2008 AT A GLANCE

- UCLA posted a 31-25 overall record and finished third in the Pac-10 Conference with a 13-11 mark.
- UCLA has earned its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance for the first time in program history.
- The Bruins won six of their final eight games, including five of their final six Pac-10 meetings.
- UCLA handed Arizona and California their only three-game home series losses of the season.
- The Bruins have compiled an all-time 33-28 record in 15 NCAA Tournaments (33-20 in Regionals).
- UCLA's pitchers have compiled a 4.43 ERA, the second-lowest team ERA at UCLA in the last 16 years.

NATIONAL BROADCAST

ESPN2 will televise all games at the Fullerton Regional live from Goodwin Field. Clay Matvick and Kyle Peterson will have the call on ESPN2. In addition, an Internet audio broadcast of all UCLA games at the Fullerton Regional will originate from UCLA's athletics website, uclabruins.com. UCLA's Danny Lee and Tim Wilhelm will provide the broadcast.

THE ROAD TO FULLERTON

UCLA entered the final two weekends of the season needing to win each of its final two Pac-10 series. Following a 6-4, mid-week victory at No. 12 UC Irvine, the Bruins swept a three-game series against Washington State at Jackie Robinson Stadium. UCLA dropped their final mid-week game of the season, a 12-8 decision at No. 6 Cal State Fullerton, before rebounding with back-to-back shutouts at No. 15 California last Friday and Saturday. UCLA lost its regular-season finale, 7-6 in 10 innings, after erasing a 4-0 deficit in the eighth inning.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE

The Bruins' roster features 15 players with postseason experience, as the core group of veterans filled the starting lineup as freshmen at the 2006 Malibu Regional. Third baseman Jermaine Curtis has logged a .379 batting average in 29 at-bats, starting all eight postseason games the past two seasons (three in 2006, five in 2007). Cody Decker, Ryan Babineau and Brandon Crawford have also started in each of UCLA's last eight postseason contests. Last spring, five players were named to the All-Regional team at Long Beach State.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING

UCLA hurled consecutive shutouts at No. 15 California last weekend, becoming the first Bruin ballclub to accomplish that feat since 1978. Tim Murphy, slated to start Friday against Virginia, tossed his second complete game shutout of the season on May 23. Murphy became the first Bruin to hurl two or more complete game shutouts in one season since 1983 (Jeff Pries). UCLA blanked California, 7-0, Saturday as Charles Brewer scattered three hits in 5.2 scoreless innings to earn his team-leading eighth win.

DOING IT ALL

Second baseman Alden Carrithers has led the Bruins at the plate all season. Carrithers, who earned team most valuable player honors at the team banquet, has posted a team-leading .380 batting average and .490 on-base percentage. One of 50 Golden Spikes Award semifinalists, Carrithers has logged the highest on-base percentage (.490) by any Bruin since Troy Glaus led the 1997 squad with a .520 mark in 67 games. Carrithers has registered the highest batting average by any UCLA player since Brian Baron hit .443 in 2001.

HAERTHER HITS IT FARTHER

First baseman Casey Haerther has logged a .326 batting average with team-highs of 10 home runs, 49 RBI, 22 doubles, 126 total bases and 49 RBI. Haerther set Pac-10 and UCLA single game records with his 7-for-7 effort at then-No. 6 Arizona, as he tallied four doubles, three singles, four runs and four RBI in UCLA's 20-8 victory. In that game, Haerther established the record for most hits in a game (Pac-10 and UCLA records). Haerther finished the regular season having registered an 18-game hitting streak in Pac-10 games.

THE ARMS RACE

UCLA's pitching staff, under the guidance of fourth-year head coach John Savage, has totaled a 4.43 earned-run average, the third-lowest mark in the Pac-10. Led by left-hander Tim Murphy (5-6, 3.52 ERA, 107 K) and right-hander Charles Brewer (8-4, 5.09 ERA, 64 K), the Bruins' pitching staff has logged 423 strikeouts in 506.1 innings (7.5 per nine innings). Murphy has earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors each of the past two weeks and currently boasts a 16.2 scoreless innings streak. Brendan Lafferty, named the team's most valuable pitcher, has made a team-high 31 appearances (54 K in 63.0 IP, 4.00 ERA).

