Bruins Begin Six-Game Road Swing, Travel to Seattle

BRUINS TRAVEL TO WASHINGTON, BEGIN FINAL REGULAR SEASON ROAD SWING: UCLA (29-25, 10-8) enter the weekend series with Washington (33-16-1, 14-7) tied for third place in the Pac-10, along with Arizona State. The Huskies will finish up their conference slate this weekend before UC Irvine heads to town next week.

LATE RALLY FALLS SHORT, BRUINS FALL 7-5 TO UC IRVINE: UCLA scored three runs in the seventh inning to cut the Irvine lead to two runs, but could not score again, falling 7-5 to the Anteaters. Pinch-hitter Billy Susdorf highlighted the inning with a two-run double, while Matt Thayer and Ryan McCarthy each had two hits in the game.

BRUINS WIN WEEKEND SERIES OVER WASHINGTON STATE: Stellar pitching performances from Wes Whisler and

David Johnson, along with a seasonhigh 14-run game by the Bruin offense led UCLA to a 2-1 series win over Washington State.

On Sunday, UCLA tied a season-high with 14 runs and Whisler threw his first career complete game shutout as the Bruins defeated the Cougars 14-0. Brandon Averill drove in five runs on the day, including three on his seventh homer of the season. The day also marked the final home Pac-10 game for five Bruin seniors and head coach Gary Adams. Adams was honored before the game with a ceremony retiring his uniform number, #13.

Johnson, Brian Schroeder and Kyle Wilson held the Cougars to six hits and one run on Saturday as UCLA claimed a 3-1 win. Whisler powered the Bruin offense with his fifth home run of the year and two RBI.

The Bruins dropped a heartbreaker on Friday night, falling 10-9 in the tenth inning. Brett McMillan led

UCLA C OMPLETES FIRST SWEEP OF CAL STATE FULLERTON SINCE 1991: The Bruins hit three home runs and held Cal State Fullerton to four hits en route to a 8-2 victory on Tuesday night. Wes Whisler drove in three runs, while Chris Denove, Brandon Averill and Jarrad Page each homered.

Starter Daniel Miltenberger improved to 3-0 on the season as he threw a career-high six innings and allowed only two hits. Reliever Kyle Wilson struck-out a career-high five batters, including three in the ninth inning, to earn his second save of 2004.

BRUINS EARN ONE WIN IN WEEKEND SERIES WITH ARIZONA: Casey Janssen picked up his eighth win of the season and UCLA picked up its only win of the weekend on Friday night over Arizona. In the 7-3 nonconference victory, the Bruin bullpen relieved Janssen, holding the Wildcats to only one run on one hit in the final 4.2 frames. The Bruin staff struck out 10 batters on the night.

On Saturday, UCLA hit a season-high four home runs, but it wouldn't be enough as Arizona claimed a 20-9 victory. Preston Griffin, Brandon Averill, Wes Whisler and Will Penniall all homered in the contest.

Sunday saw UCLA held to two hits, as Arizona hurler John Meloan pitched complete game. Griffin and Ryan McCarthy had the lone Bruin hits., which were both home runs. Griffin's roundtripper came in the first Bruin atbat of the game and marked his second home run in as many games.

UCLA D ROPS TWO CONTESTS AT #12

WICHITA STATE: The Bruins took early leads in both of their games in Wichita, Kansas, but the 12th-ranked Shockers posted late rallies to hand UCLA backto-back losses.

BRUINS CLAIM SERIES WIN OVER USC IN Dramatic Fashion: UCLA came back to win the Saturday and Sunday contests against USC to take its first conference series win over the Trojans since 2001.

After dropping a 6-4 contest on Friday night, UCLA posted a 12-6 victory over the Trojans on Saturday. Jarrad Page would go 4-for-4 with three

doubles and four RBI to spearhead the Bruin offense, while Matt Thayer hit his third home run of the season. On the mound, Adam Simon shut down USC, holding the Trojans to two hits over the final 3.2 innings of the game. Sophomore Scott Botterman picked up his first collegiate win in the contest.

On Sunday, UCLA rallied to score six runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to overcome a 12-7 deficit and post a 13-12 win over the Trojans. Sophomore catcher Chris Denove drove in the winning run in the ninth with a single through the right side of the Trojan infield. Mike Svetlic finished the day with a 4-for-6 performance and three RBI, while Brett McMillan also drove in three runs.

UCLA DROPS PITCHER'S DUEL, 2-1 AT Long Beach State: Long Beach State scored a run in the bottom of the ninth to take a 2-1 win over the Bruins at Blair Field on Tuesday night.

Bruin starter David Johnson was stellar in his fifth start of the season. He held the 49ers scoreless in his seven inning outing and scattered four hits.

Ryan McCarthy continued to swing a hot bat as he went 3-for-4 with the night's only Bruin RBI.

BRUINS WIN ONE AT AZTEC INVITATIONAL AT PETCO P ARK: UCLA helped San Diego open its new major league baseball stadium and went 1-2 in the Aztec Invitationat at PETCO Park.

In Thursday night's tournament opener, a NCAA record 40,106 filled the stadium to watch San Diego State defeat Houston, 4-0. The mark shattered the previous NCAA record of 27, 673 that saw Tulane play LSU at the Superdome in 2002.

On Friday, the Bruins opened their tournament play with a 3-0 loss to ninthranked Long Beach State. UCLA could only muster one hit against All-American and the Collegiate Baseball Player of the Week, Jered Weaver. Starter Hector Ambriz dropped to 2-2 on the year despite throwing a season-high seven strikeouts in the game.

Prior to the contest, Bruin head coach Gary Adams, was honored by the UC Irvine Athletic Department. Adams led the Anteaters to back-to-back national championships in 1973 and 1974 before taking the helm of the UCLA program.

Bruins Take One From 14th-Ranked

TEXAS A&M: In their first series against a ranked opponent, the Bruins claimed victory in Friday night's game against 14th-ranked Texas A&M before dropping the weekend contests.

On Friday, UCLA defeated the Aggies behind the solid pitching of starter Casey Janssen. The senior from Huntington Beach improved to 4-0 on the season with the win. He allowed only two runs on six hits in 7.1 innings. He also struck out four batters to bring his season strikeout total to 39 in 31.1 innings of work. On the offensive side, Wes Whisler and Matt Thayer both posted three hits in the game. Whisler hit his second homer of the season, while driving in

two runs.

Despite out-hitting the Aggies on Saturday, the Bruins were unable to hold onto an early lead and fell 8-4 to Texas A&M. Brett McMillan and Billy Susdorf highlighted the Bruin offense with two hits apiece. McMillan hit his team-leading third home run of the season in the game.

UCLA S WEEPS FOUR-GAME SERIES AT HAWAII-HILO: Matt Thayer hit for the cycle and Bryan Beck threw a complete game shutout to highlight the Bruins 4-0 trip against Hawaii-Hilo. The sweep marked the first for UCLA since 2001, when the Bruins swept UNLV.

In Thursday's 10-4 victory, Hector Ambriz picked up the win with a six inning outing in which he struck out four batters. Wes Whisler spearheaded in Bruin offense, going 3-for-4 and scoring three runs. Brett McMillan knocked in three UCLA runs with a bases loaded triple to lead the team in RBI on the night.
