

UCLA FINISHES SEASON 17TH AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

SEVEN BRUINS NAMED ALL-AMERICANS AT THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS.

2004 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS RECAP

The Bruins tied for 17th at the NCAA Championships, held at Texas' Mike A. Myers Stadium, scoring 17 points. UCLA's highest finisher was junior vaulter Yoo Kim, who cleared a personal best 18-4.50 (5.60m) to finish second in the pole vault. Kim also broke the Korean National Record of 18-2.50, which he had set last year.

Senior co-captains Juaune Armon and Dan Ames also turned in All-American performances at the championships. Armon finished fourth in the long jump with a season wind-aided best of 26-0 (7.92m, +2.6). Ames, who competed in three throwing events, tied for sixth in the shot put, throwing 62-7.75 (19.09m). It was the third All-America honor of Armon's career and 10th for Ames.

In the 1600m relay, the Bruin squad of Brandon Johnson, Jonathan Williams, Denye' Versher and Craig Everhart finished seventh in 3:06.63 to end the championships. All of the Bruins received the first All-America honors of their careers.

Final Results

Long Jump – Senior co-captain Juaune Armon placed fourth with a season best wind-aided jump of 26-0 (7.92m, +2.6). Armon received All-America recognition, the third of his career, and scored UCLA's first four points of the meet. LSU's John Moffitt won the event on the final jump of the night. He jumped 27-6.75 (8.40m) for the title.

Preliminary Field Results

(Top-12 finishers overall advance to the final unless otherwise noted.)

Pole Vault – Junior Yoo Kim and senior Pat Luke advanced to the final. Both cleared 17-4.50 (5.30m) to qualify for the final.

Hammer Throw – Senior co-captain Dan Ames placed seventh in the second flight of the prelim. He threw 205-11 (62.76m) to qualify as one of the 12 hammer finalists.

Shot Put – In the first flight of the shot put, sophomore Jake Knight placed eighth, 16th overall, with a throw of 59-3.50 (18.07m). Ames and sophomore Jeremy Silverman competed in the second flight. Ames placed third, throwing 62-8 (19.10m). It was also the third best throw overall. Silverman finished eighth, 14th overall, with a throw of 59-6.75 (18.15m). Ames advanced to the final. Knight and Silverman did not advance to the final.

Preliminary Track Results

100m – Sophomore Matt Bruno finished ninth in heat three, 24th overall, in 10.57 (w: 2.7).

110m Hurdles – Junior Tony Golston was eighth in heat three, 24th overall, in 14.11 (w: 1.7).

800m – Senior Nick Thornton finished ninth in heat three, 26th overall, in 1:52.76.

1500m – Juniors Jon Rankin and Ben Aragon competed in the second heat of the 1500m. Rankin finished sixth, 13th overall, in 3:47.75. Aragon finished ninth in 3:48.10, 16th overall. The top-12 finishers advanced to the final.

4x400m – The Bruin squad of Brandon Johnson, Mario Bassani, Denye' Versher and Craig Everhart ran 3:04.09 to finish third in the third heat. It was the seventh best time of the day. The Bruins advance to Saturday's final as a time qualifier.

Final Event Results

Discus – Senior Dan Ames was fourth in heat two, throwing 179-3 (54.63m). He finished 16th overall.

Decathlon (Day 1) – In the first day of the decathlon, senior Chris Staton scored 3,652 points. In the 100m, he ran 11.23 (+2.7, 810 points). In the long jump, he had a mark of 21-11.75 (6.70m, 743 points). In the shot put, he threw 39-8.75 (12.11m,

613 points). In the high jump, he cleared 6-6.75 (2.00m, 803 points). And, in the 400m, he ran 52.97 (683 points). Staton is currently 21st overall. The decathlon will conclude tomorrow.

Preliminary Track Results

400m – Senior Denye' Versher finished fourth in heat three, 21st overall, in 46.97. In the fourth and final heat, sophomore Craig Everhart finished second in 46.20.

400m Hurdles – Junior Jonathan Williams and sophomore Brandon Johnson competed in the fourth and final heat of the 400m hurdles. Williams finished second, 11th overall, in 50.83. Johnson was fourth, 17th overall, in 51.24.

Hammer Throw – Senior Dan Ames finished 12th with a throw of 205-11 (62.76m).

