Administrator Biographies



Dr. Gene Block

Chancellor • Stanford '70 • 6th Year

Dr. Gene Block became chancellor of UCLA in summer 2007, taking the helm of a world-class institution comprising 37,000 students and 27,000 faculty and staff, with an annual budget of \$3.6 billion. As chief executive officer, he oversees all aspects of the university's three-part mission of education, research and service.

Previously, Dr. Block served as vice president and provost of the University of Virginia, where he also held the Alumni Council Thomas Jefferson Professorship in Biology. With academic expertise in biological clocks, he conducts research on the neurobiology of circadian rhythms in higher organisms, leading a research lab funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). From 1991 to 2002, he directed the National Science Foundation's Science and Technology Center for Biological Timing. In 1997, he was named a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He has invented a number of devices and

holds a patent for a non-contact respiratory monitor for the prevention of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome.

Dr. Block joined the faculty of the University of Virginia in 1978 as an assistant professor of biology. He served as vice provost for research from 1993 to 1998 and then as vice president for research and public service until his appointment as vice president and provost in 2001. He also headed an NIH graduate training program aimed at increasing the number of scientists from underrepresented groups. In 1998, he received the Commonwealth of Virginia's Outstanding Public Service Award for his work with Virginia's business community.

A native of Monticello, NY, Dr. Block holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Stanford University and a master's and Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Oregon. He also completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Stanford, working with the late Colin Pittendrigh, "the father of biological timing" and distinguished biologist and former Stanford President, Donald Kennedy. Dr. Block and his wife, Carol, have two adult children.



Dan Guerrero

Athletic Director • UCLA '74 • 11th Year

On April 25, 2002, Daniel G. Guerrero was named UCLA's eighth Director of Athletics. A former Bruin baseball player, Guerrero, who assumed his duties on July 1, 2002, has enjoyed great success and exudes the pride of a student-athlete who is in charge of the program at his alma mater.

Guerrero is one of the most respected administrators in all of intercollegiate athletics. He is the current president of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and serves on numerous conference and national committees. He currently is a member of the Pac-12 Nominating Committee, the Pac-12 Athletic Directors Revenue Sharing Committee, the Pac-12 Bowls Committee, the Pac-12 Bosharing Committee. In addition, Guerrero is a member of the Rose Bowl Management Committee and is the Pac-12 Athletic Director's Liaison to the Men's Basketball Coaches. He also is a member of the BCS Athletic Directors Administrative Group

and an NCAA search committee member for NCAA's vice president of men's basketball championships.

In Guerrero's 10 years as Athletic Director, he has clearly established a pattern of "image and substance" that few in his profession can match. UCLA stands as the No. I University in the nation for NCAA team championships (108) won, a number that continues to grow under his direction. In that 10-year period, UCLA teams have won 22 NCAA team titles (the highest total in the nation in that span) in 12 different sports, finished second 19 times and have had an additional 41 Top Five finishes (79 total). A staggering 191 teams (of 229 possible) have qualified for NCAA post-season competition and the football team has appeared in eight bowl games. The program has also won 51 conference championships in 15 different sports, produced over 515 All-Americans and featured four Honda Award winners, including the 2003-04 Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year.

Under Guerrero's leadership, UCLA continues to remain one of the premier broad-based intercollegiate athletic programs in the country. In the last 10 years, UCLA has finished second three times (2007-08, 2006-07 and 2005-06), third three times (2011-12, 2004-05 and 2003-04), fourth (2009-10), sixth (2002-03), 11th (2010-11) and 16th (2008-09) in the race for the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup.

This past year, in NCAA action, UCLA captured its 108th NCAA crown in women's volleyball, placed second in men's water polo and women's tennis, third in women's water polo and women's gymnastics, tied for third in men's soccer and men's tennis, tied for fifth in baseball and men's golf and placed eighth in women's golf. UCLA also brought home four conference championships.

Guerrero came to UCLA in 2002 from UC Irvine, where he had served as UCl's fifth Director of Athletics for 10 years. Prior to arriving at UC Irvine, he was the Athletic Director for five years at Cal State Dominguez Hills. He received his Bachelor's degree from UCLA in 1974 and played second base in the Bruin baseball program for four years. Guerrero, born on November 10, 1951 in Tucson, AZ, was raised in Wilmington, CA. He is married to the former Anne Marie Aniello and they have two grown daughters: Jenna and Katie.



