- UCLA will play five games against teams ranked in the NSCAA/adidas preseason Top 20 - No. 1 Louisville, No. 5 SMU, No. 7 California (twice) and No. 14 UC Santa Barbara.
- UCLA returns all 11 starters from last year's squad, including leading goal scorer Victor Chavez (10 g), Pac-10 Freshman of the Year Kelyn Rowe (7 g, 10 a), and team captain Andy Rose (22 starts).
- The Bruins are 16-9-4 all-time against Santa Clara and 14-0-0 against UC Davis.

<u>This Week</u> — No. 6/13 UCLA (0-1-0) will hit the road again this week, traveling to Northern California to face Santa Clara (1-0-0) on Friday, Sept. 2 at 7 pm at Buck Shaw Stadium and UC Davis (0-1-0) on Sunday, Sept. 4 at 5 pm at Aggie Soccer Stadium.

<u>Live Coverage</u> — Santa Clara is offering live stats and a FREE live video broadcast of Friday's match. Both links are available at santaclarabroncos.com. Fans can follow the UC Davis match via gametracker. The link for gametracker is available at uclabruins.com on the events calendar on the front page.

In The Rankings — The Bruins dropped to No. 13 in the NSCAA poll after their 2-0 loss to Louisville in the opener. UCLA is also ranked No. 4 by College Soccer News, No. 6 by Soccer America and No. 7 by Top Drawer Soccer. Santa Clara is ranked No. 24 by Top Drawer Soccer while UC Davis is unranked in all polls.

<u>Scouting The Broncos</u>—Santa Clara enters Friday's match with a 1-0-0 record after they defeated Stanford 1-0 in the season opener. Senior Alex Fitschen scored the only goal of the match for the Broncos and was assisted on the goal by senior David Castellanos. Like UCLA, the Broncos return all 11 starters from last year's squad that went 10-6-5 and won the WCC Championship. Head Coach Cameron Rast is in his 10th season at the helm of Santa Clara and has compiled a record of 52-14-19 during that time.

<u>The Series With Santa Clara</u> — UCLA leads the overall series with Santa Clara 16-9-4. The two teams last met in 2008 at Drake Stadium where the Bruins won 2-0. Current Bruins Andy Rose, Zack Zerrenner, Chris Cummings and Fernando Monge all played in that match. UCLA is just 2-3 against the Broncos in their last five meetings.

<u>Scouting The Aggies</u> — UC Davis opened the season with a 1-0 loss at Saint Mary's. The team put three shots on goal against the Gaels while Aggie goalkeeper Omar Zeenni recorded three saves in the loss. UC Davis returns four starters from the 2010 team that went 6-12-0 and finished tied for 4th in the Big West Conference. Head Coach Dwayne Shaffer is in his 15th season as head coach of the Aggies.

**The Series With UC Davis** — The Bruins have never lost to the Aggies, compiling a record of 14-0-0 all-time. UCLA won the last meeting between these two teams 4-0 back in 2009 at Drake Stadium. Current UCLA forwards Chandler Hoffman and Evan Raynr each had goals in that game, with Hoffman scoring two and Raynr adding one.

Bruins Fall in Season Opener — Last weekend UCLA paid a visit to No. 1 Louisville to face off in a rematch of last year's NCAA Quarterfinal match that the Cardinals won 5-4. This time would be no different, as Louisville defeated the Bruins 2-0 in the season opener for both teams. UCLA fell behind early after an own goal in the sixth minute that gave Louisville a 1-0 lead. Then forward Colin Rolfe tacked on another goal in the 47th minute to put the Cardinals up for good at 2-0. UCLA goalkeeper Brian Rowe did his best to keep the team in the match with four saves while the Bruins could only muster two shots on goal against the Cardinals. The match was also played in front of a crowd of 7,821, which marked the largest crowd that Louisville has ever had for a soccer match at Cardinal Park.