Pole Vault – Junior Yoo Kim placed second, scoring eight points, with a personal best vault of 18-4.50 (5.60m). The mark is third all-time in school history. It is also a new Korean national record. Last year, Kim set the previous record of 18-2.50. Senior Pat Luke finished 13th in the pole vault, clearing 16-10.75 (5.15m).

Decathlon – Senior Chris Staton finished 18th with 7,040 points. In the 110m hurdles, he ran 15.10 (+2.6, 837 points). In the discus, he threw 134-6 (41.00m, 685 points). In the pole vault, he cleared 14-1.25 (4.30m, 702 points). He threw 175-3 (53.41m) in the javelin for 639 points. And, in the 1500m, he finished in 5:06.07 (525 points).

Shot Put – Ames tied for sixth in the shot put, throwing 62-7.75 (19.09m). He scored 2.50 points for the Bruins and earned the 10th All-America honor of his career.

4x400m Relay – The squad of Brandon Johnson, Jonathan Williams, Denye' Versher and Craig Everhart ran 3:06.63, finishing seventh. All of the Bruins received All-America honors, the first of their careers.

NATIONAL RANKINGS**Trackwire 25**

The Bruins enter the NCAA Championships ranked fifth in the nation in the final Trackwire 25 ranking. Arkansas continues to dominate the ranking, maintaining the No. 1 spot with 63 points. Auburn is second with 42 points, followed by LSU with 41 points. Florida is fourth in the nation with 39 points. And, the Bruins round out the top five with 37 points.

The Trackwire 25 projects a hypothetical score for the NCAA meet, factoring in injury reports and other variables supported by information gathered from coaches and NCAA-qualifying competitions across the country. This projection is generated by scoring the Dandy Dozen, a power ranking of the top 12 athletes and relay squads in each NCAA event.

USTCA Team Power Ranking

In the final United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA) Team Power Ranking, the Bruins are ranked 12th in the nation with a score of 385.33. BYU ends the season ranked first with 415.55 points, followed by Florida (414.64), Nebraska (413.39) and Minnesota (410.64). Wisconsin rounds out the top five with a score of 407.56.

In the final Team Power Indoor Ranking, the Bruin men were ranked No. 7 in the nation (271.43).

The Team Power Ranking is a unique system of ranking teams on the basis of quality of athletic performance, team depth, and dual meet scoring potential. The system rates teams in the same fashion as decathlete or heptathlete. Points are assigned for two athletes in each event contested in a dual meet and points assigned on the basis of quality of performance. The top person in each event has his/her points doubled to adjust for the value of the number one performer on each team in a dual meet. The points for all events are then totaled for the ranking score.

HEAD COACH ART VENEGAS

Venegas enters his fifth year at the helm of the UCLA men's track and field team and 23rd as the Bruin men's and women's throws coach. During his time leading the Bruins, Venegas has led the Bruins to the 2004 Pac-10 title and back-to-back NCAA West Region team titles.

NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT SIGNEES

(ANNOUNCED JUNE 17, 2004)

Head Coach Art Venegas has announced the signing of eight individuals during the Spring signing period. Dustin DeLeo, Dominique Easterling, Michael Haddan, Michael Johnson, Boldiszar Kocsor, Matthew Reuter, Vache Sevajian, Drew Shackleton and Kyle Shackleton will enter as true freshmen. Dane Endly and Andrew Ninow will transfer from UC Riverside and American River Junior College, respectively. All have signed National Letters of Intent and will join the Bruins this fall.

Dustin DeLeo is a pole vaulter who hails from Seal Beach, CA and attends Los Alamitos High School. He is coached by former Bruin great Mike Tully and vaulted a personal best 16-2 to win the Orange County Championships. That mark is also currently tied for No. 3 in the state this season. At the Arcadia Invitational, he placed second with a vault of 15-7. He cleared 15-5.75 (4.72m) to place seventh at the Golden West Invitational. He won the Southern Section Div. I title at 15-9. At the Southern Section Masters Meet, he tied for first clearing 15-8. And, at the 2004 CA State Meet, DeLeo vaulted 15-0 (4.57m) to finish 10th in the preliminaries.

