## NO. 22/23 BRUINS AT NCAA TOURNEY

Coach Nikki Caldwell's No.22 UCLA Bruins (24-8), winners of 10 of the last 11 games, were selected as the #8 seed in the Kansas City Region and will play the #9 seed North Carolina State (20-13, tied for fifth in the ACC) in the first round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament. The first/second round games will be held at the University of Minnesota's Williams Arena in Minneapolis, MN.

The game will tip-off at approximately 8:30 p.m. CT/6:30 PT and will be broadcast live on ESPN2. The winner will advance to play the winner of the Nebraska (#1 seed, 30-1) and Northern Iowa (#16 seed, 17-15) contest on Tuesday night at 8:30 p.m. CT/6:30 PT. Nebraska and Northern Iowa start off the Sunday first-round doubleheader and will tip-off at 6:06 CT/4:06 PT. The UCLA-NC State battle will tip 30 minutes following the end of the first game.

The Bruins, who have no current players with NCAA post-season experience, enter the tournament for the first time since the 2005-06 season, when they were the #5 seed in the Cleveland, OH Regional.

Coach Caldwell has plenty of NCAA experience, having been a player at Tennessee and an assistant coach at both Virginia and Tennessee. She owns three NCAA championship rings. Caldwell was a member of Tennessee's 1991 National Championship squad. She was also an assistant coach on the 2007 and 2008 Tennessee Lady Vol National Championship teams.

This will be UCLA's 10th overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Bruins have posted a record of 8-9 in tournament action.

The Bruins completed the regular season with a 70-46 loss to No. 2 Stanford in the championship game of the Pac-10 Conference Tournament. That setback snapped a string of 10 straight wins. In fact, second-ranked Stanford is the only team to defeat the Bruins (Feb. 4, March 14) since mid-January.

**TV/Radio Notes** — All games of the NCAA Tournament in which the Bruins participate will be radio broadcast live on the internet at www.uclabruins.com. Dave Marcus, Tracy Murray and Michael Sondheimer will be on hand to call the tournament action. ESPN is providing television coverage (ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN Full Court) of all 63 games in the 2010 NCAA women's basketball tournament.

## THE VOTES ARE IN - RANKED BRUINS

The Bruins have received votes in the two major Top-25 polls in each of the last four weeks of the regular season. UCLA was tabbed as the No. 22 team in the ESPN/ USA Today Coaches Poll for the week of March 15 and is listed at No. 23 in the most recent AP poll. This is UCLA's first listing in the AP poll since it was ranked No. 21 in Nov. of 2006.

## PAC-10 POST-SEASON HONORS

**Nikki Caldwell** was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year by both the coaches and the media, becoming the first UCLA women's coach ever to win this award. **Doreena Campbell** and **Jasmine Dixon** were chosen to the 15-member All-Pac-10 team, while Markel Walker was an honorable mention selection. Walker was also named to the All-Freshman first team and to the honorable mention All-Defensive team. The Pac-10 media selected Dixon and Walker to the All-Pac-10 team and Walker to the All-Freshman team.

## UCLA FINISHES 2ND IN PAC-10

UCLA finished in second-place in the Pac-10 regular season standings and earned the #2 seed into the conference tournament. The #2 seed was UCLA's highest ever for the tournament, which began in 2001-02. The Bruins won the Pac-10 Tournament, once before, in the 2005-06 season.

The second-place finish is UCLA's best since it captured a share of first-place in the 1998-99 season,

which is the Bruins' lone Pac-10 title. UCLA has finished second (tied) in the Pac-10 conference, once before, in 1997-98.

## STRONG PAC-10 PERFORMANCE

UCLA's 15-3 record in conference play matches its best performance ever in the Pac-10. The 1998-99 team captured a share of first place with a 15-3 finish.

The Bruins won eight out of nine conference games in the second-half of Pac-10 play. It is the most wins ever by a Bruin team down the stretch in the Pac-10. UCLA had won as many as seven Pac-10 second-half games on three previous occasions, each with a 7-2 record, and all three helped put them into the NCAA Tournament (2005-06, 2003-04, 1997-98).

The Bruins' 7-2 first half Pac-10 start was the team's best since it began the 1999-00 conference season with six consecutive wins and also finished with a 7-2 mark. In 1998-99, UCLA opened with nine straight wins in Pac-10 play. The Bruins have had only three previous Pac-10 first half results with seven or more wins (7-2 in 1999-00; 9-0 in 1998-99; 7-2 in 1997-98) NOTE -- first Pac-10 season was 1986-87.

## UCLA'S NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

This is the 10th overall NCAA Tournament appearance for the Bruins and the first since the 2006 tournament. UCLA's all-time NCAA Tournament record is 8-9 (3-1 at home; 2-5 away; 3-3 at neutral sites).

