



Adam Krikorian – Head Coach • 9th Year • UCLA ('97)



There may not be another head coach in any sport throughout the country who has accomplished more than Adam Krikorian in such a short span. In his 16 years with UCLA's water polo program as both a player and a coach, Krikorian has won an unprecedented 13 national titles – nine as a head coach, three as an assistant coach and one as a student-athlete.

This fall, Adam Krikorian enters his ninth season as head coach of the UCLA men's water polo team and his seventh season alone at the helm. In 1999 and 2000, he shared head coaching duties with Guy Baker, who now serves as head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team.

As the men's water polo head coach, Krikorian has guided UCLA to three NCAA Championships and boasts a .767 winning percentage (155-47 record). Krikorian's men's water polo teams have won 80 percent of their conference matches and have finished with a perfect 8-0 MPSF record twice (1999 and 2004).

Last season, Krikorian led the men's squad to

a third-place finish in the MPSF Tournament and a No. 3 final national ranking. For the first time in program history, the Bruins won four games against conference-rival Stanford. In the spring of 2007, Krikorian guided the women's team to its third consecutive NCAA title and UCLA's 100th NCAA team championship. The 2007 women's water polo title marked Krikorian's fourth national championship since the start of the 2004-05 school year.

That season, Krikorian led both water polo teams to national-champion status for the third time in his head coaching career. Krikorian previously led both squads to national championships in the same season in 1999-2000 and 2000-01. The 2004 men's water polo team finished with the best winning percentage of any UCLA water polo team since 1972, and the 2005 women's team completed the second undefeated season in NCAA water polo history by running off a record 33-game winning streak.

Krikorian led the men's team back to the top of the rankings in 2004. He guided the Bruins to their first perfect conference finish since 1999 and first NCAA

title since winning back-to-back championships in 1999 and 2000. The 2004 squad also rattled off an 18-game winning streak, which included capturing the NorCal Tournament title and gaining multiple victories over the nation's other three top-ranked teams - Stanford, California and USC.

In 2002, Krikorian guided a young Bruin team to a third-place finish in the MPSF Tournament and its first win over Stanford in three years. That team also claimed the Nor Cal Tournament Championship with a 6-3 victory over USC in the title game. In the spring of 2003, Krikorian led UCLA's women's water polo team to a national championship, his fifth title as a head coach.

In 2000, Krikorian led the men to their fourth NCAA title in six years and second consecutive championship. He also led the UCLA women to the inaugural NCAA championship in Baker's absence (Baker was coaching the U.S. Women's National Team). The 2001 women's squad finished the season with an 18-4 overall mark, including a 9-1 MPSF record, and won its second consecutive national championship.

Krikorian was promoted to Co-Head Coach at the start of the 1999 men's season, after serving as an assistant for three years. In the spring of 1999, he served as the interim head coach for the women's water polo team, while Baker was once again coaching the U.S. Women's National Team.

During the 1996-97 school year, Krikorian served

as a student assistant coach as he completed his undergraduate studies, assisting Baker in leading both squads to national championships.

As a senior captain in 1995, Krikorian helped lead UCLA to its first men's water polo national championship since 1972. Krikorian scored two goals in the Bruins' 10-8 win over California in the NCAA championship game. During his senior season, he registered a team-best 31 goals, including one two-pointer, while earning All-America second-team honors and All-MPSF second-team accolades.

A four-year letterman, Krikorian captained the team in 1994 and 1995, leading the Bruins to the NCAA Tournament in each of those seasons. He finished his Bruin career with 76 goals, including a pair of two-pointers. Krikorian was named "Most Inspirational Player" by his teammates in each of his last three seasons.

A standout prep athlete at Mountain View High School, Krikorian was a four-year letterman in water polo and swimming. As a senior, he scored 113 goals and earned honorable mention All-America accolades. In 1992, he helped lead his team to the National Junior Olympic championship. Krikorian's older brother, Blake, was on the UCLA water polo team from 1986-89.

Krikorian graduated from UCLA with a psychology degree and a business administration emphasis in June 1997.

Matt Flesher - Assistant Coach • 3rd Year • UCLA ('02)

Matt Flesher enters his third season serving as an assistant coach on the UCLA men's water polo staff. Flesher, a three-time All-America selection at UCLA from 1999-2002, helped guide the Bruins to a 38-14 mark in his first two years on the coaching staff.