ROAD WARRIORS

The Bruins enter postseason action with a 12-12 road record and 13-12 overall mark away from Jackie Robinson Stadium (one neutral site win). UCLA won three of four Pac-10 series this spring after having won two of three games at California last weekend. With that series victory, UCLA became the only team this season (third team in three years) to win a three-game series at California – the Golden Bears totaled a 21-7-2 home record. The Bruins opened Pac-10 play at Arizona (March 28-30), handing the Wildcats their only home series loss – Arizona finished with a 25-5 home record. UCLA became the second team in the past two seasons to win a three-game series at Arizona (USC, 2007). The weekend of April 25-27, UCLA won two of three games at Washington, where the Huskies had previously recorded an 18-5 home record.

TEAM CAPTAINS

The 2008 season marks the first year under head coach John Savage in which the Bruins have officially named team captains. Juniors Ryan Babineau, Jermaine Curtis and Tim Murphy have served as team captains this spring, after having led UCLA to the postseason as freshmen in 2006 and sophomores in 2007. Babineau has played in 157 career games, making 151 starts, as the Bruins' primary catcher each of the last three seasons. Curtis has been a spark at third base and at the plate for UCLA since arriving in Westwood in the fall of 2005, totaling a .317 career batting average in 143 games (137 starts). Murphy spent his freshman season as an outfielder before excelling on the mound the past two years.

TOP CLASSES

UCLA's success the past three seasons can be largely attributed to head coach John Savage's first full recruiting class, a group of student-athletes who enrolled at UCLA in the fall of 2005 and completed their first season in 2006 (10 of those players remain on the team). Savage's first recruiting class at UCLA was ranked fifth-best in the nation by Baseball America. Anchored by starters such as Brandon Crawford, Jermaine Curtis, Ryan Babineau, Tim Murphy and Cody Decker, this group of freshmen in 2006 helped lead UCLA to the Malibu Regional at Pepperdine. Savage's second recruiting class was ranked No. 13 by Baseball America (first played in 2007), and his most recent class was tabbed No. 7 by the publication.

RIPKEN-LIKE STREAK

Junior shortstop Brandon Crawford has started all 175 games (173 at shortstop, two at designated hitter) in his three seasons at UCLA. Crawford has compiled a .296 batting average, 11 doubles, five home runs, 45 RBI and a team-best 48 runs in 56 starts at shortstop this spring. A five-tool player with superb defensive range and a strong arm, Crawford has been a key member of UCLA's three consecutive postseason appearances. The Pleasanton, Calif., resident carries a .317 career batting average and a team-leading 130 career RBI into this weekend's action at Cal State Fullerton.

SENIOR LEADERS

UCLA's four seniors have played integral roles on the team this season. Second baseman Alden Carrithers (.380 avg, 5 HR, 45 RBI) has led UCLA at the plate all season and has shown power, hitting five home runs and 15 doubles, as well as terrific speed, stealing 17 bases in 23 attempts. Catcher Brent Dean (.288 avg, 1 HR, 10 RBI) has started 24 games behind the plate, alternating time with junior Ryan Babineau. Outfielder Brady Dolan (.281, 1 HR, 17 RBI) has started 31 games in the outfield, and outfielder Mickey Weisser (.241 avg, 2 HR, 16 RBI) has recorded a .388 on-base percentage in 37 games (24 starts).

THE REAL DEAL

Junior right-hander Jason Novak has compiled a 1-1 record, 3.72 ERA and three saves in 17 relief appearances. Novak, who hails from Agoura, Calif., has limited the opposition to a .194 batting average in UCLA's last 16 games (Novak's last nine appearances). In his third season with the Bruins, Novak has pitched in 64 career games, logging a 5-2 record and 4.72 ERA at UCLA. Novak earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors on May 6, after having thrown seven scoreless innings in three appearances the previous week.

