Former UCLA All-American Jorge Salcedo enters his fourth season as head coach for the Bruins.

A product of UCLA's strong soccer tradition, Salcedo has maintained the Bruins' standard for success, winning Pac-10 titles in his first two seasons and guiding his teams to NCAA Tournament appearances. He signed the No. I recruiting classes in the nation in 2006 and 2004, and those players produced results, advancing all the way to the NCAA Championship game in the 2006 season.

The 2006 Bruins faced an uphill battle with injuries to several starters throughout the season, but they fought through the adversity and ended a successful post-season run in the title game with a final season record of 14-6-4.

In 2005, Salcedo's Bruins recorded a 12-5-3 record and ranked amongst the best in the nation in team defense, allowing just 14 goals and posting a team goals against average of 0.67. The Bruins also captured the Pac-10 title for the fourth year in a row and earned a No. 5 seeding in the NCAA Tournament.

During his first season, Salcedo earned Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year honors after leading UCLA to its third-straight conference title. His Bruins ended the regular season ranked No. 3 by *Soccer America* and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, where they finished the year with a 14-4-2 record.

Salcedo was UCLA's assistant coach from 2001-03 and helped lead the Bruins to the 2002 NCAA Championship and to two Pac-10 team championships. In 2002, he served as acting head coach in a crucial road victory at Stanford in November that helped the Bruins capture their first-ever Pac-10 title. He also served as acting head coach in the spring of 2002 in the coaching transition between Todd Saldaña and Tom Fitzgerald and had served in a similar capacity after Fitzgerald announced his resignation.

Salcedo, who is a scout for the U.S. National Team, was the head coach of the 2002 U-16 SoCal ODP State team and was also the assistant coach of the U-17 team in 2001.

The Cerritos, Calif. native had an illustrious career at UCLA from 1990-93. Salcedo was a four-year starter, playing 74 games and tallying six goals and seven assists for 19 points. As a freshman, he scored the decisive penalty kick in the shootout during the 1990 NCAA Championship game to give UCLA its second national title. In 1993 as a senior, he earned NSCAA first-team All-America honors. He prepped at Cerritos HS. where he earned two *Parade* All-America honors.

Salcedo played for five years in Major League Soccer (MLS). In his first season in the league, he was a starter for the Los Angeles Galaxy and helped take his team to the MLS Championship game. He also played for Chicago, where he served as team co-captain, Columbus and Tampa Bay before returning to the Galaxy in 1999. Prior to his MLS career, he played with the LA Salsa in the APSL and then for F.C. Morelia of the Mexican First Division. Salcedo was also a member of the U.S. National Team program, earning three caps with the full national team and captaining the U-17 team at the 1989 World Youth Championships and the U-20 team at the 1990 CONCA-CAF Tournament.

Salcedo has had extensive ties to the Bruin program for many years. He graduated from UCLA with a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science and was part of three of the Bruins' four NCAA Championship teams. He was a ball boy for UCLA during its first championship year in 1985, scored the game-winning penalty kick in the 1990 Championship game and was an assistant coach for the 2002 squad. In addition, his father Hugo was a UCLA assistant coach from 1978-79 and a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic team and will be serving as the FIFA Chairman of the 2014 World Cup. His brother Eddie was a UCLA letterwinner in 1995.

Salcedo and his wife Rebecca have been married for three years, and they had their first child, Matteo Johan Salcedo, in 2006. They are expecting a second child in January of 2008.

Former Cal State Fullerton All-American Eddie Soto begins his second season as UCLA assistant coach and his seventh season overall as a NCAA Division I coach. In his first season at UCLA, he helped guide the Bruins to the NCAA College Cup finals.

Soto was the assistant coach for the men's team at Cal State Fullerton from 2001-03 and was hired again as the lead assistant in 2006. He was also the lead assistant for the women's team at Long Beach State from 2004-05 and the head assistant at Long Beach City College in 1997 when the women's team won its first championship.


