

2007 Season in Review

After a second-place showing in 2006, and with eight returning starters, expectations were high for the 2007 Bruins, who were voted pre-season No. 1 by several outlets. Due to various injuries and circumstances, the Bruins were not quite able to live up to those high expectations but still extended the team's streak of NCAA Tournament appearances to 25 consecutive years.

Much like 2006, injuries took a toll on the Bruins in the early-going, with leading scorer David Estrada undergoing surgery on Aug. 20 for a fractured metatarsal that would keep him out for a month. Also that day, freshman defender Fernando De Alba went down with a dislocated knee and sat out the whole season. Injuries to defenders Ryan White (quad injury, played in just three games), Brandon Owens (missed three games after spraining his knee at Cal State Northridge), Sean Alvarado (season-ending knee injury) and Edwige Ligonde (out for the second-straight season with leg fractures) further thinned the defensive unit. In addition, Jason Leopoldo, who ranked second on the team in goals in 2006, was not at full strength either, missing two games in September with a hamstring injury and the NCAA first round game with a sprained ankle.

With the fluctuating lineups, and playing one of the most difficult schedules in the nation, the Bruins struggled with continuity and had a roller-coaster of a season. UCLA started off the year winless in its first three games after suffering a crushing overtime defeat to Notre Dame in Indiana and then falling 1-0 to the Hoosiers. The Bruins salvaged a scoreless tie at Creighton but had several scoring opportunities thwarted by the woodwork, as two shots hit the crossbar and two others hit the post. In the 105th minute, the Bruins hit the woodwork three times in one play, with Leopoldo hitting back-to-back shots that went off the crossbar, and Kyle Nakazawa hitting the last rebounded shot off the post.

UCLA picked things up when it returned home to face Big Ten foes Ohio State and Penn State. Playing at home for the first time, the Bruins handed 12th-ranked Ohio State its first loss, winning by a 3-1 margin. Maxwell Griffin, Michael Stephens and Jason Leopoldo scored for UCLA,

and the Buckeyes' only goal was an own goal. Two days later, Griffin exploded for three goals, notching his first career hat trick in the Bruins' 4-1 win over Penn State.

The Bruins kept the winning streak going with a 1-0 road victory at 12th-ranked San Francisco. Chance Myers scored the game-winner in the 88th minute to break a scoreless tie. Myers had previously shown a flair for the dramatic in the season opener, scoring the tying goal with just 38 seconds remaining in regulation against Notre Dame.


Things were looking good for the Bruins two nights later at eighth-ranked Santa Clara after Mike Zaher put UCLA ahead, 1-0, with a goal in the 38th minute, but after Richard Flores was red-carded in the 68th minute, the Bruins' fortunes turned in an instant. Playing a man down, the Bruins were unable to sustain the Bronco pressure, and Santa Clara tied the score with four and a half minutes to play. Just 39 seconds into the overtime, the Broncos scored the game-winner. UCLA followed that heartbreaking loss with a confidence-crushing 3-0 defeat at Cal State Northridge.

The Bruins rebounded with a 1-0 win against San Diego but lost another heartbreaker later that week at San Diego State when the Aztecs scored the game's only goal in the final five and a half minutes.

A scoreless tie against Stanford at home served as the catalyst for a five-game unbeaten streak that UCLA used to move into first place in the Pac-10 at the halfway mark. After the Stanford game, the Bruins upset 16th-ranked California on a Griffin goal in the 88th minute. Four different goal scorers helped UCLA match its highest offensive output of the season in a 4-1 win at Oregon State, and three more players scored in the 3-2 win at Washington. The Bruins netted another dramatic goal, as Nakazawa scored the game-winner with 53 seconds left on the clock.

A 2-1 home victory over Oregon State a week later kept UCLA in first place in the conference, but an unfortunate fluke goal by Washington in a game the Bruins dominated stopped UCLA's winning streak and set off a

three-game losing streak that saw the Bruins' conference lead vanish. The Bruins' regular season finale against San Diego State saw UCLA in a pressure-filled situation of needing a win or tie to remain eligible for the NCAA Tournament. UCLA took a 1-0 lead on a Nakazawa first-half goal and held on for a 1-1 tie.

UCLA finished the season tied for second in the conference and had a high enough RPI to earn an at-large bid and a first round home game against New Mexico in the NCAA Tournament. In that first round game, Nakazawa broke a scoreless tie by bending in a free kick for a goal with 1:39 remaining in regulation to give the Bruins a 1-0 victory and a second chance against Santa Clara in the second round.

Trying to avenge the heart-breaking September loss at Santa Clara, the Bruins simply found more heartbreak when opportunity after opportunity was denied. Backup goalkeeper Trevor Hunter, who was filling in for injured starter Brian Perk, played admirably in goal in the first significant action of his college career, but Santa Clara capitalized on a few defensive miscues and thwarted the Bruins' attack, leading to a 3-1 Bronco win and an end to the Bruin season.

Eleven players landed on the All-Pac-10 teams, including first-team selections Tony Beltran, Leopoldo, Myers and Zaher. Myers and Beltran went on to become two of the Top 3 picks in the MLS Draft, with Myers going No. 1 and Beltran No. 3.

The Bruins did excel in the classroom during the 2007-08 academic year, with 24 of 30 team members making the Director's Honor Roll in at least one of the three quarters, including an impressive 19 during the fall playing season. Zaher became the third UCLA player ever to earn NSCAA/adidas Scholar-Athlete All-America honors.

The Pac-10 branched out of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) after the 1999 season to form its own conference. Since 2000, the Pac-10 has had at least three teams advance to the NCAA Tournament every season, and in 2002 UCLA and Stanford faced each other in the Championship match, marking the first time two schools from the same conference have battled for the NCAA men's soccer title.

Over the years, the Pac-10 has upheld its tradition as the "Conference of Champions." Pac-10 members have claimed an incredible 159 NCAA team titles over the past 18 seasons, for an average of more than eight championships per academic year. Even more impressive is the breadth of the Pac-10's success, as those 159 team titles have come in 26 different men's and women's sports. The Pac-10 has led the nation in NCAA Championships 42 of the last 48 years and finished second five times.