HIT PARADE

Alden Carrithers leads the offense with 23 multiple-hit games (including five four-hit efforts) and 14 multiple-RBI efforts. No Bruin has tallied that many games with four or more hits since Brian Baron logged seven four-hit performances in 2001. Carrithers has hit safely in 44 of 55 games and has totaled separate hit streaks of 11 and 10 games. Carrithers spent the 2005 and 2006 seasons playing baseball at UC Santa Barbara, where he totaled a .317 average over both seasons. Each of the last two summers, Carrithers has played in the Cape Cod League, where he helped lead Yarmouth-Dennis to the 2006 Cape Cod League title.

GO-TO GUY

Left-hander Brendan Lafferty enters the weekend having pitched in 31 games (all in relief), tied with two players for the most appearances among all Pac-10 pitchers. Lafferty earned two victories in a three-game span two weeks ago. In UCLA's 6-4, 10-inning win at UC Irvine (May 13), Lafferty limited the host Anteaters to two runs (one earned) and five hits in 3.1 innings of relief. Before a nationally-televised audience against Washington State (May 17), Lafferty hurled three scoreless innings, scattering to hits to pick up the win.

COACHING MILESTONES

UCLA's fourth-year head coach John Savage earned his 200th career victory on Saturday, May 24, as the Bruins blanked No. 15 California, 7-0. Savage totaled 88 wins in three seasons as the head coach at UC Irvine before registering 112 wins the past four years at UCLA. Savage registered his 100th career victory as UCLA's head coach on Sunday, April 20, in an 8-2 victory over No. 10 Stanford.

UPPER DECKER

Cody Decker, who has started 46 games this spring (41 at designated hitter, four at first base, one in left field), leads all Bruins with 26 career home runs. The Santa Monica, Calif., resident enters this weekend having registered seven home runs and 30 RBI in 50 total games. Decker earned 2007 All-Pac-10 honors after having led UCLA with 14 home runs and 57 RBI. Two weeks ago, Decker clubbed UCLA's first grand slam of the season in a 10-0 series-opening victory against Washington State (May 16). Decker had two RBI in UCLA's 7-6, 10-inning loss on Sunday to reach the 100 career-RBI plateau.

HEAD OF THE PACK

Several Bruins rank among the league leaders among Pac-10 performers. Alden Carrithers ranks fifth in batting average (.380), third in on-base percentage (.490), fourth in hits (79), third in stolen bases (17) and seventh in walks (39). Casey Haerther ranks second in doubles (22), and Jermaine Curtis is tied for fourth in walks (42). Among Pac-10 pitchers, Tim Murphy is tied with Washington's Nick Haughian as the league leader (107) and ranks fifth in earned-run average (3.52). Murphy (94.2 IP) and Charles Brewer (94.0 IP) have logged the fifth- and sixth-most innings, respectively.

CATCH ME IF YOU CAN

UCLA has stolen 73 bases in 56 games this spring, the third-highest mark among Pac-10 teams. Arizona State leads the way with 87 steals, and Arizona follows with 78 swipes. The Bruins have attempted 97 steals, the third-highest total in the conference. Alden Carrithers leads UCLA with 17 stolen bases in 23 attempts (.739), and Brandon Crawford ranks second with 11 stolen bases in 17 attempts (.647). Casey Haerther ranks third on the team with 10 steals in 12 attempts. Gabe Cohen and Jermaine Curtis have each totaled eight stolen bases in 10 attempts.

2007 IN REVIEW

UCLA finished the 2007 season with its first trip to the NCAA Super Regionals since 2000 and totaled a 33-28 record. In the Super Regional, UCLA dropped both games to Cal State Fullerton (12-2 and 2-1). UCLA advanced after winning the Long Beach Regional, defeating No. 3-seed Pepperdine (7-3), No. 4-seed Illinois-Chicago (3-1) and No. 1-seed Long Beach State (7-4) at Blair Field. At the Long Beach Regional, UCLA's starting pitchers combined for 26.2 innings, as Gavin Brooks and Tim Murphy hurled back-to-back complete games. The Bruins finished the season with a third-place Pac-10 finish and 13-10 conference mark.

