John Speraw, who guided UC Irvine to the 2012 NCAA men's volleyball championship in a three-set victory over USC, was named UCLA's head coach on June 5, 2012.

Speraw served 10 seasons as UC Irvine's head coach and transformed the program into a national power. Under his direction, the Anteaters won three NCAA titles in the last six years and advanced to the NCAA Championship four times, won two MPSF regular season titles and a pair of MPSF Tournament championships.

"We are excited to welcome John Speraw back to Westwood to take the reins of the men's volleyball program," Guerrero said. "After winning three national titles as a head coach at UC Irvine and two as a player at UCLA, he certainly knows what it takes to win at the highest level. In addition, as a former Bruin assistant coach and student-athlete, he knows first-hand the values and ideals we hold near and dear as an athletic department and as an institution."

Speraw, 41, assumes the duties of his collegiate mentor, Al Scates, who retired after 50 years as the Bruins' head coach on June 30, 2012.

"I'm confident that John Speraw is the right man to lead UCLA men's volleyball into the next era," said Scates. "He has proven himself to be an outstanding coach both collegiately and internationally. UCLA is privileged to have him."

Speraw has also been successful on the international level, serving as an assistant coach with the United States Men's Indoor Volleyball Team that won the gold medal at the 2008 Olympics in Beijing. In 2011, he was given the U.S. Olympic Achievement Award, an honor that recognizes the colleges and universities whose coaches and student-athletes have won Olympic medals in the past two Olympiads.

At the London Olympics in 2012, the USA won its pool before falling in the quarterfinals.

"It is a great honor to be asked to lead one of the greatest programs in NCAA sports history," said Speraw. "Al Scates is a great friend and mentor. I hope to continue his legacy of producing great championship teams."

"As I walked around campus, I remembered why I chose UCLA years ago," Speraw continued. "I love the campus. I love the people who work there and the values that we share. I loved my experiences as a student-athlete and a young coach and I'm very much looking forward to my experiences as a head coach at my alma mater. This is indeed home and I am excited to be back."

In 2009, Speraw guided UCI to a 27-5 overall record and ended the year ranked No. 1 in the country. The Anteaters were ranked

No. 1 for eight weeks, the most of any team in the nation. UCI also captured the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation regular season title.

With UCI's first national championship in 2007, Speraw became the only individual to win a title as a head coach, assistant coach and player in collegiate men's volleyball history.

Along with the national championship in 2007, Speraw's team also won its first Mountain Pacific Sports Federation tournament championship, ended the year with the No. 1 ranking and recorded a school record 29 victories, a win total that was the best among all NCAA Division I-II schools that season. That season, he was also awarded the USA Olympic Committee's National Coach of the Year.

Speraw was named 2006 AVCA National Coach of the Year as well as Mountain Pacific Sports Federation and *Volleyball* magazine Coach of the Year. He has been a finalist for National Coach of the Year three times.

In 2006, The Anteaters claimed their first-ever regular season Mountain Pacific Sports Federation title, finishing with a 20-2 league record. The team won a school-record 21 consecutive matches to end the regular season and held the top ranking for eight consecutive weeks.

Speraw, who was 199-106 (.652) overall as head coach of the Anteaters, mentored both the AVCA Division I-II Men's National Player of the Year and the AVCA Division I-II Men's Newcomer of the Year in 2006. UC Irvine players earned All-American distinction 21 times since Speraw arrived at UCI, including nine first-teamers. While at Irvine, Speraw's players also captured MPSF Player of the Year, MPSF Freshman of the Year, NCAA Championship MVP, NCAA All-Tournament Team, numerous national and conference Player of the Week honors as well as academic distinctions such as Academic All-American, MPSF and UCI academic honors. Under Speraw's leadership, the men's volleyball team has produced no fewer than five scholar-athletes each year.

Speraw, who had a team ranked No. 1 in five different seasons at UCI, placed the Anteaters in the Top 10 final rankings all but one year while at the helm at Irvine.