Coach Caldwell will be coaching her first game in the NCAA Tournament. However, she has played in the NCAA Tournament and been an assistant coach on Virginia and Tennessee teams which have played in the Tournament. The 2007 and 2008 Tennessee team captured back-to-back NCAA championships with Caldwell on staff. She was a player on the 1991 Tennessee team which won the NCAA title.

## ABOUT THE OPPONENTS

**North Carolina State (20-13)---** NC State leads the series by a 5-1 count. The 'Pack won the last meeting, 58-55, in a game that was played in Pauley Pavilion on Nov. 25, 1994. Common Oppt.--NC State won at USC, in December, 59-53.

**Nebraska (30-1)---** The Bruins lead the series with the 'Huskers by a 4-0 count. The last meeting came in Honolulu, HI, on Nov. 27, 1998, an 85-67 Bruin win. Common Oppt.--Nebraska defeated Washington St. (107-54), St. Mary's (84-73), Texas Tech (89-47), Kansas (67-60 / 77-52).

**Northern Iowa (17-15)---** The Bruins have never met NIU, which won the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament with a 54-53 win over Creighton. Common Oppt. -- NIU lost to Illinois State twice in the regular season (70-64 and (69-66), before topping them in the conf. tournament (61-59).

## VS. THE NCAA FIELD

UCLA posted a 1-4 record this season against teams in the 2010 NCAA Tournament. It faced two of the number one seeds in Stanford (0-3) and Tennessee (0-1), as well as #11 seed Princeton (1-0).

## SEVEN IN TOP 50 IN NCAA STATS

The Bruin team began the week listed in the Top 58 of the latest NCAA national rankings (from Mar. 14) in seven categories - 17th in rebound margin (6.5), 24th in steals/g (10.8), 31st in field goal% (43.7), 33rd in scoring defense (56.8), 35th in scoring margin (10.7), 47th in turnover margin (2.91), 50th in fg% defense (36.7). ## THIS AND THAT...

The Bruins are 17-0 this season when scoring at least 64 points and have won their last 20 straight games under **Coach Nikki Caldwell** when hitting the 64-point mark ... UCLA is 20-5 since transfer **Jasmine Dixon** made her UCLA debut on Dec. 15... Dixon has scored in double digits in the last 10 games and 21 games overall ... The Bruins have shot **better than 50%** in 10 games this season, all wins ... The Bruin 10-game win streak was its longest since the 1998-99 team captured 10 straight ... The Bruins are **33-3** in the Caldwell era in games in which they have held an opponent to 60 points or less ... UCLA has never finished with more than **15 Pac-10 conference wins**---1998-99 (also 15-T1st) when Maylana Martin was the leading scorer... UCLA has finished with **20 wins** or more in five seasons since Pac-10 play began in 1986-87--- 2009-10, 2005-06 (21), 1998-99 (26), 1997-98 (20), 1991-92 (21) and have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of those seasons --- note: UCLA also had 20-win seasons in 1984-85 (20), 1980-81 (29), 1978-79 (24), 1977-78 (27), 1976-77 (20) ... **Nikki Caldwell** is the first UCLA coach to be named Conference Coach of the Year since Billie Moore earned WCAA Coach of the Year honors in 1984-85.

## DEFENSIVE DANDIES

The Bruins have held opponents in 28 of 32 games to 70 points or less, 27 opponents to 65 points or less and 22 to 60 points or less. UCLA held eight straight opponents to less than 60 points earlier this season, one shy of the school record stretch of nine set in the 1974-75 season.

In addition, none of the Bruins' last 36 opponents has shot better than 50% from the field. Opponents are shooting .367 on the year. Twenty-one opponents have shot less than 40% this season and just two have shot over 44% (Stanford, 50%, at UW 46%). Opponents are scoring 56.8 ppg. Both opponent marks - shooting % and scoring defense - approach or would set the school record totals of .355 in 1976-77 for shooting % and 59.7 ppg in 1976-77.

The 21.7 fg% shot by Cal (2/6) was an opponent season-low and the fourth time this season the Bruins have held an opponent to less than 30% shooting (at Cal, at WSU, Cal, Utah).

In Coach Caldwell's two seasons at the helm, her Bruin teams have held 36 opponents to 60 points or less, 12 opponents to 50 points or less and four to 40 points or less. UCLA has held two opponents to sub-40 scoring games this season - Cal with 32 and Utah with 33.

## 2010 RECRUITING CLASS

Head coach Nikki Caldwell announced three November, 2009 signings --- **Rhema Gardner** of Ayala High School, Chino Hills, CA; **Thea Lemberger** of Santa Monica, CA High School; **Corinne Costa** of Liberty High School in Discovery Bay, CA.