AGAINST THE COMPETITION

UCLA has never played Virginia or Rider in its 88-year baseball history. Earlier this season, the Bruins dropped three mid-week games to Cal State Fullerton. The Titans downed UCLA in back-to-back evenings the first week of March. In both teams' most recent meeting (Tuesday, May 20), Cal State Fullerton overcame a 7-4 deficit to register a 12-8 win at Goodwin Field.

FAMILIAR WITH THE FIELD

UCLA played 26 games against teams which have advanced to the 2008 NCAA Tournament, totaling a 10-16 record in those regular-season meetings. The Bruins notched two victories against Arizona and California and also registered one win against Bethune-Cookman, Stanford, Pepperdine, UC Irvine, Arizona State and Oklahoma. UCLA is one of 25 teams appearing in the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive year.

NOTHING BUT THE BEST

UCLA has advanced to the postseason the past three seasons having played among the nation's most difficult schedules, as rated by Boyd's World (strength of schedule rating service, boydsworld.com). The Bruins enter the 2008 NCAA Tournament having played the third-most challenging schedule in the nation, behind Loyola Marymount and Stanford, respectively. In 2007, the Bruins faced the second-most difficult schedule. Two seasons ago, UCLA played the nation's most challenging schedule, as rated by Boyd's World.

EXTRA! EXTRA!

UCLA has posted a 4-3 record in seven extra-inning games. UCLA lost a 12-inning game, 3-2, to Oklahoma in the nightcap of a season-opening doubleheader (Feb. 23). The Bruins outlasted UC Santa Barbara, 5-4, in 13 innings (Feb. 27) in a five-hour, 35-minute affair. UCLA edged Arizona, 4-3, in 10 innings (March 28) in the Bruins' Pac-10 season opener. UC Irvine downed the Bruins, 6-5, in 10 innings at Jackie Robinson Stadium (April 8). UCLA used a two-out rally, keyed by Brandon Crawford in the bottom of the 11th inning, to defeat UNLV, 8-7 (April 22). The Bruins defeated Washington State, 7-6, in 10 innings on an RBI-single by Tim Murphy (May 17). In the regular-season finale, California edged the Bruins, 7-6, in 10 innings (May 25).

INJURY REPORT

Right fielder Gabe Cohen is not available to play this weekend (wrist). Sophomore outfielder/left-handed pitcher Justin Uribe is out for the season (left elbow). Freshman right-hander Dan Klein missed most of the season with shoulder soreness and is questionable this weekend. Inactive with shoulder soreness. Freshman outfielder Jeff Rapoport (shoulder) missed the 2007 season with a shoulder injury and remains sidelined, along with freshman right-hander Erik Goeddel (elbow) and junior right-hander Tim Schlatter (shoulder).

ON THE FARM

Last summer, 17 former Bruins competed in minor league baseball – 11 of those players were drafted under head coach John Savage. Five former Bruins are playing minor league baseball at the double-A level, and one former Bruin, Wes Whisler, is competing on a triple-A club. Hector Ambriz, Chris Denove, David Huff, Dave Johnson, Paul Oseguera and Kyle Wilson have started their seasons in double-A ball. Two Bruins from last year's ballclub – Tyson Brummett and Brant Rustich – are playing at the single-A level.

DEALIN' IN DOUBLE-A BALL

Former Bruin David Huff, who pitched for UCLA in 2006, has logged a 4-1 record and 1.98 ERA in 10 games (nine starts) this season, pitching for the double-A Akron Aeros (Cleveland Indians' affiliate). In his five starts, Huff has allowed three earned runs and 20 hits in 31.2 innings, recording three wins, 27 strikeouts and seven walks. Opponents are hitting the left-hander at a .122 clip in 59.0 innings. Right-hander Josh Roenicke, a teammate of Huff at UCLA, has compiled nine saves in 20 appearances for the double-A Chattanooga Lookouts (Cincinnati Reds' affiliate). Roenicke has totaled 23 strikeouts in 20.0 innings.