In 2008, he received a Pillar Award, which showcases outstanding achievement in ethical leadership at the 12th Annual Ethics in America Awards. Speraw was also named to OCMETRO Business Magazine's 18th annual list of the Hottest 25 Business People of Orange County and was tabbed No. 16 in the Daily Pilot's 2007 Top 103 Most Influential People in the Newport/Costa Mesa Area. Speraw was on the Most Influential list the last four years including the Sports Newsmaker of the Year in 2006.

BRAD KELLER

Assistant Coach • 1st Year

Brad Keller, a former outside hitter at Loyola Marymount, enters his first season at UCLA. With a reputation for building championship-caliber teams, Keller has spent the last six seasons on the collegiate level, including helping to lead USC to the 2009 NCAA men's volleyball title match.

Prior to his appointment at UCLA, Keller served at UConn for the 2011 season working with the Huskies' women's volleyball team. Before moving to Storrs, CT, Keller helped guide the UC Irvine men's team to an 18-11 regular season record, and a No. 3 national ranking. The Anteaters finished sixth nationally in 2011. In 2010, his first season at UCI, the Anteaters finished eighth nationally.

Before his stint at UC Irvine, Keller served as an assistant at USC from 2007-10 with the men's volleyball team. As the offensive coordinator during the 2009 season, Keller helped guide the Trojans to the NCAA Final, as USC ended the year ranked second nationally in kills and assists as well as fifth in hitting percentage. USC lost 15-12 in the fifth set to UC Irvine. In four seasons with the Trojans, he coached two All-Americans as well as six All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation honorees. Keller also helped USC sign some of the best recruiting classes in the nation during his tenure there.

In addition, Keller has worked in several capacities for USA Volleyball. In 2010 he was an assistant coach with the USA Volleyball Men's Junior National Team, guiding it to its first gold medal in USA Volleyball history. That fall, Keller helped prepare the U.S. Men's National team for the 2010 FIVB World Championship as an advance scout, developing reports for use during World League competition.

Keller, 32, also founded the Bay to Bay Volleyball Club in San Jose, Calif. which is a youth boy's volleyball club created to serve the needs of the South Bay community. He served as the chief director from 2001-06 and was heavily involved in all aspects of the organization. Bay to Bay has produced 70 varsity collegiate athletes in the past 11 years.

As a student-athlete Keller played two seasons at Loyola Marymount where he graduated in 2002 with a Bachelor's degree in Graphic Design and a minor in Marketing.



ANDREA BECKER

Assistant Coach • 1st Year
Sacramento State '01

Andrea Becker, who served as an assistant men's volleyball coach at UC Irvine in 2012 when the Anteaters marched to the NCAA championship, begins her first season as UCLA's assistant coach.

Becker, 33, is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Kinesiology at Cal State Fullerton. In assuming her new duties at UCLA, she will take a one-year sabbatical from CSUF.

In 2012, Becker helped UC Irvine capture the NCAA championship. UCI finished with a 26-5 record, won the MPSF Tournament crown and defeated top-ranked USC in three sets to capture its third NCAA championship in six years.

Becker received her PhD in Sport Studies from the University of Tennessee in 2007 where she also worked in the Volunteer athletic department providing sport psychology services to athletes, coaches and teams. In her final year at Tennessee, she was honored with the Edward A. Capen Research Award and the Extraordinary Professional Promise Award.

She received her BS (2001) and MS (2003) degrees in Kinesiology and Sport Performance from Sacramento State, where she was honored with the A.W. Hobt Teaching Award for the 2004-05 academic year.

Becker is an active member of the Association of Applied Sport Psychology and the National Assn. for the Psychology of Sport and Physical Activity. She has published her research in *The Sport Psychologist*, where she also serves on the editorial board. She is also co-author of *Focused For Fastpitch*, a softball-specific mental training book. She has written extensively about successful coaches, and coaching techniques and behaviors. In addition, she has several papers in progress, including a study of the role of optimism in coaching effectiveness.

On the public speaking circuit, Dr. Becker has given numerous lectures and scholarly presentations both locally and nationally on successful coaching methods, sport research and training, and the practice of sport and exercise psychology.

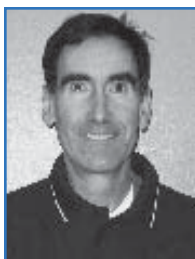