Dominique Easterling is a jumper from Madras High School in Madras, OR. At the Oregon State 3A Championships, he defended his triple and high jumps titles and was third in the long jump. In the high jump, he cleared 6-8. In 2003, cleared 6-6 for the OR State 3A high jump title. In the triple jump, he won with a jump of 46-11.75 (w: 0.0). In 2003, he won with a jump of 48-11.75. He is also the meet record holder in the triple jump, after winning the 2002 title with a mark of 49-4.75. Easterling also had a fine performance at the Golden West Invitational. He won the triple jump with a mark of 49-2.50 (15.00m, w: 0.0). In the high jump, he cleared 6-4 (1.93m) to tie for fourth. And, he placed sixth in the long jump with a mark of 22-5.25 (6.84m, w: 1.0).

Dane Endly, from Laguna Hills, CA, will transfer to UCLA from UC Riverside and will have three remaining years of eligibility. He is a sprinter with a personal best of 21.44 in the 200m. His season bests for 2004 were 6.97 (60m), 10.91 (100m) and 21.92 (200m). As a senior at Laguna Hills High School, he

finished sixth in the 200m at the 2003 CA State Meet in 21.64 (21.50q).

Michael Haddan, a middle distance runner from Woodbridge High School in Irvine, CA, is currently ranked No. 1 in the state in the 800m with a time of 1:51.50. He ran that time to win the event at the Southern Section Masters Meet. At the Arcadia Invitational, he placed third in 1:52.52. Haddan won the Southern Section Div. II 800m title in 1:54.30 (1:53.69q). And, at this year's CA State Meet, he placed third in the final (1:53.03) after winning his qualifying heat in 1:53.63. In 2002, Haddan finished second at the CA State Div. II Cross Country Championships in 15:08. He has also competed at the World Junior Championships.

Michael Johnson, a jumper from Rancho Cucamonga, CA, attends Rancho Cucamonga High School. He is currently ranked No. 3 in the state in the triple jump at 49-2 (w: 1.2), which he jumped to win the Southern Section Div. I title. He also won the Southern Section Masters Meet with a jump of 49-0.25w (w: 2.9). At the CA State Meet, he was the runner-up in the triple jump with a mark of 50-2.75w (15.31m, w: 3.7).

Boldiszar Kocsor, a thrower from University City High School in San Diego, CA, is one of the top-ranked hammer throwers and shot putters in the state. He is ranked No. 2 in the U.S. in the hammer with a mark of 199-11. His mark of 62-11.50, which he threw to win the San Diego Section Div. II shot put title, is ranked No. 3 this season. In the discus, he is ranked No. 18 in the state with a mark of 176-2. At this year's CA State Meet, he placed fifth in the shot put (60-6.50/18.45m). He also finished 13th in the discus with a throw of 169-9 (51.74m). At the San Diego Section Div. II Championships, Kocsor won the shot put (62-11.50) and was second in the discus (169-2). At the Golden West Invitational, he finished sixth in the shot, throwing 57-0.75 (17.39m). And, at the Arcadia Invitational, Kocsor placed eighth with a throw of 58-11.50.

Andrew Ninow is a thrower from Folsom, CA, who will transfer to UCLA from American River Junior College. Ninow is considered one of the top junior college throwers in the state. At this year's CA Community College Championships, he placed second in the hammer with a throw of 181-1 (55.19m). In the prelims, he threw 182-8. Ninow attended Folsom High School.

Matthew Reuter, a hurdler and high jumper from Ontario, CA, attends Brother Damien High School. In the state rankings, Reuter is No. 11 in the 110m hurdles at 14.42 (w: 1.5; No. 10 wind-aided time of 14.31), No. 13 (tied) in the high jump (6-8) and No. 20 in the 300m hurdles (38.61). At the Arcadia Invitational, Reuter won the 110m hurdles in 14.92 and was fourth in the 300m hurdles (39.50). At the Southern Section Div. II Championships, he won the 110m hurdles title in 14.38 (w: 2.5) and was sixth in the 300m hurdles (39.78, 38.61q). He also cleared 6-4 in the high jump in the prelims. At the State Meet, he tied for 17th in the 110m hurdle prelims with a time of 14.81 (w: 1.7).

Vache Sevajian, a shot putter, hails from Marantha High School in Pasadena, CA. This year, he is currently ranked No. 11 in the shot put at 59-4.75, which he threw in the prelims at the State Meet. He won the Southern Section Div. IV shot put title, throwing 57-5. And, he was fifth at the Masters Meet with a throw of 58-2. At the State Meet, Sevajian placed seventh in the final with a mark of 59-4.25 (18.09m). And, at the Arcadia Invitational, he finished 14th with a throw of 55-0.50.

