin recorded six hits or more in a game since May 9, 2000, when Chasey Utley went 6-for-6