Gardner, the younger sister of Bruin sophomore Rebekah Gardner, is a 6-1 guard/forward who averaged 12.9 points, 11.1 rebounds and 3.5 blocks last season as junior. She was named All-CIF Southern Section and second-team All-State, junior class. Lemberger, a 5-6 point guard, averaged 16.5 points, 3.7 assists and 2.3 steals per game as prep junior. Her team advanced to the CIF Division 4 semifinals last season and won its first-ever CIF title this year. She connected on 57 of her 142 three-point shots attempts. Costa, a 6-4 post player, averaged 14.2 points, 4.8 blocks and 8.8 rebounds per game last season.

## HEAD COACH NIKKI CALDWELL

Nikki Caldwell was named the 2010 Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year in a vote of both the league coaches and of the national and conference media. Recognized as one of nation's top assistant coaches during stints at the University of Tennessee and at the University of Virginia, Caldwell is in her second year as head coach at UCLA. This season, she has guided her Bruin team into the NCAA Tournament after a second-place conference finish and a 20-win season. It is the school's third conference finish of second-place or higher and fifth 20-win season since beginning Pac-10 play 1986-87. UCLA, 15-3 in Pac-10 play, has finished with more than 14 conference wins in just one other season.

In 2008-09, her first Bruin team checked in with a 19-12 record and tied for fourth in the Pac-10. In addition, for the first time since the 1986-87 season, the Bruins won as many as nine pre-season, non-conference games.

In her 14 seasons as a collegiate player and assistant coach, her teams compiled an amazing 404-76 record and appeared in the NCAA Tournament in each season, while winning three NCAA Championships. Caldwell, the fifth women's basketball coach in UCLA history, played for and coached alongside legendary Pat Summitt at the University of Tennessee for all but three of those 14 seasons. She came to UCLA in April of 2008 after being on staff at Tennessee for the previous six seasons, the last two of which produced National Championships.

The 37-year old Caldwell helped the Lady Vols capture a second-straight NCAA championship in 2008. National Player of the Year Candace Parker, the No. 1 selection in the '08 WNBA draft, led a group of five Lady Vols to be drafted into the WNBA.

Caldwell joined the Tennessee staff for the 2002-03 season and became the recruiting director in spring 2003. In the fall of 2003, the Tennessee staff signed perhaps the most prolific freshman class in the history of women's collegiate basketball. For the 2004-05 season, Tennessee welcomed six 2004 high school All-Americans, including three Players of the Year. In 2007, the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) named Tennessee as the best recruiting school in the nation. In 2008, three of the top-15 high school seniors (hoopgurlz.com) in the country committed to play for the Lady Vols and five played in the McDonald's All-American Game.

Prior to her return as a coach at her alma mater, Caldwell served as an assistant at the University of Virginia for three seasons (2000-2002). She was responsible for recruiting, scouting, film exchange, player development, camps and monitoring academic progress of the student-athletes. UVA compiled a record of 60-36 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of her three seasons. She helped to develop standout Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) players Telisha Quarles at guard and forward Brandi Teamer, the 2002 ACC Rookie of the Year.

A guard during her playing days at Tennessee (1991-94) when the Lady Vols put together a 118-13 record, Caldwell was known for her tough defense and three-point shooting. She still ranks among the all-time top 10 at Tennessee in three-point field goals made (128) and attempted (364). She scored 20 points in her first collegiate game against Stanford and went on to be named to the Southeastern Conference's (SEC) All-Freshman team. In the 1991 NCAA title game victory over Virginia, Caldwell's defense was considered a key in UT's overtime win.

Caldwell received the Gloria Ray Leadership Award in both her junior and senior seasons at Tennessee. After graduating with a degree in public relations in 1994, Caldwell moved behind the microphone as a color analyst on Tennessee games for Fox Sports Net South. She went on to become the color analyst for the SEC's Game of the Week from 1995-97. Her television exposure opened the door for her to become the hostess of the sports segments for the Knoxville, TN-based television show, Shop at Home (1997-98). She then decided to return to her first love, coaching, in 1998 when she became a graduate assistant for administration on the Lady Vols women's basketball staff. During the 1998-99 season, Tennessee went 31-3 and captured the SEC regular season and SEC Tournament titles. Caldwell was responsible for assisting the coaching staff in all aspects of basketball operations.

A native of Oak Ridge, TN, Caldwell is single.

UCLA converted all eight free throw attempts in the final minute of play to seal a 70-61 win over Arizona. After the Wildcats jumped out to an early lead, the Bruins managed to close out the first half on a 16-4 run to take a 37-33 edge at the break. UCLA grew the lead to as much as 12 points in the second half. Senior Erica Tukiainen topped the Bruins with 20 points, including six free throws in the final minute of action on Senior Day.

