

NOTES FROM THE 2005-2006 SEASON

BRUINS ADVANCE TO NCAA PLAY

UCLA rebounded from a 7-6 overall and 2-2 conference start to the season to post a 14-5 record to close out the year. The Bruins went 10-4 down the stretch in Pac-10 play and followed it up with three straight wins to win the conference tournament and earn an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. It was UCLA's ninth NCAA appearance.

UCLA was seeded fifth in the Cleveland, OH Regional and began play against 21st-ranked Bowling Green in a first round game played at Purdue. The Bruins snapped a 19-game Falcon winning streak with a 74-61 win behind 23 points and 12 rebounds from Lisa Willis and 21 points from Noelle Quinn. Purdue, the host team which was ranked 11th in the polls, knocked the Bruins out of the tournament with a 61-54 decision in second round play.

PAC-10 TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

UCLA captured its first Pac-10 Conference Tournament Championship with wins on consecutive days over three NCAA Tournament-bound teams. In doing so, UCLA earned a second win during the season against California, Arizona State and Stanford. In the case of the pair of wins over the Cardinal, it marked UCLA's first two-win season over Stanford since the 1987-88 campaign, which was the last time a Pac-10 team handed the Cardinal more than one loss in a season. The wins earned the Bruins the conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Lisa Willis was named the Most Valuable Player of the Pac-10 Tournament after she totaled 14 points and seven steals against Cal, 27 points and six steals against ASU and 20 points and six steals against Stanford. Nikki Blue, who was selected for the fourth-straight year, and Noelle Quinn joined Willis on the all-tournament squad.

BY THE NUMBERS

UCLA, at 21-11, posted at least 21 wins in a season for the third time since the 1980-81 team won 29 games. Its home court winning percentage of .833 (10-2) ranked as the best since the 1980-81 team achieved a .833 mark (15-2). The 12 conference wins (12-6) tied for the third-most in school history. The total of 2,475 points ranked as the sixth-most points scored by a Bruin team in school history. The 45.5% shooting percentage mark was the 10th highest in school annals and the third-best mark since 1983-84. The Bruins set a school record with 161 made three-point shots during the course of the season. The 36.6% three-point shooting percentage was the second-best in school history. The total of 1,266 rebounds ranked as the 10th highest on the all-time school list. The 555 assists was the sixth-best school total for a season. The 94 blocked shots ranked third-best in school history.

The 580 points scored by Noelle Quinn were the most by a Bruin player since Rehema Stephens scored 595 in the 1992 season. Lisa Willis completed her career with an 115-steal, 100-assist season. She ranks first on the all-time Pac-10 steals list (372) and second on the all-time Conference three-point shots made list (256). At UCLA, she finished ninth on the scoring list (1,677-21st in Pac-10 history), 12th on the rebounding list (645), first on the made three-point shot list (256) and second on the steals list. Nikki Blue became just the second

Bruin player to reach the 600 mark for assists, ending her career at 602 and in second on the all-time school list. Blue ranked fifth on the UCLA scoring list (1,797/ 18th in Pac-10 history), 14th in rebounding (616) and third in steals (325).

Head coach Kathy Olivier also passed a milestone, earning her 200th career win at UCLA in the Pac-10 Tournament semifinal victory over ASU.

BRUINS HIT THE BOOKS

Noelle Quinn and Lindsey Pluimer were selected to the CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District 8 women's basketball team. Quinn, who holds a 3.26 GPA in Sociology, was selected to the first team. Pluimer, a 3.67 student, received third-team honors.

THE TRIPLE THREAT

The Bruin triple threat of Lisa Willis, Nikki Blue and Noelle Quinn combined to average 48.4 points, 18.7 rebounds, 7.2 steals and

12.8 assists per game in 2005-06. Quinn and Willis each finished among the top 10 in the Pac-10 in scoring (No. 3 Quinn and No. 4 Willis). Quinn also ranked second in rebounding, fourth in assists, second in assist/turnover ratio, second in defensive rebounding and third in minutes played. Willis also ranked first in steals (third straight season), ninth in assists, sixth in three-point shots made, eighth in assist/turnover ratio, eighth in three-point shooting percentage and seventh in minutes played. Blue led the Pac-10 in assists and was fifth in steals, fourth in assist/turnover ratio, fourth in three-point field goal percentage and ninth in minutes played.

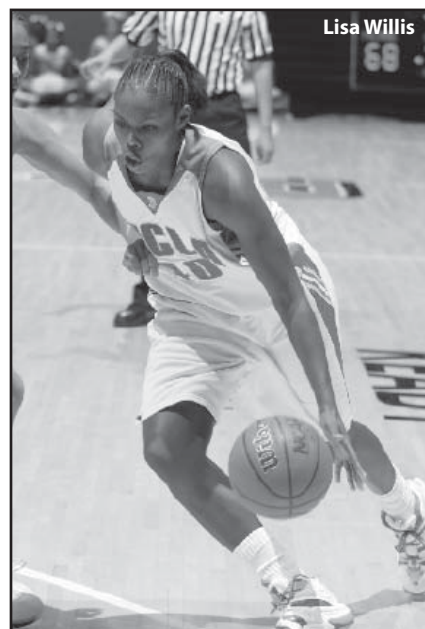
CHARTING THE BRUINS

Blue's assist average of 5.91 per game ranked 12th in the nation. She became the first Bruin to ever lead the Pac-10 in assists. Willis' 3.60 steals/g mark ranked sixth in the NCAA. She became the first Bruin to record three straight seasons with 100 or more steals.

