2010-11 UCLA OUTLOOK

With no seniors on the squad and coming off a 14-18 season, the Bruins find themselves in a rebuilding year in 2010-11. But UCLA returns three starters this season, compared to just one a year ago, and signed another nationally ranked recruiting class. After seeing its streak of players drafted in the NBA snapped at 13 consecutive years, UCLA has plenty of young talent on its roster, all eager to make their mark and return UCLA to where it belongs ... among the nation's elite basketball programs.

THE JUNIORS

There's no doubt that this nationally top-ranked recruiting class has lost a lot of firepower, but there are seven juniors on the squad ready to lead the 2010-11 Bruins.

Guard Malcolm Lee (6-5, 200) is one of three returning starters and is UCLA's leading scorer returning after averaging 12.1 points per game last year, which ranked 16th in the Pac-10 Conference. Lee played most of the season at point guard, but should return to his natural shooting guard slot this season. He did an admirable job at point a year ago, averaging 3.1 assists per game (10th in the Pac-10) and 4.4 rebounds per game. He is second among all returning players in the Pac-10 in minutes played as he averaged 34.8 minutes of action per game last year.

Point guard Jerime Anderson (6-2, 183), will battle it out for time as the floor general with another junior, transfer Lazeric Jones (6-0, 187). Anderson has been the back-up point guard in each of the last two seasons and averaged 5.8 points, 2.7 assists and 1.9 rebounds per game last year. He started in 14 of 32 games a year ago at the point.

Jones, a JC transfer from John A. Logan College in Chicago, Ill., will vie for the starting job at point and is expected to help turn one of last year's weaknesses into one of the team's strengths in 2010-11. Jones averaged 14.5 points, 5.7 assists and 4.9 rebounds per game last year as a sophomore.

A trio of walk-on guards round out the six-man class of juniors. Tyler Trapani (6-0, 190), Blake Arnet (6-0, 180) and Matt DeMarcus (6-3, 203) each played on the squad last year. Trapani played in only one game (the Wooden Classic contests versus Mississippi State) while Arnet played in just four minutes of three games and averaged 0.3 rebounds per game. DeMarcus never appeared in any games

a year ago. The Bruins also held a tryout on Oct. 8 and has added Kenny Jones (6-0, 190), a junior guard to the 2010-11 roster.

THE SOPHOMORES

This former Top 5 recruiting class is looking to have a breakout season in 2010-11, with two of its members earning Pac-10 All-Freshman Team honors last year.

Leading the charge will be Pac-10 All-Freshman Team members Tyler Honeycutt (6-8, 188) and Reeves Nelson (6-8, 235), both returning starters from a year ago.

Honeycutt got off to a slow start when an injury sidelined him for the first six games of his freshman campaign. But he responded well, becoming the third freshman to lead the Bruins in rebounding (6.5 rpg, 9th in Pac-10) in the last five years. He joined Luc Richard Mbah a Moute (8.2 rpg in 2006) and Kevin Love (10.6 rpg in 2008) in that exclusive club. Honeycutt led all Pac-10 freshmen with four double-doubles, and those came over the last 11 games of the season where he averaged 9.8 points and 7.4 rebounds during that span.

Nelson was second on the squad in rebounding at 5.7 rpg, which ranked 11th in the Pac-10 Conference. He led the Bruins and ranked second in the Pac-10 last year in field goal percentage at 64.7 percent (119-of-184). He started in 14 games last year and missed four contests late in the season due to injury. But he came back strong in the Pac-10 Tournament, recording his second double-double of the season with 19 points and 10 rebounds in the win over Arizona in the quarterfinals.

Brendan Lane (6-9, 223) also got off to a slow start, hampered by injuries. He made three starts on the year and averaged 2.4 points and 1.5 rebounds per game while averaging 10.0 minutes per game in 27 contests. Lane had surgery in April on his left ankle to repair the damage from multiple injuries over the year, forcing him to miss five months during offseason workouts.

The final two sophomores to round out the five-man class are new additions to the Bruins in 2010-11 and will be sidelined for the season. Travis and David Wear transferred from North Carolina over the summer and will be ready to make an impact

in 2011-12. Travis (6-10, 220) averaged 3.5 points and 2.2 rebounds per game last year at UNC while David (6-10, 225), averaged 2.9 points and 1.7 rebounds per game.

THE REDSHIRT FRESHMEN

Two freshmen sat out the 2009-10 season for the Bruins and are redshirt freshmen this year. Center Anthony Stover (6-10, 235) and forward Alex Schrempf (6-5, 220) took their initial freshman season to improve their strength and conditioning and overall game and will look to contribute to the Bruins' efforts this year. Stover, who was part of the 2009 CIF-Division V Championship team at Windward School, should contend for playing time in the post.

THE FRESHMEN

Head Coach Ben Howland has brought in another nationally ranked recruiting class with the 2010-11 crop that includes center Joshua Smith and guards Tyler Lamb and Matt Carlino.

Smith (Kentwood HS, Kent., Wash.) averaged 21.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 5.0 blocks per game last year while leading Kentwood HS to the state championship. Smith (6-10, 305) was a 2010 McDonald's All-American and will likely become the Bruins' starting center.

Lamb (Mater Dei HS, Santa Ana, Calif.) averaged 18.9 points, 7.0 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game last year. Lamb (6-5, 200) was a 2010 first team All-State selection and will vie for playing time with Lee at shooting guard.

Carlino (Bloomington South HS (Ind.), Scottsdale, Ariz.) averaged 13.4 points, 5.9 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game as a junior last year at Bloomington South HS. Carlino (6-1, 172) graduated a year early from high school to become eligible to help the Bruins immediately. He was named to the 2010 Indiana Junior All-Star Team.

The final freshman is a walk-on with ties to the Bruin family. Jack Haley (6-4, 185) from Seal Beach, Calif., will walk-on to the UCLA squad this season. The 2010 Griffin Award winner from Los Alamitos High School, is the son of Bruin alum Jack Haley, who had a successful 10-year career in the NBA.