## UCLA still has some Madness left

LOS ANGELES -- Every year during this stretch of March, four things happen, or well, don't happen:

- 1. Millions become so consumed with following the NCAA men's basketball tournament they forget to eat.
- 2. People watch their picks with more care that they mind their children around the knife set.
- 3. Work productivity declines to the crawl seen before the advent of Facebook.
- 4. Hardly anyone watches the NCAA women's tournament. Unless you have played in the tournament. Or know somebody in the tournament. Or you don't get CBS.

But this year there's reason to give women's hoops -- or as some have called it, "the femme cagers," -- a glimpse on Sunday when the

No. 23 UCLA women begin trying to shake up the tournament.

Perhaps you can have the 6:30 p.m. game on ESPN2 or ESPNU while you are updating your men's bracket. Perhaps you might consider caring just enough to watch athletes who mostly graduate and play the fundamental style of basketball that predates the men's above-the-rim track event.

It could be like trying sushi for the first time. Who knows? You might like it.

The UCLA men aren't dancing for the first time since 2004. But the rebuilt Bruin women (24-8) are in as an at-large selection, seeded eighth in the Kansas City Region. These Bruins make their 10th tournament appearance but only their first since 2006 and only their fifth since the program's best-ever tournament run to the Elite Eight in 1999.

The women, who face ninth-seeded North Carolina State (20-13), should go farther than the second round that the Bruin men reached last season. The Bruin women made it to the second round in 2006 but were one-and-done in 2000 and 2004. This season may not end with net trimming or new jewelry but it marks a turning point to the winning direction thanks largely to fresh, talented legs and the drill-sergeant tactics of a second-year coach.

Jasmine Dixon, who was an All-America player at Long Beach Poly, transferred to UCLA this season from powerhouse Rutgers to become the Bruins' best player. The All-Pac-10 sophomore forward is listed at 6 feet, 1 inch -- a height that her Poly coach Carl Buggs believes "had to come in heels and while standing on a big book."

"You can't tell on the court because she plays like she's 6-4 inside," said Buggs, recalling the best player he coached in 11 seasons. "Jasmine is the player who changed our program and carried it to the next level, got us over the hump of where we were just competing for titles to where we were winning three CIF state championships."

Only in basketball can a single superbly skilled player change the fortunes of a team. And Dixon has elevated the Bruins by averaging team-highs of 15.3 points per game on 54.3 percent shooting and 8.0 rebounds. She has also chipped in nine blocks and 59 steals in her 25 games – all starts – since finishing her transfer penalty and regaining her eligibility.

She's Xena-strong enough to play bumper pool with post players inside. But she's also speedy with "Dancing with the Stars"-worthy feet that enable her to jet outside like a guard to hit jumpers and retreat quickly on defense. With Dixon in the lineup, the Bruins are 20-5.

"I like that I'm making a difference but I came here because I already knew that UCLA was a team on the rise," Dixon said. "I knew coach was onto something."

Junior Doreena Campbell also earned All-Pac-10 honors. Markel Walker, who ranked second on the team in scoring (10.8 ppg) and rebounds (7.4) was an honorable mention selection and named to the All-Freshman team. The team has everything except a player with NCAA postseason experience.

That's OK. Coach Nikki Caldwell has enough for everyone, which is why Bruin athletic director Dan Guerrero plucked her from the Pat Summit's braintrust at eight-time national champion Tennessee. Caldwell was an assistant on the Lady Vols' 2007 and 2008 title teams and played on Summit's 1991 championship squad.

Caldwell, the Bruins' first-ever Pac-10 Coach of the Year and a contender for national coaching honors, took a defibrillator to the program the moment she arrived two years ago as a rookie head coach. ESPN women's college basketball analyst Doris Burke openly rooted for Caldwell during Monday's women's selection show and called the Bruins "a team to look out for."

If only we could do the same.

She whipped a staggering Bruin program into the victory column (43-20 in two seasons), into the nation's Top 25 and into that worth-worrying-about realm that frightens opponents. Hey, the UCLA women were mentioned on national television and called "dangerous."

Their first-round game again North Carolina State is considered Sunday's best contest. Both teams lost in their league championship games but stomped upon a lot of opponents on their ways there. The Bruins fired off 10 consecutive victories before falling to Stanford, the top seed in the Sacramento Region, in the Pac-10 tournament final. The Wolfpack, who reached the Sweet Sixteen in 2007, had won seven of nine games before losing to Duke in the ACC title game.