Soto also has vast experience coaching at the club level, totaling 13 years as a coach in the prestigious Coast Soccer League. He coached former UCLAAll-Americans Zach Wells and Matt Taylor at Irvine Strikers and also coached the NHB futbol club for five years.

An All-American at Cal State Fullerton in 1992 and 1993, Soto is the No. 2 scorer in Titan history, totaling 96 points and 38 goals from 1992-94. He still holds the single-season record for goals in a season with 18, set in 1994. In 1993, he led the Titans to the NCAA semifinals for the first time in school history. His team also advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals in 1994. Soto was named to the MPSF 15-Year Anniversary first team.

Upon graduating from Cal State Fullerton in 1995 with a B.A. in Kinesiology, Soto was selected in the initial MLS Draft in 1996 by the NY/NJ MetroStars and again in the supplemental draft in 1998 by the San Jose Clash. He also played for the Orange County Zodiac of the A-League, the Los Angeles Cobras of the USISL and ended his career with the USA Pro Beach Soccer Team.

The Cerritos native was a two-time ParadeAll-American and the 1990 CIF 3-A Player of the Year at Cerritos HS, where he was teammates with UCLA head coach Jorge Salcedo. He was also a member of the NHB futbol club that won the 1991 National Championship and a member of the U.S. U-18 and U-20 National Teams.

Soto, who has a U.S. Soccer Federation "A" Coaching License, resides in Long Beach with his wife, Stephanie, and his children, Fabrizio, Wyatt and Isabela.


Former University of Virginia All-American goalkeeper David Comfort begins his second season as assistant coach. In his first season at UCLA, he helped guide the Bruins to the NCAA College Cup finals.

Comfort still ranks in the Top 5 in Virginia history with 193 career saves and 19 solo shutouts from 1999-2002. He also ranks seventh all-time with a 0.98 career goals against average, and in the Top 3 amongst all Virginia goalkeepers in minutes played (5,442) and games played (60). He earned honorable mention All-America honors and second-team All-State acclaim in 2001 after posting nine shutouts with a 14-2-1 record. With Comfort in goal that season, the Cavaliers became the first team in conference history to win the ACC by going undefeated without allowing a goal.

After graduating from Virginia with a degree in economics in 2002, Comfort was selected in the third round of the 2003 MLS Draft by the Dallas Burn as the 21st overall pick and later played with the NY/NJ MetroStars that season

Comfort was an all-state, all-region and all-district honoree at Monacan HS in Richmond, VA.

He began his coaching career with the Richmond Kickers club team and was the club's goalkeeper trainer and the U-15 coach in 2003. From 2003-06, he was the boys and girls coach at Aspen HS in Colorado, and he also served as the goalkeeper coach for the Aspen United Soccer Club from 2004-06.



Jose Lopez, the first soccer player ever to be inducted into the UCLA Hall of Fame, enters his 13th year as a volunteer assistant coach. He had previously aided the Bruin soccer program with video taping from 1987-1994.

Lopez enjoyed a hugely successful playing career at UCLA, leading the Bruins to their first NCAA Championship games in 1970, 1972 and 1973 and playing on two regular-season undefeated teams. A two-time team captain, Lopez never lost a home game in his four years as a Bruin.


Following his senior season in 1973, he was selected to play in the College Senior Bowl and became UCLA's first-ever No. I professional draft choice when he was chosen by the Los Angeles Aztecs of the North American Soccer League. In his rookie season, he helped the Aztecs win the NASL title, and in his second year he was selected the Aztecs' Midfielder of the Year. Lopez has played with and against soccer legends like Pele, Franz Beckenbauer and George Best.

A UCLA Hall of Fame inductee in 1993, Lopez also played baseball and kicked on the freshman football team at UCLA. He lettered in baseball, football, basketball and track at Santa Ana Valley HS.

Lopez coached soccer and baseball at Santa Monica HS and now teaches AP Spanish Language and Literature. He has been married to his wife Sheri for 30 years, and they have two daughters who graduated from UCLA, Ashlei and Alexys.
