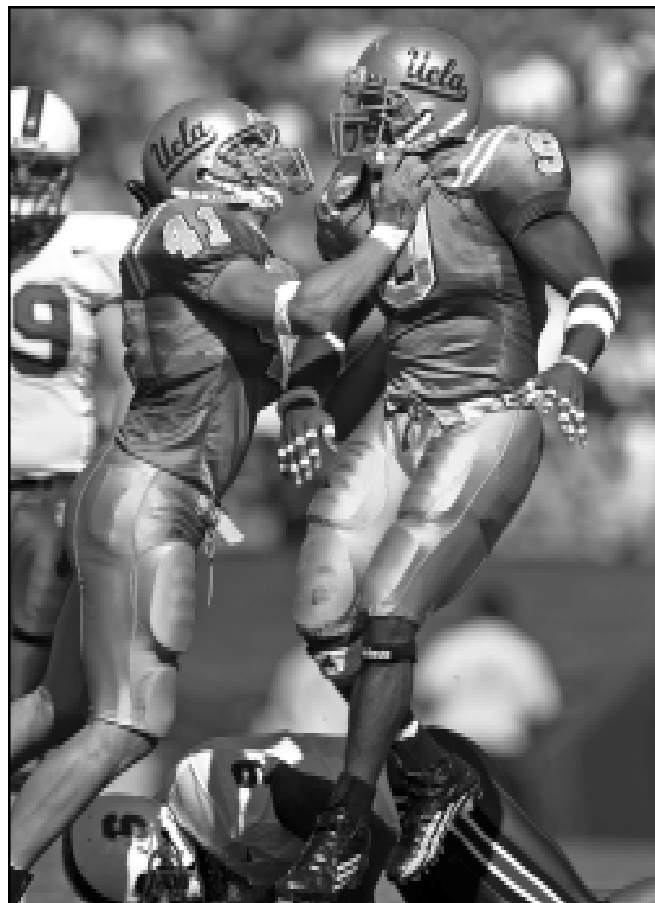

UCLA FOOTBALL FACTS

• Only eight schools in the nation have recorded more bowl victories than UCLA (10) over the last 23 years. (Among those schools, UCLA's winning percentage of .625 ranks seventh).

• UCLA has more bowl wins (10) in the last 23 years than any other school in the Pac-10.

• No other school in the Pac-10 has more final Associated Press Top 25 rankings than the Bruins over the last 23 years.

• Only eight schools, none from the Pac-10, have been ranked in the Top 10 more often than UCLA in the last 23 seasons.

• 135 of UCLA's last 143 games have been on live television. (Eleven of UCLA's 12 games in '04, 12 of 13 in '03, all 13 in '02, all 11 in '01, eleven of 12 in '00, 10 of 11 in '99 and all 12 of UCLA's games in '98 appeared on live television).

• UCLA has produced a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last 11 seasons. (An eighth player rushed for 994 yards in a season. In addition, UCLA has produced two first-team All-America tailbacks — Karim Abdul-Jabbar in 1995 and Skip Hicks in 1997 — and four first-team All-Pac-10 tailbacks — Abdul-Jabbar, Hicks and DeShaun Foster in 2000 and 2001 — in that span).

• Eight Bruin players and three coaches have been elected to the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

• UCLA's eight-game winning streak against USC between 1991 and 1998 is the longest in the history of the series.

• Sixteen Bruin football players have earned NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarships. (Five — Carlton Gray in 1992, George Kase in 1995, Chris Sailer and Shawn Stuart in 1998 and Danny Farmer in 1999 — in the last 13 seasons).

• Seventeen UCLA football players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams.

• UCLA had four players selected in the 2004 NFL Draft.

• UCLA has produced 11 No. 1 selections in the last 18 National Football League drafts.

(Robert Thomas in 2002, Freddie Mitchell in 2001, Cade McNown in 1999, Shaun Williams in 1998, Jonathan Ogden in 1996, J.J. Stokes in 1995, Jamir Miller in 1994, Tommy Maddox in 1992, Eric Turner in 1991, Troy Aikman in 1989 and Gaston Green in 1988).

• UCLA is the only school to produce five quarterbacks who have played in the Super Bowl (Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tom Ramsey and Jay Schroeder)

• UCLA defensive lineman Mike Lodish is the only player in NFL history to appear in six Super Bowls.

• UCLA Linebacker Ken Norton, Jr. is the only man in NFL history to play for three straight Super Bowl champions.

• UCLA's Troy Aikman was the first quarterback to lead his team to three Super Bowl victories in a four-year span.

• UCLA has had at least one former player participate in the Super Bowl in 25 of the last 26 games.

• UCLA was the first school to win a bowl game in seven consecutive seasons (1982-88).
