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NCAA Championships

Sixth-seeded and six-time NCAA Champion UCLA (16-5) hosts the 2013 National Collegiate Women's Gymnastics Championships in Pauley Pavilion on Apr. 19-21.

Championship Schedule

The competition begins on Friday, Apr. 19 with two semifinal sessions at 12 pm and 6 pm. No. 6 seed UCLA competes in the second semifinal at 6 pm, along with No. 2 Oklahoma, No. 3 Alabama, No. 7 Michigan, No. 10 Utah and No. 11 Arkansas. Competing in the first semifinal at 12 pm are No. 1 seed Florida, No. 4 Georgia, No. 5 LSU, No. 8 Minnesota, No. 9 Stanford and No. 12 Illinois. The top three teams from each semifinal will advance to the Super Six Team Finals on Saturday, Apr. 20 at 4 pm. Individual event finals will take place on Sunday, Apr. 21 at 1 pm. The all-around champion and individual event finalists will be determined during Friday's semifinals. Individuals qualify for event finals by placing in the Top 4 (including ties) of that particular event during their own semifinal session.

Coverage

Live scoring for all sessions will be available at uclabruins.com. Also follow @UCLAGymnastics on Twitter for updates. NCAA.com will broadcast Thursday's semifinals live, and ESPN3 will broadcast both the Super Six Team Finals on Saturday and the Individual Event Finals on Sunday. The team finals will be televised by ESPN3 on Apr. 30 at 5 pm PT. Calling the action for ESPN will be two-time Olympic gold medalist Bart Conner and two-time Olympic medalist Kathy Johnson Clarke.

Rotation Order

The rotation order for the NCAA semifinals was determined by blind draw. In the second semifinal, UCLA will begin on balance beam in rotation one. After a bye, the Bruins resume competition in the third rotation on floor, then vault, another bye and then uneven bars to finish.

UCLA's NCAA Championship History

The Bruins have won six NCAA gymnastics titles - in 1997 at Florida, 2000 at Boise State, 2001 at Georgia, 2003 at Nebraska, 2004 at UCLA and 2010 at Florida. This is UCLA's 29th overall appearance in the 32 NCAA Championships.

Individual NCAA History

A total of 16 Bruins have won 31 NCAA titles to rank second behind only Georgia (40) in individual NCAA titles. UCLA's NCAA champions are: Kim Hamilton (1987-88-89 floor, 1989 vault), Jill Andrews (1988 vault, 1989 beam), Stella Umeh (1995 and 1998 floor), Heidi MoneyMaker (1988 bars, 1999 vault), Kiralee Hayashi (1999 beam), Mohini Bhardwaj (2000 bars, 2001 floor), Lena Degteva (2000 beam), Onnie Willis (2001 all-around), Yvonne Tousek (2001 bars), Jamie Dantzschler (2002 all-around, vault and floor; 2003 bars), Kate Richardson (2003 bars and beam, 2006 floor), Kristen Maloney (2005 vault and beam), Tasha Schwikert (2005 all-around, 2008 all-around and bars), Vanessa Zamarripa (2010 vault), Brittani McCullough (2010 floor) and Samantha Peszek (2011 beam). Two other Bruins won AIAW national titles - Sharon Shapiro (1980 sweep of all all-around and all four events, 1981 all-around and vault) and Diane Dovas (1981 bars). Shapiro remains the

only gymnast ever to sweep the all-around and all four events in one year at a national championship. Hamilton is the only woman to win three consecutive floor titles. UCLA has won at least two individual titles in nine of the last 15 years and a team or individual title in 12 of the last 15 years. Since 2000, the Bruins have captured 19 individual titles, the most of any school during that time period.

Last Year At NCAAs

In the closest competition in NCAA Super Six history, UCLA earned its third-highest NCAA Championships score ever with a mark of 197.750, but it wasn't enough at the 2012 NCAA Championships, which went to Alabama for the second-straight year. The Crimson Tide scored a tenth higher than the Bruins, 197.850, clinching the victory with a 9.95 on beam by its last competitor, Ashley Priess. Florida finished .025 ahead of the Bruins in second place with a score of 197.775. The competition went down to the wire in the final rotation. The luck of the draw had UCLA in the locker room in the last rotation after finishing up with a final score of 197.75. Florida needed to score 49.4 on floor exercise to overtake the Bruins, and Alabama needed 49.425 on balance beam to move ahead of UCLA. It came down to the last competitor for both the Gators and Crimson Tide to decide UCLA's final placement, and they each scored enough to move ahead of the Bruins. UCLA received monster performances from Vanessa Zamarripa, who scored a career-high 39.775 in the all-around and a perfect 10 on vault, and Samantha Peszek, who earned a career-high 39.675 in the all-around and career-bests on bars (9.925) and beam (9.95).

