## ROSE BOWL: THE 31st YEAR

The 2012 season marks the 31st year that the Rose Bowl, currently undergoing a renovation, will serve as home of the Bruins.

The focus of the renovation project is to expedite tunnel ingress/egress, improve concourse circulation, increase the number of concession stands and restrooms, provide state-of-the-art premium seating products in a rebuilt press box and install a new scoreboard and video board.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 127-57-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/Slon-Campus.



## UCLA Has Bye Week Before Heading to Tempe

Three Home Games Remain on the Schedule in 2012

Bruins Meet Arizona State on Oct. 27 at Noon on FX

**BYE WEEK** — The Bruins are off this week and will return to field on Oct. 27 with a game at Arizona State.

**GAME 8** — The Bruins (5-2, 2-2) are back on the road following the bye week. UCLA will travel to No. 24-ranked Arizona State on Saturday, Oct. 27 to meet the Sun Devils in a Noon game. The contest will be televised by FX. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 570am in the Los Angeles area. The game will also be aired nationally on SIRIUS.

**VS. ARIZONA STATE** — UCLA owns a 7-5 record in games played in Tempe, but has dropped the last two meetings in the desert. A year ago in the Rose Bowl, the Bruins bested then 20th-ranked Arizona State by a score of 29-28. Derrick Coleman ran for 119 yards, 81 of them in the second half and 65 yards coming on the game-winning drive which culminated with the senior slamming into the end zone from one-yard out with 49 seconds left to play. Earlier in the second half, Kevin Prince and Nelson Rosario had hooked up on a 76-yard scoring pass. Rosario finished the game with 151 receiving yards and moved into 10th place on the all-time school list in the category. Tevin McDonald led the defense with 11 tackles.

In the 2010 game played in Tempe, quarterback Richard Brehaut set a school record with 56 passing attempts. He completed a school record 33 of the attempts for three scores and 321 yards, but it was not enough to hold off the Sun Devils in a 55-34 loss.

\*\*\*QB Brett Hundley's 14 touchdown passes leave him three back of Tommy Maddox's UCLA freshman record total of 17 set in 1990 season; Drew Olson holds the overall season record with 34 scoring tosses in 2005 -- Hundley also has 167 completions, a total which is third on the freshman list (Maddox 182, in 1990, is No. 1)

\*\*\*Y receiver Joseph Fauria, who was named to the Mackey Award Midseason Watch List, has caught a pass in 15 straight games; he moved into 11th on the all-time UCLA touchdown receptions list (13) with his scoring grab at Cal (J.J. Stokes, 1991-94, is No. 1 at 28; Mercedes Lewis, 2002-05, is second on that list, with 21, and first among Bruin tight ends)

\*\*With a career total of 3,547 rushing yards, Johnathan Franklin has vaulted into second on the all-time school list .... He is 185 yards shy of moving past Gaston Green's (1984-87) school mark of 3,731 yards.

\*\*Junior linebacker Anthony Barr, playing his first season on defense, is ranked T-13th in the nation in sacks (7.5 sacks for 1.07 per game average)

\*\*\* Bruins own the Pac-12 lead and rank tied for 4th in the nation with 18 turnovers gained (11 ints.-T-first in Pac-12 / T-4th in nation, and seven fumbles gained which is T-first in Pac-12 -- TCU is national leader with 20)

\*\*\*Utah was the 17th straight game UCLA has won when holding the opponent to less than 20 points

\*\*\*UCLA has played 25 freshmen so far this season -- 12 true freshmen and 13 redshirt freshmen

\*\*\*UCLA has won 14 of its last 18 games when winning the turnover battle (.778) and dropped 28 of its last 40 games (.300) when losing or tying the turnover ratio

\*\*\*RB Johnathan Franklin ranks ninth in the nation in rushing (125.4/g) ... He put together two season-opening 200-yard plus efforts against Rice (214) and Nebraska (217)...The senior ranks 14th in the nation in all-purpose yardage (154.6) and has caught a career-best 16 passes this season

\*\*\*UCLA is ranked 9th in the nation in sacks (3.43/g) after being ranked T-112th last season (1.00)

\*\*\*Johnathan Franklin (878 yards rushing to date this season) is attempting to join seven other Bruin backs who have had multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons --- DeShaun Foster - 2001: 1,109 / 2000: 1,037 -- Skip Hicks - 1997: 1,282 / 1996: 1,034 -- Karim Abdul-Jabbar - 1995: 1,571 / 1994: 1,227 -- Gaston Green - 1987: 1,098 / 1986: 1,405 -- Freeman McNeil - 1980: 1,105 / 1979: 1,396 -- Theotis Brown - 1978: 1,283 / 1976: 1,092 -- Wendell Tyler - 1975: 1,388 / 1976: 1,003