ON THE HORIZON

Head coach John Savage announced on Nov. 14, 2007, that seven student-athletes had signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period to attend UCLA and play baseball. These student-athletes will arrive on campus and enroll in the fall of 2008. Headed by assistant coach and recruiting coordinator Brian Green, the fourth recruiting class under Savage includes six position players and one pitcher. This group features three AFLAC All-Americans – infielders Chris Amezcuita and Clark Murphy and right-handed pitcher Gerrit Cole. All seven signees have earned all-league honors in high school and were Milwaukee Brewers Area Code Games selections. Cole and Cutter Dykstra have captured preseason first-team All-America honors and Murphy has earned third-team All-America accolades from *Baseball America*.

HAERTHER'S HISTORIC EVENING

Sophomore first baseman sets school record with 7-for-7 performance

Casey Haerther went 7-for-7 in UCLA's 20-8 win at then-No. 6 Arizona on March 29 at Jerry Kindall Field. The hitting performance by Haerther, a sophomore first baseman from Chatsworth, Calif., not only set records at UCLA, but also in the Pac-10 Conference. By game's end, he had posted more than a few memorable numbers.

HAERTHER'S 7-FOR-7 EFFORT:

- marked his career highs in hits and at-bats
- set a Pac-10 single-game record for hits by an individual (previous high, six hits, happened numerous times)
- was the first time a Bruin recorded six hits or more in a game since May 9, 2000, when Chasey Utley went 6-for-6
- marked the first seven-hit performance in Division I college baseball since April 21, 2002 (Brad Bauder of Virginia Tech, 8-for-8, vs. Georgetown)

John Savage – Head Coach

In his fourth season as UCLA's head baseball coach, John Savage has led the Bruins to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments for the first time in school history. In each of the past three seasons, Savage has guided the Bruins into the NCAA Tournament as the No. 2 seed in a Southern California-area regional. Last season, UCLA advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the second time in school history and for the first time since 2000.

Under Savage's direction, the UCLA baseball team enters the 2008 postseason as one of 25 programs to be making its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Savage has quickly turned the UCLA baseball program into a national power by attracting three top-13 recruiting classes, as ranked by *Baseball America*, and by playing the most competitive schedules in the nation.

The 2008 UCLA baseball team posted a 31-25 record and registered a third-place finish (13-11 record) in the competitive Pac-10 Conference for the third consecutive season. Serving as UCLA's pitching coach, Savage guided a pitching staff that posted the second-lowest ERA (4.43) in the program's last 16 years – the lowest ERA in that span (3.77) came in 2006, during Savage's second season at the helm. The Bruins won six of their final eight games, including five of the team's last six Pac-10 contests, to advance to the Fullerton Regional.

The Bruins' 2008 schedule has featured 26 games against teams which have advanced to the postseason. UCLA played 18 games against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* weekly top-25 poll. Savage helped lead UCLA to series victories in three of the team's four Pac-10 series (at Arizona, Washington and California). The Bruins played the third-most difficult schedule in the nation, as ranked by Boyd's World, a national strength-of-schedule ranking service.

In each of the past three seasons, at least one Bruin pitcher has totaled 100 or more strikeouts. David Huff netted 100 strikeouts as a junior in 2006 before being drafted by the Cleveland Indians as a supplemental first-round pick (39th selection). Last spring, Tyson Brummett fanned 138 batters as a senior before the Philadelphia Phillies drafted the right-hander in the seventh round. This season, left-hander Tim Murphy enters postseason play tied with Washington's Nick Haughian for the lead in strikeouts (107) among Pac-10 pitchers.

In 2007, Savage helped UCLA overcome an 8-14 start and record a 33-28 overall record, a 14-10 Pac-10 mark and a third-place finish in the Pac-10. UCLA won 19 of 23 games midway through the 2007 season, marking UCLA's most successful such stretch since 1997, when UCLA last advanced to the College World Series.