All five Bruins who qualified for event finals made the podium, with Elyse Hopfner-Hibbs tying for second on floor, Olivia Courtney placing third on bars, Zamarripa recording a fifth-place finish on bars and sixth-place on floor, Aisha Gerber finishing sixth on bars, and Peszek placing seventh on beam.

NCAA Championship Notes

*Only four teams have ever won the NCAA title in the 31 years of the Championships - Georgia (10), Utah (9), UCLA (6) and Alabama (6). For the first 15 years of the Championship, only Utah, Georgia and Alabama had ever won the team title. UCLA broke the stranglehold in 1997. Fifteen championships later, there still has not been a team outside of UCLA, Alabama, Georgia and Utah to win a title.

*Nine schools return from the 2012 NCAA Championships, including all six Super Six teams. Returning teams are Alabama (1st place), Florida (2nd), UCLA (3rd), Stanford (4th), Utah (5th), Arkansas (6th), Oklahoma (7th), LSU (9th) and Georgia (11th). Michigan and Illinois are back after one-year absences, and Minnesota is making its first appearance since 2002. Absent from last year's field are Nebraska (8th), Ohio State (10th) and Oregon State (12th).

*No. 12 Auburn is the only Top 12 team that did not qualify for the NCAA Championships.

*UCLA ranks second among all schools with 31 individual titles. Georgia leads all teams with 40. Utah is third with 24.

*UCLA has won either a team or an individual NCAA title in 12 of the last 15 years.

UCLA vs. 2013 NCAA Field

The Bruins have matched up against seven of the 11 other teams in the NCAA field this season, including all five opponents in the semifinals. UCLA is 1-0 against Arkansas, 2-0 against both Stanford and Utah, and 0-1 against Oklahoma, Alabama, Michigan and LSU.

Redemption Time for Bruins in Semifinals

UCLA will get another shot at three teams it lost to in consecutive weeks during the regular season - Oklahoma, Alabama and Michigan. The Bruins lost to Oklahoma and Alabama on the road in back-to-back dual meets in Feb. 22 and Mar. 1 and placed second to the Wolverines at home Mar. 10.

Championships Return to New Pauley

This is the fourth time UCLA has hosted the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships. The last time the Championships were held in Pauley Pavilion, in 2004, UCLA set a NCAA Super Six record with a winning score of 198.125. The Bruins also previously hosted in 1998 (UCLA placed fifth, Georgia first) and 1984 (UCLA finished second, Utah first).

This championship marks the first held in New Pauley Pavilion. The arena underwent a 33-month, \$136 million dollar renovation, reopening in November 2012. In Pauley Pavilion's history, UCLA teams have won 13 NCAA titles in the arena, with the 2004 gymnastics title the most recent.

In the Rankings

UCLA closed the regular season strong, scoring its season-high on the road at the Pac-12 Championships (197.375) to jump up two spots to No. 6 nationally with a RQS of 197.2. The Bruins rank sixth on beam (49.220) and floor (49.430) and ninth on vault (49.375) and bars (49.280).

Vanessa Zamarripa remains ranked No. 1 in the nation in the all-around (39.660) for the seventh consecutive week and jumped up to No. 1 on vault (9.970). Her No. 1 ranking on vault gives her the distinction of finishing each of her four seasons ranked No. 1 in the nation on that event. Zamarripa also ranks in the Top 25 on the other three events, checking in at No. 4 on bars (9.935), No. 7 on floor (9.925) and No. 22 on beam (9.880). Olivia Courtney ranks eighth on vault (9.920) and 17th on floor (9.910), Danusia Francis ranks 16th on beam (9.890), and Alyssa Pritchett is 17th on floor (9.910).

Bruins Qualify for NCAAs after Second-Place Finish at Regionals

With a second-place showing at the NCAA Columbus Regional, UCLA qualified for its 29th NCAA Championship. The Bruins scored 196.95 to finish behind first-place LSU (197.275). The Bruins took the lead after the first rotation thanks to a team vault score of 49.225. LSU claimed the lead after the third rotation, and Arizona crept up to third place just two-tenths behind the Bruins. UCLA took control of its destiny by producing a strong balance beam set in rotation four, taking a 9.875 leadoff score by Kaelie Baer and running to a 49.25 team score and breathing room between themselves and the Wildcats. UCLA sewed up its place at NCAAs with a strong performance on floor exercise, scoring 49.425 to finish in second place. Olivia Courtney tied for first in the all-around and on vault to claim her second NCAA Regional all-around title in three years.

