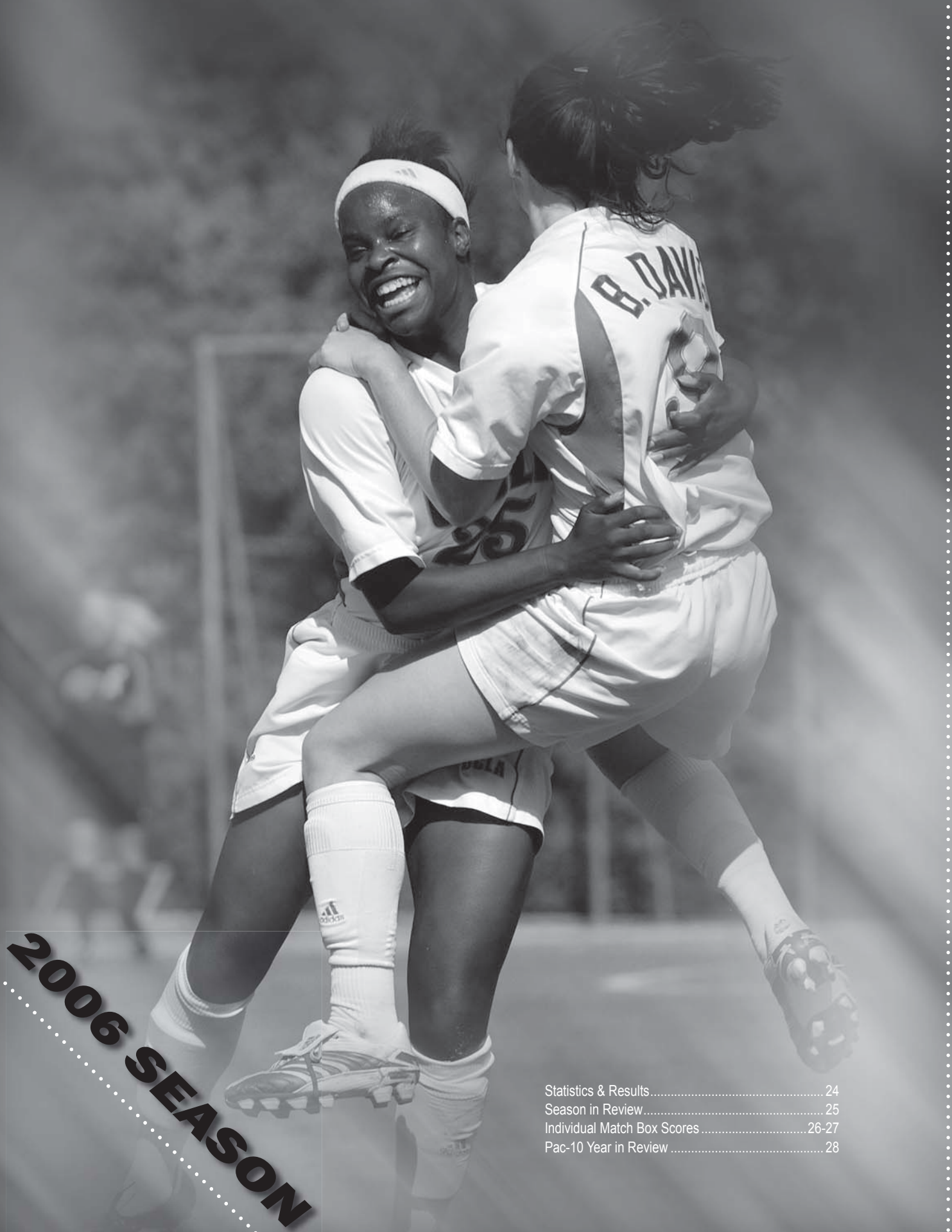

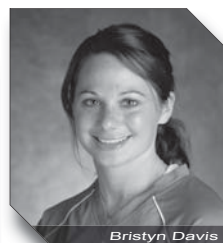

Bruins Reach 20-Win Mark For Second-Straight Season

UCLA ended the season with a 21-4 overall record, making it the second year in a row that the Bruins have reached the 20-win mark (the Bruins were 22-2-2 in 2005). It was also the fourth 20-win season in Jillian Ellis' eight years as head coach.

UCLA in the Final Rankings

The Bruins ended the season ranked No. 3 in the four polls issued by NSCAA/adidas, Soccer America, Soccer Buzz and Soccer Times. It marked UCLA's fourth-straight top 5 finish in the NSCAA/adidas Coaches' Poll. The Bruins have finished in the top 10 the last seven years.

UCLA Makes History With Fourth-Straight Conference Title

UCLA became the first school in Pac-10 history to win four-straight conference championships, as the Bruins defeated Oregon State, 4-0 in the final match of the regular season, clinching the 2006 title. The Bruins, who have now won the Pac-10 championship seven of the 13 years it has been contested, ended the conference season with an 8-1 record.

