Needing a win on the final day of the regular season to clinch the 2005 Pac-10 title, the UCLA women's soccer team scored with just 30 seconds remaining to defeat Arizona State, 2-1 on Nov. 6 at Drake Stadium. It marked the Bruins' third conference title in a row.

UCLA Claims Third Pac-10 Title in a Row

Bruins advance to NCAA title match for second-consecutive year

Bruins Fall to top-ranked Portland in NCAA title match

Just one year removed from a heart-breaking loss to Notre Dame in the 2004 NCAA Final, the Bruins found themselves on the verge of capturing the championship yet again in 2005. UCLA advanced to last year's title match as arguably the hottest team in the country, outscoring its competition 25-0 in five previous rounds heading into the final. Portland, however, proved why it was the No. 1-ranked team heading into the tournament, as the Pilots handed the Bruins a 4-0 loss in the title match at Texas A&M's Aggie Soccer Stadium. UCLA advanced to the final with victories over Mississippi Valley State (1st Rd.), Colorado (2nd Rd.), Marquette (Rd. of 16), Virginia (QF) and Florida State (SF). Danesha Adams, Iris Mora and Jill Oakes were all named to the NCAA All-Tournament Team at the conclusion of the championships.

UCLA in the Rankings

The Bruins checked in at No. 3 in the final polls released by NSCAA/adidas and *Soccer Buzz*. UCLA ended up at No. 4 in the *Soccer America* poll that is released prior to the NCAA Tournament.

Third Pac-10 Title in a Row Brought Back to Westwood

Needing a victory in its final match of the regular season to claim the Pac-10 title outright, UCLA clinched the conference championship with

a 2-1 victory over Arizona State at Drake Stadium on Nov. 6. Sophomore Danesha Adams scored the go-ahead-goal in the 90th minute to give UCLA the win. The Bruins, who secured the Pac-10's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament with the win, claimed the title for the third year in a row. UCLA ended the conference season with a 7-0-2 record.

Team and Individual Records Broken in 2005

As a team, UCLA set four single-season school records in 2005, including: consecutive games unbeaten (19), shutouts (17), assists (58) and victories (22). Individually, goalkeeper Valerie Henderson set the single-season school record for wins with 20. Forward Iris Mora broke her own single-season assist record of 14 set in 2003, finishing with 15.

Several Bruins Garner All-America Acclaim

First-team NSCAA/adidas All-American Jill Oakes headlined a group of four Bruins to earn All-America honors in 2005. Midfielder Danesha Adams and goalkeeper Valerie Henderson were named to the second team, while forward Kara Lang earned honorable mention accolades from *Soccer Buzz*. In addition, Lang and Christina DiMartino were named *Soccer Buzz* Freshman All-Americans.

Oakes, Mora Cap Off Stellar UCLA Careers in 2005

Defender Jill Oakes and forward Iris Mora were named two of 15 semifinalists for the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy in 2005, given annually to the top player in the nation. Although neither won the award, both finished off their senior seasons in tremendous fashion. Mora left UCLA as the second-leading scorer in school history with 104 points (33g, 38a). Her 38 career assists is also a UCLA record. Oakes proved why she was considered one of the top defensive players in the country last season, helping the Bruins post a school record 17 shutouts. She posted results on the offensive side of the field as well, ending the year with 12 points on three goals and six assists.

All-Pac-10 Honors Announced

Midfielders Jill Oakes, Danesha Adams, and goalkeeper Valerie Henderson all earned first-team All-Pac-10 honors in 2005. Forward Iris Mora was a second-team selection, while midfielder Christina DiMartino, defender Mary Castelanelli and forward Kara Lang were named honorable mention. In addition, DiMartino, Lang and Erin Hardy were named to the first-ever All-Freshman team. Castelanelli and Henderson were also honored for their outstanding work in the classroom, as both were named honorable mention All-Pac-10 Academic.

Freshmen Emerge as Future of Bruin Soccer

Headlined by Kara Lang, Christina DiMartino and Erin Hardy, UCLA's freshman class turned in some impressive results in 2005. Lang ranked second on the team in scoring with 40 points (17g, 6a), while DiMartino was the only freshman to start all 26 matches. Hardy played and started every match but one in the back, helping UCLA surrender just 12 goals all season. In addition to those three, the Zerbini sisters (Blake and McCall), Caitlyn Mac Kechnie, and Catherine Calvert all appeared in at least 14 matches.

UCLA Makes it Six Straight Over Cross-Town Rival USC

UCLA turned in one of its most thrilling victories in recent memory last season, rallying from a two-goal deficit to come back and defeat cross-town rival USC, 3-2 in double-overtime at Drake Stadium on Oct. 7. Down 2-0 at the half, the Bruins came out for the second half on fire, scoring twice in the 53rd minute to tie the game at 2-2. No team was able to score through the end of regulation and the first overtime period. However, with less than three minutes remaining in the second overtime period, Iris Mora scored to give UCLA the 3-2 victory. It marked the Bruins' sixth-straight win over the Women of Troy, and extended UCLA's unbeaten streak against USC to nine.