Zamarripa, Courtney, Francis Earn Regular Season All-America Honors

As announced by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches (NACGC/W), three Bruins earned regular season All-America honors. The regular-season All-Americans are selected by national ranking prior to NCAA competition. Vanessa Zamarripa picked up four more All-America honors, earning first-team acclaim in the all-around, vault, bars and floor. She now has a total of 16 in her career, which ties for most in school history with Onnie Willis, who had 16 (all post-season awards). Olivia Courtney added a sixth All-America honor to her career stash, earning first-team honors on vault. Freshman Danusia Francis received her first-ever award, second-team honors on beam.

UCLA Second at Pac-12 Championships

UCLA earned a season road-best score of 197.375 to finish in second place behind host Oregon State at the Pac-12 Championships. The Bruins

grabbed an early lead after a season-best performance on uneven bars to start the meet but lost the advantage in the second rotation after a low-scoring beam set. UCLA bounced back in the final two rotations, scoring 49.45 on floor and a season-high-tying 49.5 on vault to pull up to second place.

Bruins Capture Four of Five Pac-12 Individual Titles

Vanessa Zamarripa won the Pac-12 all-around title for the second time in her career, scoring a season-high 39.75. She also won her third vault title, scoring the sixth perfect 10 in Pac-12 Championship history and first in nine years, and first beam title, tying for first place on beam with Stanford's Amanda Spinner with a season-high-tying 9.925. Olivia Courtney tied for first place on floor with a season-high-tying 9.95, capturing the fourth Pac-12 title of her career.

Five Bruins Earn All-Conference Honors

Five members the UCLA Gymnastics squad were named to the 2013 Pac-12 All-Conference team, led by Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year Vanessa Zamarripa, who earned first-team acclaim in the all-around for the third time in her career. Junior Olivia Courtney received first-team honors on vault for the third-straight year. Senior Kaelie Baer and freshman Danusia Francis each picked up their first career All-Pac-12 nods, with Baer earning second-team acclaim on vault and Francis landing a spot on the second team on beam. Senior Alyssa Pritchett received second-team honors on floor exercise for the second-straight year.

Bruins Dominate Weekly Conference Awards

UCLA led all conference schools in 2013 with 10 weekly Pac-12 awards. Vanessa Zamarripa led all gymnasts with five total awards - four Gymnast of the Week awards (tied for most ever in one season) and one Special Performance of the Week award. Olivia Courtney and Alyssa Pritchett each won one Special Performance of the Week award. Sophina

Zamarripa Named West Region, Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year

Senior Vanessa Zamarripa was voted the West Region and Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year for the second time in her career (she previously won as a sophomore in 2010). Zamarripa has dominated at the national level, ranking No. 1 in the nation in the all-around for the last seven weeks of the season and No. 2 the other five weeks. She has competed in the all-around in all but one meet this season, winning six times and scoring a season-high 39.75 to win the Pac-12 title. Zamarripa also won the Pac-12 vault and beam titles.

In 46 routines competed, she has placed first 22 times, winning her event 48% of the time. She has scored three perfect 10s on vault (nine in her career), a 9.975 on both bars and floor and scored above 39.5 eight times in the all-around.

Zamarripa was awarded Pac-12 Gymnast of the Week four times this year and Special Performance of the Week once. She set or tied conference records for most career Gymnast of the Week awards (nine), most career Special Performance of the Week awards (eight), most Gymnast of the Week awards in a season (four). She is a finalist for the AAI Award as the nation's top senior gymnast.

Zamarripa is a 16-time All-American and 2010 NCAA team and vault champion. In 2010, she made the rare jump to the elite level from the collegiate level, making the U.S. National Team after her sophomore season. Also that year, she became the first U.S. gymnast ever to land the Cheng vault in competition, sticking the vault at the VISA National

Championships. She is tied for No. 3 with two-time Olympian Kate Richardson in UCLA's record books for most career perfect 10s with nine and ranks second for most 10s on vault.

Courtney Continues Consistency

Junior Olivia Courtney has been one of the Bruins' most consistent gymnasts since her freshman season. Through her career, she has hit 118 of 121 routines (97.5%), with her only three misses all coming on balance beam. She is 40-for-40 this season and averages 9.888 on vault, 9.821 on bars, 9.771 on beam and 9.888 on floor. She has scored 39.4 or better in her last five all-around efforts, including a career-high 39.55 to place third at the Pac-12 Championships and a 39.45 to place first at NCAA Regionals. On vault, she has scored 9.9 or higher in her last six meets, including three 9.95s. She also has six 9.9+ marks on floor, including three 9.95s.