<u>UCLA Picked To Win Pac-12</u> — In a polling of the Conference's men's soccer head coaches, UCLA has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the Pac-12 in 2011. The Bruins, searching for their third conference title in four years and seventh title overall, received the maximum amount of points (25) with five first-place votes. In the last three seasons, the Bruins have compiled a 20-4-6 conference mark, the best amongst the Pac-12 teams.

**A Look At The Bruins** — With all eleven starters back from last season's squad that made the NCAA Quarterfinals, expectations are sky high in Westwood for 2011. The Bruins come into the season ranked second in the nation by College Soccer News and Soccer America and are looking to improve on last year's playoff run. Leading the way for the Bruins is sophomore midfielder Kelyn Rowe, who earned Pac-10 Freshman of the Year Honors in 2010 and was named a third-team All-American by the NSCAA. Rowe also led the team with 10 assists last season, tying the school's freshman record, and ranked second on the squad in goals scored (7) and points (24). This season, Kelyn was named a preseason first-team All-American by College Soccer News and is also a part of the MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. Senior midfielder Andy Rose, who was last season's team captain and a first-team All-Pac-10 selection in 2010, also returns after starting all 22 games last year. Junior midfielder Ryan Hollingshead, who ranked third on the team with five assists, is also back as is second-team All-Pac-10 selection Eder Arreola. Arreola was second on the team in assists last season with seven and third on the team in points with 15.

The Bruins have a lot of depth at the forward position and are led up front by last season's Pac-10 leading goal scorer Victor Chavez. Chavez, a sophomore, registered 10 goals and 5 assists last season which

was good for a team-high 25 points. Joining Chavez up front will be junior Chandler Hoffman, who scored six goals in 11 games in an injury plagued 2010 season, and sophomore Reed Williams, who tallied five goals in 2010.

The back line in 2011 will be led by senior Shawn Singh and junior Matt Wiet. Singh, a former walk-on, earned second-team All-Pac-10 honors in 2010 while Wiet, a transfer from Indiana, was voted as UCLA's Defensive MVP. Sophomores Patrick Matchett and Joe Sofia return to the defense as well.

In goal, the Bruins return last year's starter Brian Rowe, who registered 91 saves and a Pac-10 leading eight shutouts a year ago. Rowe was also named UCLA's Team MVP. Redshirt freshman Earl Edwards will look to earn playing time as well after seeing time with the U.S. U-20 National Team earlier this year.

Fresh Faces — The Bruins welcome six new faces to the team, led by ESPN RISE First-Team All-American Reed McKenna. McKenna, a forward, led his high school to a section title and a CIF Regional semifinal appearance in 2011 while also being named All-San Diego Section Player of the Year. UCLA also added two goalkeepers in freshmen Jake Tenzer and Alex Padilla and signed midfielder/defender Nati Schnitman. Finally, the Bruins picked up two transfers in the offseason in junior Ryan Lee (Ohio State) and sophomore Victor Munoz (Iona). Munoz was named MAAC Rookie of the Year for Iona in 2010 while Lee made nine starts for the Buckeyes last season.

Seven Bruins Named To TDS's "100 Players To Watch" List—Seven UCLA players have been named to Top Drawer Soccer's "100 Players to Watch" list (sophomores, juniors and seniors only). Midfielder Kelyn Rowe topped the list at No. 1 while the other UCLA players on the list are Eder Arreola (No. 23), Victor Chavez (No. 70), Andy Rose (No. 73), Brian Rowe (No. 79), Shawn Singh (No. 89) and Joe Sofia (No. 93).

Rose Nominated for Lowe's Senior Award — Senior midfielder/defender Andy Rose has been named as one of the 30 candidates for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Rose is on track to graduate after the Fall quarter after just three years and one quarter and has twice earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors. Andy has also volunteered for UCLA's I'm Going To College program, giving campus tours and doing autograph signings for the collegiate community outreach effort; Adopt-A-Classroom, in which players correspond and meet with elementary school children; and Marathon Kids, a school and community-based fitness program. To be eligible for the Lowe's Senior CLASS award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.