Flesher's instruction proved vital to UCLA's offensive prowess in 2006. The Bruins averaged 10.5 goals per game, third-best in the MPSF, and featured six players who scored 20 goals or more.

In his four-year career as a Bruin, Flesher led UCLA to back-to-back national championships (1999 and 2000), was twice honored as an All-MPSF athlete and finished his collegiate career with 81 goals scored.

Prior to returning to Westwood in 2005, Flesher kept busy playing water polo abroad. He spent three seasons as a full-time member of the U.S. National Team in 2002, 2003 and 2005 and competed for professional Greek team Ethnikos-Pireaus in 2003 and 2004.

Flesher also served as an assistant coach at Corona Del Mar High School in

2004 and helped lead the SeaKings to a CIF Division I semifinal appearance.

While with the National Team, Flesher competed in the World University Games in 2003 and helped guide the United States to its qualification for the Water Polo World Championships in 2005.

Flesher enjoyed his finest playing season at UCLA as a sophomore in 2000, tallying a career-high 32 goals while adding 14 assists and 16 steals. During that campaign, which earned Flesher honorable mention All-America status, he helped lead UCLA to its second consecutive national title. One of that season's defining moments emerged with Flesher scoring the game-

winning goal against California in the MPSF Tournament title game.

In 1999 as a newcomer to Westwood, Flesher added eight goals to UCLA's 22-3 national championship team. Flesher earned third-team All-America status as a junior in 2001 after scoring 24 goals, good for third on the squad.

As a senior in 2002, Flesher was again awarded third-team All-America honors after notching 17 goals and serving as UCLA's emotional leader and co-captain. His most noted offensive performance of that season came in the third-place match of the MPSF Tournament, when he led all scorers with three goals to send UCLA past



top-ranked Stanford.

Flesher was awarded UCLA's Jack Bariteau "Most Inspirational Player" Award following the 2002 season. He earned his degree in political science from UCLA in 2002.

Flesher was born on April 28, 1980 in Lakewood, Calif.

Brandon Brooks - Assistant Coach • 3rd Year • UCLA ('05)

Brandon Brooks enters his third season as an assistant coach on the water polo staff. As an assistant coach, Brooks focuses his efforts on the development of goalkeepers and oversees their conditioning and strength training program.

Brooks joined the water polo staff as a full-time assistant coach in the summer of 2006 after assisting head coach Adam Krikorian as an undergraduate assistant coach in 2004. That season, Brooks helped lead the Bruins to their eighth national championship.

In 2006, Brooks' instruction proved valuable as freshman goalkeeper Chay Lapin earned second-team All-MPSF honors. Lapin finished the season as UCLA's primary goalkeeper, posting a 4.87 goals against average and totaling 110 saves in 15 games. The Bruins' goalkeeping unit tallied the second-lowest goals against average (5.70) in the MPSF.

Brooks, a four-time All-America selection at UCLA and a former Olympic goalkeeper, helped lead the Bruins to national titles in 1999 and 2000 as UCLA's goalkeeper, all while becom-

ing UCLA's all-time saves leader with 700 stops.

In the summer of 2004, Brooks and former UCLA teammates Adam Wright and Brett Ormsby competed for Team USA in the Olympic Games in Athens, Greece. One year earlier, the Honolulu, Hawaii, native provided stellar defense as goalkeeper for the U.S. National Team at the FINA World Championships in Barcelona, Spain.

Following the 2003 World Championships, Brooks manned the net at the Pan-American Games, where Team USA took the gold medal and ultimately qualified for the 2004 Olympics.

As a student-athlete at UCLA, Brooks led the Bruins to consecutive national championships in his first

two seasons. As a freshman in 1999, Brooks totaled 100 saves in 51.75 quarters. His 5.60 goals against average that season ranks second all-time in the school's record books. As a sophomore, he recorded 208 saves in 95 quarters and posted a school-best 4.80 goals against average, a mark which still ranks first today.

Coming off back-to-back national championships at the start of the 2001 season, Brooks led UCLA to a 16-5 mark as a junior, totaling 165 saves in 78 quarters. As a senior in 2002, he made 227 saves in 79 quarters and recorded a 6.46 goals against average. The All-America selection guided the Bruins to a third-place finish in the MPSF Tournament. He also earned first-team



All-MPSF accolades in 2002.

Brooks graduated from UCLA with a degree in sociology in 2005.

The oldest of three children, Brooks has 21 year-old twin sisters (Nicole and Jessica). He was born on April 29, 1981.
