## ROSE BOWL: THE 31st YEAR

The 2012 season marks the 31st year that the Rose Bowl, currently undergoing a renovation, will serve as home of the Bruins. On Oct. 28, 2012, the stadium marked its 90th birthday.

The focus of the renovation project is to expedite tunnel ingress/egress, improve concourse circulation, increase the number of concession stands and restrooms, provide state-of-the-art premium seating products in a rebuilt press box and install a new scoreboard and video board.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 129-57-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/Slon-Campus.

**GAME 12** — UCLA (9-2, 6-2), ranked 15th in this week's Associated Press poll and 16th in the USA Today Coaches Poll, hosts Stanford (9-2, 7-1 and ranked 11th in each poll) on Saturday, Nov. 24 at 3:30 p.m. PT. The contest will be televised by FOX with Gus Johnson and Charles Davis in the booth and Julie Alexandria on the sidelines. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 570am in the Los Angeles area. The game will also be radio broadcast nationally by Dial Global Sports with John Tautges and former Bruin head coach, Terry Donahue, mikeside and on SIRIUS (Ch. 139)/ XM (Ch. 194). This week's honorary captain is former UCLA and NFL linebacker Donnie Edwards.

## IN BRIEF

- \*\*Johnathan Franklin's rushing total of 4,110 yards ranks sixth on the Pac-12 conference career list (5th is Darrin Nelson of Stanford, 1977-81 - 4,169)
  - \*\*Franklin recorded his eighth 100-yard rushing game of the season this past Saturday against USC which tied to the school single-season record
  - \*\*UCLA has won five straight games in a season for the first time since 2005, when it won first eight; it is also the last time that UCLA has won five straight conference games in a season
  - \*\*Redshirt sophomore linebacker Eric Kendricks has recorded 55 tackles in his last four games (10 v. USC) and is the Pac-12 leader in tackles (10.2/g) ... Also in his last four games, he has two forced fumbles, interception, blocked punt, fumble return for touchdown, two sacks, two tackles for loss
  - \*\*Junior linebacker Anthony Barr, in his first season on defense after two as a running back, is fourth in the nation in sacks (1.09/g) and tied for eighth in tackles for loss (1.64)
  - \*\*In his last four games, redshirt freshman quarterback Brett Hundley has completed 82 of 108 passes (76%) for 1,057 yards, 11 touchdowns and two interceptions
  - \*\*Hundley is zeroing in on several school records --- single-season total offense: Hundley 3,255 -- record is 3,652 by Cade McNown in 1998; single-season passing yardage: Hundley 2,973 -- record 3,470 by Cade McNown in 1998; single-season completions: Hundley 249 -- old record 242 by Drew Olson in 2005
  - \*\*Only one head coach has won as many games in his first season at UCLA as Jim Mora (9) -- Terry Donahue, 1976
  - \*\*Y receiver Joseph Fauria, a Mackey Award semifinalist, has caught a pass in 19 straight games; he is 7th on the all-time UCLA touchdown receptions list (18); T-3rd on season list with 10 in 2012
  - \*\*Senior punter Jeff Locke, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, leads the Pac-12 with 29 kicks placed inside the 20-yard line (20, at or inside the 10-yard line) and 60 touchbacks on 76 kickoffs this season -- USC returned three punts for two yards and one kickoff for 27 yards last week
  - \*\*DL Cassius Marsh has totaled 32 stops in the last six games (8.0 for loss)
  - \*\*In his last four games, senior running back Johnathan Franklin (5th in nation in rushing) has 563 rush yards (140.8 avg) and eight touchdowns. He has also made 10 receptions, including one for a touchdown.
  - \*\*UCLA is listed No. 17 the BCS rankings - highest ranking since Dec. 4, 2005, when it checked in at No. 16
  - \*\*Hundley's 25 touchdown passes rank him tied for 2nd on the school season list with Cade McNown-1998; Drew Olson holds the overall season mark, 34 in 2005
  - \*\*UCLA has played 25 freshmen so far this season -- 12 true freshmen and 13 redshirt freshmen. UCLA started seven freshmen on offense in the game against Utah and six at ASU and versus U of A.
  - \*\*UCLA is ranked 5th in the nation in sacks (3.5/g) after being ranked T-112th last season (1.00)
  - \*\*UCLA has won 16 of its last 20 games when winning the turnover battle (.800) and dropped 28 of its last 42 games (.333) when losing or tying the turnover ratio
  - \*\*The Bruins have won four road games for the first time since 2002, when it won five
  - \*\*Hundley is the first UCLA quarterback to ever throw for at least 300 yards in three straight games (305 Nebraska/320 Houston/372 Oregon St.). He is the eighth to total at least three, 300-yard games in a season.

