Triple Threat Back for More—UCLA returns one of the finest backcourts in the nation with its Big Three of juniors **Nikki Blue** and **Lisa Willis** and sophomore **Noelle Quinn**, who combined to average 45.4 points, 18.7 rebounds, 8.4 steals, 10.2 assists a game in 2003-04 as the Bruins posted a 17-13 record and a third place (tied) finish in the Pacific-10 Conference ... The threesome finished the year with each player ranked amongst the Top 10 scorers in the Pac-10 conference (No. 6 Quinn-15.9, No. 7 Blue-15.2, No. 10 Willis-14.3) ... The trio also ranked amongst the Top 5 in the league in steals (No. 1 Willis-3.3, No. 2 Blue-2.9, No. 4 Quinn-2.2) ... In addition, they each ranked amongst the Top 15 in the conference in rebounding (No. 6 Quinn-7.7, No. 12 Blue-5.6, No. 15 Willis-5.4).

Incoming Recruits — Head coach Kathy Olivier signed two standouts for the 2004-05 season. **Lauren Pedersen**, a 5-10 guard from Brea-Olinda, CA High School, averaged 14.7 points per game last season. She helped lead her team to the CIF-Southern Section II-A championship and the Division II Southern California Regional semifinals. **Lindsey Pluimer**, a 6-3 forward from San Clemente, CA High School, averaged 23.9 points, 9.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game last season. She was named a McDonald's All-American and played in the annual All-Star game. Pluimer was also selected the CIF-SS Division I-A Player of the Year for the third consecutive season. She was invited to the U.S. Women's Junior National team trials this summer.

Nikki Blue — Finished last season by scoring an NCAA-tournament school record total of 33 points against Minnesota ... Her two-year scoring average of 15.9 points per game ranks as the eighth-best ever a UCLA ... Selected to back-to-back Pac-10 All-Tournament teams ... Two-time first-team All-Pac-10 pick ... Her season total of 148 assists last year tied for seventh on the all-time school list ... Her total of 89 steals was the seventh-best in school history and ranked her 28th in the nation in steals per game (3.0) ... She finished

the year ranked among the conference leaders in steals-2nd (2.97), assists-3rd (4.93), scoring-7th (15.2) and rebounding-12th (5.6) ... Had 12 games when she totaled at least 14 points and five assists ... Averaged 6.4 assists per game over the last 10 contests of the regular season.

Noelle Quinn — The Pac-10 Freshman of the Year averaged 20.5 points and 9.1 rebounds per game over the last 11 contests of the season while shooting 87% from the free throw line ... On Feb. 19 at Cal, she became the first Bruin to record a triple-double (21 points, 10 rebounds, 10 assists) since Erica Gomez in the 1995-96 season ... Her 21 points in that contest gave her six-straight games with 20 or more points to set a school freshman record (Ann Meyers held the old mark at four) ... The last Bruin with more than five straight 20+ point games was Natalie Williams with eight in 1992-93 ... Quinn scored 31 points vs. Arizona on Feb. 12, the fourth-best freshman total in school history ... She connected on 30 straight free throws during the season to fall just shy of the school and Pac-10 record (32 by Michelle Greco in 2002-03 is school record; 33 is Pac-10 mark) ... Named Pac-10 Player of the Week twice during the month of February ... Scored in double digits in the final 21 games of the year and led the team with 24 double digit games on the season ... Led the team with eight double-doubles.

Lisa Willis — Averaged 16.1 points per game over the last 11 contests of the season ... Led the Pac-10 Conference and ranked 11th in the nation in steals (3.3) per game ... Set a school single-season record for three-point shots made with 70 and moved into second place on the school career list with 116 treys ... Her total of 100 steals, a sophomore record, tied for the third-highest total in UCLA history ... The 100 steals also tied for the third-most ever by a Pac-10 conference player ... Her two-year three-point shooting percentage total of .359 is the fifth-best of all-time at the school ... Scored a career-best 31 points at California and recorded eight steals (tied for eighth-best all-time at UCLA) ... Had 13 games last season when she totaled at least 15 points and five rebounds ... Made at least three treys in 11 contests last season ... Totaled at least four steals in 11 games a year ago.

Team Headlines — The Bruins went 17-13 overall last season and return seven players who saw action in at least 18 games each, including five with starting experience from a year ago ... UCLA won seven of its last eight conference games to finish in a tie for third in the Pac-10 with an 11-7 mark (its highest conference finish since winning the Pac-10 title in 1998-99) ... The team advanced to the NCAA tournament for the eighth time overall last season and the first time since the 2000 tournament ... UCLA's defense allowed 63.8 points per game in 03-04 to rank as the third-lowest mark in school history and the lowest since the 1976-77 season (59.7) ... The Bruins ranked tied for seventh nationally in steals (12.3), and the total of 369 steals ranked as the eighth-best total in school history ... Opponents scored 60 points or less in 13 games, and the Bruins gave up more than 66 points in regulation just seven times ... The opponent shooting percentage of .410 ranked as the fifth-lowest in school history ... The team finished the season outrebounding 14 of the last 21 opponents ... The total of 150 made three-point shots was the most in school history ... UCLA led the Pac-10 in steals and turnover margin ... Over the last 11 games, the team shot 81% from the free throw line ... The season free throw percentage of .707 ranks as the fifth-best in school history ... The 11 home wins marked the most since the 1998-99 team won 13 ... The 8,094 fans attending the USC game marked the second-highest total attendance ever at a regular season Bruin contest.