Super Seniors Leading the Way

The Bruins' three redshirt seniors - Kaelie Baer, Alyssa Pritchett and Vanessa Zamarripa - are making the most of their final season of competition.

Baer, who sat out the 2010 season and most of 2011 due to injuries, has competed in every meet in 2012 and 2013. This season, she has scored career-highs of 9.925 on vault and 9.875 on beam. The All-Pac-12 performer on vault is averaging 9.865 on the year. Baer has been a consistent leadoff performer on beam with a high of 9.8 or better achieved six times.

Pritchett enjoyed a breakout year in 2012 after missing 2011 with a stress fracture in her ankle and came back even better in 2013, averaging a team-best 9.896 on floor with Top 3 finishes in eight meets and a new career-high of 9.95 set Mar. 10 and Mar. 17. She earned her first-ever Pac-12 Weekly Award on Mar. 12, receiving the Special Performance of the Week award, and earned All-Pac-12 honors on floor for the second consecutive year. She has also scored a career-high on vault this year with a 9.85.

Zamarripa sat out 2011 with a ruptured Achilles and came back in 2012 to score two perfect 10s on vault and enjoy a dominating all-around performance at the NCAA Super Six, scoring a career-high 39.775. Dominating doesn't even begin to describe Zamarripa's 2013 campaign. She has captured 22 out of a possible 46 event titles this year and was voted the West Region and Pac-12 Gymnast of the Year. She ranks in the Top 25 nationally on all four events and has been ranked No. 1 in the all-around for eight weeks straight.

Rookie Performers Shine

With UCLA needing to replace 12 routines from last year's NCAA Championships, many new faces have emerged to play key roles in 2013. Freshmen Sophina DeJesus and Danusia Francis jumped right into competition, with the duo combining to win seven events in UCLA's 12 meets. DeJesus has one victory each on uneven bars and balance beam, while Francis has won beam in a team-best five meets and earned regular season All-America and All-Pac-12 acclaim on the event. A pair of sophomores who did not compete due to injuries a year ago have also been steady competitors. Dana McDonald is averaging 9.793 on vault and 9.735 on floor in leadoff positions. She set a new career-high on floor Mar. 10 with a 9.875, and at Oregon State on Feb. 16, she competed on beam for just the second time this season and scored a career-high 9.8. Sadiqua Bynum has competed in nine of 12 meets on floor, with a high of 9.85 set most recently at NCAA Regionals. Additionally, two other athletes who missed most of last season with injuries, are back - junior Sydney Sawa, who scored 9.8 on vault vs. Utah and a season-best 9.875 on floor at NCAA Regionals, and senior Lichelle Wong, who set a new career-high in the all-around with a 39.375 at the Pac-12 Championships. Wong ranked No. 1 in the nation on bars in the first two weekly rankings and is currently 30th.

Eleven team members made the Director's Honor Roll for Fall Quarter (3.0 GPA in at least 12 quarter units) - Kaelie Baer, Monique De La Torre, Danusia Francis, Mattie Larson, Christine Peng-Peng Lee, Dana McDonald, Asi Peko, Samantha Peszek, Sydney Sawa, Lichelle Wong and Vanessa Zamarripa. In all, 364 UCLA student-athletes - 49% of enrolled student-athletes, made the Director's Honor Roll this past quarter.

UCLA Signs Two in Early Signing Period

UCLA head coach Valorie Kondos Field signed two gymnasts in the early signing period in November - two-time U.S. National Team member Hallie Mossett and reigning Level 10 national floor exercise champion Angela Cipra. The duo will join the six-time NCAA champion Bruins for the 2014 season.

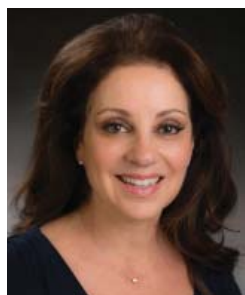

Head Coach Valorie Kondos Field

UCLA head coach Valorie Kondos Field has positioned her Bruins as one of the premier programs in collegiate gymnastics. Not only has she consistently recruited and coached some of the top talent in the world, but she has produced the results.

The Bruins won their first NCAA championship in 1997 under Kondos Field and won again in back-to-back seasons in both 2000-2001 and 2003-2004. In 2010, UCLA won its sixth NCAA

title with a 24-for-24 performance in the Super Six. UCLA has remained the Leader of the Pac under Kondos Field's tenure, winning 12 conference titles, including the inaugural Pac-12 title in 2012, to go along with 16 NCAA Regional titles. She has won both National and Conference Coach of the Year honors four times in her career.

