Bruins Notch 22nd NCAA Semifinal Appearance

For the 22nd time in program history, UCLA reached the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament, held last year at Tulsa's Michael D. Case Tennis Center. The Bruins were a No. 3 seed, marking their highest seeding since 2001. UCLA began their NCAA run with three straight shutouts in early-round play, defeating Eastern Washington (1st Rd.), Wisconsin (2nd Rd.) and Florida State (Rd. of 16) all by 4-0 scores. UCLA had a much tougher time in the quarterfinals, however, eventually pulling out a dramatic 4-2 decision over cross-town rival USC. The Bruins' hopes for an NCAA title were dashed in the semifinals, as UCLA suffered a 4-2 loss to No. 7 Texas.

Martin Continues QF Streak

With UCLA reaching the NCAA Semifinals last year, head coach Billy Martin continued his streak of leading the Bruins to at least the quarterfinals in each of his 15 seasons as coach. Under Martin, the Bruins have never finished out of the top 5 at the NAAs.

Bruins Win Fifth Straight Pac-10 Championship

UCLA wrapped up the school's fifth straight Pac-10 men's tennis title last year, clinching it with a 4-3 victory at No. 4 USC in the final match of the regular season. It marked the second year in a row that both teams entered the final conference match with perfect 6-0 records. After barely winning the doubles point - Jeremy Drea and Michael Look battled back from 2-8 down in the deciding match - UCLA got singles wins from Look, Harel Srugo and Nick Meister. Srugo clinched the match at court No. 1, posting a 6-4, 6-3 upset over seventh-ranked Robert Farah.

UCLA in the Final ITA Rankings

As a team, UCLA finished at No. 5 in the Final ITA Rankings published on May 23. Individually, UCLA had four players ranked in singles, led by Harel Srugo at No. 23. He was followed by No. 42 Mathieu Dehaime, No. 52 Holden Seguso and No. 89 Haythem Abid. In doubles, Nick Meister and Srugo ended the year at No. 37.

Bruins Step it Up in 2008

UCLA posted an impressive 25-2 record last year despite missing its top four players from the previous season. Benjamin Kohlhoeffel, Chris Surapol, Philipp Gruendler and Haythem Abid were all starters on the 2007 team that reached the quarterfinals in Athens, Ga. Kohlhoeffel, Surapol and Gruendler graduated at the end of that year, while Abid redshirted the 2008 campaign due to injury. That didn't stop the Bruins from having a successful season, as newcomers Harel Srugo, Holden Seguso and Nick Meister all enjoyed fantastic years. In addition, seniors Mathieu Dehaime and Jeremy Drea registered the best seasons of their careers. Not since 1996 had a Bruin team finished with two losses or fewer (UCLA was 27-1 that year).

20 Wins Again

UCLA reached the 20-win mark for the 10th straight season in 2008, ending the year with a 25-2 overall record. Only twice in head coach Billy Martin's 15 years as head coach have the Bruins failed to reach 20 wins (1995 and 1998). UCLA's 25 wins last year was the highest total since the 2005 squad had 27 en route to the NCAA title.

Meister Leads Team in Victories

It's not often that a freshman leads the team in victories, however Nick Meister did just that in 2008, posting a team-high 30 wins. Other players with over 20 wins last year were: Jeremy Drea (29), Mathieu Dehaime (28), Michael Look (23), Harel Srugo (23) and Holden Seguso (20).

Perfect at Home

UCLA was undefeated in home matches last season, as the Bruins posted a perfect 14-0 record at the Los Angeles Tennis Center. It marked the second year in a row that UCLA has gone undefeated at home (the Bruins were 15-0 in 2007). UCLA's last home loss was back on March 11, 2006 (Baylor).

Dehaime Shines in the Classroom

UCLA's Mathieu Dehaime earned first-team *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America honors last year, becoming the first Bruin men's tennis player to be named to the first team. He joins Tobias Clemens, who was a third-team selection in 2004, as the only other UCLA men's tennis player to earn Academic All-America honors. Dehaime, a senior from Meudon, France, was a Business-Economics/Math & Applied Science double-major. He was named to the Dean's List (3.725 GPA & above) in eight of his 12 quarters at UCLA. On the court, Dehaime ended his career with a 68-25 overall singles record, including a 58-35 mark in doubles play. He helped UCLA reach the semifinals at the NCAA Championships in 2008, going 21-4 in dual matches while playing at the Nos. 2 and 3 singles positions. He teamed with freshman Holden Seguso at No. 2 doubles, going 18-6 overall. Dehaime, who was also named the Pac-10 Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 2008, is the 110th Academic All-American in UCLA history.

