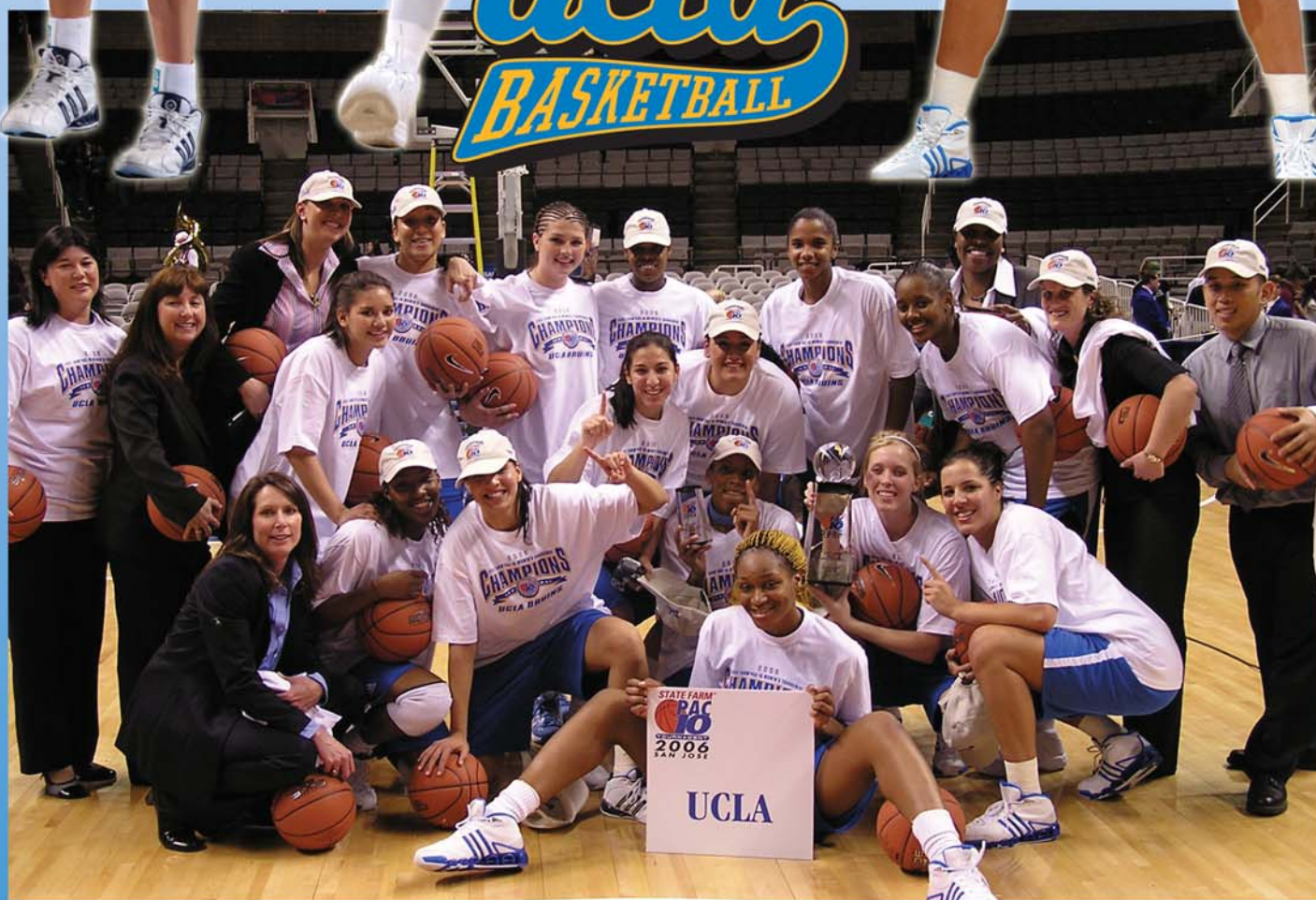

**Bruins Return Eight for 2006-07**— Coach Kathy Olivier welcomes back eight returning letter-winners for the 2006-07 season. Headlining the list is senior guard Noelle Quinn, an honorable mention AP All-American and the leading returning scorer and rebounder (18.1/8.2) on last year's team. Two other starters are slated to return--- 6-4 junior forward Lindsey Pluimer (10.6/5.4) and 6-1 senior forward Amanda Livingston (5.7/2.4). Also expected back are guards Shaina Zaidi (senior- 1.3/0.3), Tierra Henderson (sophomore - 1.1/1.4) and frontcourt players forward Julia Pitts (senior - 0.5/1.1), forward/center Consuelo Lezcano (senior - 1.8/0.7) and center Chinyere Ibekwe (sophomore - 5.0/3.8).

