UCLA C OMPLETES FIRST SWEEP OF CAL STATE FULLERTON SINCE 1991:

The Bruins hit three home runs and held Cal State Fullerton to four hits en route to a 8-2 victory on Tuesday night. Wes Whisler drove in three runs, while Chris Denove, Brandon Averill and Jarrad Page each homered.

Starter Daniel Miltenberger improved to 3-0 on the season as he threw a career-high six innings and allowed only two hits. Reliever Kyle Wilson struck-out a career-high five batters, including three in the ninth inning, to earn his second save of 2004.

BRUINS EARN ONE WIN IN WEEKEND SERIES WITH ARIZONA:

Casey Janssen picked up his eighth win of the season and UCLA picked up its only win of the weekend on Friday night over Arizona. In the 7-3 nonconference victory, the Bruin bullpen relieved Janssen, holding the Wildcats to only one run on one hit in the final 4.2 frames. The Bruin staff

struck out 10 batters on the night.

On Saturday, UCLA hit a season-high four home runs, but it wouldn't be enough as Arizona claimed a 20-9 victory. Preston Griffin, Brandon Averill, Wes Whisler and Will Penniall all homered in the contest.

Sunday saw UCLA held to two hits, as Arizona hurler John Meloan pitched complete game. Griffin and Ryan McCarthy had the lone Bruin hits., which were both home runs. Griffin's roundtripper came in the first Bruin at-bat of the game and marked his second home run in as many games.

UCLA DROPS TWO CONTESTS AT #12 WICHITA STATE:

The Bruins took early leads in both of their games in Wichita, Kansas, but the 12th-ranked Shockers posted late rallies to hand UCLA back-to-back losses.

On Tuesday, David Johnson notched a new career-high with seven strikeouts in 5.1 innings of work. How-

BRUINS CLAIM SERIES WIN OVER USC

IN DRAMATIC FASHION : UCLA came back to win the Saturday and Sunday contests against USC to take its first conference series win over the Trojans since 2001.

After dropping a 6-4 contest on Friday night, UCLA posted a 12-6 victory over the Trojans on Saturday. Jarrad Page would go 4-for-4 with three doubles and four RBI to spearhead the Bruin offense, while Matt Thayer hit his third home run of the season. On the mound, Adam Simon shut down USC, holding the Trojans to two hits over the final 3.2 innings of the game. Sophomore Scott Botterman picked up his first collegiate win in the contest.

On Sunday, UCLA rallied to score six runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to overcome a 12-7 deficit and post a 13-12 win over the Trojans. Sophomore catcher Chris Denove drove in the winning run in the ninth with a single through the right side of the Trojan infield. Mike Svetlic finished the day with a 4-for-6 performance and three RBI, while Brett McMillan also drove in three runs.

UCLA DROPS PITCHER'S DUEL, 2-1 AT

LONG BEACH STATE: Long Beach State scored a run in the bottom of the ninth to take a 2-1 win over the Bruins at Blair Field on Tuesday night.

Bruin starter David Johnson was stellar in his fifth start of the season. He held the 49ers scoreless in his seven inning outing and scattered four hits.

Ryan McCarthy continued to swing a hot bat as he went 3-for-4 with the night's only Bruin RBI.

BRUINS CLAIM PAC-10 SERIES WIN AT CALIFORNIA : UCLA defeated California on Friday and Saturday to take a 2-1 series win at Berkeley.

Casey Janssen improved to 7-2 on the season in UCLA's 7-2 win on Friday afternoon. A three-run home run from Brandon Averill and a two-run shot from Chris Denove spearheaded the Bruin offense in the victory.

On Saturday, UCLA came back to score six runs in the sixth inning to take a 8-5 lead en route to a 10-7 victory. Denove homered for the second straight day with a two-run roundtripper in the seventh frame to seal the Bruin win.

UCLA dropped a 3-2 heartbreaker on Sunday as the Golden Bears scored one run in the bottom of the seventh inning to salvage the series. Despite suffering

the loss, Wes Whisler had a solid outing, scattering six hits and three runs over six innings of work.

BROPHY SHUTS DOWN TITANS AS UCLA WINS 12 INNING CONTEST , 5-4:

Kevin Brophy struck out a career-high three batters and did not allow a run in the final 2.2 innings of the game lead UCLA to a 5-4 win at Cal State Fullerton. With the win, the freshman improved to 5-0 on the year.

Josh Roenicke knocked in the game winner in the top of the 12th frame to seal the win for the Bruins. Brett McMillan, Ryan McCarthy and Preston Griffin each had two hits on the night.

UCLA TAKES ONE IN WILD WEEKEND AGAINST ARIZONA STATE:

The Bruins claimed a 11-10 win on Sunday to salvage the series against the Sun Devils who won the two previous games of the weekend.