\*\*UCLA has won 12 of its last 13 games when it limits the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards  
 \*\*Franklin ranks 2nd on UCLA's career all-purpose list at 4,599 yds; 1st is Maurice Jones-Drew, '03-'05 with 4,688  
 \*\*Franklin's 4,110 career rushing yards rank 4th among active FBS players (1-Montee Ball, Wisc.-4,727)  
 \*\*Arizona was the 18th straight game UCLA has won when holding the opponent to less than 20 points  
 \*\*UCLA had not gained at least 500 yards of total offense in any previous three-game stretch, prior to his season (complete records date back to 1958 season) ... Years in which UCLA has had at least three games, with at least 500-yards of total offense -- 2005 (3); 1998 (5); 1996 (3); 1991 (4); 1987 (3); 1986 (4); 1976 (5); 1973 (5) (dating back to 1965)  
 \*\*USC was Franklin's 18th career 100-yard rushing game, moving him into second on school list  
 \*\*UCLA won its first two road games of a season for the first time since 2005 when it captured wins in its initial three road games on the way to a 10-2 record for the year  
 \*\*Arizona (308 yds) was the sixth 200-yard rushing game of the season for UCLA... The Bruins had six such games last year... UCLA opened 2012 with a 247-yard total vs. Houston, a 344-yard total vs. Nebraska and a 343-yard sum at Rice ... The Bruins have won 24 straight games in which they have rushed for at least 250 yards (81-3-1 all-time).

**VS. STANFORD** — UCLA owns a 10-5 advantage in series games contested in the Rose Bowl. Last year on the Farm, UCLA took the opening kickoff and marched inside the five-yard line but could not turn the drive into points. Then No. 6/4 ranked-Stanford took over and drove the length of the field to take a 7-0 lead and was never headed in a 45-19 win. Joseph Fauria caught two scoring passes from Richard Brehaut in the contest. In 2010, Stanford jumped to a 13-0 halftime lead in a game played in the Rose Bowl. Following a Kai Forbath missed field goal attempt, Stanford proceeded to score 14 points in nine seconds, on a touchdown run and a fumble return, to take a 28-0 advantage into the fourth quarter and went on to a 35-0 win. In the last series win by the Bruins, the 2008 contest played at the Rose Bowl, Kevin Craft hit Cory Harkey with a seven-yard scoring pass with 10 seconds to play to give the Bruins a dramatic victory.

**BOWLING** — UCLA is bowl eligible in 2012. It has played in bowl games in eight of the last 10 seasons (not 2010, 2008). It is the first time the Bruins have been eligible before the month of November since 2005.

**UCLA AND THE BCS** — UCLA is ranked No. 17 in the BCS Standings this week. The last time UCLA was ranked in the BCS, prior to this season, was on Dec. 3, 2006, at No. 25. The Bruins have moved into the BCS rankings in the 1998, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2012 seasons. The Bruins have been ranked as high as No. 1 in the rankings and were No. 1 in the very first BCS ranking released on Oct. 26, 1998.

