Quinn Racks Up Honors

Noelle Quinn, who was selected by the Minnesota Lynx with the fourth pick of the 2007 WNBA draft, was up for nearly every national collegiate award in 2006-07. She was named one of 12 finalists for the Wade Trophy as the National Player of the Year. She was a Naismith Award finalist, appeared on the Wooden Award watch list, and was a nominee for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, which is presented annually to a NCAA Division I male and female senior basketball player who excels both on and off the court.

The Los Angeles native was also named to Street and Smith's magazine's "Terrific 10" list as one of the Top 10 players in the country. She was listed by ESPN.com as one of the top 5 players in the nation at the wing position. Quinn earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors for the third time in her career. On Jan. 30, 2007, she became the first Bishop Montgomery HS student-athlete ever to have her jersey retired by the school.

Quinn First to 1700/700/400

With her first basket in the Feb. 10 game at USC, senior guard Noelle Quinn became the first Bruin in history to total 1,700 points, 700 rebounds and 400 assists for a career. She finished her Bruin career with 1,829 points, 794 rebounds and 450 assists and came up just short of becoming only the second player in Pac-10 history (joining Stanford's Nicole Powell) to reach 1,800 points, 800 rebounds and 400 assists.

Quinn joined Denise Curry, Natalie Williams and Maylana Martin as the only Bruins to have totaled at least 1,700 points and 700 rebounds for a career.

Pluimer Joins 1,000 Point Club

Lindsey Pluimer became the 23rd player in UCLA women's basketball history to reach the 1,000-point plateau during the game at Oregon on Feb. 23. She also recorded the 500th rebound of her career in the same contest. Pluimer completed her junior season with 1,118 points (20th all-time at UCLA) and 537 rebounds.

Livingston Shoots Up the Lists

Forward Amanda Livingston made huge improvements in both field goal and free throw shooting during her senior season. She upped her career field goal % from .472 to .478, which left her just shy of the all-time Bruin

top 10 list. Her career free throw % jumped from .618 to .708 after shooting a season mark of .819. Her mark of .819 fell just short of ranking as the 10th-best mark ever by a Bruin player and ranked her fourth in the Pac-10 conference.

Bruins Hit the Books

Noelle Quinn and Lindsey Pluimer were selected to the CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District 8 women's basketball team. Pluimer, a 3.68 student in the Communications Studies major, earned second-team acclaim after receiving third-team honors the previous season. Quinn, who held a 3.21 GPA in Sociology, was named to the third-team.

Both were also selected to the Pac-10 All-Academic Team. Pluimer was a first-team selection, while Quinn and Shaina Zaidi were honorable mention picks.

By the Numbers

With 90 team blocked shots, the Bruins matched the fifth-best total in school history. The Bruin free throw percentage of .680 (three starters shot at least .800) ranked as the 10th-best season mark in school history. The team three-point shooting % of .359 ranked as the third-best mark in school single season history. The total of 131 made three-point shots was the fifth highest.

Noelle Quinn finished her career ranked fourth on the all-time scoring list with 1,829 points and eighth on the rebounding list with a total of 794 rebounds. She also ranked seventh in assists (450), tied for seventh in three-point shots made (81), third in double-digit scoring games (96), fifth in 20-point scoring games (38), third in field goals attempted (1,649), fifth in field goals made (713), ninth in free throws made (322), eighth in three-point field goals attempted (240), ninth in free throws attempted (426), 10th in rebounds average (7.4), 10th in free throw % (.756), sixth in scoring average (17.1). Her total of 184 assists last year was the fourth-best in school history. Quinn finished her career 15th on the all-time Pac-10 scoring list.

Shaina Zaidi's three-point mark of .404 (38-94) tied for the fifth-best mark in school history. Lindsey Pluimer moved up to eighth on the all-time blocked shot list (60). Pluimer's career free throw % (.798) ranks fourth on the school list. Amanda Livingston completed her

career having played in 121 games, which ties for the third-most in school history.

Pac-10 Rankings

Quinn ranked fifth in the league in scoring (17.2) and 12th in rebounding (6.6). She was second in the Pac-10 in assists (5.75), seventh in free throw % (.805), fifth in three-point % (.381), seventh in assist-turnover ratio (1.45), tied for fourth in defensive rebounds (5.59) and third in minutes played (36.56).

Pluimer ranked ninth in the league in scoring (15.5), 16th in rebounding (5.7), 10th in field goal % (.488), fifth in free throw % (.817), 10th in blocked shots (0.84), ninth in offensive rebounds (2.44) and sixth in minutes played (35.81).

Shaina Zaidi ranked ninth in the league in three-point shots made (1.23) and third in the league in three-point % (.404).

Chinyere Ibeke ranked 11th in rebounding (6.6), eighth in field goal % (.503) and sixth in offensive rebounds (2.78).

Tierra Henderson ranked fourth in the league in steals (2.09). Amanda Livingston ranked fourth in free throw % (.819).

The Bruin team finished second in the conference in three-point shooting % (.359) and third in rebounding offense (40.1). UCLA rated third-best in the league in rebounding margin (+4.6), assists (14.16), defensive rebounds (25.34).

In the Nation

Quinn's assist average of 5.75 per game ranked 15th in the nation.

Class Rank

Quinn's total of 184 assists last season was the second-most ever by a senior. Her 549 points ranked tied for sixth.

Ibeke's 212 rebounds ranked as the eighth-best mark by a Bruin sophomore. Her total of 24 blocked shots ranked fifth on the list.

Pluimer's 495 points ranked seventh on the junior list while her 27 blocks were tied for fourth.

Henderson's 67 steals ranked eighth on the all-time sophomore class list.