Postseason Run Ends in Another College Cup Appearance

UCLA, which was making its ninth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, began the Championships as the No. 2 seed in its region. UCLA opened up with a pair of dominating victories over UNLV (6-1) and Cal State Fullerton (3-1) in the first and second rounds respectively. Those wins set up a meeting with No. 16 Florida in the round of 16. Goals from Danesha Adams, Christina DiMartino, and eventually Lauren Cheney proved to be the difference, as the Bruins edged the Gators, 3-2 to advance to the quarterfinals. The Bruins' opponent in the quarterfinals was No. 6 Portland, a team UCLA owned a three-game winning streak over. With the score tied 1-1, a Cheney penalty kick in the 70th minute booked UCLA's ticket to Cary, N.C. - site of the NCAA College Cup. UCLA entered the Final Four as the only team in the nation making its fourth-straight appearance. Playing in front of a large, partisan crowd, North Carolina ended UCLA's season with a 2-0 victory. The Tar Heels went on to win the tournament.

Cheney Good as Advertised

After earning nearly every national player of the year honor in high school, a lot was expected of No. 1 recruit Lauren Cheney heading into her freshman season. She didn't disappoint, leading the Pac-10 in scoring with 39 points on 19 goals and one assist. Her goals also came when it mattered most, as she led the Bruins with eight game-winning goals. For her efforts, the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year was named a first-team NSCAA/adidas All-American. She also took home National Freshman of the Year honors from Soccer Buzz.

Three UCLA Players Earn All-America Honors

In addition to Lauren Cheney, sophomore Christina DiMartino and junior Danesha Adams also earned All-America honors. DiMartino was actually the most recognized Bruin All-American, as she swept first-team honors from NSCAA/adidas, Soccer America and Soccer Buzz. Adams, who was a second-team NSCAA/adidas All-American in 2005, took home third-team honors last season.

Seven Bruins Named All-Pac-10

Headlined by first-team selections Christina DiMartino, Lauren Cheney and Danesha Adams, UCLA had a total of seven players earn All-Pac-10 honors in 2006. Goalkeeper Valerie Henderson took home second-team honors, while defender Erin Hardy and midfielder Stacy Lindstrom earned honorable mention acclaim. Forward Kristina Larsen was named to the Pac-10 All-Freshman Team.

Injuries Derail UCLA's Championship Hopes

Forward Kara Lang and defender Mary Castelanelli both suffered season-ending injuries last year, making UCLA's title run extremely difficult. After leading the team in scoring as a freshman in 2005, Lang was heading into her sophomore season with high hopes until suffering a serious knee injury while training with Canada in the offseason. She ended up spending the entire year on the bench. Castelanelli, on the other hand, started the first nine matches of the year until her season came to an end with a knee injury against Pepperdine on Sept. 24. As a senior, Castelanelli was the veteran leader of UCLA's rather young back line.

Home Unbeaten Streak Moves to 27

UCLA went 16-0 at home in 2006, pushing its home unbeaten streak to 27. The last time the Bruins were defeated at home was back on Sept. 9, 2005 in a 1-0 double-overtime loss to Penn State. UCLA's home winning streak stands at 22.

Bruins Honored for Work in the Classroom

In addition to their efforts on the field, four Bruin players earned All-Pac-10 Academic honors in 2006. Defender Mary Castelanelli and midfielder Catherine Calvert were named to the second team, while goalkeeper Valerie Henderson and midfielder Christina DiMartino were honorable mention selections. Castelanelli was also named to the ESPN The Magazine All-Academic Third Team. Henderson was named a Scholar Athlete by NSCAA/adidas.

UCLA's Los Angeles Dominance Continues

UCLA defeated USC for the seventh-straight time in 2006, improving its overall record against its cross-town rival to 15-2-1. With the scored tied at 1-1, senior Stacy Lindstrom headed in a Bristyn Davis cross in the first overtime period (98th minute) to give the Bruins the victory. It marked the third-straight overtime win for the Bruins in the series.

National Team Invites Impact Bruins' Season

U.S. National Team commitments impacted the Bruins in several ways last season. First and foremost, UCLA played the first four matches of the season without five players who were competing at the FIFA Under-20 World Championships in Russia. UCLA had more players involved in the event than any other college, as Christina DiMartino, Lauren Cheney, Erin Hardy, Valerie Henderson and Danesha Adams were all part of the Under-20 U.S. squad. Adams also missed two more matches when she was brought in with the U.S. Women's National Team for a friendly against Chinese Taipei. She earned her first cap in that match, also registering an assist after coming in as a substitute in the 75th minute.
