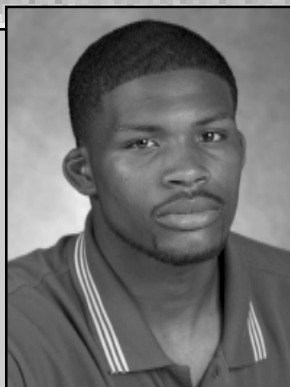

UCLA—In his two seasons as UCLA's starting strong safety, Jarrad has established himself as an aggressive, hard-hitting performer ... With two seasons remaining in his career, he has a chance to develop into an outstanding safety ... He has started 22 of his 25 career games ... Missed all of Spring drills while playing with the Bruins baseball squad ... Started 32 of his 46 games in center field and batted .233 with three home runs, 19 runs batted in, 26 runs scored and six stolen bases ... Batted .308 in Pac-10 action.

2003—In his second year as a starter, he made 55 tackles in 12 games to rank sixth on the team ... Tied for the team lead with three interceptions, returning one for a touchdown (Washington) ... Earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention ... Made six tackles in the season-opener at Colorado ... Made three stops against Illinois ... Added four tackles at Oklahoma ... Made seven stops against San Diego State ... Against Washington, he made four tackles and returned an interception 24 yards for a touchdown which gave UCLA a 32-16 lead early in the fourth quarter ... Did not play at Arizona due to a sprained and bruised shoulder which snapped a string of 15 straight starting assignments ... Returned to starting lineup against California and made four tackles, including one for loss ... Against Arizona State, he made three stops and broke up one pass ... Totaled five tackles, including one for loss, and made his second interception of the season at Stanford ... Credited with five tackles, including 0.5 for loss and made an interception and a fumble recovery ... Against Oregon, he made four tackles ... Recorded five tackles, including three for loss, and recovered a fumble in the game at USC ... Had three stops in the bowl game against Fresno State ... Overall, he started all 12 games in which he appeared and played at least 65 snaps eight times, including 80 against California, 79 versus Washington and 74 at Washington State.

2002—Page saw action in all 13 games and started the final 10 contests at strong safety ... Named first-team Freshman All-America and first-team Freshman All-Conference by The Sporting News ... Became the first Bruin safety since Kenny Easley in 1977 to start as many as 10 games as a true freshman ... Began the season as a backup and moved into the starting lineup when Matt Ware moved from free safety (Ben Emanuel moved from strong to free safety) to cornerback for the San Diego State game ... Started the last 10 games of the season ... Finished sixth on the team with 43 tackles and had two interceptions and six pass defenses ... Also served as a member of the punt return, field goal block, kickoff and punt units on special teams during the season ... Had two tackles against both Colorado State and Oklahoma State ... Had two stops in the game against Colorado ... Had two tackles in his first career start at San Diego State ... Added three solo stops at Oregon State ... Had five solo tackles and a pass deflection against Oregon ... Made one tackle for loss at California ... Totaled four tackles against Stanford ... Made a career-best eight tackles in the win at Washington ... Also made his first career interception against the Huskies which set up a field goal early in the second half ...
