

The Bruins started big with a whopping 49.55 on vault in the first rotation, with UCLA's last four gymnasts each scoring 9.9 or higher. After scoring 49.275 on bars to take a 1.075 lead at the halfway point, the Bruins faltered on beam in rotation three, scoring just 48.375. UCLA held on in the final rotation, scoring just enough on floor exercise (48.875) to squeak out the victory by .05.

Boise State was second with a score of 196.025, followed by Missouri (195.525) and Illinois (195.1). The Bruins had event winners on all four events, with Olivia Courtney winning vault and tying for first on bars with a career-high tying 9.9. Mattie Larson picked up her first event victory, winning beam with a 9.85, and Alyssa Pritchett set a new career-high of 9.9 on floor to win that event for the second time this year.

Stanford held the lead for each of the first three rotations before falling out of contention during the fourth and final rotation. The Bruins kept close throughout the meet and showed tremendous grace under pressure in the final rotation, scoring 49.375 on beam to overtake Stanford and hold off a surging Utah, who scored 49.525 on floor. The Bruins' final three performers on beam came up big, with Vanessa Zamarripa scoring a season-high 9.95, Elyse Hopfner-Hibbs scoring a meet-winning 9.975, and Samantha Peszek clinching the win with a 9.85.

UCLA led a Pac-12 sweep in the first semifinal of the NCAA Championships, placing first with a score of 197.400, two-tenths ahead of second-place Utah and .275 ahead of third-place Stanford. The Bruins had to overcome some adversity on their final two events to win the meet. A fall from a Bruin competitor on both beam and floor put senior Elyse Hopfner-Hibbs in pressure-filled situations, but on each event she came through immediately after with scores of 9.9 to prevent UCLA from counting a fall. The Bruins had strong team scores on bars (49.45), beam (49.325) and floor (49.35) to pull ahead after a relatively shaky start on its highest-scoring event - vault (49.275).

# Meet 14 - NCAA Super Six (Apr. 16)

UCLA earned its third-highest NCAA Championships score ever, recording 197.750, but it wasn't enough at the 2012 NCAA Championships, which went to Alabama for the second-straight year. The Crimson Tide scored a tenth higher than the Bruins, 197.850, clinching the victory with a 9.95 on beam by its last competitor, Ashley Priess. Florida finished .025 ahead of the Bruins in second place with a score of 197.775. The competition went down to the wire in the final rotation. The luck of the draw had UCLA in the locker room in the last rotation after finishing up with a final score of 197.75. Florida needed to score 49.4 on floor exercise to overtake the Bruins, and Alabama needed 49.425 on balance beam to move ahead of UCLA. It came down to the last competitor for both the Gators and Crimson Tide to decide UCLA's final placement, and they each scored enough to move ahead of the Bruins. UCLA received monster performances by Vanessa Zamarripa, who scored a career-high 39.775 in the all-around and her sixth career perfect 10 on vault, and Samantha Peszek, who earned a career-high 39.675 in the all-around and career-bests on bars (9.925) and beam (9.95).