UCLA's challenging road to the 2007 Super Regionals included 29 games against 11 teams that advanced to the postseason, including 14 contests against teams that advanced to a Super Regional. The Bruins played their first 18 games against seven opponents ranked in the top-25 much of the season.

Savage led UCLA to five consecutive Pac-10 series victories, as the Bruins won two of three games against Washington, Arizona and California in addition to road sweeps of Stanford and USC. UCLA faced the second-most difficult schedule in the nation and the No. 1 most challenging non-conference slate (Boyd's World).

Savage's tutelage proved instrumental in the development of Brummett, an All-Pac-10 selection, and the emergence of left-handers Gavin Brooks and Tim Murphy. Under Savage's guidance, Brummett became just the eighth pitcher in school history to have pitched seven or more complete games in one season. Brooks finished the season having thrown three consecutive complete games and recorded more strikeouts and pitched more innings than any freshman in program history.

Savage engineered a quick turnaround in 2006. He led the Bruins to a 33-25 mark, a berth in the Malibu Regional of the 2006 NCAA Championships and a third-place finish in the competitive Pac-10 Conference. UCLA faced the toughest schedule in the nation, as rated by Boyd's World, and the Bruins played 10 teams during the regular season that were selected among the NCAA Tournament's field of 64. Savage led UCLA to a 15-12 mark against Arizona State, Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Miami, Mississippi, North Carolina State, 2006 NCAA champion Oregon State, Pepperdine, Stanford and UC Irvine.

Less than one week after the season ended, Savage's squad tied a program record as 12 Bruins were selected in the 2006 MLB Draft. Despite losing several talented players to the professional ranks, hopes in Westwood remain high as Savage secured the fifth-best recruiting class in 2006, according to *Baseball America*.

Much of the college baseball world noticed UCLA's success in 2006 and aimed their praise toward Savage. Following the 2006 campaign, Savage was named a finalist for the National Coach of the Year award by CollegeBaseballInsider.com, marking the second such time he has been labeled a finalist.

In July 2006, *Baseball America* hailed Savage as one of "10 People to Watch in the Future." The magazine listed Savage with other distinguished personnel such as New York Mets general manger Omar Minaya, Mets all-star third baseman David Wright and Los Angeles Dodgers assistant GM Kim Ng. *Baseball America* lauds Savage for his winning ways: "UCLA has always been viewed as a sleeping giant on the West Coast, and it looks like Savage has the giant stirring."

Prior to taking over the UCLA baseball program in 2005, Savage's coaching career has made stops at Nevada, USC and UC Irvine, where he led the

Anteaters to the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2004. His ability to soundly recruit first-class student-athletes and to develop them into highly recognized Division I baseball players led UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero to hire Savage on July 1, 2004, to replace the retired Gary Adams.

Coincidentally, Guerrero also hired Savage at UC Irvine three years prior and asked him to re-launch a dormant Anteater baseball program. Savage spent his first season recruiting players and building the foundation for his program that began play in 2002. In their first season, the Anteaters compiled a 33-26 record, and the pitching staff set a school record with 487 strikeouts. Despite injuries to key players the following season, UC Irvine recorded 417 strikeouts and a 3.61 ERA (third in the Big West Conference).

In 2004, Savage led UC Irvine to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division I baseball tournament. UC Irvine competed at the Notre Dame Regional and finished the year with a 34-23-1 mark. Savage's pitching staff recorded 483 strikeouts, four shy of the school record, and compiled a 3.69 ERA (second in the Big West). The UC Irvine offense hit at a .288 clip, averaging 5.7 runs per game.

That season, Savage coached a myriad of talented athletes, including the Big West Conference Freshman Pitcher of the Year, the Collegiate Baseball "Louisville Slugger" Freshman of the Year and the only freshman in the nation to earn All-America first-team accolades from *USA Today/Sports Weekly*. Savage also led UC Irvine to its highest national ranking in school history – a No. 7 spot from Collegiate Baseball in April 2004.