A curious subplot will be seeing Caldwell coach against Kellie (Jody) Harper, who won three titles as a Lady Vol (1996, 1997, 1998) and had Caldwell as a graduate assistant during her 1999 senior season.

So there's plenty of drama to see in this Bruin basketball climb. All of that should make watching them, even it's during the commercials for the men's games, worthwhile.

## UCLA women's basketball coach Nikki Caldwell earns her title as Pac-10 Coach of the Year

It was the 2005-2006 season.

The UCLA women's basketball team, after concluding the regular season with a record of 17-10, entered the Pac-10 tournament as the No. 3 seed. Needless to say, the only way that the Bruins could count on an NCAA tournament berth would be to win the Pac-10 tournament.

After defeating sixth-ranked Cal, and pulling out a one-point victory over second-seeded Arizona State, UCLA was set for a showdown with No. 1-seeded Stanford, their NCAA tournament hopes on the line. And in overtime, UCLA upset the Cardinal, granting themselves a ticket to March Madness, where they were knocked out in the second round.

---

That was 2006. And since then,  
UCLA has sniffed the Big Dance  
but has not heard its name called on that fateful Selection Monday.

But between that 2005-2006 season and now, something special happened to the UCLA women's basketball program ... something that can be described in one word.

Nikki.

After Kathy Oliver, who had coached the Bruins for 15 years, decided to resign in 2008, UCLA went recruiting. And where better to look than Tennessee, the most famous women's basketball program in the nation, where Nikki Caldwell, a former national champion as a player at Tennessee and as a coach, just happened to be ready to run her own show.

Upon Caldwell's hiring at UCLA, the almighty Pat Summitt, who has coached Tennessee women's basketball to eight national championships and is the all-time winningest coach in college basketball history, men or women, had this to say:

"Tennessee's loss is going to be UCLA's gain. Nikki Caldwell is truly one of the rising stars in women's college basketball. She is the total package as a teacher, a coach and a recruiter. She is a woman of great character and has a powerful gift of mentoring young women."

And based on Caldwell's success so far in only her second season at UCLA, the former Tennessee Lady Volunteer is proving Summitt correct.

In her first season at the helm, Caldwell led the Bruins to a 19-12 record, a three-game improvement from the previous year, and had UCLA on the brink of its second NCAA tournament appearance in five years.

However, this season has been Caldwell's year to shine. The Bruins are ranked No. 22 in the nation, hold a record of 24-8, and are heading into the NCAA tournament as a No. 8 seed.

"I think one thing that she brought to us was her aggressive nature and her drive to want to have greatness," junior guard Doreena Campbell said of Caldwell. "And just the fact that we have got to work together."

But if you ask Caldwell, a majority of the Bruins' success these past two seasons has been a result of the players recruited by Oliver and the work of her coaching staff, which includes Tennessee alumni Tasha Butts and Tony Perotti, Texas-Arlington alumna Stacie Terry, and

former assistant coach under Oliver and now director of operations, UCLA alumna Pam Walker.

"I think it starts with the fact that when I came here, there was talent," Caldwell said. "The guard play was very strong with Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Erica Tukiainen, and we had size with (Moniquee) Alexander and Christina (Nzekwe). The second component was assembling a great staff. I have a wonderful staff who went out, did their job, and got us (Markel) Walker and (Mariah) Williams. And then, by the grace of God, (Jasmine) Dixon decides that she wants to transfer and we get her. That component of it played a huge role."

In addition to Caldwell leading the Bruins to an impressive record, a Pac-10 tournament finals appearance and an NCAA tournament birth this season, there is now one more accomplishment Caldwell can add to her resume:

Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

On Thursday, Caldwell was named Pac-10 Women's Coach of the Year by her peers, and in the process, became the first ever UCLA women's coach to win the award. And just two days prior, Caldwell was also voted Pac-10 Women's Coach of the Year by the Pac-10 media.

When asked about winning the award, Caldwell expressed her excitement but made sure to show appreciation for her coaching staff. She also made it clear that individual awards are not what she is focused on.

She wants her team to win.

"Well it's a great honor because there are unbelievable coaches in this conference. I appreciate the media and obviously my peers for giving us that type of appreciation, but you're not getting that honor without a great support staff. ... For me, I want the team accolades."

Prior to taking over the UCLA women's program, Caldwell was assistant coach under Summitt at Tennessee for six years, from 2003-2008. During her tenure as one of Summitt's assistants, the Lady Vols won back-to-back national championships in 2007 and 2008. From 2000-2002, Caldwell served as an assistant coach at the University of Virginia under Debbie Ryan, who, like Summitt, is a member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. And Caldwell maintains that the majority of her coaching methods she learned from her two Hall of Fame mentors.