Ryan McCarthy went 5-for-5 on Sunday with two homers, including a two-run game winner in the eighth to highlight the Bruin offense. Kevin Brophy picked up his fourth win of the season as he kept ASU from reclaiming the lead in the top of the ninth.

GRIFFIN'S WALK-OFF HOMER LEADS UCLA TO 6-5 VICTORY OVER TOP-RANKED STANFORD

: Preston Griffin hit the first pitch of the bottom of the ninth inning over the right field wall to give UCLA a 6-5 win over top-ranked Stanford on Sunday. The win was the only one of the weekend for the Bruins as they fell on Friday night (11-14) and Saturday (15-13).

The homer was the first of the season for the senior infielder and handed the Cardinal only its fourth loss of the year.

In Saturday's contest, Johnny Ash hit a two-run homer in the top of the ninth to lead the Cardinal to a 15-13 victory over UCLA. Eight homers were hit between the teams in the contest, while 13 left the yard over the course of the weekend. Ash and Bruin Ryan McCarthy both hit two out on Saturday.

On Friday, the Cardinal posted six runs in the second inning to build a lead the Bruins could not overcome as Stanford won 11-4.

BRUINS FALL AT SAN DIEGO STATE,

5-1: In a game that was added to the schedule, UCLA fell 5-1 to San Diego State.

The Bruins posted six hits in the contest, including triples from Anthony Norman and Matt Thayer. Norman's triple would bring Jarrad Page around to score in the top of the ninth to break up the Aztec shutout.

Bruins reliever Kyle Wilson threw a career-high four strikeouts in two innings of work, while starter David Johnson suffered his first loss of the season.

UCLA POSTS FIRST WIN AT DEDEAUX FIELD SINCE 1999:

The Bruins claimed their first win at USC in 11 games when they defeated the Trojans, 13-7, in the final game of the three-game non-conference series.

After dropping the first two games of the series, UCLA exploded for 13 hits and 13 runs on Sunday to take the win. Mike Svetlic drove in a career-high five runs, while Matt Thayer went 3-for-6 to lead the way for UCLA.

Freshman reliever Brian Schroeder picked up his second save of the season as he forced Jeff Clement to ground into a double play to end a bases loaded threat in the seventh frame. Schroeder finished the game for UCLA, throwing 2.2 innings of scoreless relief.

UCLA AVENGES LOSS, DEFEATS LOYOLA MARYMOUNT, 7-5:

Sophomore reliever Scott Botterman retired the final three Lion batters and left the bases loaded as he claimed his first collegiate save and the Bruins notched a 7-5 victory over Loyola Marymount.

The Bruins posted five runs in the first three frames to build a lead the Lions could not overcome. Brett McMillan and Anthony Norman both drove in two runs apiece, while Ryan McCarthy added two doubles to the UCLA attack.

On the mound, Bryan Beck improved to 2-1 on the season as he struck out four batters and allowed five hits in six innings of action.

BRUINS WIN ONE AT AZTEC INVITATIONAL

AT PETCO PARK: UCLA helped San Diego open its new major league baseball stadium and went 1-2 in the Aztec Invitational at PETCO Park.

In Thursday night's tournament opener, a NCAA record 40,106 filled the stadium to watch San Diego State defeat Houston, 4-0. The mark shattered the previous NCAA record of 27,673 that saw Tulane play LSU at the Superdome in 2002.

On Friday, the Bruins opened their tournament play with a 3-0 loss to ninth-ranked Long Beach State. UCLA could only muster one hit against All-American and the Collegiate Baseball Player of the Week, Jered Weaver. Weaver struck out 15 Bruins and allowed three base runners in eight innings of action. Ryan McCarthy recorded UCLA's one hit off Weaver, while Billy Susdorf singled in the ninth.

Saturday's game saw Bruin Casey Janssen dominate Nebraska and improve to 5-0 on the season in UCLA's 4-2 win over the Huskers. Janssen threw a career-high 8.2 innings and allowed

only four hits, all singles, in the outing. He struck out five batters, while walking one.

Ryan McCarthy highlighted the Bruin offense on Saturday, hitting a two-run home run in the sixth inning. McCarthy, along with Matt Thayer, finished the day going 2-for-4.

On Sunday, UCLA came back from a four-run deficit in the eighth inning only to see Houston score the game-winner in the bottom of the ninth, as the Bruins fell 7-6.

After trailing 6-2, the Bruins put up a four-run eighth inning to tie the score. However, after the leadoff Cougar reached base on an error in the ninth, he would come around to score on a bases loaded walk. Preston Griffin and Brett McMillan both drove in two runs, while Wes Whisler brought in two more with a double in the eighth. The five Bruin pitchers combined to strikeout eight Cougars, while Adam Simon fanned a season-high three in 2.2 innings of action.

