

DAN GUERREROAthletic Director • UCLA '74 • 11th Year

In just 10 years as UCLA's Director of Athletics, Daniel G. Guerrero has boldly placed his imprint on the school's athletic program.

Guerrero, one of the most influential, respected and talented administrators in intercollegiate athletics, completed his term in 2010 as the chair of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee and was involved in the organization's negotiation of the new \$10.8 billion, 14-year NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament television package as well as the decision to expand the event to 68 teams. In addition, he served as the president of the the National Assn. of Collegiate

Directors of Athletics (NACDA) in 2011-12 and is a member of the BCS Athletic Directors Advisory Group, among several other committees.

In his first decade as AD, Guerrero has clearly established a pattern of "image and substance" that few in his profession can match. UCLA's 108 NCAA team championships ranks No.1 in the nation. In Guerrero's tenure, UCLA teams have won a nation-leading 22 NCAA team titles in 12 different sports, finished second 18 times and have recorded an additional 38 Top Five finishes. More than 80% of UCLA teams have qualified for NCAA post-season competition and the football team has appeared in eight bowl games. The program has also won 51 conference championships in 15 different sports, produced nearly 500 All-Americans and featured four Honda Award winners, including the 2003-04 Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year.

Furthermore, during the 2012 Summer Olympic Games in London, 34 Bruins participated as athletes or coaches, representing the United States and eight other nations. They won nine medals, including six gold.

This past year in NCAA competition, UCLA won its 108th NCAA title in women's volleyball, and nine teams finished among the Top 5 nationally. Men's water polo and women's tennis finished second, men's soccer, women's gymnastics, men's tennis and women's water polo captured third place, and men's golf and baseball each placed fifth. Bruin teams also won conference titles in men's soccer, women's gymnastics, baseball and men's and women's water polo. Finally, 80 student-athletes earned All-America honors and 89 were selected to various all-conference teams.

Guerrero came to UCLA in 2002 from UC Irvine, where he had served as UCI's fifth Director of Athletics for 10 years. Prior to arriving at UC Irvine, he was the Athletic Director for five years at Cal State Dominguez Hills (1988-92). He received his Bachelor's degree from UCLA in 1974 and played second base in the Bruin baseball program for four years. Originally from Tucson, AZ, he is married to the former Anne Marie Aniello and they have two daughters: Jenna and Katie.



GLENN TOTH Senior Associate Athletic Director • UCLA '76 • 35th Year

Glenn Toth, who has served the athletic department as an administrator for more than 30 years, enters his 16th year in charge of the UCLA men's and women's tennis programs. He is in his fifth year overseeing the men's volleyball team, the men's and women's cross-country teams, and the men's and women's track & field teams. In addition to his role as a sports supervisor, Toth has also seen duty as an assistant golf coach, and serves as a member of athletic director Dan Guerrero's senior staff.

A senior associate athletic director with a variety of responsibilities, Toth serves as the liaison with shoe and apparel sponsor adidas, having orchestrated both the original 1999 agreement and its renewals in 2005 and 2012. Adidas supplies all Bruin teams,

and represents the department's most lucrative sponsorship. In addition, Toth was point person on the negotiation with International Sports Properties (ISP) which now handles the department's corporate relations, media rights, program printing, web page, ad sales, and sponsor promotions.

Toth also has administrative responsibility for the athletic equipment room which designs, outfits, and maintains all of the Bruins' uniforms, practice, and playing equipment. Sporting a staff of six full-time and dozens of part-time personnel, the equipment room has significant on-site capability, including laundry, mechanical repair, and custom fitting/tailoring.

In addition, the sports medicine area/athletic training room, which provides injury evaluation, treatment, rehabilitation, therapy, and nutritional services to over 700 student-athletes falls under Toth's supervision. UCLA sports medicine has 14 full-time employees, a student trainer program, and interfaces with UCLA medical personnel and physicians. Among the features of the sports medicine complex are hydrotherapy pools, physician's exam and treatment offices, and diagnostic ultrasound capability. Toth also supervises the athletic performance area and its personnel.

Toth graduated from UCLA in 1976 with a degree in economics and was hired shortly thereafter by former athletic director J.D. Morgan to work in the events and travel office. From 1978-84, he supervised the management of home athletic events and team travel. In 1982, Toth handled the logistics of UCLA's move to the Rose Bowl and at the same time became the athletic department's first marketing director. Promoted to Associate Athletic Director in 1984, he was credited with several award-winning football marketing campaigns and the creation of the department's corporate relations program.

Toth lettered in golf at Tustin's Foothill High School where he graduated in 1972. He enjoys scuba diving, hiking, and mountaineering, and also serves as a Reserve Captain with the LA County Sheriff's Department, managing the Search and Recovery Dive Team. His golden retrievers are Misty and Dottie.

PAULEY PAVILION - HOME OF THE BRUINS

Pauley Pavilion is the home of UCLA's championship volleyball, basketball and gymnastics teams. The site of the 1984 Olympic gymnastics competition where the U.S. men's team earned a gold medal, Pauley Pavilion has been the host site for an unprecedented 13 NCAA Men's Volleyball Championships (1970, '71, '75, '77, '79, '84, '85, '87, '89, '93, '96, '99 and 2005) and will host its 14th in May 2013.

Championship history lives in this pavilion. From the rafters hang 11 NCAA championship banners won by the UCLA men's basketball teams. UCLA volleyball teams have won nine of their 19 NCAA championships here, and the men's gymnastics team won national championships in this arena in 1984 and '87. The Bruin women's volleyball team won two of its four NCAA titles on the Pauley hardwood.

In the Spring of 2004, the women's gymnastics team won its first NCAA championship in Pauley, and in April 2013, UCLA will host the Women's Gymnastics Championship.

The pavilion has hosted some of the largest collegiate volleyball crowds in history. In 1984, the men's NCAA championship match between UCLA and Pepperdine drew 9,809 fans to set a collegiate record that stood for 15 years. The 1987 NCAA championship match between the Bruins and USC Trojans attracted 8,952 spectators, third largest in NCAA history.

The 1993 NCAA final between UCLA and CS Northridge drew 8,482 fans and the 1996 final between the Bruins and Hawaii attracted 7,688 fans.

Renovation of the storied building began in the Spring of 2010 and was completed last October. Most home matches for the 2013 season will be played in the newly renovated Pauley Pavilion, unless otherwise noted.



Newly renovated Pauley Pavilion has a number of new features that enhance the fan experience: a new video board, a ribbon board, new seats, improved concessions and an increased capacity to seat nearly 14,000 spectators.