Defensive back **Tevin McDonald**'s (#7) brother, Tim Jr., plays at USC and his dad, Tim, played in the NFL from 1987-99 with the Cardinals and 49ers ... Defensive back **Sheldon Price**'s (#22) dad, Dennis, played at UCLA from 1984-87 and then in the NFL with the Raiders ... Punter **Jeff Locke** (#18) has been named to the All-Conference academic team the past three seasons; he has finished 12th (2011), fourth (2010) and 16th (2009) in the nation in punting average ... OL **Xavier Su'a-Filo** (#56) spent the last two years on an LDS mission in Alabama and Florida during which time he learned the Spanish language ... LB **Anthony Barr**'s (#11) dad, Tony Brooks, was a fourth-round pick of the Eagles in the 1992 draft, after playing at Notre Dame ... Reserve fullback **Luke Gane** (#49) underwent chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant in high school to help overcome a rare blood disorder (aplastic anemia) ... Offensive guard **Alexandru Ceachir** (#76) came to this country two years ago from Moldova (located between Romania and Ukraine) and can speak four languages - Russian, English, Romanian, Ukrainian ... Freshman linebacker **Aaron Porter**'s (#30) mom, Sandy, played in the Softball World Series for Long Beach State and is in the school's Hall of Fame ... Running back **Jordan James** (#6) has a black belt in Taekwondo ... Defensive back **Brandon Sermons**' (#2) brother, Rodney, also played for USC ... **Brett Hundley**'s (#17) dad, Brett, Sr., lettered at running back for the University of Arizona ... Most of the Bruin coaching staff has a tie to the NFL - head coach **Jim Mora** - 25 seasons with San Diego 1985-91, New Orleans 1992-96, San Francisco 1997-2003, Atlanta 2004-06, Seattle 2007-09; receivers coach **Eric Yarber** - 5 seasons with Tampa Bay 2010-11, San Francisco 2003-04, Seattle 1998; Defensive Coord. **Lou Spanos** - 17 seasons with Washington 2010-11 and Pittsburgh 1995-2009; Special teams Coord./

## THE OFFENSE

### Redshirt senior tailback JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)

\*\*\*Maxwell Award semifinalist (Collegiate Player of the Year)

**Franklin** moved past Gaston Green's 25-year old all-time school rushing record on his third carry against Arizona, a 37-yard scoring burst. He went on to rack up 162 rushing yards on the night. He posted his 18th 100-yard rushing game with a 171-yard effort versus USC. It was the most rushing yards by a Bruin against the Trojans since Gaston Green ran for 224 in 1986. It was the eighth 100-yard rushing game of this season which tied the school record shared by Karim Abdul-Jabbar (1995), Gaston Green (1986), Freeman McNeil (1980, 1979) and Wendell Tyler (1975).

He kicked off the 2012 season with a pair of 200-yard plus rushing games, the second and third of his career, to match Gaston Green (1985, 1986, 1987) and Karim Abdul-Jabbar (three in a row 1995) for the most in school history. In game three against Houston, he racked up 110 yards on the ground and caught a career-best four passes (58 yds).

Franklin began the 2012 season with a 214-yard effort at Rice, which included two 70-plus yard runs for touchdowns. He raced 74 yards midway through the first quarter and then navigated 78 yards for a score late in the second quarter. He became the first Bruin to have two runs of over 72 yards in a game. Franklin was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for his efforts against the Owls. Against Nebraska, Franklin compiled a career-best 217 yards on the ground on 26 carries. He also caught a nine-yard scoring pass in the fourth quarter. For the second week in a row, he was named Conference Player of the Week. UCLA had never before had the same offensive player earn back-to-back POW honors from the Pac-12/Pac-10.

Franklin ran for a previous career-best 216 (30 carries) in a 2010 contest against Washington State (it was the most since Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004). In 2010, Franklin appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts. He led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage by a Bruin since Skip Hicks (1,282-1997). He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998. Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10 and No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list.

**Hundley** scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice. His 372 passing yards against Oregon State marked the third straight game above the 300-yard mark. It was the second-highest total in a single game by a UCLA freshman (Maddox, 409 vs. USC, 1990). In addition, it was the most aerial yards since Drew Olson threw for 510 against Arizona State in 2005. The 404 yards of total offense by Hundley are the second-highest total by a UCLA freshman in a single game (Maddox, 445-1990 v. USC) and fifth-highest in school history.

Hundley threw for 202 yards and two touchdowns in the opener against Rice. He ran seven times for 68 yards. The redshirt freshman totaled 305 yards, four scoring passes, and 53 rushing yards against Nebraska. He threw for 320 yards against Houston. Hundley threw for two scores and ran for a couple of more touchdowns at Colorado.

