The defending national champion and 14th-ranked Bruins (33-17, 9-12 Pac-10) travel to the Gainesville, Fla. Regional this weekend, facing Jacksonville (43-14, 18-2 Atlantic Sun) in their first game on Friday at 12:30 p.m. PT. The winner of the Gainesville Regional will take on the winner of the University Park, Pa. Regional, which features #13-seed Oregon, Fordham, Penn State and Albany, next weekend in Super Regionals. The Super Regional round is a best 2-of-3 and will take place either May 27-28 or May 28-29.

NINE BRUINS HONORED ON ALL-PAC-10 TEAMS

Six Bruins were honored on the All-Pacific-10 Conference teams on Wednesday, while all four UCLA freshmen were named to the All-Freshmen squad.

Junior Andrea Harrison and freshman Kellie Fox were named All-Pac-10 first team, senior GiOnna DiSalvatore was honored on the second team and senior Donna Kerr, junior Katie Schroeder and sophomore B.B. Bates were named honorable mention.

Fox, Jessica Hall and Alyssa Tiumalu were honored on the All-Freshmen Team, while Talee Snow was honorable mention.

Harrison earned her second-straight, first-team honor and her third overall conference nod after receiving honorable mention accolades as a freshman.

Fox is the first UCLA freshman since Anjelica Selden in 2005 to earn first-team honors in her initial season in Westwood.

DiSalvatore is the 23rd Bruin to receive four all-conference selections. She was named second team in 2008 and 2009 and first team last season.

Kerr (honorable mention in '08 and '10) and Schroeder (honorable mention in '08 and first team in '09) each earned their third All-Pac-10 awards, while it was Bates' first accolade.

NEWS AND NOTES

Senior GiOnna DiSalvatore is UCLA's all-time leader in doubles with 63, breaking the record held by Tairia Mims (59) on April 9 against Stanford. She also has the best walk-to-strikeout ratio on the team, having walked (26) 2 1/2 times more than she's struck out (10) ... with two more starts, senior Donna Kerr will have 100 for her career. Kerr has pitched in 11 of the last 13 games and has fanned at least seven in 11 of her 31 appearances this season ... junior Samantha Camuso is day-to-day with a lower body injury. She has started her last four games at second base, the first four of her career, and has hits in four of her last seven contests ... junior Andrea Harrison has hits in nine of her last 12 games, batting .385 during that stretch. Her 18 multiple-hit games are the most on the squad and of her 50 games started, 36 have come in left field and 14 at first base ... freshman Talee Snow leads all Pac-10 players with 11 sacrifice hits. She is one of five regulars to have more walks (15) than strikeouts (10), joining DiSalvatore, Harrison (28/17), junior Dani Yudin (26/15) and freshman Kellie Fox (28/26) ... sophomore Destiny Rodino has started twice in

