



Season Prospectus

The exuberance of youth is well-apparent in the 2006 UCLA Gymnastics team. With freshmen comprising more than half of the squad, this is definitely a new-look Bruin squad, one that head coach Valorie Kondos Field is excited to lead.


While having a freshman-dominated team could be a concern, this Bruin crew will be seasoned veterans by the time post-season hits. A rash of minor injuries to the Bruin veterans will enable the freshmen to get valued competition time right away. Kondos Field has already seen that her youngsters are competitors.

"The youth of this team is very refreshing," Kondos Field said. "They are excited about competing. Every time we have an intrasquad or some kind of team challenge in workouts, every single one of them jumps in with both feet to help their team win."

"They are an exciting group of competitors to be around daily," she continued. "I can only imagine how competitive they will be when the season starts. There is a healthy competitive atmosphere within our own team. They not only want to make the lineup, but they want to be last up in the lineup, and they want to prove that they earned that spot."

The Bruin team's diversity is something else that stands out to Kondos Field. "I love that our team is diverse," she said. "While all come from different social and gymnastics backgrounds with extremely different styles of gymnastics and personalities, they have all embraced the philosophy we have here in that we expect them to excel in all areas of their lives, academically, athletically and socially, and they are as excited about being the best they can be as they are about the pursuit of a national championship."

Each Bruin brings something different to the table. Senior co-captain **Kate Richardson** brings poise and an elite level of gymnastics. In 2004, she did what only one other female gymnast has ever done - compete in the Olympics as a collegiate athlete. Richardson not only competed in her second Olympic Games, but she also became the first Cana-

dian woman ever to qualify for the floor exercisefinals, where she placed seventh. She returned to Westwood and earned first-team All-America honors on beam and floor at the NCAAChampionships, bringing her career total to 10, third-most in school history. Richardson also brings a steely determination, as evidenced by her quick recovery from a broken tibia suffered in September. She has also fully recovered from a thumb injury suffered in mid-season last year.

Sophomore Tasha Schwikert brings competitive greatness and big gymnastics. The 2000 U.S. Olympian and six-time U.S. national champion had a terrific rookie

campaign in 2005, winning all three post-season all-around titles, including the NCAA all-around championship. Schwikert, the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and the only gymnast to earn the maximum five first-team All-America honors last year, racked up big numbers, scoring a pair of perfect 10s on both bars and floor and recording season-best numbers of 9.975 on vault and beam. She competed in the allaround in 15 meets and averaged 39.522 with a high of 39.825. Unfortunately, she will miss a substantial amount, if not all, of the 2006 season due to shoulder surgery.

Sophomore Jordan Schwikert gives UCLA Jordan Schwikert consistency and hard work



in the gym every day and in competition. She is UCLA's third returning All-American, having earned second-team honors on the balance beam last year. She also earned All-Pac-10 honors in the all-around and scored a career-high 39.5 in two meets in March. Jordan has career-highs of 9.925 on vault, bars and beam and averaged 9.835 on floor.

Junior Ashley Peckett has what Kondos Field calls an "effervescent $vitality that is {\it extremely infectious''}. The former Canadian {\it national beam}$ champion has played a major role on the Bruins' NCAA championship squads in her two years, setting her teammates up with solid 9.8+leadoff scores every time up. Peckett is a very consistent competitor and enters the season having hit 33 consecutive routines without a fall.

Junior co-captain Michelle Selesky is a shining example of all things being possible through hard work and determination. Selesky walked on to the team as a freshman, learned new skills and saw some competition time as a sophomore and has now earned a spot as team co-captain and earned a scholarship as well. "She has exceeded all of our expectations," said Kondos Field.

Another athlete who blossomed last season was junior Courtney Walker, who continues to be a strong, powerful athlete with beautiful lines. Last year, she earned a spot in the post-season lineup on bars and floor and set a career-best on bars at the NCAA Super Six. In her first all-around appearance, she placed first in a dual meet at Cal State Fullerton.

Leading the seven-member freshman class is U.S. National Team member Kristina Comforte, who brings a perfect combination of power and grace. Comforte has impressive results on vault, where she was the national runner-up in 2003 and the U.S. junior champion in 2002, but she is a strong competitor in all four events, as evidenced by her sixth-place all-around finish at the 2005 U.S. Championships.

Kondos Field lauds Melissa Chan's power and uncanny ability of finding her landings. Chan is a three-time Level 10 national all-around and vault champion and former U.S. Junior National Team member. She also won the 2004 Level 10 beam title and was second on vault and bars in 2003.

Jalynne Dantzscher "lives to compete", according to Kondos Field. Her competitive desire saw her win the 2004 Level 10 national allaround and floor exercise titles in the Senior A division. The former

senior international elite earned a Top 20 finish at the 2002 U.S. Junior Championships and placed fourth on floor.

Jalynne's twin sister **Janelle Dantzscher** is all about beautiful lines, power and good technique, possessing perhaps as good of a combo as any Kondos Field has seen at UCLA. Janelle was the Level 10 state vault champion in 2004 and the state and regional all-around champion in 2003.

Ariana Berlin brings to the Bruin squad a tremendous work ethic and competitive drive. She is returning to gymnastics after a serious car accident forced her retirement at age 14. Prior to her accident, she had been a budding international elite, and she returns to the sport after spending the last few years as a professional dancer. "The possibilities are endless for Ariana," said Kondos Field. "She is all about honesty in everything she does and unwavering determination."

Walk-on **Alyssa Kitasoe** brings beauty and grace, as well as a strong conviction. Kondos Field expects her to fill in with strong and beautiful

gymnastics. Kitasoe was a 2005 Level 10 Regional and State qualifier and a two-time national qualifier. She won the Region 1 titles on beam in 2002 and bars in 2001 and won bars and beam at the 2003 State Championships.

UCLA's newest addition is **Maranda Smith**, who is expected to bring power and confidence to all of her events. Smith, who graduated from high school early to join the Bruins in late December for the start of the season, is the 2005 Level 10 national champion on floor and the 2004 Level 10 national vault champion. She was second in the all-around, vault and bars and first on floor at the 2005 Region 1 Championships.

"We have a great blend of freshmen and upperclassmen," notes Kondos Field. "I think this is the most cohesive team we've had in many, many years. They have all responded positively to all of the challenges we put before them and are willing to do whatever it takes for the good of the team."