Individual Headlines — Noelle Quinn and Nikki Blue each earned first-team all-conference honors ... Quinn became just the third Bruin freshman to be named first-team all-conference (joining Maylana Martin in 1996-97 and Nikki Blue in 2002-03) and only the eighth in conference history ... Quinn was also named Conference Freshman of the Year, becoming the fourth Bruin to earn the honor (Maylana Martin-1997, Erica Gomez-1996, Molly Tideback -1989) ... Lisa Willis, the only Bruin to start all 30 games, earned honorable mention all-conference honors in her first season as a starter.

Pitts' Rehab on Track for Return in Fall — Forward Julia Pitts has been rehabbing her injured knee and is on schedule to return to the court in time for the start of practice in

October. Pitts suffered a torn meniscus in her left knee last season and had surgery on Feb. 12, 2004. She is expected to make a full recovery. Pitts played in 18 games last season and started nine times.

Bruins Sign Top Recruiting Class — Head coach Kathy Olivier signed two standouts for the 2004-05 season - **Lauren Pedersen**, a 5-10 guard from Brea-Olinda High School, averaged 14.7 points per game last season. Her team won the Century League with a perfect 10-0 mark and finished with a 26-5 overall record. She scored a high of 27 points versus Canyon High School and had a team-high 15 in a win over San Clemente High. Pedersen helped lead her team to the CIF-Southern Section II-A championship and the Division II Southern California Regional semifinals. She was selected the CIF-SS II-A Player of the Year, the MVP of the Century League and to the All-Orange County team the past three seasons. As a junior, she averaged 13.9 points, 5.2 assists, 4.6 steals and 4.0 rebounds per contest. She was ranked by one publication as one of the top 60 recruits in the nation.

Coach Olivier says --- "Lauren has a great knowledge and sense of the game and uses it to excel. She anticipates well and is a serious scoring threat from the perimeter. She will play the one or two guard position for us."

Lindsey Pluimer, a 6-3 forward from San Clemente, CA High School, averaged 23.9 points, 9.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game last season. Her team won the South Coast League with a 10-0 mark and posted a 23-5 overall record. She scored at least 20 points in 20 games as a senior, including a school record total of 42 in a game against Canyon Springs. Pluimer set school records for career scoring (2,584 points), single-season scoring (764), most rebounds in a season (364), most blocks in a season (136) and highest scoring average. She was named a McDonald's All-American and played in the annual All-Star game. Pluimer was also selected the CIF-SS Division I-A Player of the Year for the third consecutive season. She was a fourth-team Parade Magazine All-America pick. This summer, she was selected to tryout for the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Team Trials. As a junior, she averaged 22 points, 10 rebounds and four blocked shots per game. She was considered by some publications to be among the top 35 recruits in the nation.

Coach Olivier says --- "Lindsey has played against a high level of competition for a long time. I expect that she will be ready to step in and contribute right away at a forward position. Lindsey can score down low and from the perimeter. Her long arms are a great asset on defense."

"We are very excited to add this pair of highly skilled recruits to our group of returning players. We competed with many of the other top programs across the country and came out on top. Each of these players will be able to make their mark individually and with the team."

Quoting Coach Olivier on the Bruin Team —

"The excitement from our finish to last season has not gone away," said UCLA head coach Kathy Olivier. "We jelled as a team about midway through last season and came on strong during the final 10 games to secure an NCAA bid. It was fun to watch the team grow comfortable with their roles last season and start to enjoy consistent success. Now we feel there is an excellent opportunity to build on it and have a really special season in 2004-05."

"This team will have as much athletic talent as we have ever had in my time at UCLA and also has experience on its side. We will miss the leadership and production of Jamila Veasley, Whitney Jones and Gennifer Arranaga, but we add a couple of outstanding recruits. The two newcomers come from highly successful programs and will fit in nicely with our veterans. In addition, we expect Julia Pitts to return to health and give us a lift on the inside."

"I am counting on the junior class, as a whole, to provide points, defense and leadership once again this season. They gained a lot from their successes of last year. Lisa Willis stepped it up in a big way, both offensively and defensively. Nikki Blue proved last season that she is a complete player who can lead a team in any number of ways. Noelle Quinn became one of the steadiest, spectacular freshmen in Bruin history and provided leadership beyond her years."

"Once again we are playing a high-quality pre-season schedule which includes games with Texas, Purdue, Illinois, Ohio State and a trip to the Miami, FL tournament. There is no better way to help prepare for what I see as one of the most competitive Pac-10 races in years. The conference tournament should once again be one of the most exciting events in the nation."