"I would have to say that the philosophy that I've learned by being at Tennessee, and prior to that, being at Virginia, with two Hall of Fame coaches, has allowed me an in-depth view of what practices should look like, how you should run your program, making sure you have great relationships with your players. ... All of those things I've learned from the best."

And Caldwell's players have certainly felt the effects of their coach learning from the best, as Caldwell expects nothing but perfection from her Bruin squad.

"For the whole program, she has a vision," senior guard Erica Tukiainen said of Caldwell. "She knows what she wants from us and she has high expectations. So when we're in practice, everything has to be done perfectly."

But according to Caldwell, above all else, it is the players that make a program successful, citing team cohesiveness as the foundation of the Bruins' success this season. And during this NCAA tournament, not only does Caldwell hope to lead her team to a Final Four berth, but that along the way her Bruins will begin to gain some much-warranted national attention as a future force to be reckoned with in women's college basketball.

"I think this team's future is untapped right now. I think we're making strides in getting that recognition, obviously in the Pac-10. But we're going to have to make that stride to get that recognition nationally. But this team has so much more potential in them. We've just got to put this program on that national stage."

### Nikki Caldwell seeks to raise UCLA women's game

**The coach leads the Bruins, who finished second in the Pacific 10 Conference, into the league's tournament.**

Nikki Caldwell is building her private Los Angeles in and around Playa Vista. There is her cafe around the corner, the lunch spot where the servers know her name, the gym where she has kickboxing class, her bowling alley, her movie theater, and so on.

"I'm from a small town," the UCLA women's basketball coach said. "So I've got to make L.A. a little smaller."

She's two years into it since being hired, but she's getting comfortable. The same goes with her team.

"That's the difference between last year and this year, we are more comfortable with each other," she said.

That partly explains the Bruins' success this season: a second-place finish in the Pacific 10 Conference, a 15-3 record in league play and 12 wins in their last 13 games to earn a No. 2 seeding in the State Farm Pac-10 women's tournament, which begins Thursday at the Galen Center. (UCLA opens on Friday, meeting the winner of Thursday's Washington-Oregon State game.)

Another aspect is improved inside play, behind newcomer forwards Jasmine Dixon and Markel Walker, who combine to average 26.2 points and 15.5 rebounds. "It's given us a whole new dimension," Caldwell said.

Caldwell comes from success, having played and been an assistant coach at Tennessee under legendary Coach Pat Summitt. "I've been exposed to it, so I have a hunger for it," she said.

She uses many of Summitt's techniques, sometimes quoting her word for word. She'll tell her players they're underdogs. She'll use inspirational quotes to theme practices. And if a player is lacking enthusiasm or isn't communicating well, she'll send her home.

"If she thinks you should be at a certain level, that's what she's going to set it at and you're going to have

to go from there," Dixon said.

The success she wants takes time. At Tennessee, women's basketball has an enormous fan base. Here, Caldwell competes for attention with night life, the beach, professional teams and other college teams. At Tennessee, recruits of the highest caliber could be signed from any state. Here, Caldwell struggles to sign the best from California.

Last year, when UCLA failed to make the NCAA tournament, Caldwell was sick. She had never been home for spring break and vowed never to be there again. "You either have spring break and we're playing or you're having spring break with me," she told her players.

Even opposing coaches have encouraged her.

"We want them to be a national power, so to speak, just to shift the balance from the East Coast more to the West Coast," said Tara VanDerveer, coach of top-seeded Stanford.

Caldwell is trying. Landing Walker, a McDonald's All-American, was a significant step.

Recruiting should be a strength, because the coach's Southern charm literally radiates. She was raised in Oak Ridge, Tenn., population about 27,000, and tells people her hometown was a main research site for the Manhattan Project, which created the atomic bomb. There is still a plant there, she adds, that manufactures and stores nuclear weapons.

"Dim the lights, I may glow a little bit," she said, laughing.

UCLA is shining with her.

All the success is not happening too fast for Nikki Caldwell.

She still has her bearings.

Her UCLA women's basketball team may be ranked for the first time in four years, winners of six in a row and 10 of 11 with the No. 2 seed for the Pacific-10 Conference Tournament locked up.

This may be only her second season at the helm, in her first head coaching gig.

Yet she's not surprised.

"It doesn't surprise me," Caldwell said, not so much smugly but with certainty, on the eve of UCLA's matchup with visiting Arizona State at 7 p.m. today. "When I took over this program, the cupboard wasn't bare. We had great guard play, which we still do. We had size. Great shooters.

"I felt good about where we were at when I first got here."

Still, the rise has been quick.

UCLA went from 16 wins in 2007 to 19 wins in Caldwell's second year. The 20 wins this year heading into the last homestand of the regular season are the most since a 21-win season in 2005-06.

