12TH-SEEDED BRUINS HOST REGIONALS AT EASTON STADIUM

The 12th-seeded Bruins (36-18, 12-12 Pac-12) host NCAA Regionals this weekend at Easton Stadium. On Friday, UCLA faces Hofstra (38-13, 19-0 Colonial Athletic Association) at 5:30 p.m. Gametracker and free audio will be available at UCLABruins.com, as well as live updates at twitter.com/uclasoftball.

ON DECK

If the Bruins advance through the Los Angeles Regional, they will take on the winner of the Gainesville Regional next weekend, which includes #5-seed Florida, South Florida, UCF and Florida Gulf Coast.

BRUINS IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Through the end of the regular season, the Bruins are the nation's leader in slugging percentage at .586 and are also in the Top 10 in four other categories. UCLA is fourth in batting average (.343) and home runs (81), fifth in runs per game (6.8) and tied for sixth in doubles (86). Individually, freshman Stephany LaRosa is in the Top 30 nationally in five categories, ranking 10th in batting average (.445), tied for 15th in runs batted in (60), tied for 19th in sacrifice flies (4), 24th in slugging percentage (.815) and tied for 26th in home runs (16). Senior Katie Schroeder is tied for 12th in runs scored (59), 23rd in on base percentage (.524), 33rd in batting average (.412) and tied for 49th in doubles (14). Also in the Top 50 nationally in their respective categories are seniors Samantha Camuso (slugging, .767, 33rd) and Dani Yudin (walks, 43, T-19th), and sophomore Jessica Hall (saves, 4, T-15th).

BRUINS IN NCAA REGIONAL PLAY

UCLA is making its 28th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and holds a record of 177-42 (.808 winning percentage). During the Regional round, the Bruins are 78-10 (.886) and have gone undefeated 19 of 27 times. Since Regional play moved to a four-team format in 2005, the Bruins are 20-5 (.800), advancing to the Super Regionals in '05, '06, '08, '09 and '10. The Bruins will be hosting an NCAA Regional for the 18th time in 28 tournament appearances. UCLA is 47-3 (.940) in 17 previous Regionals at Easton Stadium and 56-6 (.903) overall during postseason games in Westwood. Seniors Samantha Camuso (.382), Andrea Harrison (.333) and Katie Schroeder (.328), and junior B.B. Bates (.302) are each hitting over .300 during their NCAA Tournament careers. Camuso has 10 homers and 25 RBI, while Harrison has seven homers and 21 RBI. Career stats for the Bruins in the postseason are available on page eight of this release.

NEWS AND NOTES

Head coach Kelly Inouye-Perez recorded her 250th-career coaching victory against Utah on April 20 ... along with their Pac-12-best .343 batting average (through May 12), the Bruins are also first in the conference in slugging (.586), hits (493), doubles (86), home runs (81) and total bases (842). The full listing of UCLA team and individual standings in the Pac-12 is available on page five of this release ... the Bruins saw their 87-game winning streak when scoring at least six runs come to an end in the first game of the April 10 doubleheader against Stanford. It was the most runs for UCLA in a defeat since May 6, 2000 at Arizona (lost 12-9 in nine innings). UCLA lost again on May 6 against Arizona when scoring six and are now 95-2 in its last 97 when scoring at least a half a dozen ... UCLA is 22-0 this season when limiting its opponent to two runs or fewer ... the Bruins are 24-0 when leading after five innings and 22-0 when leading after six. Starting with the 2008 season, UCLA is 146-1 when ahead after five (only loss vs. Florida, 2/25/11) and 134-1 when ahead after six (Washington, 4/23/11) ... the Bruins are 0-14 this year when getting out-hit or tied in hits ... 38 of the Bruins' 81 home runs have been solo shots. The third inning has been the best