each of the last two weekends. She has won four of her seven career starts, including May 8 against Arizona when she allowed only one run in five-plus innings ... freshman Jessica Hall earned her 16th win of the season on Friday at Oregon. She is looking to become the first Bruin freshman to lead the team in wins since Anjelica Selden in 2005 ... sophomore B.B. Bates hit cleanup for the first two times in her collegiate career on Friday and Saturday at Oregon. She hit a pair of three-run homers last weekend and has doubled her freshman total for long balls with 10 this season ... with her 11th home run on May 6 against Arizona, Fox has the second-most homers by a freshman in a single season at UCLA. She surpassed Julie Adams (1996), Claire Sua (2001) and Emily Zaplatosch (2003), who hit 10 in their first years in Westwood. The UCLA freshman record for homers is 20 by Stacey Nuveam in 1997 ... after 167 straight starts in center field, junior Katie Schroeder made her first collegiate start in right on Saturday at Oregon. She has hits in 22 of her last 29 games, batting .358 during that stretch ... freshman Alyssa Tiumalu is one homer away from joining Fox in double digits after hitting her ninth on May 8 against Arizona. She is currently fourth on the squad in home runs, slugging (.561) and sacrifice hits (4) ... sophomore Devon Lindvall has a four-game hitting streak and belted her second homer in as many weekends on Friday at Oregon. She has made 25 starts at five different positions (13 in LF, 7 at DP, 3 in CF, 1 in RF and 1 at 1B) ... junior Dani Yudin left Thursday's game at Oregon after getting hit by a pitch in the neck, suffering a concussion. She is day-to-day and has hits in 10 of her last 15 contests ... Kelly Inouye-Perez earned her 200th-career victory on March 11 against Sacramento State and is 216-66 as the head coach ... with five runs and a loss on Thursday at Oregon, the Bruins fell for the first time this year when scoring five runs or more in a game. UCLA is now 26-1 this season when posting at least five runs. On the flip side, the Bruins are 0-13 when being held to two runs or fewer ... UCLA is 27-2 when holding its opponent to three or fewer runs, with the only losses coming to Arizona State (April 16) and California (May 1) ... the Bruins are 23-2 this season when scoring in their first at-bat and 44-3 over the last two years ... UCLA has posted 11 mercy-rule wins, seven shutouts and 13 comeback victories ... the Bruins are 20-1 when leading after five innings (19-1 when leading after six), with the only loss coming to Washington on April 23 ... UCLA is 19-1 when hitting two homers or more in a game (only loss April 23 vs. Washington) ... 122 of the Bruins' 280 runs have been scored via the home run (43.6 percent of their runs) ... UCLA has three or four homers in a game 10 times this season ... the Bruins have five grand slams (Fox and Yudin 2, Harrison 1), 12 three-run homers, 19 two-run shots and 28 solo home runs ... 130 of UCLA's 280 runs have been scored with two outs (46.4%), including 10 of its 12 last weekend at Oregon ... Bates and Harrison are tied for the top spot with 23 two-out RBI, with Fox right behind them with 22.

BRUINS IN NCAA REGIONAL PLAY

Twelve-time national champion and 11-time NCAA titleist UCLA is making its 27th appearance in the NCAA Tournament and holds a record of 174-40 (.813 winning percentage). During the Regional round, the Bruins are 75-8 (.904) and have gone undefeated 19 of 26 times, including each of the last three seasons. Since Regional play moved to a four-team format in 2005, the Bruins are 17-3 (.850), advancing to the Super Regionals in '05, '06, '08, '09 and '10. 2011 marks the first time since 2003 (Fresno) that the Bruins have been sent packing for the Regional round. UCLA is 21-2 (.913) in Regional contests away from Westwood. Playoff time has been Samantha Camuso time over her two postseasons. The redshirt junior is batting .423 (22-for-52) in 18 games in the NCAA Tournament with 10 home runs and 24 runs batted in. Eight of those homers and 21 RBI came in last year's tournament, as Camuso hit .467 (14-for-30) in being named to the WCWS All-

Tournament Team. Junior Andrea Harrison was also named to the All-WCWS squad after tying a Series record with four homers and setting a new mark with 11 RBI. The Bruins hit 31 homers in the 2010 postseason, including 14 in Oklahoma City, a WCWS record.

BRUINS IN THE SUNSHINE STATE

The Bruins have never been to the state of Florida for the postseason or played in Gainesville. UCLA has appeared in five tournaments in Florida and owns a record of 30-2. In three tournaments in Tampa, the Bruins went 8-1 in 1994, 8-0 in 1996 and 6-0 in 2000. In 2003, UCLA went 5-0 at the FAU Worth Invitational in Boca Raton. Last season, the Bruins opened their campaign in Clermont at the Dot Richardson Invitational. UCLA defeated Florida Atlantic, Tennessee and Georgia, while losing to Michigan.

HAPPY HOMECOMING

Native Floridian GiOnna DiSalvatore will have plenty of fans cheering her on this weekend as the Bruins make a return trip to her home state. She is the fourth Bruin to come out of the Sunshine State, joining Chris Olivie, Dot Richardson and Claire Sua.