Drew Shackleton is a distance runner from Carlmont High School in Belmont, CA who will join the Bruins along with twin brother Kyle this fall. This season, Drew is ranked No. 31 in the state in the 3200m at 9:20.58. At the Arcadia Invitational, he placed 16th in the 3200m, running 9:23.85.

Kyle Shackleton is a distance runner from Carlmont High School in Belmont, CA who will join the Bruins along with twin brother Drew this fall. In 2004, Kyle is ranked No. 6 in the state in the 3200m with a time of 9:05.36. He ran that time to finish third at the Central Coast Section Championships. At the CA State Meet, he finished fifth in the 3200m in 9:17.03. And, at the Arcadia Invitational, he finished 16th in the two-mile run in 9:12.92. In cross country last fall, he was ranked as the No. 7 runner in the state.

Head Coach Art Venegas received three National Letters of Intent during the Fall signing period. **Chad Dunn**, **James Rhoades** and **Joel Tuosto** will join the Bruins as true freshmen in 2004.

Dunn (Seal Beach, CA) attends Los Alamitos High School. At the 2002 California State Meet, he ran the first leg of Los Alamitos' 4x100m relay that placed ninth in 42.11. Dunn will compete in the 100m and 200m for the Bruins next season.

Rhoades (Ramona, CA), a sprinter, attends Ramona High School. At the 2003 CA State meet, he was a finalist, placing eighth in 49.14. Rhoades is the fourth fastest returning quartermiler in the state. He has run prep bests of 48.48 (400m) and 22.21 (200m). In addition to running track, Rhoades is a corner back for the Ramona High football team.

Tuosto (Greenfield, CA) attends Greenfield High School. At the 2003 California State Meet, he placed fourth in the triple jump with a jump of 48-10. He was the Mission Trail Athletic League's long jump champion. In 2002, he placed 13th in the preliminary round of the triple jump with a jump of 45-4.25, but did not advance to the final.

2004 OUTDOOR MEET RECAPS

MAY 28-29: BRUINS WIN BACK-TO-BACK WEST REGION TITLES

The Bruins defended their West Region title, scoring 141 points. In all, UCLA qualified 15 individual athletes and both relays for the NCAA Championships, June 9-12, in Austin, TX. It is the largest Bruin contingent to qualify for the NCAA Championships in the history of UCLA. In 1972, under head coach Jim Bush, the Bruins took a 14-man contingent to the NCAA Championships.

Overall, UCLA qualified an individual in every event they competed in this weekend. Individual regional champions were senior co-captain Dan Ames (HT, SP, DT), sophomore Craig Everhart (400m) and true freshman Brandon Johnson (400mH).

Bruin Head Coach Art Venegas: "I'm thrilled that so many of our kids have the opportunity to go to Austin for the NCAA Championships. Like at the Pac-10 Meet, all areas contributed in a major way. It's good to see our athletes be a team and have each other's backs. People say that track is such an individual sport. I've tried to get away from that way of thinking with this team. Our success is due to coming together as a team."

MAY 14-15: BRUINS WIN 17TH PAC-10 TITLE, STATON PLACES SECOND AT CLARMONT CLASSIC DECATHLON

The UCLA Bruins won the 2004 Pac-10 Championships with 143 points. It is UCLA's 17th Pac-10 Title and the first under head coach Art Venegas. UCLA last won the Pac-10 Championships in 1998, when the Bruins scored 130.5 points for the victory.

In the team standings, Oregon finished second with 130 points, followed by Arizona State (third, 120 points), USC (fourth, 95 points) and Arizona (fifth, 93 points). Stanford finished sixth (76 points), followed by Cal (seventh, 75 points), Washington (eighth, 45 points) and Washington State (ninth, 41 points).

In the final day of the championships, UCLA racked up four individual titles. Senior co-captain Dan Ames kicked things off, winning the hammer throw with a mark of 210-8 (64.21m, RQ). Later in the day, he completed the Pac-10 Championship trifecta by winning the discus throw (185-11, 56.67m). Ames is the first athlete in the history of the throwing events to win three individual titles at one Pac-10 Championship meet.