The Bruins are doing it with one player, sophomore Jasmine Dixon, ranked in top-20 in Pac-10 scoring.

"You don't have to be the most talented team to become the most successful team," Caldwell said.

"You've got to have all the qualities of being great teammates. Our philosophy is real simple, when we say buy into the system it's really about buying into each other."

And the Bruins do.

Caldwell hijacked the philosophy from her mentor and former coach at the University of Tennessee, the legendary Pat Summit. But Summit wasn't only her coach. She was her boss.

Those six years with the Volunteers helped fill in all the small gaps she overlooked as a player and it highlighted the important qualities every successful basketball team needs.

Maybe just the one quality: unselfishness.

"Coming from (Tennessee) and being under one of the greatest coaches, I know you win with people," Caldwell said. "They've got to win with each other; once you get that attitude toward the system and the philosophy. Help-side defense is a prime example of if your team is united. Making the extra pass - that's a quality you possess because you buy into each other. Let somebody else take the best shot for the team."

She first saw the unselfishness when her entire squad chose to commit early last summer. Every player took the third session of summer school together.

"That allowed them to work out together, to weight train together, to get to know each other," Caldwell said. "They were formulating a special bond in the offseason, and it carried itself over into the season. I got a glimpse of it when they made that commitment initially."

Caldwell isn't stupid, though.

She's knows major college basketball isn't always smiles and roses.

At some point, to take the next step, she'll need a superstar.

Unlike the men's college game, where one or two spunky teams with a rag-tag bunch of scrap-heap players might make a run to the top, women's teams typically need at least one superstar.

"When it's all said and done, just looking back on the championships I've been affiliated with, you had that Wade Trophy winner on your squad," Caldwell said. "You had a Daedra Charles, a Candace Parker. UConn, with Diana Taurasi, Maya Moore. You do need that thoroughbred on that roster."

But not yet.

"We will continue to recruit the best players in the country who fit in our program," Caldwell said. "But I do think you can be consistent and field a top-25, top-15 team with role players. You can mix and match up. That's the thing, that's the key ... we've got post players that play like guards."

What's she's saying is they can surprise some people.

# How 33 is Twice as Nice as 3: Jasmine Dixon's Intensity & An Adapted "Iverson Mentality"

The UCLA media guide states that forward Jasmine Dixon's favorite pro athlete is **Allen Iverson** and she wasted no time demonstrating an Iverson-like mentality in **UCLA's 68-63 victory** over the University of Washington.

With less than a full shot clock elapsed in the game, the stocky 5'10" forward missed a jumper from the right elbow, got the ball back off an offensive rebound, and went up strong against 6'3" Washington forward Mackenzie Argens, drawing the foul and earning two free throws. Walking to the free throw line unfazed by the contact with a player 5 inches taller, she knocked down the first two points of the game from the charity stripe.

Less than 30 seconds later, she slapped the ball loudly as she grabbed a defensive rebound and initiated the fast break, finding freshman guard Mariah Williams streaking up court for an easy fast break layup, quickly helping UCLA to a 4-0 lead.

With 16:59 left, she got a pass from Williams at the right elbow and paused to size up a challenge from Argens in a different context. After the brief evaluative moment, she decisively drove to the basket with one strong dribble, not as much getting by the taller Argens as simply overpowering her at the basket to make a short contested jumper in the lane. After a jumper by forward Erica Tukiainen facilitated by a swing pass from Dixon, UCLA took their biggest lead of the first half, 8-2.

To say that Dixon dominated the game start to finish would be an overstatement – Washington went into the half with a 30-28 lead. But Dixon set the tone early and re-established it often as she scored a career-high 25 points on 9-14 shooting to go with a game-high 9 rebounds. As illustrated by the first 3 offensive plays she made, she is a player that can predictably beat opponents in multiple ways with a singular mentality even if they know it's coming.

"We knew it," said Washington coach Tia Jackson. "She just made some tough baskets. It wasn't like they weren't contested looks. They were tough baskets to make. But again, they were right around the rim."

There were no three pointers, pull-up 15 footers, or fancy displays of open court dribbling. Time and time again, Dixon just got the ball, patiently determined how to breakdown her defender, and decisively got herself to the rim. She's a multi-talented player who wasted no movement once in the paint, using creative footwork to either overpower defenders or draw fouls.

Perhaps her mentality is best represented by a run-capping basket late in the game.

With 1:48 left in the second half, she just got the ball in the post, faced up on 6'2" Washington forward Mollie Williams and got a shot to the rim while getting the ball around Williams' outstretched arms as though it didn't even matter that a taller obstacle was in front of her. As she went to the line to make 1 of 2 free throws that capped a late 7-0 run to break the game's 8th tie, Williams took her place on the lane with a look of surprised disappointment – it's hard to imagine how to stop a player that almost pretends defenders aren't there.

