STORY LINES

• No. 11/12 UCLA (26-7, 14-4 Pac-12), a No. 3 seed, scored the game's first 11 points and defeated 14th-seeded Stetson (24-9, 14-4 Atlantic Sun), 66-49, in the first round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament. The Bruins will now face No. 6 Oklahoma (23-10, 11-7 Big 12) in the second round in Columbus, Ohio on Monday, March 25 at 4:00 p.m. (PT)/7:00 p.m. ET in St. John Arena. The game will be televised live on ESPN2. The contest is also a rematch of a Nov. 14 matchup where an unranked UCLA team went to No. 11 OU and defeated the Sooners 86-80. More about that game can be found on the next page.

• While UCLA is 26-7 overall and went 14-4 (third place) in the Pac-12, all four conference losses and six of the seven defeats this season were to Top 7 teams (Top 2 seeds) in the country. UCLA lost to 4th-ranked Stanford (#1 seed) on the road and on a neutral court (Pac-12 Tournament title game), at home to 5th-ranked Notre Dame (#1), at 6th-ranked Stanford (#1), at home to 6th-ranked California (#2) and at 7th-ranked California (#2). The Bruins defeated 5th-ranked California (#2) in the Pac-12 Tournament semifinals and posted victories at 11th-ranked Oklahoma (#6), vs. 12th-ranked Texas (neutral) and at home over 22nd-ranked Colorado (#5). The Bruins were 4-6 vs. ranked teams this season. It is the most ranked teams UCLA has faced in one season since 2006-07. That year, the Bruins faced 10 Top 25 teams (1-9 vs. ranked teams). Additionally, UCLA is 7-6 against the 2013 NCAA Tournament field. The Bruins also posted wins at home over No. 9 seed Saint Joseph's and No. 9 seed Princeton and at No. 10 St. John's in overtime and most recently, on a neutral court over No. 14 seed Stetson. UCLA also went 6-0 vs. the 2013 WNIT field.

BRUINS IN STATISTICAL RANKINGS

UCLA is 3rd in the Pac-12 in scoring (67.3 ppg) and is 4th in the Pac-12 and 23rd in the country in rebounding margin (+7.0). The Bruins lead the Pac-12 and rank 17th in the nation in assists (16.3) and also lead the league in steals (10.2). UCLA is also 2nd in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (.423) and 3rd in offensive rebounds (15.5) and three-point field goal percentage (.309).

ALL-PAC-12 HONORS

Seniors Markel Walker and Alyssia Brewer and junior Atonye Nyingifa were all named All-Pac-12 by both the Pac-12 coaches and media. Additionally, freshmen Kari Korver and Nirra Fields were both chosen as honorable mention selections to the All-Freshmen Team by the league's head coaches. Markel Walker was also named to the five-member Pac-12 All-Defensive Team by both the media and the coaches.

SUCCESSFUL SENIORS

The senior class of Markel Walker, Jasmine Dixon and Mariah Williams as well as redshirt junior Atonye Nyingifa (who should be a senior this year), has won the second-most games in a four-year period in UCLA history. Bolstered by Tennessee transfer, senior Alyssia Brewer, the class is currently 93-37 (.715), which is second behind the 1981 senior class that went 98-32 (.754). This year's group might have already surpassed the Bruin class that played from 1977-78 to 1980-81, had it not been for last year's 14-16 mark. In that season, Walker missed the first seven games with a thumb injury, Nyingifa missed the last 21 games with a knee injury, Brewer was on the bench due to NCAA transfer rules and Dixon missed the entire season with a ruptured Achilles tendon. The 1980-81 senior group started in 1977-78 as Ann Meyers (Drysedale) led the Bruins to a national championship (AIAW) with a 27-3 record. The Bruins, led by Anita Ortega, were 24-10 in 1978-79 and 18-12 in 1979-80. Then with senior Denise Curry and a couple of freshmen phenoms in Necie Thompson and Jackie Joyner, UCLA won a school record 29 games with seven defeats in 1980-81. UCLA is 26-7 this season after last year's 14-16 mark. UCLA also went 28-5 in 2010-11 and 25-9 in 2009-10, to win 25 or more games in three of the last four years, a feat unmatched in Bruin history.