for homers, as the Bruins have 23, with the first frame ranking second with 20 dingers ... senior Katie Schroeder is in the UCLA career top 10 in seven categories, ranking second in runs scored (199), third in stolen bases (50), tied for third in hit by pitches (32), fourth in on base percentage (.478) and walks (115), sixth in hits (272) and tied for seventh in batting average (.374). Senior Andrea Harrison is listed six times, coming in at fourth in slugging (.655), home runs (54) and total bases (461), fifth in runs batted in (187), sixth in doubles (48) and seventh in hit by pitches (19). Senior Dani Yudin is tied for second in walks (121), sixth in on base percentage (.444) and eighth in hit by pitches (18), senior Samantha Camuso is seventh in slugging (.602) and sophomore Jessica Hall is third in saves (6) ... freshman Ally Carda has earned a win and produced at least a pair of hits in the same game six times (Loyola Marymount, Fordham, Pittsburgh, UC Santa Barbara, Cal Poly, Stanford-Game 3) ... Camuso recorded her first-career, two-homer game on May 6 against Arizona. She has 33 for her career and double figures for the second time in her career (16 in 2010) ... sophomore Talee Snow has nine multiple-hit contests and six multi-RBI games, including one of each on May 10 at Oregon ... Stephany LaRosa's 16 home runs are the second most by a freshman in a single season at UCLA. Stacey Nueman holds the record with 20 in 1997. Nueman also holds the UCLA single-season freshman mark in average (.457) and RBI (71), with LaRosa at .445 with 60 RBI ... Hall's four saves tie her for second on UCLA's single-season list with Christa Williams (1997). Megan Langenfeld holds the record with five saves in 2008 ... Harrison is one homer away from tying for third in UCLA history (Caitlin Benyi, 55). She has reached double figures in dingers for the third straight season ... junior B.B. Bates leads the Bruins with nine game-winning RBI and seven game-winning runs scored, and hit her 30th career homer on May 12 at Oregon ... sophomore Kellie Fox recorded her fourth-career, three-hit game in the first end of an April 10 doubleheader against Stanford and is four hits away from 100 for her career ... Schroeder stole her 50th career base on May 10 at Oregon. She is two doubles away from 40 and one run scored away from 200 ... sophomore Alyssa Tiimalu hit her 11th career home run on May 4 against Arizona ... Yudin drove in her 100th career run on May 10 at Oregon.

SCOUTING THE HOFSTRA PRIDE

After starting the year 4-12, Hofstra, which is making its 13th NCAA appearance, has won 34 of its last 35 games heading into the postseason, including 17 in a row. The Pride (38-13) went 3-0 last weekend to win the Colonial Athletic Association Tournament after going 19-0 in the CAA this season. Hofstra is 4-7 against teams that made the NCAA Tournament, beating Virginia Tech, LIU Brooklyn, Iona and Lehigh. Five of its seven losses were to ranked foes, including a setback to UCLA on March 4. The Pride carry a .301 batting average with 42 home runs and 39 stolen bases, averaging 5.7 runs per game. Olivia Galati leads Hofstra at the plate and in the circle. The junior is batting .370 with four homers and 37 RBI, and is 30-5 with a 0.90 earned run average and 331 strikeouts in 232 2/3 innings. Four others are hitting over .300, including junior Tessa Ziemba, who is tied for the team lead with 11 homers and is first with 43 RBI, and junior Becca Bigler, who also has 11 homers. The Bruins lead the all-time series with the Pride 3-1, defeating them on March 4 in Lake Buena Vista, Fla. (box score and recap on page 7). The teams have never met in the NCAA Tournament and all four matchups have come at neutral sites.

SCOUTING THE FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES

The Seminoles are headed to their 13th-straight NCAA Regional (25th overall) after closing the regular season with a 46-14 record, finishing second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 16-5 mark. Florida State is 14-11 against teams in the NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles were 2-5 against squads currently ranked in the Top 25, beating North Carolina twice, while losing to Hawai'i twice, North Carolina, South Florida and Florida. Florida State is hitting .268 as a team with 31 home runs and 81 stolen bases, averaging 4.7 runs per game. Junior Tiffani Brown and sophomore Courtney Senas are each hitting .305 to pace the team. Brown has 42 stolen bases, while Senas has 19. Junior Briana Hamilton is tops on the squad with 11 home runs. In the circle, freshman Lacey Waldrop and junior Monica Perry have split the action. Waldrop is 19-5 with a 1.35 earned run average and 137 strikeouts in 160 1/3 innings, while Perry is 21-5 with a 1.64 ERA and 188 strikeouts in 174 2/3 innings. The Bruins lead the all-time series with the Seminoles 8-1, but the teams haven't met since 2002 at the Women's College World Series, with Florida State winning 2-1 in nine innings. The teams have met five times in the postseason, with UCLA going 4-1, including a pair of victories at the Los Angeles Regional in 2000.

