

NO. 1 USC EDGES NO. 2 UCLA, 9-8, TO WIN SOCAL TOURNAMENT TITLE

The Trojans held off a late Bruins' rally to earn first place

LOS ANGELES – The No. 1 USC men's water polo team won its eighth consecutive SoCal Tournament crown with a 9-8 win over crosstown rival No. 2 UCLA at Spieker Aquatics Center on Sunday evening. Freshman Nikola Vavic and sophomore Tobias Preuss led the Trojans with two goals apiece. Vavic registered the gamewinning goal with 35 seconds left, snapping an 8-8 tie. USC led the contest by three goals, 7-4, with 5:48 to play in the game before UCLA charged back, tying the contest at 8-8 on a goal from sophomore Josh Samuels with 50 seconds remaining in the final quarter. Junior goalie Joel Dennerley registered 15 saves in goal for USC (15-0). Freshman Cristiano Mirarchi led host UCLA (8-2) with three goals. Freshman goalkeeper James Hartshorne recorded 10 stops in the cage for the Bruins.