UCLA FALLS AT 18TH-RANKED UC IRVINE, 6-0: The Bruins dropped their third straight game on Tuesday night in a 6-0 loss at 18th-ranked UC Irvine.

Ryan McCarthy posted a season-high three hits as UCLA only mustered seven hits as a team.

Starter Hector Ambriz dropped to 2-2 on the year despite throwing a season-high seven strikeouts in the game.

Prior to the contest, Bruin head coach Gary Adams, was honored by the UC Irvine Athletic Department. Adams led the Anteaters to back-to-back national championships in 1973 and 1974 before taking the helm of the UCLA program.

BRUINS TAKE ONE FROM 14TH-RANKED TEXAS A&M: In their first series against a ranked opponent, the Bruins claimed victory in Friday night's game against 14th-ranked Texas A&M before dropping the weekend contests.

On Friday, UCLA defeated the Aggies behind the solid pitching of starter Casey Janssen. The senior from Huntington Beach improved to 4-0 on the season with the win. He allowed only two runs on six hits in 7.1 innings. He

also struck out four batters to bring his season strikeout total to 39 in 31.1 innings of work. On the offensive side, Wes Whisler and Matt Thayer both posted three hits in the game. Whisler hit his second homer of the season, while driving in two runs.

Despite out-hitting the Aggies on Saturday, the Bruins were unable to hold onto an early lead and fell 8-4 to Texas A&M. Brett McMillan and Billy Susdorf highlighted the Bruin offense with two hits apiece. McMillan hit his team-leading third home run of the season in the game.

Sunday saw the Bruin bats post only four hits while dropping the rubber match of the series, 8-2. A two-run home run from Ryan McCarthy drove in both UCLA runs, while Susdorf hit his seventh single on the year.

DENOVE'S WALK OFF HOMER GIVES UCLA 3-2 W IN OVER UCSB: After going hitless in his previous 19 at-bats, Chris Denove broke out of his slump in the top of the 12th inning against UC Santa Barbara with a solo home run that gave UCLA a 3-2 win over the Gauchos. The win marked the sixth straight for the Bruins after their four-game sweep in Hawaii and a win over Pepperdine.

Sophomore right-hander Daniel Miltenberger claimed the win after retiring the last two batters of the top of the 12th. Hector Ambriz started the game and posted five strikeouts in 5.1 innings of scoreless relief.

UCLA SWEEPS FOUR-GAME SERIES AT HAWAII-HILO: Matt Thayer hit for the cycle and Bryan Beck threw a complete game shutout to highlight the Bruins 4-0 trip against Hawaii-Hilo. The sweep marked the first for UCLA since 2001, when the Bruins swept UNLV.

In Thursday's 10-4 victory, Hector Ambriz picked up the win with a six inning outing in which he struck out four batters. Wes Whisler spearheaded in Bruin offense, going 3-for-4 and scoring three runs. Brett McMillan knocked in three UCLA runs with a bases loaded triple to lead the team in RBI on the night.

Thayer became the fourth Bruin to hit for the cycle in Friday's 14-1, seven in-

ning win. The junior from Woodland Hills completed the hardest parts of the cycle first needing a single to complete the feat.

Casey Janssen continued his dominance on the mound with another overpowering performance on Friday. He struck out eight batters in six innings while allowing only one run on two hits.

After Saturday's game was rained out, the teams resumed the series on Sunday in Kona. Beck, in only his fourth career start, threw a complete game shut out in the 11-0 victory. He allowed only four hits and did not walk a batter in the contest. He also struck out six Vulcans.

On the offensive side, McMillan led the Bruins, going 3-for-5 with a triple and a home run. Whisler was also hot at the plate with his first home run of the year and two walks. Thayer also drove in three runs, while going 2-for-4.

In Monday's contest, UCLA scored six runs in the ninth inning to add to its lead to post a 12-1 win in the final game of the series. 11 different Bruins posted a hit in the game, while the team had 15 hits as a whole. Anthony Norman drove in two runs with a triple while Ambriz hit a solo home run in the first inning.

BRUINS WIN 8-6 S LUGFEST WITH PEPPERDINE: UCLA hit three solo home runs in the first inning and came back from a three-run deficit in the sixth inning to earn an 8-6 win over the Waves.

Chad Concolino, Billy Susdorf and Hector Ambriz all homered in the first frame, while Ambriz led the team with three RBI on the day. Brett McMillan went 3-for-3 as the Bruins recorded 13 hits as a team.

Brant Rustich picked up his first collegiate win after pitching a career-high 3.2 innings and striking out a career-high five batters.