SCOUTING THE SAN DIEGO STATE AZTECS

The Aztecs (30-22) earned the Mountain West Conference's automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament after going 9-3 in league play. San Diego State, which is making its eighth NCAA Tournament appearance, is 7-11 against teams that made the NCAA Tournament and 1-10 versus squads that are currently ranked in the Top 25 (lone win vs. Oregon State). The Aztecs are hitting .296 as a team with 58 home runs and 35 stolen bases, averaging 5.0 runs per game. Sophomore Hayley Miles is tops on the team with a .446 average, 20 home runs and 49 runs batted in. Five others are hitting better than .300, including sophomores Lorena Klopp (13) and Patrice Jackson (11), who each have double figures in homers. Junior Rebecca Arbino and senior Bailey Micetich have split the action in the circle. Arbino is 13-10 with a 2.09 ERA and 101 strikeouts in 154 innings, while Micetich is 15-7 with a 2.68 ERA and 170 strikeouts in 149 innings. The Bruins have won 55 straight against the Aztecs and lead the series 62-2, winning at SDSU 1-0 on February 19 (box score and recap on page 7). The teams have met four times in the NCAA Tournament, with UCLA winning all four matchups.

RECAPPING THE OREGON SERIES**Saturday - Oregon 8, UCLA 2**

Junior B.B. Bates hit a two-out, two-run homer in the top of the first for the 14th-ranked Bruins, but #12 Oregon scored eight unanswered to post an 8-2 victory in the regular-season finales for both teams on Saturday at Howe Field.

UCLA had six hits as a team, as freshman Stephany LaRosa posted a pair of infield singles.

Sophomore Jessica Hall (19-12), struck out six in six innings, allowing eight runs (seven earned), eight hits and two walks.

The Bruins scored a pair of runs in their first at-bat. Senior Katie Schroeder led off with a slap single to second base, moved to second on a sacrifice by LaRosa and advanced to third on a ground out to second off the bat of senior Andrea Harrison. Bates followed with her 14th homer of the season to left-center to make it 2-0.

Oregon responded with five in its half of the first. Janie Takeda struck out to start the inning, but reached first on a passed ball on strike three. A walk to Kaylan Howard and an infield bunt single for Kelsey Chambers loaded the bases for Kailee Cuico, who hit a grand slam to center to put the Ducks up 4-2. One out later, Christie Nieto homered to right to make it 5-2.

Thanks to a couple of Duck miscues, the Bruins had a chance in the fourth, but could not edge closer. With one out, sophomore Kellie Fox reached when a grounder to Chambers at short went through her legs. Senior Dani Yudin followed with a single up the middle, as Fox took third and Yudin moved up to second on a fielding error by Takeda in center. But Oregon pitcher Jessica Moore struck out freshman Ally Carda and sophomore Talee Snow to end the threat.

Oregon rallied with two outs in its half of the fourth. Takeda drew a walk, stole second and scored on a single up the middle by Howard to make it 6-2.

The Ducks added two more in the fifth. Chambers singled up the middle and came home one out later on a homer to right off the bat of Samantha Pappas to make it 8-2.

UCLA had one more look at the game in the sixth, as the visitors drew three walks to senior Samantha Camuso, Yudin and Snow, but Schroeder popped up to third to end the inning.

Friday - Oregon 3, UCLA 2

Junior B.B. Bates broke up the no-hitter and the shutout with a two-out, two-run double in the sixth inning, but the 14th-ranked Bruins dropped a 3-2 decision to #12 Oregon on Friday at Howe Field.

Bates and Fox on a leadoff single in the seventh were the only Bruins to record hits. In the circle, freshman Ally Carda (13-5) started and struck out one in 2 1/3 innings, allowing two runs, three hits and one walk. She posted a 1-2-3 inning in the first. Sophomore Jessica Hall tossed 3 2/3 frames of relief, fanning three and giving up one run, three hits and one walk. She recorded a 1-2-3 inning in the sixth.