Hundley's 31 completions at Cal are the most-ever by a Bruin freshman qb and third on the all-time list. His 47 passing attempts tied for the most-ever by a Bruin freshman (Maddox - 1990 v. USC) and are tied for fifth on the all-time school list. He threw for one score (64 yds) and ran for another (12) against Utah. He moved past Maddox (17) for most scoring passes by a Bruin freshman with his four touchdown performance at ASU. He completed 23 of 28 passes against Arizona (288 yds) and 16 straight attempts during one stretch of the game.

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer knee injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

He threw for 2,348 yards as a senior in high school with 20 scoring passes, two interceptions. He also led his team in rushing with 856 yards and nine touchdowns. Following his senior season, he won the passing competition at the Under Armour All-America Game Skills Challenge.

Fauria had his fourth career two-touchdown performance versus Arizona this season. He saw action in all 14 games in 2011 and made nine starts. He led the team with six scoring catches and was second on the team with 39 receptions for 481 yards. The total of six touchdown receptions in 2011 was the most by a Bruin receiver since Mercedes Lewis (now with the Jaguars) had 10 in the 2005 season. He made his first career start in the 2011 opener at Houston and caught six balls for 110 yards and a touchdown. The 110 yards receiving was the most by a Bruin tight end since Mercedes Lewis had 108 in a 2005 game against Arizona State. In 2010, Fauria appeared in 12 games off the bench and on special teams. Fauria transferred into UCLA in 2009 after spending 2008 at Notre Dame. He saw action in three games as a reserve tight end for the Irish.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** — The Bruins started three freshmen on the offensive line in a season-opening game for the first time in history. Redshirt freshmen Torian White joined true freshman Simon Goines at the tackle positions; redshirt freshman Jake Brendel handled the center spot.

Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA (#60)**, who has 42 career starts, started at guard in the first two games of the 2012 season and in the last seven contests. He started at tackle for 11 contests last season before sliding to guard against Illinois in the bowl game. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left guard. In 2008, he appeared in nine games with eight starts at left tackle.

True sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO (#56)** returns to UCLA after serving a two-year Mormon mission. Su'a Filo started the first 11 games of 2012 at guard. He re-enrolled in school for the 2012 Winter Quarter and was back on the field in the spring. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left tackle which was the most starts by a Bruin true freshman at any non-kicking position. Su'a-Filo became the first Bruin true freshman to start a season-opener on the offensive side of the ball and earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors.

**QUARTERBACK** — Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** saw his first action of 2012 in the fourth quarter versus Houston and came on at the end at Colorado. He completed his only two passes of the night in the fourth quarter versus Arizona. He started the last eight games (10 overall) of 2011. Prince completed his junior season ranked among UCLA's all-time best in total offense (8th), pass completions (8th) and passing yards (9th). He finished with 424 yards rushing (most since Jeff

## HEAD COACH JIM MORA

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcons' defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

NFL Pro Bowlers who have played under coach Mora over the years include -- Julian Peterson, LB Seattle and San Francisco; Marcus Trufant, DB Seattle; Allen Rossum, DB Atlanta; Patrick Kerney, DL Atlanta; Roderick Coleman, DL Atlanta; Keith Brooking, LB Atlanta; DeAngelo Hall, DB Atlanta; Michael Vick, QB Atlanta; Alge Crumpler, TE Atlanta; Warrick Dunn, RB Atlanta; Bryant Young, DL San Francisco; Lance Schulters, DB San Francisco; Merton Hanks, DB San Francisco; Eric Allen, DB New Orleans; Tyrone Hughes, DB New Orleans; Gill Byrd, DB San Diego Chargers.

Dankworth racked up 815 in 1976. His 163 yards rushing v. Cal marked the first time a Bruin quarterback had gone over the 100-yard mark in a game since Dankworth in 1976. It was the most rushing yardage by a quarterback since John Sciarra totaled 178 versus Tennessee in 1974.

In 2010, Prince appeared in five games, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of that season after undergoing knee surgery on Oct. 23. In 2009, Prince started all 11 games in which he played. He became the second freshman quarterback in UCLA history to pass for over 300 yards, three times in a season (Maddox, 1990).