The team finished seventh in the country in scoring (77.3), 18th in the nation in field goal percentage (.455), eighth in assists (17.34) and 26th in three-point shooting (.366).

PLAYER HONORS

Nikki Blue, Lisa Willis and Noelle Quinn were each selected to the AP honorable mention All-America team and to the Region 8 Kodak/WBCA All-America team. The threesome was also selected to the first team all-conference squad by the vote of the coaches (Bruins to earn multiple first-team All-Pac-10 honors — Maylana Martin (four times), Nikki Blue (four times), Rehema Stephens and Natalie Williams (three times), Noelle Quinn, Lisa Willis, Dora Dome and Erica Gomez (twice).

2006 PAC-10 TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

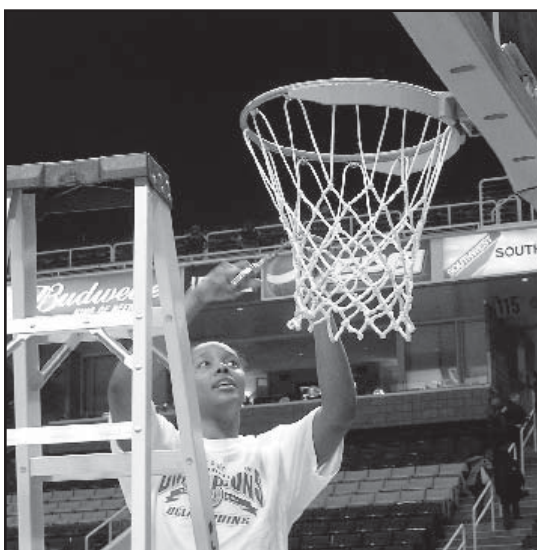
Led by the Triple Threat of Nikki Blue, Noelle Quinn and Lisa Willis, the Bruins entered the 2006 State Farm Pac-10 Tournament as the third seeded team and proceeded to knock off California (#6 seed), Arizona State (#2) and Stanford (#1) on consecutive days in the HP Pavilion in San Jose, CA to win the school's first-ever conference tournament championship.

Willis was named the Most Valuable Player of the Tournament after averaging 20.3 points per game over the three days. Blue, who set a tournament record with 11 assists in the win over Cal, was named to the All-Tournament team for the fourth consecutive season, becoming the first Pac-10 player to accomplish this feat. Quinn, who led the Bruins with 22 points in the championship win over Stanford, was also selected to the All-Tournament Team.

Blue handed out a tournament record 11 assists and scored 14 points to help the Bruins past Cal in a quarterfinal round game, 80-63. Quinn paced the team with 18 points and 10 rebounds. Willis added 14 points and seven steals.

Willis poured in 27 points to help lead the Bruins past Arizona State in the semifinal round of the tournament. Quinn recorded another double-double with 16 points and 10 boards. UCLA got off to a slow start in the game and trailed, 28-19, at the half. The second half saw seven ties and 11 lead changes. A pair of free throws by Quinn with 29 seconds on the clock proved to be the difference in the contest.

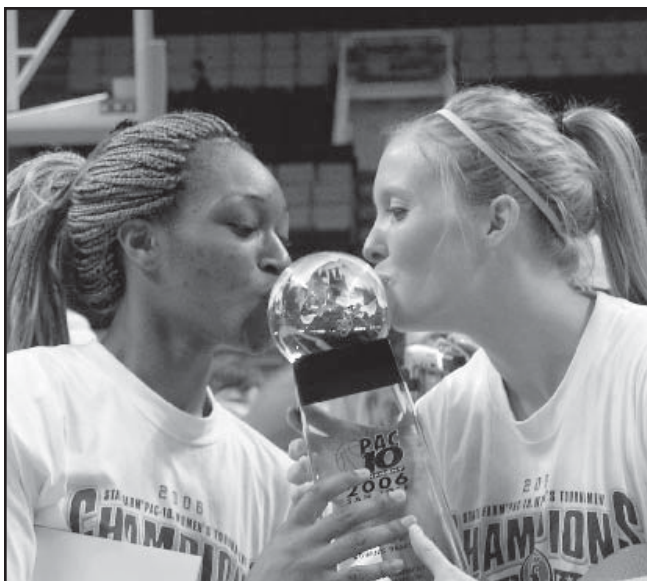
Quinn had the answer again in the championship game against Stanford. UCLA trailed by as many as 13 points in the second half of the game and by seven points, 70-63, with 1:29 to play. The Bruins scored the final seven points in regulation time with a basket by Quinn with seven seconds to play knotting the score at 70. A three-point shot by Lindsey Pluimer pushed the Bruins into a 73-72 lead in overtime they would not give up. Two big free throws by Chinyere Ibekwe with 28 seconds to play in overtime gave UCLA an 80-76 advantage. UCLA hits five of six free throws down the stretch while holding Stanford without a basket to earn its first conference tournament championship. Quinn finished with 22 points and eight rebounds. Willis added 20 points, four assists and six steals. Pluimer contributed 16, and Nikki Blue had 14 points, eight assists and six steals.

GAME 1 — Nov. 18, 2005 WACO, TX

UCLA dropped its opening game at Baylor despite 22 points from Lisa Willis and 20 from Noelle Quinn. Baylor led for almost the entire game, but not by more than six points in the first half. The Lady Bears opened up the first double digit lead of the game with 5:03 remaining in the second half, at 79-69, and built it up to as many as 14, 88-74, with 2:20 to play. UCLA battled back to close the gap to 92-85 on a three-point shot by Willis with 15 seconds remaining. UCLA then stole the ball in the backcourt, but a Tierra Henderson three-point attempt did not fall, and UCLA was forced to foul.