The Ducks scored first with a pair in the third. Alexa Peterson led off the inning with a check-swing single down the right-field line and Allie Burger slapped a single down the left-field line. Janie Takeda then tapped a ball to short, as Fox went to the third-base bag to force Sara Goodrum, who was running for Peterson. But Kaylan Howard followed with a double to the base of the center-field wall, scoring Burger and Takeda to make it 2-0.

Oregon added one more run in the fourth, but could have had more, as the Bruins got lucky to keep it a three-run game. Samantha Pappas led off with a double-to left-center, stole third and scored when sophomore Alyssa Tiumalu's throw went into left field to make it 3-0. After a hit by pitch of Christie Nieto and a single to left-center by Jessica Moore, Peterson tried to bunt the runners over, but Hall went to third to get the force of Nieto. Burger then slapped a ball to the 5-6 hole, which went off the glove of a diving Fox. But the sophomore had the presence of mind to get up and throw to third to force Moore for the second out.

Takeda grounded a ball to second, but sophomore Talee Snow bobbled it to extend the inning and load the bases for the Ducks. Howard then hit a high pop up on the infield, but the ball landed untouched. However, the ball spun back into foul ground before anyone touched it for an interesting foul ball. Howard would end up lining out to center, as senior Katie Schroeder dove to her knees to make the catch and end the inning.

The Bruins rallied to score two with two outs in the sixth to give them 20 runs in the sixth inning over the last five games. Freshman Stephany LaRosa drew a walk and the inning was extended when senior Andrea Harrison reached on a booted ball at second. Bates then recorded the first Bruin hit of the ball game, going the opposite way and getting one down just inside the left-field chalk line to plate LaRosa and Harrison to make it 3-2. Senior Samantha Camuso was walked intentionally to put a pair of runners on, but senior Dani Yudin was struck out to end the inning.

Thursday - UCLA 10, Oregon 0 (6 innings)

Eight of the nine Bruin starters had at least one hit, a pair of pitchers combined on a three-hitter in the circle and 14th-ranked UCLA played flawless defense in a 10-0, six-inning victory at #12 Oregon on Thursday at Howe Field.

Senior Katie Schroeder had three hits, sophomore Talee Snow added two hits and a pair of RBI and senior Samantha Camuso had a grand slam.

In the circle, sophomore Jessica Hall struck out five in five innings to improve to 19-11 on the season. She allowed just two hits and two walks. All five of Hall's strikeouts came in a row, with two to end the first and three in the second, as the sophomore retired the first seven of the ballgame. Freshman Ally Carda tossed the last inning, striking out one and giving up one hit and one walk.

After four scoreless innings, the Bruins got on the board in the fifth. With one out, sophomore Kellie Fox reached on a bunt single down the first-base line and scored on a double to right-center by Snow to make it 1-0.

In the bottom of the fifth, UCLA had a pair of great defensive plays to keep the Ducks off the pond. Freshman third baseman Stephany LaRosa snared a line drive off the bat of Jessica Moore to start the inning. One out later, and with a runner at first following a single, Kaylan Howard hit a soft liner to the second-base bag, which was caught by a diving Snow to end the inning.

In the sixth, the Bruins sent 12 to the plate and scored nine times to break it open. Junior B.B. Bates opened the inning with a bunt single to third and moved to second on a walk to Camuso. Senior Dani Yudin followed with a double to left-center to plate Bates to make it 2-0, as freshman Tara Mueller, who was running for Camuso took third. A single to center by sophomore Alyssa Tiumalu brought home Mueller with the Bruins' third run. After freshman

Kaelin Sprawls, who was running for Tiumalu, moved to second on a ground out, Snow laid down a perfect squeeze bunt, as Yudin scampered home to make it 4-0.

Schroeder then singled to right to score Sprawls to increase the advantage to 5-0. One out later, the Bruins loaded the bases on a single up the middle by senior Andrea Harrison and a free pass to Bates would force home Snow with the Bruins' sixth run. Camuso then capped the inning with a grand slam to left-center, her 13th homer of the year, to make it 10-0.