Defensive back **Tevin McDonald**'s(#7) brother, Tim Jr., plays at USC and his dad, Tim, played in the NFL from 1987-99 with the Cardinals and 49ers ... Defensive back **Sheldon Price**'s(#22) dad, Dennis, played at UCLA from 1984-87 and then in the NFL with the Raiders ... Punter **Jeff Locke**(#18) has been named to the All-Conference academic team the past three seasons; he has finished 12th (2011), fourth (2010) and 16th (2009) in the nation in punting average ... OL **Xavier Su'a-Filo** (#56) spent the last two years on an LDS mission in Alabama and Florida during which time he learned the Spanish language ... LB **Anthony Barr**'s(#11) dad, Tony Brooks, was a fourth-round pick of the Eagles in the 1992 draft, after playing at Notre Dame ... Reserve fullback **Luke Ganel**(#49) underwent chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant in high school to help overcome a rare blood disorder (aplastic anemia) ... **WORKING OVERTIME** — UCLA has a 7-1 record in overtime games, the last coming in the 2008 season-opener against Tennessee, a 27-24 win. The Bruins have won the last four overtime contests they have played with the only loss coming in triple overtime, at Cal, in 2000.

A school-record 17 true freshmen played for the Bruins in 1977. In recent years, nine played in 2005, eight in 2006, two in 2007 and 11 in 2008. UCLA played 10 freshmen in 2009 and in 2010. Tight end Raymond Nelson (no longer on the roster) was the lone first-year player to see action in 2011.

## THE OFFENSE

### Redshirt senior tailback JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)

\*\*\*38 career starts

\*\*\*Three career 200-yd plus rushing games; two this season

\*\*\*2nd on UCLA career rushing list (184 yds behind Gaston Green)

\*\*\*15 career 100-yard rushing games

Franklin kicked off the 2012 season with a pair of 200-yard plus rushing games, the second and third of his career, to match Gaston Green (1985, 1986, 1987) and Karim Abdul-Jabbar (three in a row 1995) for the most in school history. In game three against Houston, he racked up 110 yards on the ground and caught a career-best four passes (58 yds).

Franklin began the 2012 season with a 214-yard effort at Rice, which included two 70-plus yard runs for touchdowns. He raced 74 yards midway through the first quarter and then navigated 78 yards for a score late in the second quarter. He became the first Bruin to have two runs of over 72 yards in a game. Franklin was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for his efforts against the Owls. Against Nebraska, Franklin compiled a career-best 217 yards on the ground on 26 carries. He also caught a nine-yard scoring pass in the fourth quarter. For the second week in a row, he was named Conference Player of the Week. UCLA had never before had the same offensive player earn back-to-back POW honors from the Pac-12/Pac-10.

Franklin ran for a previous career-best 216 (30 carries) in a 2010 contest against Washington State (it was the most since Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004). In 2010, Franklin appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts. He led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage by a Bruin since Skip Hicks (1,282-1997). He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998. Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10 and No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list.

\*\*\*First UCLA qb with three straight 300-yard passing games

\*\*\*His 14 scoring passes are three behind UCLA freshman leader Tommy Maddox. Hundley, added recently to the Maxwell Award watch list, scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player. His 372 passing yards against Oregon State marked the third straight game above the 300-yard mark. It was the second-highest total in a single game by a UCLA freshman (Maddox, 409 vs. USC, 1990). In addition, it was the most aerial yards since Drew Olson threw for 510 against Arizona State in 2005. The 404 yards of total offense by Hundley are the second-highest total by a UCLA freshman in a single game (Maddox, 445-1990 v. USC) and fifth-highest in school history.

Hundley threw for 202 yards and two touchdowns in the opener against Rice. He ran seven times for 68 yards. The redshirt freshman totaled 305 yards and ran for 53 against Nebraska. He threw for 320 yards against Houston. Hundley threw for two scores and ran for a couple of more touchdowns at Colorado.

Hundley's 31 completions at Cal are the most-ever by a Bruin freshman qb and third on the all-time list. His 47 passing attempts tied for the most-ever by a Bruin freshman (Maddox - 1990 v. USC) and are tied for fifth on the all-time school list. He threw for one score (64 yds) and ran for another (12) against Utah. Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer knee injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

He threw for 2,348 yards as a senior in high school with 20 scoring passes, two interceptions. He also led his team in rushing with 856 yards and nine touchdowns. Following his senior season, he won the passing competition at the Under Armour All-America Game Skills Challenge.