The Bruins add four recruits signed in the 2005-06 early period to that list including 6-6 center Moniquee Alexander of the Edison Academic Center at IMG Academy in Bradenton, FL, guard/forward Amy Horton of Harlison County HS in Tallapoosa, GA, guard/forward Erica Latimer of Windward HS in Los Angeles and guard Jerica Williams of Mt. Miguel HS in the San Diego area. Two additional newcomers, Alexis Olivier (Los Alamitos HS) and Allison Taka (Culver City HS), will also join the team this Fall.

**Challenging Schedule Set for 2006-07** — The Bruins could see action against as many as 10 teams which were in the NCAA Tournament a year ago (Tennessee, Baylor, Oklahoma, California, USC, Washington, Stanford, Arizona State, New Mexico, North Carolina) in the 2006-07 season. UCLA will play at Tennessee on November 16. It will mark the first meeting with the Lady Vols since the 1999-2000 season. Big XII teams from Oklahoma and Baylor come to Pauley Pavilion on November 21 and December 17, respectively. The Bruins could meet North Carolina and New Mexico in Holiday tournament action.

**What's Returning for 2006-07** — The Bruins return 60% of games started (96/160), 54% of their points scored (1,347/2,475), 63% of the rebounds (704/1,113), 38% of the assists (208/555) and 37% of the steals (125/334) from the 2005-06 season.

**Quinn Named To Wade Watch List** — Senior guard Noelle Quinn is amongst 25 players named to the preseason "Wade Watch" list for The State Farm Wade Trophy NCAA Division I Player of the Year for the 2006-07 season. Quinn was an AP and WBCA/Kodak honorable mention All-American a year ago after averaging a team-best and career-high 18.1 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. During the last 16 games of the season, she averaged 20.5 points and 8.9 rebounds while shooting 53.2%



from the field. She finished the year ranked third in the Pac-10 in scoring, second in rebounding and fourth in assists (3.84) and earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors for the second time in her career. The 2004 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year has earned Pac-10 Player of the Week honors a Pac-10 record-tying eight times in her career. Quinn was also a first-team CoSIDA Academic All-District first-team honoree in 2005-06 and was a two-time Pac-10 All-Academic selection. For her career, she averages 17.1 points, 7.8 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.1 steals per game.

**Bruin Pac-10 Notes** — With its third place conference finish in 2006, the Bruins earned their sixth top-four conference finish in the last nine seasons. Only Stanford, with nine top-four finishes, has achieved a higher level of success in that period. Arizona, Arizona State and Oregon are next with five such finishes each.

Noelle Quinn earned three Conference Player of the Week awards in the 2006 season, upping her career total to eight. That mark ties her for the all-time lead in the Pac-10 with Tanja Kostic (1993-96) of Oregon State, Lisa Leslie (1991-94) of USC, Cherie Nelson (1987-89) of USC and Natalie Williams (1991-94) of UCLA.

UCLA's win over Stanford in the 2006 Pac-10 Tournament marked its second win of the season over the Cardinal. It was the first time a Stanford team has lost to a conference opponent twice in the same season since the Bruins won a pair of matchups in the 1987-88 season.

Noelle Quinn averaged a career-best 18.1 points per game in the 2005-06 season and owns a 17.1 points per game mark for her career. She finished the season ranked third in Pac-10 scoring (18.1), second in rebounding (8.2) and fourth in assists (3.84). She completed her junior season with 1,280 career points. Quinn scored 20 points or more in 10 of the last 16 games of the 2005-06 season and averaged 20.5 points (328) and 8.9 rebounds (142) while shooting 53.2% (134-252) from the field in those final 16 games. She had seven double-doubles in that span and the team won 12 of those last 16 games. Her total of 580 points in 2006 were the most by a Bruin since Rehema Stephens scored 595 in the 1992 season.

**Quinn, Pluimer Earn Academic All-District Honors** — Noelle Quinn and Lindsey Pluimer were selected to the CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District 8 women's basketball team. Quinn, who holds a 3.26 GPA in Sociology, was selected to the first team and was eligible for the national Academic All-American ballot. Pluimer, a 3.67 student, received third-team honors and was one of just two underclassmen selected to the All-District 8 teams. Each also earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors, with Pluimer making the first team and Quinn the honorable mention squad.