Yudin was hit by a pitch on the first offering of the inning and was pinch-run for by freshman Sam Duran, who moved to second on a sacrifice by Carda and advanced to third on a grounder to the circle from Reed. Aztec pitcher Arbino was then called for an illegal pitch when she started her windup and then stopped, which awarded Duran the next base to put UCLA up 1-0.

Hall's no-hitter was broken up in the bottom of the fifth with two outs, as Kristin May singled to right-center for the home squad's first hit.

In the bottom of the sixth, the Aztecs had back-to-back, one-out singles by Miles and Tiffany Corder. But Jackson grounded a hot shot to third, as LaRosa stepped on the bag for one and threw across to double up Jackson and end the inning.

Senior Dani Yudin, sophomores Jessica Hall and Talee Snow and freshman Stephany LaRosa each had two hits, while Hall pitched 5 1/3 innings of scoreless relief, as the 14th-ranked Bruins completed the Citrus Classic with a 9-4 win on Sunday over Hofstra.

The Bruins improve to 14-6 overall and went 3-2 on the weekend, while the Pride fall to 2-11.

LaRosa and senior Andrea Harrison both homered, with Harrison driving in three and LaRosa plating two. Snow and freshman Ally Carda also drove in two runs apiece. Every UCLA starter had at least one hit.

One out later, Carda singled to right to plate Bates and junior Devon Lindvall, who was running for Camuso, to up the lead to 4-0. Yudin and Carda, who each moved up a base on the throw home, both scored on a single to left by Snow to make it 6-0.

Hofstra came back with four in the top of the second, matching the 10 batters to the plate UCLA had sent up in the first. Erin Trippi led off with a double to right-center, moved to third on a wild pitch and was pinch-run for by Krista Thorn. After a walk to Rocha, Michelle Lavagnino lined a shot to third, which tipped off LaRosa's glove and was thrown away at first, allowing Thorn to score, Rocha to move to third and Lavagnino to advance to second. Rachael Senatore followed with a single up the middle to score Rocha to make it 6-2. After a ground out moved Senatore to second, Olivia Galati grounded a ball to third, but Lavagnino just beat the tag at the plate to bring in the Pride's third run. A wild pitch would then score Senatore to make it 6-4.

Kelly Inouye-Perez is beginning her sixth season as the Bruins' head coach in 2012 and has an overall record of 219-68 (.763).

Last year, UCLA recorded a 36-19 mark and tied for sixth in the Pac-10 (9-12). Nine Bruins were honored on the all-conference teams, while Andrea Harrison was named first-team All-Region and All-American. Inouye-Perez earned her 200th career victory on March 11 against Sacramento State.

In 2010, Inouye-Perez led the UCLA softball program to its 12th national title and 11th NCAA championship in 2010. The Bruins (50-11) went a perfect 10-0 in the postseason, including 5-0 at the Women's College World Series. UCLA set numerous WCWS records, including the most home runs in one tournament with 14. Megan Langenfeld was named the Most Outstanding Player of the WCWS, while Harrison and Samantha Camuso each earned All-Tournament honors. Following the season, Inouye-Perez and her staff were honored as the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year.

UCLA set single-season school records for home runs, slugging, on base percentage and walks. Langenfeld and

GiOnna DiSalvatore were each named to the NFCA All-America first-team. The Bruins also had three players named to the All-Region team and 10 honored by the Pac-10.

In 2009, she led the Bruins to a Pacific-10 Conference Championship, as UCLA went 45-11 overall and 16-5 in league play. She was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year and earned her 100th career victory on Feb. 22 against Maryland. In 2008, the Bruins went 51-9 and advanced to the Women's College World Series, finishing second in the Pac-10 with a 17-4 record. In her first season at the helm of UCLA in 2007, Inouye-Perez posted a 37-18 overall record and a 12-9 Pac-10 mark (t-3rd).

Over Inouye-Perez's five seasons, the Bruins have earned 12 All-American awards, 19 All-Region honors and 39 All-Pac-10 accolades.

Inouye-Perez, just the third head coach in UCLA softball history, officially took over the reins from Sue Enquist on Jan. 1, 2007. Enquist announced her retirement as head coach on Sept. 26, 2006.

