

Follow the Bruins on the Air

Head Coach Nikki Caldwell and her UCLA women's basketball team will be featured throughout the season on the UCLA "Bruin Talk" Cable Television Show. "Bruin Talk", which was taped for years at Time Warner Cable in Santa Monica, has moved to the UCLA campus for the first time and is taped at UCLA Res TV in De Neve. The program, which is hosted by Dave Marcus and Shopa Joshpi, airs weekly from Ventura County to the San Diego area. The show also airs throughout the San Fernando Valley, into the South Bay and parts of Orange County and in Los Angeles on Channel 36. On campus, it airs on a daily basis in the UCLA residence halls.

Fox Sports Net has developed a 17-game regular season Pac-10 schedule which will be shown, live or delayed, in a minimum of 30 million homes. Fox Sports Net has confirmed a live telecast of UCLA's home games vs. Kansas and USC, and the away game against Stanford. Cable station LA Channel 36 will also broadcast selected home games on a delayed basis.

UCLA will also have all games broadcast by the Bruin radio network and on the Internet (www.uclabruins.com). In addition, am570 and Sirius satellite radio will broadcast selected games. All post-season games will be broadcast as well.

This is the 31st straight year that UCLA women's athletics events have been broadcast on commercial radio, longer than any other program in the West. Local broadcasters Dave Marcus, Michael Sondheimer and Tracy Murray will call the action.

Photography

Television and photo credentials entitle video and still photographers to shoot from designated areas along the baselines behind each basket. Photographers will not be permitted to shoot from the stands or near the team bench areas.

Interview Policies

Player telephone numbers are private and will not be released. Please do not expect players to be available if you have not made prior arrangements.

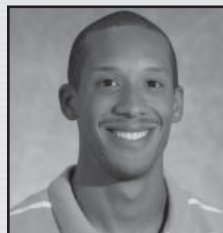

Administrator Biographies



Dr. Gene Block

Chancellor • Stanford '70 • 2nd Year

Dr. Gene Block became chancellor of UCLA in summer 2007, taking the helm of a world-class institution comprising 37,000 students and 27,000 faculty and staff, with an annual budget of \$3.6 billion. As chief executive officer, he oversees all aspects of the university's three-part mission of education, research and service.

Previously, Dr. Block served as vice president and provost of the University of Virginia, where he also held the Alumni Council Thomas Jefferson Professorship in Biology. With academic expertise in biological clocks, he conducts research on the neurobiology of circadian rhythms in higher organisms, leading a research lab funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). From 1991 to 2002, he directed the National Science Foundation's Science and Technology Center for Biological Timing. In 1997, he was named a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He has invented a number of devices and holds a patent for a non-contact respiratory monitor for the prevention of Sudden

Infant Death Syndrome.

Dr. Block joined the faculty of the University of Virginia in 1978 as an assistant professor of biology. He served as vice provost for research from 1993 to 1998 and then as vice president for research and public service until his appointment as vice president and provost in 2001. He also headed an NIH graduate training program aimed at increasing the number of scientists from underrepresented groups. In 1998, he received the Commonwealth of Virginia's Outstanding Public Service Award for his work with Virginia's business community.

A native of Monticello, NY, Dr. Block holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Stanford University and a master's and Ph.D. in psychology from the University of Oregon. He also completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Stanford, working with the late Colin Pittendrigh, "the father of biological timing" and distinguished biologist and former Stanford President, Donald Kennedy. Dr. Block and his wife, Carol, have two adult children.



Dan Guerrero

Athletic Director • UCLA '74 • 7th Year

On April 25, 2002, Daniel G. Guerrero was named UCLA's eighth Director of Athletics, succeeding the retiring Peter Dalis. A former Bruin baseball player, Guerrero, who assumed his duties on July 1, 2002, exudes the pride of a student-athlete who is now calling the shots at his alma mater.

Guerrero, one of the most respected and talented administrators in intercollegiate athletics, has placed his mark on the program as the director of athletics at UCLA. He is currently serving as the chair of the NCAA's Division I Men's Basketball Academic Enhancement Group. He is also a member of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee. In addition, he is the third vice-president of NACDA, serves on the NACDA Executive Committee and is also on the executive board of the Division I Athletic Directors Association. In June of 2007, he was named NACDA Division I West Region Athletic Director of the Year.

In his first six years, Guerrero has clearly established a pattern of "image and substance" that few in his profession can match. UCLA stands as the No. 1 University in the nation for NCAA Team Championships (103) won, a number that continues to grow under his direction. In those six years, UCLA teams have won 17 NCAA national team championships (the highest total in the nation in that span) in 11 different sports, finished second 13 times and have had an additional 22 Top Five finishes. A staggering 113 teams (of 138 possible) have qualified for NCAA post-season competition, and the football team has appeared in six bowl games. The program has also won 37 conference championships in 15 different sports, produced 338 All-Americans and featured four Honda Award winners, including the 2003-04 Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year.

In the last six years, UCLA has finished second three times (2007-08, 2006-07, 2005-06), third twice (2004-05, 2003-04) and sixth (2002-03) in the race for the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) Director's Cup. Only two schools (UCLA and Stanford) have made the top six in each of the past six years, representative of UCLA's place among the nation's elite.

Guerrero came to UCLA in 2002 from UC Irvine, where he had served as UCI's fifth Director of Athletics for 10 years. Prior to arriving at UC Irvine, he was the Athletic Director for five years at Cal State Dominguez Hills (1988-92). He received his Bachelor's degree from UCLA in 1974 and played second base in the Bruin baseball program for four years. Guerrero was inducted into the UCLA Baseball Hall of Fame in 1996. Petrina Long enters her fifth year as senior associate athletic director/senior women's administrator at UCLA, having joined the staff in June of 2004. Long has oversight responsibility for several sports, including women's basketball, women's volleyball, softball and gymnastics, as well as several administrative areas, among them academic services, compliance, equity issues, and governmental relations.

Long came to UCLA from UC Irvine, where she had served as senior associate athletic director/senior women's administrator since 1993, working closely with Bruin athletic director Dan Guerrero. She also served as interim athletic director following Guerrero's departure to UCLA.