Following Savage's historic 2004 campaign, he was tabbed a finalist for National Coach of the Year honors by CollegeBaseballInsider.com. Three of his players were selected in the June 2004 MLB Draft, and a total of 12 athletes went pro under his tutelage at UC Irvine.

As a head coach, Savage compiled a perfect 4-0 mark against UCLA. His UC Irvine squads defeated the Bruins twice in 2002 (both times by 6-4 scores) and twice more in 2004 (by scores of 6-0 and 7-5).

Prior to taking over the UC Irvine program, Savage served as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Southern California (USC) from 1996 to 2000. At USC, he produced numerous successful athletes, including consecutive Pac-10 Pitchers of the Year Seth Etherton, Rik Carrier and eventual American League Cy Young Award winner Barry Zito. Ultimately, Savage helped guide Etherton to the 1998 *Sporting News* National Player of the Year award and was instrumental in his nomination as a Golden Spikes Award finalist. Also under his mentorship was current San Diego Padres right-hander Mark Prior, one of the game's top pitchers.

As recruiting coordinator, Savage helped facilitate the Trojans' top-ranked recruiting class (*Collegiate Baseball*) in 1999-2000 and served as an assistant to Mike Gillespie for the USA Baseball National Team of collegiate all-stars in the summer of 2000. That summer, the U.S. National Team tallied a 27-3-1 record and brought home a gold medal from the Haarlem Baseball Week Tournament in the Netherlands.

Two years prior, Savage earned Collegiate Baseball's Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 1998 after his coaching talents helped USC capture the 1998 College World Series Championship. He also helped guide USC to an NCAA Regional title in 1999 and the NCAA Super Regional at Georgia Tech in 2000.

Savage coached at the University of Nevada from 1992-96, helping the Wolf Pack compile a 177-82 record in five seasons. Throughout his tenure at Nevada, the baseball program won the 1994 Big West Conference title and strung together its first back-to-back 35-win seasons in school history. During Savage's years at Nevada, 24 Wolf Pack players signed professional contracts.

Savage began his coaching career as the pitching coach for Reno (NV) High School during the 1988-1989 school year.

He was a sixth-round draft choice of the New York Yankees in 1983, following his senior season at Reno High, but chose to attend Santa Clara University, where he pitched for three seasons. In 1986, the Cincinnati Reds selected Savage in the 16th round. He played two seasons in the Reds' organization before moving on to help the independent league Salt Lake City Trappers set a professional baseball record with 29 consecutive victories in 1987.

Following his professional career, Savage earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education, with an emphasis in physical education and history, from Nevada in 1991.

Savage, 43, and his wife, Lisa, have four children: Julia (12), Jack (10), Ryan (8) and Gabrielle (6).

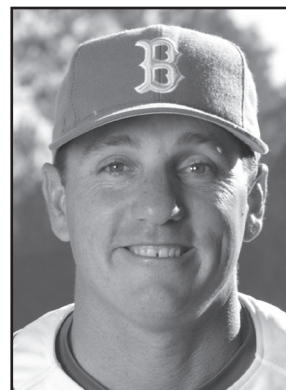

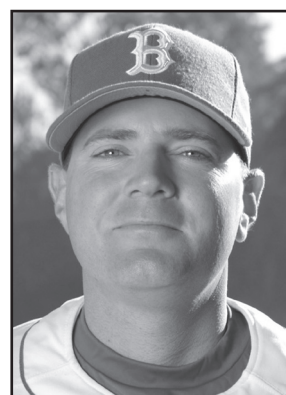

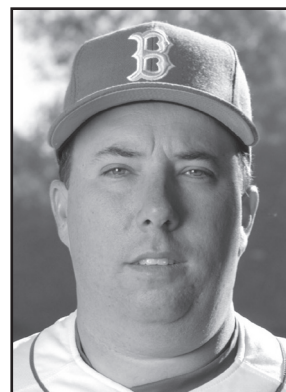