True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** saw action for a few plays in the fourth quarter versus Arizona and in the second half against Nebraska where he completed one pass. He came on in the fourth quarter of the Rice game and threw for 101 yards.

In 2011, he appeared in seven games, with four starts. He came on in relief of Kevin Prince in the opener at Houston and went on to start game two against San Jose State. He came off the bench against Texas and then started games at Oregon and at Stanford. He suffered a broken leg after starting game six against Washington State. He came back for a brief appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game and threw his first interception in 141 passing attempts.

In 2010, Brehaut appeared in nine games, with seven starts. He started the final six games of the season. At Arizona State, he set school records with his 33 pass completions (old record, 32 by Troy Aikman v. USC in 1988) and 56 pass attempts (old record, 51 by Dennis Dummit v. Cal in 1970). He also set personal bests with 321 passing yards and three touchdown passes.

### DEFENSIVE LINE

True senior defensive end **DATONE JONES (#56)**, on the Mid-Season Ted Hendricks Award watch list, is ranked tied for 34th in the nation in tackles for loss per game (1.23). He had a career-best nine tackles at Arizona State. He started 2012 in a big way, with two games in which he has totaled three tackles for loss. At Rice, Jones had six tackles to tie his career-best, including two for loss and a sack. He also forced a fumble, which Damien Holmes scooped up and scored. He had three tackles for loss against Nebraska, one for a safety. Against Houston, he recorded three tackles for loss and caught a touchdown pass, after lining up at a tight end position. Jones started all 14 games in 2011. He led all UCLA linemen with 41 tackles. He also topped the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. Jones had six stops versus Cal, including two sacks. He returned to the field after missing 2010 with a fractured foot. Jones started 13 games in 2009.

## DID YOU KNOW...

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 30 years (including 2011), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (17) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Marcedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the initial decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Marcedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 108 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's volleyball in 2011-12).

## THE KICKING GAME

Redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)**, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, has landed a Pac-12 high 29 punts inside the 20-yard line (20, at or inside the 10-yard line) this season as he helps UCLA win the field position battle. He has 69 kickoffs and a conference-best 54 touchbacks.

Locke was one of 30 candidates for the 2012 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. He has also been selected as a semifinalist for the prestigious National Football Foundation (NFF) National Scholar-Athlete Awards. In 2011, Locke ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation with a 44.34 average. He also kicked his first field goals, making two against Texas. He was named to the 2011 second-team Pac-12 All-Academic squad and was selected UCLA's male Scholar-Athlete for 2011-12.

In 2010, Locke helped UCLA lead the nation in net punting (41.27). He ranked first in the Pac-10 and fourth in the NCAA (45.84). Locke earned third-team All-America acclaim from Rivals.com and was the punter on the ESPN Academic All-District 8 team as well as Pac-10 All-Academic first team.

In 2009, Locke was a semifinalist (only freshman) for the Guy Award, presented to the nation's top punter. **GAME 2: Nebraska at UCLA -- Sept. 8, 2012 at Rose Bowl**

UCLA used a Datone Jones safety and a scoring pass from Brett Hundley to Johnathan Franklin to break open a close game and held off 17th-ranked Nebraska down the stretch for a big win in the home-opener. Franklin ran for a career-best 217 yards in the contest and Hundley had 358 yards of total offense, third-highest total ever by a Bruin freshman. UCLA racked up 653 yards against Nebraska, the sixth-highest total in school history and most since 2005. It was also the first time UCLA had ever put together back-to-back games with at least 645 yards of total offense.

**GAME 3: Houston at UCLA -- Sept. 15, 2012 at Rose Bowl**

Now ranked No. 27/23 in the major polls, UCLA shot out to a 30-0 lead against Houston. Linebacker Eric Kendricks lit up the scoreboard first after scoring on Cougar fumble in the game's first minute. For the second time in his career, Johnathan Franklin recorded a third straight 100-yard plus game on the ground. Quarterback Brett Hundley threw for 325 yards, becoming the first freshman at UCLA to reach the 300-yard passing plateau in back-to-back games. It was also the third straight game in which UCLA had reached the 500-yard mark in total offense, a first in school history. Sheldon Price tied the school record with three interceptions on the day.