BRUINS SPLIT A PAIR WITH PACIFIC IN RAINY WEEKEND SERIES: Casey Janssen hurled an eight-inning, 10 strikeout performance on Friday night to lift UCLA to a 6-1 victory over Pacific. Saturday's starter Alex Graham returned the favor with a complete game in which he held the Bruins to two hits en route to a 7-0

Tiger win. The teams tried to beat an incoming storm by scheduling a double-header on Saturday, but the rain cut short the second game as UCLA trailed 2-0 in the bottom of the fifth frame. The game is not likely to be rescheduled.

Friday night featured 11 Bruin hits, as senior Chad Concolino hit two doubles and three other Bruins had multiple hit games. Preston Griffin went two-for-two at the plate with two doubles of his own along with two runs driven in.

On Saturday, Wes Whisler and Billy Susdorf were the only Bruins to record hits against Graham.

AVERILL NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Brandon Averill was named the Pac-10 Player of the Week on Tuesday. It was the second such honor for the senior in his career.

Averill, from Orange, Calif., hit .364 (4-for-11) over the weekend, as UCLA took two of three from Fresno State. His three-run home run with two outs in the bottom of the eighth inning pushed the Bruins past Fresno State, 13-11, on Feb. 14. In that game he posted a career-best six RBI, tops for UCLA over the entire weekend. He also smacked two doubles and scored two runs over the three-game set.

BRUINS SUFFER A 7-3 HEARTBREAKING LOSS AT LMU: Loyola Marymount scored five runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to take back the lead and defeat UCLA at George C. Page Stadium. The Bruins had rallied to tie the score at 7-7 in the top of the ninth inning, but the game was called due to lack of light. Therefore, the score reverted back to the last completed inning.

Catcher Chris Denove spearheaded the Bruin attack, driving in two of the team's three runs. Brandon Averill continued his hot start, going 3-for-4 on the day, while Billy Susdorf stole two bases.

UCLA TAKES TWO OF THREE FROM FRESNO STATE IN OPENING SERIES: Senior Casey Janssen allowed only one hit in six innings and struck out eight Bulldogs to lead the Bruins to a Friday night win against Fresno State. A balanced

offensive attack would help the team post 10 hits. Billy Susdorf, Wes Whisler and Chris Denove all had two hits on the night, while Preston Griffin drove in two runs.

A three-run homer from Brandon Averill in the bottom of the eighth inning would prove to be the game winner to bring the Bruins back from behind to post a 13-11 win on Saturday. Freshman walk-on Kevin Brophy shut down the Bulldog offense late in the game with 2.1 innings of scoreless ball to earn the win. Averill finished the day with a career-high six RBI, while Susdorf went 4-for-5 with three doubles.

On Sunday, a two-run homer from Brett McMillan would even the score at 2-2 in the fifth inning and the game would remain that way until Fresno State scored a run in the top of the tenth inning to take a 3-2 victory. Bruin starter Bryan Beck was stellar in his first start of the season, striking out seven batters with only one walk in 5.2 innings of work.

ALUMNI AND CURRENT BRUINS PLAY TO 2-2 TIE: The 2004 Bruins and Bruin professionals played to a 2-2 tie in a five-inning contest at Jackie Robinson Field.

Philadelphia Phillie Chase Utley drove in the first alumni team runs in the top of the third inning with a double to right field. Both Jack Santora and Los Angeles Dodger Dave Roberts scored on the hit.

Bryan Beck started the game for the 2004 Bruins and recorded three strikeouts in three innings of action.

David Johnson pitched the fourth frame and struck out two of the three batters he faced.

The Bruin rally started in the bottom of the fourth frame as Sean Carpenter singled to start the frame. After moving to second on a passed ball, Carpenter would come around to score on a Brandon Averill single. Hector Ambriz would drive the tying run with a single. After four innings, the teams were tied at 2-2.

Earlier in the day, Utley hit the only home run of the home run derby in the last at-bat of the contest to take the crown.

The Old Timers game, which consisted of alumni from 1939 - 1979, ended in a 6-6 tie after a late rally from the home team.

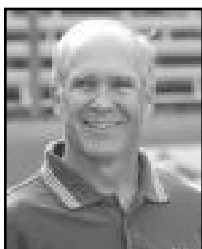

Induction into the ABCA Hall of Fame is the highest honor given to college baseball coaches. Upon entering, Adams will join current Hall of Fame coaches like Mark Marquess of Stanford and Jack Smitheran of UC Riverside, along with former coaches like Rod Dedeaux of USC and Jerry Kindall of Arizona. Former UCLA Head Coach Art Reichle is also a member of the ABCA Hall of Fame.