Kondos Field emphasizes a team concept, but her student-athletes have also found individual success, winning 25 NCAA individual titles during her years as head coach, including 22 in the last 14 years.

Kondos Field's professional journey has been a unique one. A former professional ballet dancer with the Sacramento Ballet, Capital City Ballet and Washington, D.C. Ballet, she initially got her start in gymnastics at Agilites in Carmichael, Calif. by playing the piano for floor exercise music. From there, she became a dance coach, and under the guidance of former University of Minnesota co-head coach Jim Stephenson, learned the fundamentals of the sport. In 1983, she was hired to be UCLA's assistant coach and choreographer. While working under head coach Jerry Tomlinson, Kondos Field helped put UCLA Gymnastics on the map with their distinctive choreography and flair.

Kondos Field was appointed head coach of the Bruins in 1991 and brought in Scott Bull as her co-head coach. As the sole head coach in 1995, she earned Pac-10 and West Region coaching honors and guided her team to first-place finishes at the Pac-10 and Regional Championships. Just one year later, she led the Bruins to a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships, and in 1997 she became just the fourth coach in NCAA history to win a national title.

Kondos Field's accomplishments did not go unnoticed. She was selected by her peers as the NACGC/W National Coach of the Year in 1996, 1997, 2000 and 2001. She was also named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1995, 2000 and 2003 and the Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2012. In 2010, she was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame.

In 23 years as Bruin head coach, Kondos Field holds a career record of 438-101-2 (.811 winning percentage). She was inducted into the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.



Associate Head Coach Chris Waller

Former UCLA All-American, NCAA Champion and U.S. Olympian Chris Waller is in his 11th season as an assistant coach for the UCLA women's gymnastics team and second as associate head coach.

Waller has brought nothing but success since returning to UCLA in 2003, helping guide the Bruins to three NCAA team titles. In his first season on the Bruin staff, he helped guide the Bruins to the 2003 NCAA, Regional and Pac-10 Championships. He was also the acting head coach when UCLA snapped the longest home court winning streak in NCAA history for any sport, handing Utah its first home loss in 23 years. In 2004, he helped coach the Bruins to a repeat championship, won in record-setting fashion. He was also selected by his peers as the 2004 NACGC National Assistant Coach of the Year. In 2010, he was voted the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

The success did not stop for Waller after the 2004 collegiate season. He coached former Bruin great Mohini Bhardwaj as she earned not only a spot on the U.S. Olympic team but the honor of team captain as well. Bhardwaj led the U.S. to a silver medal and placed sixth in the floor exercise finals.

One of the United States' all-time gymnastics greats, Waller was a member of the National Team from 1989-97 and captured the U.S. all-around crown in 1991 and pommel horse titles from 1991-93. He was an all-around finalist at the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona and took fifth on the pommel horse, just one-tenth of a point away from the gold medal. In addition, Waller placed in the Top 6 on the pommel horse at the 1993 World Championships and won three medals at the 1990 Goodwill Games and a team gold at the 1995 Pan American Games. He was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame in 2003.

At UCLA, Waller earned four All-America honors and helped the Bruins capture the NCAA title in 1987. He also won individual titles on the pommel horse in 1989 and the high bar in 1990. Every year from 1989-1993, Waller won either a U.S. or NCAA national title.



Assistant Coach Randy Lane

Randy Lane is in the second year of his third stint as a Bruin assistant coach and his ninth year overall with the program.

In 2012, he was selected the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year and helped lead UCLA to the first-ever Pac-12 Championship, as well as a NCAA Regional championship and a third-place NCAA finish.

Lane previously coached at UCLA from 1992-94 and 1998-2001. He left coaching for a private business but returned to the sport as an assistant coach at Florida from 2002-06. He was an associate head coach at Michigan State from 2007-11 and had previously served as the head coach at UC Santa Barbara from 1995-97.

During Lane's second stint at UCLA, he helped guide the Bruins to NCAA titles in 2000 and 2001. UCLA gymnasts won eight NCAA individual titles from 1998-2001, including three on the event on which he was the lead coach, uneven bars. He was honored as the NACGC/W National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000, and in 1998, he was named the West Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

Lane was a member of the 1989 Illinois NCAA Men's Gymnastics National Championship squad and the 1988 NCAA Championship runner-up squad. He was also a member of the 1988 and 1989 Big Ten Championship teams. While competing for the Columbus Gymnastics Center, he won the Indiana State all-around title eight times and was the 1984 AAU Junior Olympic National parallel bar champion. He was named the 1984 Indiana Outstanding Athlete over such notables as Indiana basketball legend, 1984 Olympic Gold Medalist and current UCLA basketball head coach Steve Alford.