SCOUTING THE JACKSONVILLE DOLPHINS

The Dolphins will be making their first NCAA Tournament appearance when they hook up with the Bruins on Friday in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. Jacksonville went 43-14 this season and 18-2 in the Atlantic Sun Conference, claiming the league's automatic bid after winning the conference tournament last weekend. The Dolphins have played four games against ranked opponents, defeating Texas A&M 3-1 on March 17, while losing to Florida, Texas Tech and North Carolina. Jacksonville is batting .278 as a team with 40 home runs and 44 stolen bases, averaging 4.6 runs per game. Sophomore Sarah Simon is one of five players batting over .300, hitting a team-best .371, tying for the team lead with nine homers and placing second with 40 RBI. Sophomore Olivia Kline (.333), junior Kayla Ouellet (.306), junior Amanda Schmidt (.301) and senior Katie Kelly (.301) are also batting above .300. Schmidt is first with 48 RBI and tied for first with nine homers, while Ouellet has a team-high 21 stolen bases. In the circle, Kline and junior Sarah Sigrest are the top two pitchers. Sigrest is 26-5 with a 1.01 earned run average and 200 strikeouts in 215 1/3 innings, while Kline is 15-6 with a 1.50 ERA and 84 strikeouts in 140 innings. Amanda Lehotak is in her fifth year as the head coach at Jacksonville. The only team the Bruins have played from the 11-team Atlantic Sun Conference is Mercer, who they defeated twice in 1999 and 2006 by 8-0, six-inning scores.

SCOUTING THE FLORIDA GATORS

The Gators went 47-9 during the regular season and placed first in the SEC East with a 21-7 record. Florida entered last week's Southeastern Conference Tournament on a nine-game winning streak, but lost in the tournament quarterfinals to Auburn last Thursday. The Gators are hitting .328 as a team with 104 home runs and 69 stolen bases, averaging 7.5 runs per game. Six players are hitting .300 or better, led by junior Michelle Moultrie, who is batting .427 with two homers, 28 RBI and a team-best 21 stolen bases. Senior Kelsey Bruder (.384, 17 HR, 63 RBI), senior Aja Paculba (.351, 15, 54), senior Megan Bush (.348, 20 HR, 72 RBI), sophomore Brittany Schutte (.321, 17, 52) and freshman Cheyenne Coyle (.313, 13, 46) are all hitting .300 or better with at least 13 homers and 45 RBI. In the circle, senior Stephanie Brombacher and freshman Hannah Rogers have split the duties. Brombacher is 17-2 with a 1.08 earned run average and 108 strikeouts in 123 innings, while Rogers is 30-5 with a 1.60 ERA and 178 strikeouts in 214 1/3 innings. Tim Walton is in his sixth season as head coach.

THE SERIES: BRUINS VS. GATORS

The Bruins are 3-2 all-time against Florida, but have never played at Katie Seashole Pressly Stadium. The two teams met on Feb. 25 at the Cathedral City Classic, with Florida winning 4-1. UCLA posted 11-1 and 10-2 (6 innings) victories at Easton Stadium in 2002 and 2007. At the Women's College World Series in 2008, the Gators ended the Bruins' season with a 2-0 win. Last year, UCLA knocked off Florida in the opening game of the WCWS by a score of 16-3 in six innings. SCOUTING THE BETHUNE-COOKMAN WILDCATS

Bethune-Cookman (33-24) won its second-straight, Mid Eastern Athletic Conference Tournament title with a 5-4, walk-off victory over Delaware State last Sunday to earn the league's automatic bid. The Wildcats, out of Daytona Beach, Fla., were a perfect 12-0 in the MEAC South Division. Bethune-Cookman is batting .305 as a team with 27 home runs and 65 stolen bases, averaging 5.7 runs per game. Six players are hitting .300 or better, led by senior Allison Garcia, who is first on the team with a .374 average, nine

homers and 56 RBI. Sophomore Michelle Banuelos-Smith (.367), junior Cesley Tafoya (.314), senior Ashton Hinds (.306), freshman Kelsey Rodney (.302) and sophomore Aurelia Gamch (.302) are also hitting .300 or better. In the circle, Garcia has started more than half of the Wildcats' games, going 26-11 with a 3.54 ERA and 133 strikeouts in 257 innings. Chris Cochran is in her third year as head coach at Bethune-Cookman.

RECAPING LAST WEEKEND'S ACTION**Saturday - Oregon 5, UCLA 0**

Sophomore Devon Lindvall and freshmen Kellie Fox and Alyssa Tiumalu recorded the only hits for the 12th-ranked Bruins as they dropped their regular season finale to #11 Oregon by a score of 5-0 on Saturday at Howe Field.