Junior Ben Aragon won the first individual title on the track. Aragon won the 800m in a personal best 1:48.45. And, true freshman Brandon Johnson won the 400m hurdles in a world leading and personal best time of 48.85.

"I feel that our seniors, in particular, had an awesome meet," said Venegas. "Ames won three events and Armon took charge in the long jump to win. Our middle distance crew showed that they belong amongst the top of the conference. Our sprinters were phenomenal. I can't say enough about Brandon Johnson. Tonight, he showed everybody what he was really capable of doing.

"I am very impressed with Jonathan Williams. He came back after a difficult 110m hurdles race to run a personal best in the 400m hurdles and scored critical points for the team.

"I'm thrilled with our staff. I work with some of the finest coaches. They prepared the athletes well and, even when things weren't going our way, we fought back.

This championship shows that UCLA is going to be a contender for a long time to come."

May 1 - BRUINS DOMINATE TROJANS, WIN 72ND ANNUAL DUAL MEET 111-52

Los Angeles, CA - In the 72nd annual dual meet between the UCLA Bruins and USC Trojans, the Bruins triumphed 111-52. On the day, the Bruins swept five events and were led by 12 event winners, 13 personal best and 22 regional qualifying performances. Multiple event winners were senior Dan Ames, who swept the throwing events, and sophomore Chad Galbreath, who swept the long distance events.

This year's victory is the greatest margin of victory for the Bruins using traditional scoring (5-3-1 individual events, 5-0 relay events) since 1992. USC maintains a 39-32 lead in the overall series history (the 1982 dual meet was non-scoring).

In the battle for the Lexus Gauntlet, the Bruin men picked up five points for UCLA.

BRUIN RESULTS

Hammer Throw (Friday) - Senior Dan Ames and sophomore Jake Knight gave the Bruins a 6-3 lead over the Trojans to begin this year's dual meet. Ames won the hammer throw with a personal best and regional qualifying (RQ) throw of 212-2 (64.68m). It is third all-time at UCLA. Ames' mark is a Pac-10 and regional leader. Knight placed third, throwing a personal best 189-8 (57.81, RQ). And, freshman Brian Ruziecki was fifth with a personal best throw of 184-6 (56.23m). USC's Michael Murray was second, throwing 207-6 (63.24m, RQ).

Javelin - The Bruins went one-two in the javelin. Ely Dial won, throwing 186-2 (56.75m). Chris Staton was second, throwing a personal best 183-8 (55.98m).

High Jump - UCLA finished second and third in the high jump. Dave Murphy was second, clearing a personal best 6-8 (2.03m). Staton finished third, jumping 6-4 (1.93m). Trojan Jesse Williams won, clearing 7-3 (2.21m).

Steeplechase - The Bruins swept the steeplechase. Chad Galbreath won in 9:46.92. Reggie Oronoz came in second in 9:55.96. And, true freshman Micky Cobrin was third, finishing in 10:02.10.

Long Jump - In the long jump, senior Juaune Armon finished third with a regional qualifying and season best jump of 24-1 (7.34m, w: 0.6). Chris Merriweather was fifth, jumping a season best 22-5 (6.83m, w: 0.8). It was an inch shy of his personal best. And, Staton was sixth with a jump of 22-2.25 (6.76m, w: 1.4). USC's Allen Simms won with a mark of 25-5.25 (7.75m, w: 1.8).

4x100m Relay - In the 400m relay, the Bruin squad of Matt Bruno, Tony Golston, Jonathan Williams and Craig Everhart ran a season best 39.72 (RQ). The USC team of Wes Felix, Phillip Frances, Garry Jones and Blake Frazier won in 39.35.

Shot Put - UCLA went one-three in the shot put. Ames won his second event of the meet with a throw of 64-7.75 (19.70m, RQ). Jeremy Silverman was second with a personal best throw of 61-11.50 (18.88m, RQ). Knight finished fifth with a personal best throw of 59-7.50 (18.17m, RQ). And, Ruziecki was sixth, throwing 57-11.75 (17.67m).

1500m - The Bruins went one-two in the 1500m. Jon Rankin won in a personal best 3:43.10. Ben Aragon was second in a personal best 3:43.45 (RQ).

110m Hurdles - Bruins Golston and Williams went one-two in the high hurdles. Golston won in 13.70 (w: 0.3). It is a wind-legal personal best, season best and regional qualifying time. Williams tied his personal best, running 13.93 (w: 0.3, RQ).