"Dixon brings intensity," said UCLA coach Nikki Caldwell. "She is a tough, tough player. Although she is undersized inside, she plays so much bigger than what she is. She gives us that go-to: when we need a basket we're looking to run action to put the ball in her hand...she'll bang in there with anybody, she takes any post assignment we give her. So we're really pleased with what Jasmine has been able to give to us."

Yesterday afternoon, what Dixon gave UCLA was a truly dominant performance. She scored 16 of her 25 points in the second half in similarly strong fashion and was responsible for 42.92% of the team's overall production in the game. She finished with a team high offensive rebounding percentage of 19.87%, making a large contribution to **one statistical factor** that ultimately led to Washington's second half letdown.

As Caldwell said, what the Rutgers University transfer brings is an intensity, toughness, and calculated fearlessness that prevents her from slipping into reckless abandon and allows her to almost singlehandedly will her team to victory when they need baskets most. It's almost as though it never occurs to her that her size might be a barrier, demonstrating an almost total disregard for the disadvantages she has against would-be challengers.

She expects to be better – perhaps twice as good – as anyone who stands to challenge her.

"When I was younger, I liked number 3, but it wasn't available because another girl had it," says Dixon, as quoted in the UCLA media guide. "My coach told me to get #33 because I could be twice as nice as the girl who had number 3. So I stuck with it, having the same mentality."

Coincidentally, the story of how she chose her number serves as an almost-too-convenient allegory for how she plays: an Iverson mentality with her own unique spin that gives her an unwavering confidence in the face of challenge.

In writing about Iverson this past November after he officially cut ties with the **Memphis Grizzlies**, Bethlehem Shoals described his significance as follows.

Allen Iverson was, and still is, heaven or the great below. He shakes basketball to its very foundations or, according to some, is foolish enough to think he can. He changed the game, though not necessarily for the better.

Obviously, Dixon is not the same kind of transcendent or era-defining athlete that Iverson is. And certainly no normal human being may ever possess Iverson's lightening quickness. Nevertheless, Dixon similarly represents a

challenge to mainstream common sense about women's basketball. It's an Iverson mentality applied to the women's game in a way that we might have been shocked by in 1996.

Champions of women's basketball, including [UCLA legend John Wooden](#), have touted women's basketball as beautiful in its glorification of fundamentals in comparison to the men's game, which has been dominated by unstoppable athleticism and physicality that occasionally makes players with no discernable skill valuable in the trenches. Yet Dixon represents something that people rarely expect from female athletes: a combination of skillful creativity and the disciplined use of power, with any finesse or strict adherence to fundamentals seemingly an after-thought.

It's not even that she's the only women's basketball player to exhibit this physical style of play – she is undoubtedly representative of a steady shift in how women's basketball is played. The competitive spirit she exhibits in imposing her will on the game is not new either -- it's far more understated than a player like WNBA MVP Diana Taurasi, who undoubtedly made an impression on the basketball world in 2009. However, it's the fusion of the fearless attitude and the style of play in an undersized package that seems to create resonance with the notion of an "Iverson mentality", if only on the court.

Perhaps lost in the power and intensity is those moments of calm in which she patiently sizes up opponents. It's not the seemingly frantic blur that we expected from Iverson, but a cerebral patience in evaluating a situation as though she's in complete control, protected from an unnecessary sense of urgency by the security of believing that she can enact what she envisions. And yet perhaps it's not quite as much a departure as we might at first assume.

Who could forget this wild and woolly [TrueHoop post](#), and a passage that should ring in our memories forever:

"Allen took psychocybernetics to a new level," [high school athletic director] Kozlowski recalls. Today, Iverson doesn't like to talk about how he does what he does on the basketball court. "I just do it," he says. Partially, like any artist, he is wary of overanalyzing his gift. But it could also be that he's known since high school that the real explanation defies easy answers, that the answer is, at heart, both beneath and above the level of language, and connected, on some level, to his psyche.

However, almost as a reminder that women's is a substantially different style of play with similar foundational principles that perhaps become more visible within the more deliberate unfolding of events, Dixon does it all within the flow of her team's offense, rather than requiring the team to adjust to her. Dominant and powerful, yet not alienating or polarizing. "Heart personified", while not being overbearing.

As such, she is far more a basketball role model whereas Iverson stands alone as something of an anomaly that cannot be imitated in his entirety.

"I just wish that other bigs would get that same type of mentality that she has, especially with us having freshmen in Markel," said Caldwell. "We think she's got a great role model to look after with how Dixon plays."

It will be fun to watch what kind of imprint she makes on her team.