Ken Weiner

Senior Associate Athletic Director • UCLA '78 • 19th Year

Ken Weiner enters his 19th year as Senior Associate Athletic Director-Business Operations at UCLA and his 33rd year overall with the university. His duties include the administration and supervision of five Bruin sport programs - men's and women's soccer, women's swimming and diving, and men's and women's water polo.

During his tenure at UCLA Athletics, his sports have garnered 14 national championships and numerous conference championship titles. He also oversees new business, project development and capital improvements for the athletic department. Weiner spearheaded the negotiations that resulted in a 20-year agreement between UCLA and the Rose Bowl, including much-needed facilities improvements for the football program. He is currently acting as owner's representative for the press box and stadium upgrades that are due to complete by 2013. In addition, he supervises the athletic facilities division, the operations of UCLA's

sports practice and competition venues, game and event operations, department and team travel and UCLA Camps, Clinics and Championships.

Weiner is responsible for major capital improvements for Athletics. Projects include the renovation of the J.D. Morgan Intercollegiate Athletics Center, the Acosta Student Athlete Training Center and Knapp Football Center, the new Hall of Fame, the Jackie Robinson baseball and Easton softball clubhouse construction and stadium renovations, the Drake Track/Marshall Field renovation, a new golf practice facility, the North soccer field construction, the new Spieker Aquatic Center which opened in the fall of 2009, and the Pauley Pavilion renovation project, which is due to be completed this Fall. Future projects include Easton Softball Stadium improvements, Drake Stadium upgrades, and construction of a new Academic Studies Center.

Weiner participates on a number of campus steering committees on behalf of Athletics, including the Campus Facilities Coordination, Campus Project Review and the Alumni Advisory Board. Weiner is a member of NACDA and IAAM. He has served on various committees for the NCAA and was previously the chairman of the Men's Water Polo Committee. He is currently serving on the NCAA Men's Soccer Committee.

Prior to his appointment at UCLA Athletics, Weiner co-founded and served as Associate Director of the UCLA Central Ticket Office and continues to serve as the liaison between the Athletic Department and the CTO. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from UCLA. He graduated with honors and was bestowed a Chancellor's Marshall award for service to the university. He and his wife, Caren, have two adult children, Nicole and Kevin.

Press Credentials

Media and photography credentials for UCLA home games may be obtained by working press only by writing or calling Mike Leary at the UCLA Sports Information Office, PO Box 24044, Los Angeles, CA 90024, (310) 206-7873. All requests should be submitted at least 24 hours in advance. Press credentials can be picked up at the main entrance gate at the top level. Photo credentials can be picked up at the field-level entrance.

Television and photo credentials entitle video and still photographers to shoot from the endlines. No photographers will be permitted to shoot near the team area. Photographers can shoot from the stands provided they do not interfere with fans' views.

Visiting Radio Lines

There is one phone line available in the upper press area for visiting radio. To use the line to dial out, you will need to call a toll free number or use a calling card.

Drake Stadium

Drake Stadium is located on the campus of UCLA. From Los Angeles International Airport, take Century Blvd.east to the San Diego Freeway (405) and head north. Exit at Sunset Blvd. and head east. Turn right on Westwood Plaza to the parking kiosk. Parking is available for \$11 in Lot 4 or Lot 7, which are underneath the North Athletic Field and the Intramural Field. Drake Stadium is just west of the Intramural Field.

North Athletic Field

The North Athletic Field, where the Bruins train, is located on the campus of UCLA, just east of Drake Stadium. From Los Angeles International Airport, take Century Blvd. east to the San Diego Freeway (405) and head north. Exit at Sunset Blvd. and head east. Turn right on Westwood Plaza to the parking kiosk. Parking is available for \$11 in Lot 4, which is underneath the North Athletic Field.

Interview Policies

All interviews must be arranged by the Sports Information Office. Players have been instructed not to grant any interview, in person or by telephone, not arranged by the Sports Information Office. Player telephone numbers are private and will not be released. Please do not expect players to be available if you have not made prior arrangements.

Interview Availability

The UCLA team is scheduled to practice on weekdays from 11 am-1 pm at the North Athletic Field. Players and coaches are generally available after practice, class schedules permitting. Please contact the Sports Information office ahead of time for practice information and arrangements for field access.

Postgame Interviews

Postgame interviews of players and coaches at home games shall take place on the field. All interviews should be requested through UCLA Sports Information staff.

For security purposes, the UCLA Sports Information Office does not release to the general public any travel information for UCLA athletic teams. If you would like to reach a member of the UCLA soccer team on the road, please contact the Sports Information Office.