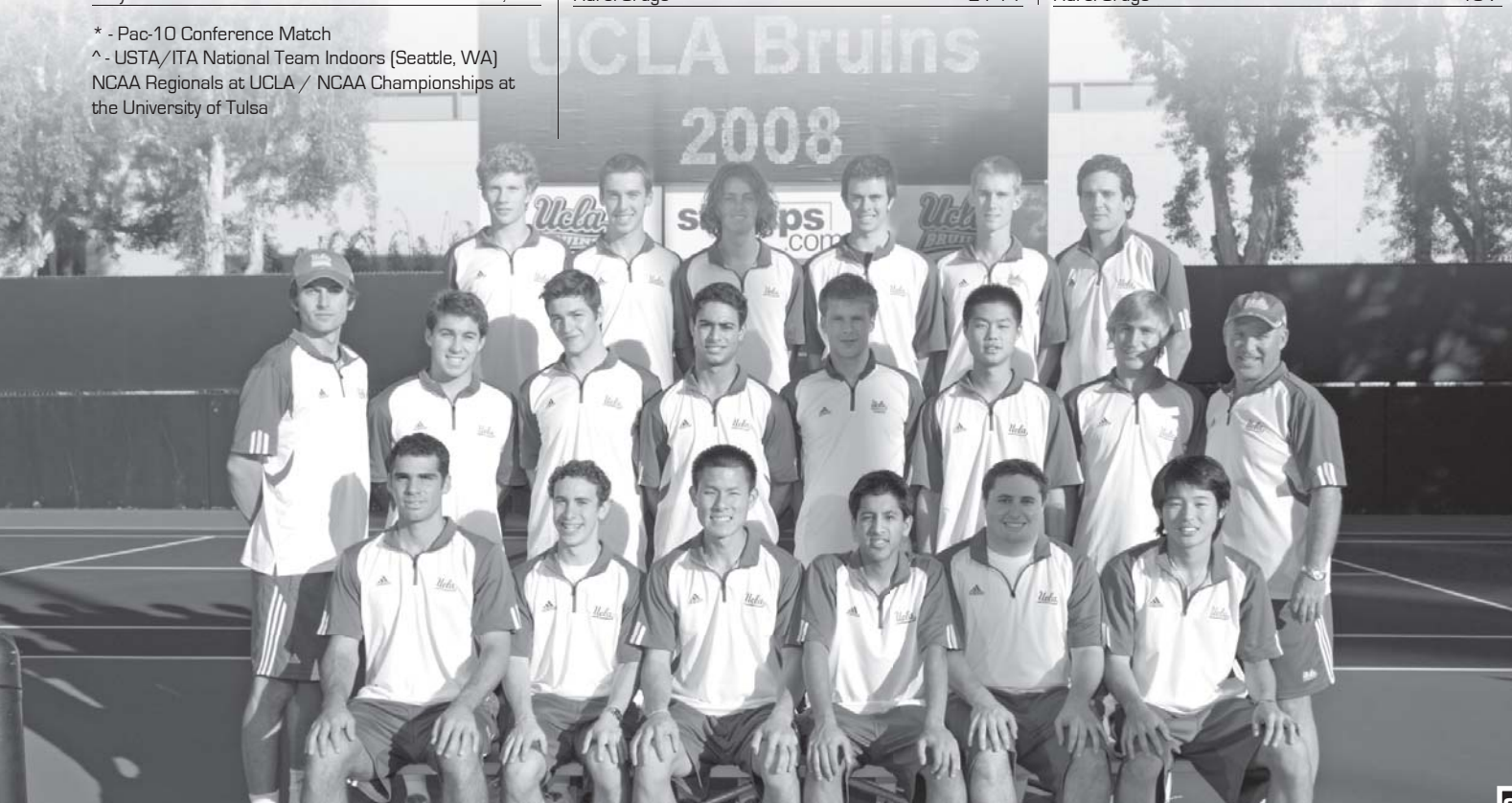