400m - Everhart and Denye' Versher went one-two in the 400m run. Everhart won in a personal best 45.39 (RQ). Versher came in second in 46.78. Mario Bassani finished fourth in 47.47. True freshmen Jeff Jacobs and Michael Elbogen finished sixth and seventh in 48.76 and 49.03, respectively.

100m - USC swept the 100m dash. Wes Felix won in a personal best 10.31 (w: 0.7). Phillip Frances was second in 10.41 and Garry Jones was third in 10.49 (w: 0.7). UCLA's Bruno was fourth in a season best 10.52 (w: 0.7).

800m - The Bruins went one-three in the 800m run. Senior Nick Thornton won the event in a regional qualifying 1:49.96. Rankin was third in a personal best 1:50.60 (RQ). And, Aragon was fourth in 1:50.93.

Pole Vault - UCLA swept the pole vault. Yoo Kim won with a regional qualifying clearance of 17-5 (5.31m). Pat Luke and Shane Hackett tied for second, clearing 16-7.25 (5.06m, RQ). Murphy and Mike Landers tied for fourth, clearing 16-1.25 (4.91m). And, true freshman Zack Miller was sixth (14-7.50/4.46m).

400m Hurdles - True freshman Brandon Johnson led a Bruin sweep of the intermediate hurdles. Johnson won in a personal best 51.15 (RQ). Williams was second in a regional qualifying 51.84. And, Matt Willis was third in 52.67.

Triple Jump - Sophomore Demetre Howard finished second in the triple jump. He jumped 48-9 (14.86m, w: 0.5). Merriweather was fourth with a wind-aided season best of 45-9w (13.94m, w: 2.2). And, Javier Aguiniga was fifth with a jump of 43-5.75 (13.25m, w: -0.5). USC's Allen Simms won the event jumping 54-10.75 (16.73m, w: 0.2).

Discus - Ames led another Bruin sweep in the throwing events. He threw a regional qualifying 182-3 (55.55m) for his third win of the meet. Silverman was second with a throw of 171-1 (52.15m, RQ). Ruziecki was third (164-0/49.98m). And, Josh Rider was fourth throwing 162-5 (49.51m).

200m - Everhart placed second in the 200m dash, running a regional qualifying 20.91 (w: -0.3). Bruno finished fourth in a season best 21.44 (w: -0.3). Trojan Wes Felix ran his second personal best of the day, winning in 20.57 (w: -0.3).

5000m - The Bruins swept the final individual event of the meet. Galbreath won his second event of the day in 15:16.94. Mohammed Qazi was second in 15:25.46. Nick DeFelice finished third in 15:33.21. And, Oronoz was fifth in 16:27.43.

4x400m Relay - The Bruins sealed their 32nd dual victory over the Trojans by winning the 1600m relay. The squad of Johnson, Thornton, Versher and Bassani won in a regional qualifying time of 3:06.59. USC's team of Garrison, Felix, Heckman and Pratt finished in 3:13.84.

Friday Results

The Bruins had two winners on Friday, senior Dan Ames and sophomore Chad Galbreath. Ames won the hammer with a personal best throw of 207-8 (63.30m, No. 8 in school history, RQ). Los Angeles, CA - The three day Rafael Johnson/Jackie Joyner-Kersey Invitational ended with a bang on Saturday. On the day, former Bruin greats John Godina and Jess Strutzel turned in a pair of American leading performances. A bevy of meet records were also broken in today's action.

In the field, meet records were broken in six of the events. In the first event of the day, 2003 NCAA champion and USC alum David Jaworski cleared 7-2.25 (2.19m) in the high jump. He broke the meet record of 6-11 set by former Bruin Kevin Weaver. In the pole vault, former Bruin All-American Scott Slover won, equaling the meet record of 17-8.50 (5.40m), set by current Bruin Yoo Kim. Brian Johnson, competing unattached, won the long jump with a meet record mark of 24-7.75 (7.51m)(1.3). Former Bruin Narc Narcisse held the previous record of 24-4.25. And, in the triple jump, Von Ware set a meet record of 53-3 (16.23m)(-0.1).