No stranger to the Bruin dugout, Inouye-Perez starts her 24th straight season in Westwood in 2012. She is a link to four decades of Bruin softball success, joining the UCLA softball program as a freshman in 1989. Inouye-Perez's time is highlighted by seven NCAA Championships and eight Pac-10 titles in her previous 23 years, spending five campaigns as a player and 13 as an assistant coach.

Over Inouye-Perez's 13 seasons (1994-2006) as an assistant coach, UCLA was 617-150-1 (.804) and appeared in the NCAA title game seven times, winning the NCAA Championship in the 1999, 2003 and 2004 seasons. The Bruins also won three Pac-10 titles during that span (1999, 2002, 2006) and in 2004 were named the National Coaching Staff of the Year by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

Inouye-Perez's primary responsibility as an assistant coach was guiding the Bruin pitchers and catchers, a list which includes many of the most honored and recognizable names in collegiate softball. Behind the dish, where Inouye-Perez also starred as a three-time All-Pac-10 honoree during her playing days at UCLA, she helped mold and influence arguably the best catcher in the history

of USA Softball in Stacey Nuveman. Under Inouye-Perez's tutelage, Nuveman became a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year, four-time, first-team All-American and the NCAA's all-time single season and career home run leader.

Since the Pac-10 Conference began issuing a Pitcher of the Year Award, UCLA has been honored with two winners, Courtney Dale in 1999 and Keira Goerl in 2003. Among the other pitching highlights accomplished by the Bruins over her 13 years as an assistant included at least one All-American award earned by a UCLA pitcher in 12 of those campaigns, including DeeDee Weiman, four-time Olympian Tanya Harding and two-time Olympian Amanda Freed.

In addition, nearly every UCLA pitching record has been set during the time Inouye-Perez has overseen the Bruin battery and the top four pitchers on UCLA's career wins list, Goerl, Selden, Freed and B'Ann Burns, were coached by her.

Inouye-Perez was an exceptionally strong fielder behind the dish for the Bruins. She made her mark immediately as a collegiate player, earning first-team All-Pac-10 as a true freshman and second-team as a sophomore, leading the Bruins to the 1989 and 1990 NCAA Championships before receiving a medical redshirt in 1991 due to shoulder surgery.

She came back strong in 1992, picking up second-team All-Pac-10 honors as the Bruins once again won the national championship and finished with a 54-2 record, the fewest losses in a season in program history. Inouye-Perez also was named to the 1992 All-Women's College World Series Team, going 5-for-12 (.417) with four RBI during WCWS play. She wrapped up her career as a fifth-year senior in 1993 with an NCAA runner-up finish. Impressively, Inouye-Perez did not commit a single fielding error during her final two seasons.

Among the UCLA pitchers during her five seasons as a player were Lisa Longaker and Lisa Fernandez, both of whom were named to the NCAA's 25th Anniversary All-WCWS Team. During her UCLA career, Inouye-Perez played in 22 Women's College World Series games, a mark that is tied for third-best in UCLA history behind only Lisa Fernandez and Kristy Howard (23). Inouye-Perez graduated from UCLA in 1993 with a B.A. in psychology and earned her master's degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific University in 2004.

Prior to college, Inouye-Perez was one of the top players during her ASA days, winning four national championships, with the Panthers (1984, '85 and '89) and the Raiders (1986). She also competed on an international level in Japan in 1985 and in Peru in 1987 (Pan American Tournament) and followed her collegiate career with time playing on the NPF Pro Tour.

Inouye-Perez and her husband, Gerardo Perez, currently reside in Cerritos. Along with Kelly's exploits on the diamond, Gerardo competed as a catcher/DH for Cerritos College from 1988-90 and helped lead the Falcons to the 1989 Junior College National Championship. After a stellar career at Cerritos, he went on to compete at Loyola Marymount, earning first-team All-West Coast Conference honors his junior and senior seasons. He currently teaches health and coaches baseball at Gahr High School in Cerritos. The couple has two children, Michael (12) and Kylie (7).

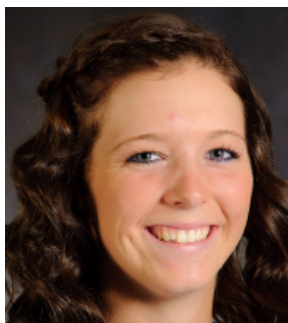