**Quinn One of Eight To Average 18/8** — Noelle Quinn's scoring and rebounding averages of 18.1 points and 8.2 rebounds per game placed her among the Bruin elite. She is one of just eight Bruins to have averaged at least 18 points and eight rebounds in a season. The other eight include Denise Curry (four times, 1978-1981), Natalie Williams (three times, 1992-94), Ann Meyers (two times, 1978 & 1975), Maylana Martin (one time, 1999), Rehema Stephens (one time, 1991), Dora Dome (one time, 1988), Necie Thompson (one time, 1982).

**Bruins Win Pac-10 Tournament, Earn Automatic Bid to NCAA Tournament** — The Bruins (third place Pac-10 regular season finisher) earned the Pac-10 Conference's automatic bid to the 2006 NCAA tournament with an 85-76 overtime win over Stanford in the title game of the State Farm Pac-10 Tournament on March 6. UCLA swept past California, Arizona State and Stanford on consecutive days in the State Farm Pac-10 Tournament played in San Jose, CA. UCLA earned a second win in the season series over all three teams during the conference tournament and headed to the NCAA Tournament for the ninth time. The win over Stanford marked the first time the Bruins had dealt the Cardinal a second loss in a season since the 1987-88 campaign.

Lisa Willis was named the Most Valuable Player in the Tournament. Nikki Blue was selected to the All-Tournament team for the fourth straight year, a feat never before accomplished by a Pac-10 player. Noelle Quinn joined them on the All-Tournament team and set a tournament record with 23 field goals.

**2006 Season Ends in NCAA 2nd Round Loss At Purdue** — UCLA finished the 2005-06 regular season by winning nine of its last 10 games, including three straight in the Pac-10 Tournament to take home the conference tournament title.

The Bruins were selected as the #5 seed in the Cleveland, OH Regional in the NCAA Tournament. UCLA defeated 23rd-ranked (AP)/21st-ranked (USA Today/ESPN) Bowling Green State University (#12 seed, champion of the Mid-American Conference) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament by a score of 74-61. UCLA dropped a 61-54 decision at #4 seed and 11th-ranked Purdue in second round play in West Lafayette, IN.

**Bruins Ranked in Both Polls to End 2005-06** — UCLA finished the 2006 season ranked in both major polls for the first time since 1998-99. The Bruins held down the 18th spot in the ESPN / USA Today poll and were ranked 21st in the Associated Press listing.

### Bruin Players Move Up School Charts —

• With 1,280 career points, Noelle Quinn moved up to No. 13 on UCLA's all-time scoring list

• Noelle Quinn became the eighth Bruin to record a season in which she averaged at least 18 points and eight rebounds per game.

• Nikki Blue became only the seventh UCLA woman to score over 1,700 career points (1,797), the second to record 600 assists (602) and the third to reach 300 steals (325)

• Blue moved into 18th on the all-time Pac-10 scoring list and finished in fifth place on UCLA's all-time scoring list with 1,797 points

• Lisa Willis' 10th point at home versus USC moved her into the all-time Bruins top 10 in scoring, and she finished with 1,677 points, good for ninth place

**Triple Threat Earn Honors** — Nikki Blue, Lisa Willis and Noelle Quinn each earned Associated Press honorable mention All-America and first-team All-Pac-10 honors. Blue became the fifth player in Pac-10 history to earn four first-team All-Pac-10 selections, joining Lisa Leslie of USC, Tanja Kostic of Oregon State, Nicole Powell of Stanford and fellow Bruin Maylana Martin. It was the second first-team selection for both Willis and Quinn.

**Olivier Gets Career Win #200** — Head coach Kathy Olivier earned her 200th career victory with a 60-59 win over Arizona State in the semifinals of the Pac-10 Tournament. In 13 seasons at UCLA, she holds a 202-175 record. Olivier is just the fourth head coach to win 200 games at a Pac-10 school, joining Tara VanDerveer (Stanford), Chris Gobrecht (Washington/USC) and Joan Bonvicini (Arizona).

## KATHY OLIVIER

HEAD COACH • 14TH YEAR (21ST OVERALL AT UCLA) • UNLV ('82)

Set to begin her 14th season as UCLA head coach, Kathy Olivier has energized the program. The former standout player at Cal State Fullerton and UNLV has produced two Pac-10 Players of the Year, three Pac-10 Freshman Players of the Year, a Pac-10 team championship and a Pac-10 Tournament championship. She is the only current Pac-10 coach to have as many as three freshmen named first-team All-Conference performers. Over the last nine years, her teams have finished in the top four of the Pac-10 standings six times, a total bettered by only one other conference institution during that period. From 1998-2000, she guided UCLA to a school-best three straight NCAA tournament appearances and had the Bruins back in the NCAA Tournament again in 2006.