KATHY OLIVIER

HEAD COACH • 12TH YEAR (19TH OVERALL AT UCLA) • UNLV ('82)

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Only conference coach to have three first-team All-Pac-10 Conference performers as freshmen
- Led UCLA to its first-ever Pac-10 Championship in 1999
- Guided UCLA to three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances (1998-00) for the first time in school history

- Produced two Pac-10 Players of the Year in Maylana Martin (1999) and Natalie Williams (1994)
- Produced three Pac-10 Freshmen of the Year in Quinn (2004), Martin (1997) and Erica Gomez (1996)

- Only the second UCLA coach to earn 100 career victories with a win over San Diego State in 1999

Set to begin her 12th season as UCLA head coach, Kathy Olivier has steadily built the program to reflect her own positive, upbeat and outgoing personality. The 2004-05 outlook seems bright indeed with the return of three starters, including all-conference honorees Nikki Blue, Lisa Willis and Noelle Quinn and another outstanding recruiting class.

Olivier was named head coach of the Bruins on May 3, 1993. In the 2000 season, she became the first coach in school history to lead a team to three-straight NCAA tournament appearances and also became just the second coach at UCLA and the 11th coach in the Pac-10 to earn victory number 100, which came on Dec. 9, 1999 against San Diego State. The former standout player at Cal State Fullerton and UNLV has posted a record of 165-152 in her 11 seasons to date.

In 2004, Olivier led the Bruins to a third-place conference finish and into the NCAA tournament. The team boasted the Pac-10 freshman of the Year in Noelle Quinn and a pair of all-conference performers in Nikki Blue and Quinn. Lisa Willis earned honorable mention all-conference accolades after leading the conference in steals. The Bruin team surrendered just 63.8 points per game, the third-lowest opponent scoring mark in school history.

Olivier led the 2003 Bruins to 12 conference wins, a total surpassed by only two other seasons in UCLA history. The 12 victories included five road wins, a total bettered by only one other conference school. By winning 18 games overall, Olivier guided the Bruins to a nine-game improvement over the previous season. The team set a school record for free throw shooting with a .716 mark. Blue became the seventh freshman player in conference history to be named to the first-team all-league team.

In 2002, Olivier guided a Bruin team which lost its top two returning scorers during the season to nine wins and a first round Pac-10 tournament victory. In 2001, she guided a team, which was playing without eight of its top nine scorers from the previous season, to a winning home record in Pac-10 play and wins over three nationally-ranked teams. In 2000, she saw her team reach the NCAA tournament for a school record third-straight season. The squad also set a Bruin home attendance record by averaging over

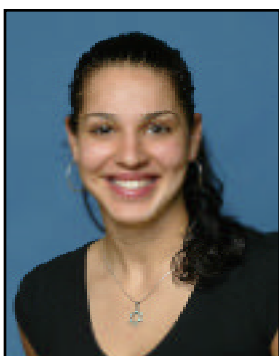
3,700 fans. Under Olivier's guidance, Maylana Martin became just the third player to ever earn All-Pac-10 honors in four-straight seasons.

In 1999, she led her Bruin team to the school's first ever Pac-10 Conference title and to a best-ever Elite Eight finish in the NCAA Tournament. The team totaled the most wins (26) since the 1981 season and advanced further in the NCAA tournament (Regional final) than any previous UCLA team. The team put together back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 1970's. In addition, the 1999 Bruin team finished with its highest ranking ever (No. 7) in the USA Today poll. Additionally, Martin became the Pac-10 Player of the Year, and she, Erica Gomez and LaCresha Flannigan each earned first-team all-conference honors. In 1998, she guided UCLA to what was then its best finish ever (tie for second) in the Pac-10, its best winning percentage in the last 17 seasons and the first 20-win season since 1992. In Olivier's first season as head coach in 1993-94, Natalie Williams earned Pac-10 Player of the Year honors.

Olivier originally joined the UCLA staff in the summer of 1986. In her seven seasons as an assistant, the team enjoyed five winning seasons and reached the NCAA Tournament in two of the final four years. In 1991-92, the Bruins compiled a record of 21-10 and reached the NCAA Sweet 16.

Olivier began her coaching career at her alma mater, UNLV, as a graduate assistant in 1981-82. Following one season at UC Irvine (1982-83), she was hired at USC and was on the Trojan staff for three years (1983-84 through 1985-86) as an assistant. USC, led by sophomore Cheryl Miller, won the NCAA title in Olivier's first year (1984) and reached the championship game in her third season (1986).

The former Kathy Ricks, Olivier was a standout player at Cal State Fullerton and then at UNLV. As a freshman (1977-78) at CSUF, she averaged 15.6 points and 9.2 rebounds and raised her scoring average to 19.3 as a sophomore. As a junior (1979-80) at UNLV, she earned All-America honors while averaging a team-high 16.3 points and 5.7 rebounds. In her final year (1980-81), she led the Rebels in scoring (20.2) and ranked second in rebounding (9.2).