**QUARTERBACK** — Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** saw his first action of 2012 in the fourth quarter versus Houston and came on at the end at Colorado. He started the last eight games (10 overall) of 2011. Prince completed his junior season ranked among UCLA's all-time best in total offense (8th), pass completions (8th) and passing yards (9th). He finished with 424 yards rushing (most since Jeff Dankworth racked up 815 in 1976. His 163 yards rushing v. Cal marked the first time a Bruin quarterback had gone over the 100-yard mark in a game since Dankworth in 1976. It was the most rushing yardage by a quarterback since John Sciarra totaled 178 versus Tennessee in 1974.

In 2010, Prince appeared in five games, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of that season after undergoing knee surgery on Oct. 23. In 2009, Prince started all 11 games in which he played. He became the second freshman quarterback in UCLA history to pass for over 300 yards, three times in a season (Maddox, 1990).

True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** saw action for a few plays in the second half against Nebraska and completed one pass. He came on in the fourth quarter of the Rice game and threw for 101 yards.

In 2011, he appeared in seven games, with four starts. He came on in relief of Kevin Prince in the opener at Houston and went on to start game two against San Jose State. He came off the bench against Texas and then started games at Oregon and at Stanford. He suffered a broken leg after starting game six against Washington State. He came back for a brief appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game and threw his first interception in 141 passing attempts.

In 2010, Brehaut appeared in nine games, with seven starts. He started the final six games of the season. At Arizona State, he set school records with his 33 pass completions (old record, 32 by Troy Aikman v. USC in 1988) and 56 pass attempts (old record, 51 by Dennis Dummit v. Cal in 1970). He also set personal bests with 321 passing yards and three touchdown passes.

Fauria, on the Mackey Mid-Season Award Watch Lists, had his third career two-touchdown performance versus Nebraska. He saw action in all 14 games in 2011 and made nine starts. Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA (#60)**, who has 38 career starts, started at guard in the first two games of the 2012 season and in the last three contests against Utah, Cal and Colorado. He started at tackle for 11 contests last season before sliding to guard against Illinois in the bowl game. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left guard. In 2008, he appeared in nine games with eight starts at left tackle.

True sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO (#56)** returns to UCLA after serving a two-year Mormon mission. Su'a Filo started the first seven games of 2012 at guard. He re-enrolled in school for the 2012 Winter Quarter and was back on the field in the spring. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left tackle which was the most starts by a Bruin true freshman at any non-kicking position. ## HEAD COACH JIM MORA



\*25 years NFL experience

\*Head coach Seattle Seahawks and Atlanta Falcons

\*NFC Coach of the Year with the Falcons

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

### DEFENSIVE LINE —

True senior defensive end **DATONE JONES (#56)**, on the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list, is ranked tied for 23 in the nation in tackles for loss per game (1.57).

He started 2012 in a big way, with two games in which he has totaled three tackles for loss. At Rice, Jones had six tackles to tie his career-best, including two for loss and a sack. He also forced a fumble which Damien Holmes scooped up and scored. He also had three tackles for loss against Nebraska, one for a safety. Against Houston, he recorded three more tackles for loss and caught a touchdown pass after lining up at a tight end position.

Jones started all 14 games in 2011. He led all UCLA linemen with 41 tackles. He also topped the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. Jones had six stops versus Cal, including two sacks. He returned to the field after missing 2010 with a fractured foot. Jones started 13 games in 2009.

## DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 30 years (including 2011), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (17) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Mercedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the initial decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards — 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 108 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's volleyball in 2011-12).

## THE KICKING GAME

Redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)** has landed a Pac-12 high 21 punts inside the 20-yard line this season as he helps UCLA win the field position battle. He has 43 kickoffs and a conference-best 36 touchbacks on the year.

Locke has been named as one of 30 candidates for the 2012 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. He has also been selected as a semifinalist for the prestigious National Football Foundation (NFF) National Scholar-Athlete Awards. In 2011, Locke ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation with a 44.34 average. He also kicked his first field goals, making two against Texas. He was named to the 2011 second-team Pac-12 All-Academic squad and was selected UCLA's male Scholar-Athlete for 2011-12.

In 2010, Locke helped UCLA lead the nation in net punting (41.27). He ranked first in the Pac-10 and fourth in the NCAA (45.84). Locke earned third-team All-America acclaim from Rivals.com and was the punter on the ESPN Academic All-District 8 team as well as Pac-10 All-Academic first team.

In 2009, Locke was a semifinalist (only freshman) for the Guy Award, presented to the nation's top punter. He was selected second-team All-Pac-10 by the league's coaches and was a first-team Pac-10 All-Academic selection. He averaged 43.63 yards (16th in NCAA and second in Pac-10) on 70 punts. UCLA was 20th nationally and first in the Pac-10 in net punting (37.76).