Interest in UCLA women's basketball has taken off to new levels under Olivier. The only six regular season crowds in Bruin history of over 7,000 fans have come out to support UCLA during her tenure. In fact, the top 13 regular season crowds in school history have come with Olivier at the helm.

Recognized as an excellent recruiter, she has steadily built the program to reflect her own positive, upbeat and outgoing personality. Olivier has posted a 202-175 overall mark which includes six top-four Pac-10 finishes in the last nine years. Her teams may favor a running game on offense, but defense is another Olivier strong point. Six of the all-time school top 10 marks for lowest opponent field goal percentages belong to Olivier-coached squads.

In 2006, the Bruins finished the season strong while posting a 21-11 record and earned a third-place finish in the Pac-10. With wins over Cal, Arizona State and Stanford on consecutive days, UCLA captured its first Pac-10 Tournament title and the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Nikki Blue became just the fifth four-time, first-team All-Pac-10 selection and was joined on the first-team by Lisa Willis and Noelle Quinn. Blue became the first Bruin player to lead the Pac-10 in assists while Willis, the Pac-10 Tournament MVP, led the league in steals for the third straight season. Quinn ranked second in the Pac-10 in rebounding and third in scoring. The team's 10-2 record in Pauley Pavilion (.833) was the highest home court winning percentage posted by a Bruin team since the 1980-81 squad went 15-2 (.882).

In 2005, Blue earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors for the third straight year and was joined on the first team by Willis. However, the Bruins lost leading scorer and rebounder Quinn to a knee injury with 12 games to play and finished sixth in the conference. Quinn earned honorable mention all-conference honors, and Lindsey Pluimer was named to the all-conference freshman team. The team set a school record for free throw shooting percentage and allowed opponents the fourth-lowest shooting percentage in school history.

In 2004, Olivier led the Bruins to a third-place conference finish and into the NCAA tournament. The team boasted the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year in Quinn and a pair of all-conference performers in Blue and Quinn. The Bruin team surrendered just 63.8 points per game, the third-lowest in school history.

Olivier led the 2003 Bruins to 12 conference wins, a total surpassed by only two other seasons in UCLA history. By winning 18 games overall, Olivier guided the Bruins to a nine-game improvement over the previous season. Blue became the seventh freshman player in conference history to be named first-team all-league.

In 2002, Olivier guided a Bruin team which lost its top two returning scorers during the season to nine wins and a first round Pac-10 tournament victory. In 2001, she guided a team, which was playing without eight of its top nine scorers from the previous season, to a winning home record in Pac-10 play and wins over three nationally-ranked teams. In 2000, she saw her team reach the NCAA tournament for a school record third-straight season. The squad also set a Bruin home attendance record by averaging over 3,700 fans. Under Olivier's guidance, Maylana Martin became just the third player in conference history to ever earn first-team All-Pac-10 honors in four-straight seasons.

In 1999, she led her Bruin team to the school's first-ever Pac-10 Conference title and to a best-ever Elite Eight finish in the NCAA Tournament. The team totaled the most wins (26) since the 1981 season and advanced further in the NCAA tournament (Regional final) than any previous UCLA team. The team put together back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 1970's. In addition, the 1999 Bruin team finished with its highest ranking ever (No. 7) in the *USA Today* poll. Additionally, Martin was named Pac-10 Player of the Year, and she, Erica Gomez and LaCresha Flannigan each earned first-team all-conference honors. In 1998, she guided UCLA to what was then its best finish ever (tie for second) in the Pac-10, its best winning percentage in the last 17 seasons and the first 20-win season since 1992. In Olivier's first season as head coach in 1993-94, Natalie Williams earned Pac-10 Player of the Year honors.

Olivier originally joined the UCLA staff in the summer of 1986 as an assistant coach. Olivier began her coaching career at UNLV as a graduate assistant in 1981-82. Following one season at UC Irvine (1982-83), she was hired at USC and was on the Trojan staff for three years (1983-84 through 1985-86) as an assistant. USC, led by sophomore Cheryl Miller, won the NCAA title in Olivier's first year (1984) and reached the championship game in her third season (1986).

The former Kathy Ricks, Olivier was a standout player at Cal State Fullerton and then at UNLV. As a freshman (1977-78) at CSUF, she averaged 15.6 points and 9.2 rebounds and raised her scoring average to 19.3 as a sophomore. As a junior (1979-80) at UNLV, she earned All-America honors while averaging a team-high 16.3 points and 5.7 rebounds. In her final year (1980-81), she led the Rebels in scoring (20.2) and ranked second in rebounding (9.2).