In the throwing events, two of the nation's top throwers established new meet records. In the shot put, former Bruin great and two-time World champion John Godina threw 67-11.75 (20.72m). It is the leading mark in the U.S. this season and second in the world. In the discus throw, 2003 U.S. champion Carl Brown threw a meet record 206-5 (62.91m) for the victory. And, in the javelin, Arizona's Matt Wagner threw 221-5 (67.49m) for the victory and meet record.

On the track, a number of meet records were broken. In the 100m, Jerome Avery won in 10.43 (0.0). In the 200m, Mickey Grimes won in 20.64 (NW) to break Jerome Davis' previous record of 20.91. In the 400m, Handan Al'Bishi won in 45.79, breaking Davis' record of 46.68. In the mile invitational, Arizona's Robert Cheseret won in 4:01.43.

In the 800m, former Oregon All-American and Pac-10 champion Simon Kimata, now representing Kenya, won in 1:46.48.

Former UCLA NCAA 800m champion Jesse Strutzel was the runner-up in 1:46.80. It is the leading time in the U.S. this season. Also competing in the 800m was Track & Field News' athlete of the year and world 400m hurdles champion Felix Sanchez. He finished fourth in a personal best 1:49.36.

In today's home opener, the Bruin men scored 240.50 points to defeat Cal Poly - San Luis Obispo (189.50), Cal State Fullerton (101) and Cal State L.A. (74). UCLA won 11 events on the day. Eight individuals had NCAA Regional qualifying marks.

MARCH 13: BRUINS FINISH 12TH AT NCAA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Fayetteville, AR - At the conclusion of the 2004 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships, held at Arkansas' Randal Tyson Track Center, the Bruins placed 12th with 17 points. LSU won the men's title with 44.50 points. Florida and Arkansas tied for second with 38 points, followed by Texas (fourth, 31) and Michigan (28 points).

In today's action, senior co-captain Dan Ames placed third in the 35-pound weight throw. He threw a personal best and school record-breaking 71-2.50 (21.70m). Former Bruin All-American Scott Moser set the previous record of 70-11 in 2002. Ames received his second All-America honors of the meet. It is his sixth indoor All-America honor and the ninth of his collegiate career.

In the men's pole vault, senior Pat Luke vaulted 17-4.50 (5.30m). He finished in a three-way tie for ninth.

MARCH 12: BRUINS TIED FOR FIFTH AT NCAA INDOOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Fayetteville, AR - At the conclusion of the first day of competition at the 2004 NCAA Indoor Track & Field Championships, held at Arkansas' Randal Tyson Track Center, the Bruins are tied for fifth place with LSU. Both schools have scored 11 points. Arkansas, the defending NCAA indoor and outdoor champion, leads with 23 points. Texas and Florida are tied for second with 21 points. Rounding out the top-five of the 40 teams are Purdue (13 points), UCLA and LSU.

In today's action, senior Bruin co-captains Dan Ames and Juaune Armon each received All-America honors. Ames was the highest placing Bruin, finishing third in the shot put with a throw of 65-6.75 (19.98m). It is a personal best for Ames and No. 6 on UCLA's all-time list. Ames also received All-America recognition, the eighth of his career. Armon placed fourth in the long jump with a mark of 26-1.75 (7.97m). It was a season best and just 1.25 inches shy of his personal best 26-3. Armon also received All-America honors, the second of his collegiate career.

Junior Ben Aragon placed sixth in the second heat of the mile run. His time of 4:04.42 was 11th overall, the top-10 advanced to the final.

The distance medley relay squad of Jon Rankin, Craig Everhart, Nick Thornton and Aragon placed 12th in tonight's final in 9:49.53.

MARCH 8: BRUIN RESULTS FROM LAST CHANCE MEET

Seattle, WA - At the Last Chance Meet on March 6, held at Dempsey Indoor Stadium in Seattle, WA, sophomore throwers Jake Knight and Jeremy Silverman provisionally qualified for the NCAA Indoor Championships. Knight was second in the shot put, throwing 59-1.50 (18.02m). Silverman placed third with a throw of 58-10.25 (17.94m).

Martell Munguia competed in the 800m run. He won the event in 1:50.97, but the mark is not a NCAA qualifying time.

FEBRUARY 28: BRUINS "THREE-PEAT" AS MPSF INDOOR CHAMPIONS

Seattle, WA - At the 2004 MPSF Indoor Track and Field Championships, hosted by Washington at Dempsey Indoor Stadium, the Bruins won their third consecutive MPSF title scoring 127 points. Cal was the runner-up with 108 points, followed by third-place Stanford (82.5 points). Rounding out the Top-Five were Arizona (fourth, 77.5) and Oregon (fifth, 66.5).