MISSING IN ACTION

Only three of the 13 Bruins have played in all 33 games this season and nobody has started in more than 28 contests, forcing Head Coach Cori Close to go with 11 different starting lineups. Rhema Gardner had knee surgery before the season began and will redshirt the season. Thea Lemberger missed the Notre Dame (Nov. 23) and Princeton (Nov. 25) games due to a knee sprain and the Arizona game (Mar. 3) and the Pac-12 Tournament (Mar. 8-10) with a sprained left elbow. She returned to practice this week and played 23 minutes in the win over 14-seed Stetson. Lauren Holiday (28 games) and Corinne Costa (26 games) have both missed contests with head injuries and have been shut down for the season and will seek medical hardships. Kacy Swain missed both of the games in New York (Dec. 15-16) with a back injury. Nirra Fields missed the upset win at Oklahoma (Nov. 14) due to personal reasons. Jasmine Dixon missed two games (Princeton on Nov. 25 and Loyola Marymount on Dec. 2) with a left knee sprain. She has played in all other contests, but is only playing 20.6 minutes per game as she is still suffering from pain in her knee and has occasional swelling. Alyssia Brewer missed most (only played three minutes) of the Pepperdine game (Dec. 28) and missed the entire Saint Joseph's game (Dec. 31) with a right ankle sprain. Markel Walker missed the Arizona game (Jan. 25) with back spasms, but returned for the Arizona State game (Jan. 27). The Bruins have used 193 different combinations of players on the court.

UCLA 86 AT NO. 11 OKLAHOMA 80 (Nov. 14, 2012)

GAME RECAP

NORMAN, Okla. (AP) - Thea Lemberger scored 18 points for UCLA to lead the Bruins to an 86-80 upset at No. 11 Oklahoma on Wednesday night in Lloyd Noble Center. Senior Alyssia Brewer had a successful return to her home state (Tulsa, Okla.) with 15 points and 16 rebounds for UCLA.

"I am proud of this win because of the respect that we have for Coach Coale and her team," UCLA Head Coach Cori Close said. "They showed so much resolve to come back in the second half. This means a lot to us because Oklahoma is such a great program. They're a tremendous team and we earned a good win against a very, very good team."

Lemberger was 7 of 12 from the field for UCLA (2-0). She had three rebounds, two assists and a steal. Alyssia Brewer scored 15 points and snagged 16 rebounds. Markel Walker added 16 points and Jasmine Dixon had 11 points for the Bruins. Atonye Nyongifa just missed a double-double with nine points and 10 rebounds for UCLA, which dominated the Sooners on the boards, 56-34.

"As much as I'm thrilled about out-rebounding them by 22, I love the mentality that it showed in our team," Close said. "They weren't just rebounds that were easy. It was how the rebounds came about that I thought were just tremendous in terms of our mentality. Relentlessness and will are what rebounding's all about. I think it showed a lot about our heart and mentality."

UCLA led by one point at halftime, 37-36.

Aaryn Ellenberg led the Sooners (1-1) with 24 points, including 7 of 9 from 3-point range. She was 7 of 13 from the field. Whitney Hand was 7 of 11 from the field and added 19 points and six rebounds. Nicole Griffin and Sharane Campbell each had 12 points.

At 19:02 in the second period, Hand made a 3-pointer to tie the game 39-39. But Brewer would make a layup and the free throw after being fouled by Griffin, putting the Bruins ahead. They would lead the rest of the game.

"We have so many different weapons, and we played big tonight for a long time with [Atonye] Nyongifa, [Markel] Walker, [Jasmine] Dixon and [Alyssia] Brewer," Close said. "I just thought we had so many opportunities to get inside touches that that had to be a major priority for us. I thought our attacks off the dribble in some very key moments were huge. I thought tonight we were really in the hunt for that attack shot. We wanted to have that attack mentality inside. We are tough to match up with on that front line."

The Bruins built their largest lead of 18 points to lead 69-51 with 9:57 remaining. But Oklahoma engineered a 27-11 run to cut it to two points (80-78) with 54 seconds left. Dixon, Walker and Lemberger would combine to go 6-for-8 from the charity stripe to put the game on ice.

QUICK HITS

- UCLA senior forward Alyssia Brewer graduated from Sapulpa High School in Sapulpa, Okla., which is about 111 miles from Norman, Okla.
- While Thea Lemberger led the Bruins with 18 points in the earlier win at OU, Alyssia Brewer had a monster game with 15 points and a career-high 16 rebounds.
- While both teams shot 43% from the floor in this year's earlier meeting, the Bruins won the game by outrebounding OU, 56-34, including 24 offensive rebounds. Both the 56 total rebounds and 24 offensive rebounds are season-highs.
- This is just the 5th meeting between the two teams with the series tied at 2-2. Each team is 1-1 on its home floor, making this the first neutral-site meeting between the teams.
- The Bruins' first-round win over 14th-seeded Stetson was its 17th-straight win over an unranked team.
- UCLA improved to 22-2 on the season when leading at the half. UCLA is just 4-5 when trailing at the half.
- The Bruins held Stetson to just 49 points, which improves UCLA's record to 6-0 on the year when their opponent scores less than 50 points. UCLA is 17-1 when holding its opponent to less than 60 points. The only loss was to No. 4 Stanford in the title game of the Pac-12 Tournament (51-49).
- The Bruins also held Stetson to 29.0% shooting from the field, improving to 6-0 when they hold their opponent to less than 30% shooting. On the year, UCLA is 15-0 when its opponent shoots less than 35% from the floor. UCLA is also 25-1 when it simply shoots better from the field than its opponent.
