# 2009-10 UCLA OUTLOOK

The Bruins are in a rebuilding year in 2009-10, returning just one starter from last year's squad that went 26-9 and finished in second place in the Pac-10 (13-5). After losing five players to the NBA Draft in the last two seasons, UCLA's depth has taken a hit. But the cupboard isn't bare as the Bruins return three seniors that have all made at least two NCAA Final Four appearances.

## THE SENIORS

Leading the veterans is senior Nikola Dragović (6-9, 225), the only returning starter from a year ago. He is also the leading returning scorer and rebounder as he averaged 9.4 points, 4.3 rebounds and 1.4 assists per game last year. Dragović finished eighth in Pac-10 games in three-point field goal percentage at 44.0 percent (44-for-100) and also finished sixth in three-point field goals made per game (2.4) during the 2008-09 campaign.

Guard Michael Roll (6-5, 200) has the most experience of any of the upperclassmen as the senior returns for his fifth year at UCLA. Roll led the Pac-10 in three-point field goal percentage in all games, sinking 51.5 percent (51-for-99) from beyond the arc. He also finished second in Pac-10 games behind teammate Josh Shipp at 51.0 percent (25-for-49). Roll averaged 6.7 points, 1.3 rebounds and 1.4 assists last year.

The final senior is forward James Keefe (6-8, 235), who started the first 14 games at the four spot last year until being replaced in the lineup by Dragović. Keefe averaged 3.0 points and 3.4 rebounds per game in 2008-09.

## THE JUNIORS

This is not only the smallest class, but outside of the freshman class, the least experienced.

Junior guard Mustafa Abdul-Hamid (6-2, 195) played in just one minute in each of the first two games last year before tearing a ligament in his right wrist. The injury forced him to miss the final 33 games a year ago and he had surgery on Dec. 23, 2008 to repair the damage. After receiving a medical hardship, Abdul-Hamid returns as a redshirt junior. He averaged 0.5 assists per game last year.

Walk-on guard Spencer Soo (5-8, 160) is the only other junior on this year's squad. He played in 11 minutes of six games a year ago averaging 0.8 points and 0.2 rebounds.

## THE SOPHOMORES

There's no doubt that this former No.-1 ranked recruiting class nationally lost its best player from last year in Jrue Holiday (first round pick in the 2009 NBA Draft). But the class has plenty of talent remaining.

In all likelihood, point guard Jerime Anderson (6-2, 174), the heir apparent to Darren Collison, will take over at point for the UCLA offense. Anderson served as the back-up point guard last year, playing in all 35 games while averaging 2.3 points, 0.5 rebounds and 1.2 assists per game.

Guard Malcolm Lee (6-4, 191) will be vying for a starting spot on the wing for UCLA in 2009-10 and many say he blossomed this summer at the adidas Nations Camp. He also ran the point at a high level at the camp in Dallas this August so look for him to get some time there as well. Last year, Lee played on the wing and averaged 3.2 points, 1.5 rebounds and 0.6 assists per game.

Forward Drew Gordon (6-9, 230) suffered a slight setback this summer, injuring his knee and

A trio of walk-on guards round out the seven-man class of sophomores. Tyler Trapani (6-0, 185), Blake Arnet (5-11, 187) and Matt DeMarcus (6-2, 185) each played on the squad last year. Trapani played in only one game (the Wooden Classic contests versus DePaul) while Arnet played in 22 minutes of 10 games and averaged 0.9 points and 0.1 rebounds per game. DeMarcus never appeared in any games a year ago.

## THE FRESHMEN

Head Coach Ben Howland has brought in another Top 5 recruiting class with the 2009-10 crop that includes five big men who all averaged double-doubles their senior year of high school.

The class consists of Tyler Honeycutt, a 6-foot-7-inch, 178-pound forward out of Los Angeles (Sylmar HS), Brendan Lane, a 6-foot-9-inch, 205-pound forward out of Rocklin, Calif. (Rocklin HS), Mike Moser, a 6-foot-8-inch, 195-pound forward out of Portland, Ore. (Grant HS), Reeves Nelson, a 6-foot-8-inch, 228-pound forward out of Modesto, Calif. (Modesto Christian HS) and Anthony Stover, a 6-foot-10-inch, 225-pound center out of Pasadena, Calif. (Windward School).

The class was rated No. 4 nationally by Scout.com and No. 9 by ESPN. Additionally, Honeycutt and Nelson were both on the Best in the West first team in 2008-09 while Lane and Stover were on the second team.

Honeycutt averaged 19.8 points, 15.0 rebounds and 3.9 blocks per game last year while picking up 2009 Parade All-American third team honors.

Lane averaged 22.1 points, 12.1 rebounds and 4.8 blocks per game a year ago while earning 2009 Sacramento All-Metro Player of the Year honors.

Moser averaged 26.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 4.0 blocks per game last year and was named the 2009 Mr. Basketball for the state of Oregon.

Nelson averaged 24.7 points, 14.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game a year ago and garnered 2009 Modesto Bee All-District MVP accolades.

Stover averaged 14.0 points, 11.0 rebounds and 9.5 blocks per game last year while picking up 2009 Honorable Mention All-State honors.

A late addition to the roster includes a walk-on freshman with a lot of potential. Guard/forward Alex Schrempf (6-4, 218) will join the Bruins for the 2009-10 season. Schrempf averaged 16.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per game leading Bellevue HS (Seattle) to its first conference championship in 40 years in 2009. His father is Detlef Schrempf, who had a storied 16-year career in the NBA after a standout career at the University of Washington.

forcing him to pull out of the USA Basketball's U19 World Championship Team Trials in Colorado Springs, Colo. But he should be back on track in time when the Bruins take the court in Oct. for the start of practice. Gordon averaged 3.6 points and 3.4 rebounds per game last year in the post.

Nobody worked harder or got into better shape in the offseason than center J'mison Morgan (6-10, 240). Morgan averaged 2.3 points, 1.0 rebounds and 0.5 blocks per game a year ago. He finished fifth on the team in blocks with 10 despite playing in only 21 of the 35 games. He is also one of only two true centers on the roster.