Three Bruins defended their 2003 individual titles. Craig Everhart won the 400m in a provisional time of 46.85. Nick Thornton won the 800m in a provisional 1:49.61. And, senior Dan Ames defended his shot put and weight throw titles. In

the shot put, he threw a NCAA automatic mark of 64-3 (19.58m). And, in the weight throw, he threw 69-0.50 (21.04).

Also victorious was UCLA's 4x400m relay. Competing for the first time this season, the squad of Everhart, Thornton, Mario Bassani and Denye Versher won in a facility record 3:09.07 (provisional). The previous record of 3:09.35 was set by Arizona State last year.

FEBRUARY 14: BRUIN MEN WIN FIVE EVENTS AT PAC-10 INDOOR

Seattle, WA - At the Pac-10 Indoor Invite, at Washington's Dempsey Indoor Stadium, the Bruins won five events. Leading the way were sophomore Craig Everhart (400m), Tony Golston (60m hurdles), Pat Luke (pole vault), Dan Ames (weight throw) and the distance medley relay.

Everhart won the 400m with a season best and NCAA Provisional qualifying time of 46.96. Golston was triumphant in the 60m hurdles, winning in a provisional time of 7.90. Luke vaulted an indoor personal best 17-7 (5.36) to win the pole vault. His mark was also a provisional qualifier. And, Ames threw a provisional 66-4.50 (20.23) to win the weight throw.

The distance medley relay squad of Ben Aragon, Denye Versher, Nick Thornton and Jon Rankin had an impressive performance. They won in a NCAA Automatic time of 9:34.21. The Bruins set a new facility record, breaking the previous record of 9:34.56 set by Stanford in 2003. It is also the No. 3 mark in school history.

Other top Bruin performers were Versher (200m, third (tie), 21.82; 400m, second, 47.60), Chris Staton (high jump, second, 6-8.75/2.05m), Ames (shot put, second, 62-10.75/19.17), Yoo Kim (pole vault, third, 17-5/5.31m) and Brian Ruziecki (weight throw, third, 57-0/17.37m).

FEBRUARY 7: UNITED HERITAGE INVITATIONAL RESULTS

At the 2004 United Heritage Invitational, hosted by Boise State, at Jacksons Track/Idaho Sports Center, senior Juaune Armon was one of the top Bruin performers of the day. Seniors Dan Ames and Pat Luke, along with juniors Jonathan Williams and Tony Golston, also led UCLA.

In his first competition of the indoor season, Armon won the long jump with a distance of 24-5.50 (7.45m). Ames placed second in the weight throw with a NCAA provisional mark of 67-0.75 (20.44m). He was also fourth in the shot put with a provisional mark of 60-8.75 (18.51m). Luke placed fourth in the pole vault, clearing 17-1 (5.71m). It was a personal indoor best for him. Williams was the runner-up in the 60m hurdles, finishing in 7.99. Golston was third in the 60m hurdles, finishing just behind Williams in 8.00. In the preliminaries, he ran a NCAA provisional time of 7.97.

The Bruin 1600m relay squad of junior Mario Bassani, sophomore Craig Everhart, senior Nick Thornton and junior Denye Versher placed fifth in 3:12.79.

JANUARY 31: HUSKY INVITE RESULTS

Seattle, WA - At today's Husky Invite, held at Washington's Dempsey Indoor Track Stadium, Bruin senior co-captain Dan Ames led UCLA with a pair of victories and NCAA provisional qualifying performances. Other winners and provisional quali-

fiers were senior Nick Thornton in the 800m and junior Tony Golston in the 60m hurdles.

Ames threw NCAA provisional marks, winning the shot put and weight throw. In the shot put, he threw 60-7.75 (18.48m). And, in the weight throw, he threw 66-9.25 (20.35m). Thornton won the 800m in a NCAA provisional time of 1:49.56. And, Golston won the 60m hurdles in a provisional qualifying time of 7.89. In addition to these individual qualifiers, the distance medley relay of junior Ben Aragon, Thornton, and juniors Denye' Versher and Jon Rankin ran a provisional time of 9:41.43, placing second.
