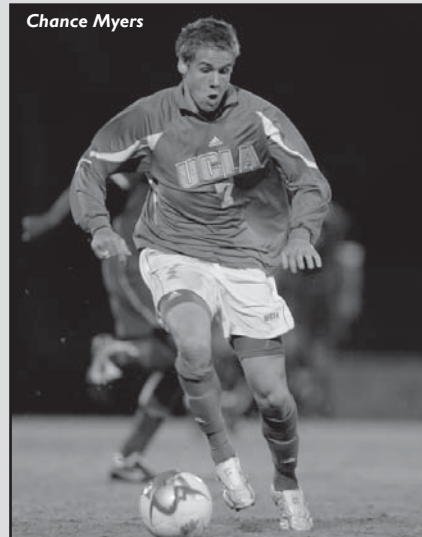

2006 Season in Review

Despite enduring a difficult series of challenges throughout the regular season, the UCLA men's soccer team persevered, advancing all the way to the NCAA Championship game. Not only did the Bruins have to play arguably the most difficult schedule in the nation, with 12 regular season games against NCAA Tournament teams, but they had to do it without several key players who were out due to injuries and with a mainly under-class team.

The season started off rough before any games were even played. Senior defender Brandon Owens tore his ACL in the spring, and junior defender Edwige Ligondé suffered a stress fracture in his left tibia in pre-season training and were both lost for the year. Freshman forward Robert Georgiefski was also forced out for the year with a torn left ACL and medial meniscus suffered in the Bruins' first exhibition game on Aug. 20.

When the season started, the Bruins had to adjust to the losses of those players, not to mention adjust to a team filled with 13 newcomers, including 12 freshmen. The regular season started with a tie against Cal State Northridge in the season opener and a pair of road losses to No. 1 Maryland and No. 3 Virginia. The schedule wasn't getting much easier, as the Bruins took their winless record to 2005 NCAA runner-up New Mexico. But in front of a crowd of over 3,000 Lobo fans, the Bruins recorded a 2-0 shutout victory thanks to a pair of goals by Maxwell Griffin. The Bruins won their next game against Oakland, 4-1, and returned home to host a pair of undefeated Top 10 squads in Santa Clara and San Francisco. Griffin was instrumental in both games, scoring the game's first goal in the 2-1 win over Santa Clara and the game-winning goal in the 2-0 shutout victory over San Francisco. Griffin was subsequently named the National Player of the Week by the NSCAA, Soccer America and Soccer Times.

Unfortunately, in the Bruins' next game at California on Sept. 22, Griffin's season came to a sudden end when he tore his left ACL just three minutes into the game. Then

in the 21st minute, midfielder Tony Beltran, a member of the U.S. Under-20 National Team, went down with an ankle injury that kept him off the field for a month. With the Bruins reeling from the loss of those two players, they dropped a 3-1 decision to the Golden Bears and then tied Stanford two days later, 1-1.

A date with fourth-ranked and undefeated Washington was next on the agenda for the Bruins, and for the third time in the season, another Top 10 team tasted its first defeat at the hands of UCLA. The Bruins defeated the Huskies 2-1 in double overtime on a goal by freshman midfielder James Jaramillo, who was starting in place of the injured Beltran, with 18 seconds left to play. The win was the first in a five-game winning streak that eventually propelled the Bruins into the Top 10 in the national rankings. UCLA added a home win over Oregon State and road wins at UC Santa Barbara, San Diego State and Oregon State before the win streak was stopped at Washington.

Despite the loss to the Huskies, the Bruins were still in position to defend their Pac-10 title but fell short after losing to Cal. The Bruins rebounded with a big 3-1 win over San Diego in the regular season finale to finish the year 6-2-2 in their last 10 regular season games.

Undoubtedly, UCLA's strength of schedule helped the team gain a No. 8 national seeding and a first-round bye in the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins returned to action in the second round to face the No. 1 offensive team in the nation, Harvard. UCLA turned the tables on the Crimson, not only scoring two first half goals, both by Sal Zizzo, but also becoming the only team in 2006 to shut Harvard out. The Bruins won the game, 3-0, to advance to the third round, where they would host ninth-seeded Clemson, another offensive power. And for the second straight game, the Bruin defense shut the visitors down, 3-0. David Estrada was the offensive hero this time, netting two goals, while Zizzo scored the other.

The victory sent UCLA to the quarterfinals at top-seeded Duke. The Bruins faced an early 2-0 deficit after the Blue

Devils scored just 25 seconds into the match and again in the 20th minute. But UCLA chipped away at the lead, with Jason Leopoldo netting a goal just before halftime. Zizzo once again came through offensively, scoring the game-tying goal in the 78th minute and the game-winner just 30 seconds into overtime to lead the dramatic 3-2 comeback win. With five goals and 11 points, Zizzo ended up as the 2006 NCAA Tournament's scoring leader.

The Bruins made their 12th College Cup appearance and looked to obtain the 100th NCAA title in UCLA's history. A weather delay postponed the team's semifinal game against Virginia for one day, but the Bruins were unfazed in their third consecutive game against an SEC opponent, scoring four second-half goals, all by freshmen, to defeat the fourth-seeded Cavaliers, 4-0. Estrada scored the game's first two goals 67 seconds apart, and Chance Myers and Michael Stephens tacked on two more after a Virginia red card relegated the Cavaliers to just 10 men on the field.

Twenty-four hours later, UCLA took to the field for the championship game at Robert R. Hermann Stadium in St. Louis in sub-freezing temperatures to face its Southern California neighbor, unseeded UC Santa Barbara. The odds were in UCLA's favor, as the Gauchos had played a grueling double overtime game after the Bruins' semifinal, but UCSB went on the attack immediately, belying any signs of fatigue, and scored the first goal in the third minute. The goal gave the Gauchos a rush of adrenaline and confidence, and they went on to win the game, 2-1, for their first ever NCAA men's soccer title.

The youthful Bruins (14 of the 18 players on the NCAA Tournament roster were underclassmen) finished a very successful season with a 14-6-4 record and produced an All-American, Zizzo, for the 24th consecutive year. In addition, Zizzo and junior defender Mike Zaher received NSCAA All-Far West acclaim and first-team All-Pac-10 honors. Estrada was honored as Soccer America's Freshman of the Year, and was selected along with Leopoldo and Beltran to the College Cup All-Tournament team.

Bruins in the Conference

Men's soccer is in its eighth year as a Pacific-10 Conference sanctioned sport. Six Pac-10 teams comprise the Pac-10 Men's Soccer Conference - UCLA, California, Oregon State, Stanford, Washington and 2005 addition San Diego State.

In 2006, four conference teams advanced to the NCAA Tournament - UCLA, California, Washington and San Diego State - with UCLA moving on all the way to the NCAA Championship game.

The Pac-10 branched out of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) after the 1999 season to form its own conference. Since 2000, the Pac-10 has had at least three teams advance to the NCAA Tournament every season, and in 2002 UCLA and Stanford faced each other in the Championship match, marking the first time two schools from the same conference have met battled for the NCAA men's soccer title.

Over the years, the Pac-10 has upheld its tradition as the "Conference of Champions." Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 146 NCAA team titles over the past 17 seasons, for an average of more than eight championships per academic year. Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 146 team titles have come in 24 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 41 of the last 47 years and finished second five times. Pac-10 schools rank 1-2-3 in overall NCAA titles - No. 1 UCLA (100), No. 2 Stanford (94) and No. 3 USC (84).