The Bruins fall to 33-17 overall and 9-12 in Pac-10 play, while the Ducks improve to 39-14 and 11-10 in league action.

Senior Donna Kerr (12-9) started and allowed four runs, three hits and one walk in 3 2/3 innings. Freshman Jessica Hall tossed 2 1/3 frames of relief, striking out five and giving up a run, three hits and a walk.

After 3 1/2 scoreless innings, the Ducks got on the board with four in the fourth. Kelsey Chambers led off the inning with a homer to right-center to make it 1-0. Two outs later, Kaitlin Vitek walked, Alexa Peterson was hit by a pitch and Samantha Pappas belted a three-run homer to left to make it 4-0.

The Bruins had a chance in the fifth, but left the bases loaded. Lindvall drew a walk, and two outs later, freshman Talee Snow and senior GiOnna DiSalvatore drew back-to-back free passes. But junior Katie Schroeder flied out to center to end the inning.

The Ducks added another run in the fifth. With one out, Courtney Ceo singled up the middle and stole second. One out later, Kaylan Howard walked and Ceo moved to third on a wild pitch on ball four. Monique Fuiava followed with a single to right to plate Ceo with Oregon's fifth run.

UCLA had one last opportunity in the seventh, loading the bases with nobody out. Lindvall led off with a single to left and moved to second on a fielding error by Oregon's Allie Burger. Tiumalu followed with a walk and Hall singled to right to load the bases. But Snow grounded into a double play to third, as Ceo came home for the first out and Peterson threw to first for the twin killing. The last out was made on a grounder to third by DiSalvatore.

Friday - UCLA 7, Oregon 4

#12 UCLA came back two separate times on Friday at Howe Field and received a three-run homer from sophomore B.B. Bates and a two-run shot from sophomore Devon Lindvall, as freshman Jessica Hall struck out four in five innings of relief in the Bruins' 7-4 victory against #11 Oregon.

Hall improved to 16-8 on the year, retiring 15 of the 17 batters she faced, including nine in a row from the fourth through the sixth innings. She allowed a run and two hits. Sophomore Destiny Rodino started and fanned two in two-plus innings, giving up three runs (one earned) and four hits. Seven of the nine Bruins in the starting lineup had at least one hit, with juniors GiOnna DiSalvatore and Andrea Harrison posting two apiece.

UCLA got on the board with a run in its first at-bat. DiSalvatore reached on a fielding error by Kaylan Howard at second to lead off the game, and one out later, moved to third on a hit-and-run single to right by Harrison. Bates then executed a perfect squeeze play, as DiSalvatore came in with the Bruins' first run.

The Ducks took their first lead of the game in the second. With one out, Kaitlin Vitek singled to left-center and moved to second on a single to left by Alexa Peterson. Kailee Cuico then grounded one to short, with freshman Kellie Fox throwing to DiSalvatore at third to force Vitek for the second out. Allie Burger then lifted a fly ball to junior Katie Schroeder in center, but it bounced in and out of her glove, allowing Peterson and Cuico to score to make it 2-1.

The Bruins tied it back up in the top of the third thanks to another Duck error. With one out, DiSalvatore singled up the middle, and one out later, she moved to second on a single to left by Harrison. Bates then tapped a ball to shortstop, but it was bobbled by Kelsey Chambers to load the bases. Fox cashed in the error with a single to right to plate DiSalvatore to even it at two.

A pair of solo home runs to lead off the third and fourth innings gave the Ducks the lead back. Chambers hit a homer in the third and a Vitek shot in the fourth made it 4-2 Oregon.

But the Bruins again rallied, tying the game in the fifth on one swing of the bat. With two outs, freshman Alyssa Tiumalu reached on an error by Courtney Ceo at third to extend the inning and Lindvall made them pay, hitting a 1-0 pitch over the center-field fence to tie it at four. It was Lindvall's third homer of the year.

In the sixth, UCLA re-took the advantage. With one out, DiSalvatore singled to right, moved to second on a wild pitch and Schroeder drew a walk. One out later, Bates connected on her second three-run homer of the weekend to left-center on a 1-0 offering to make it 7-4. It was Bates' 10th homer of the season.

Thursday - Oregon 6, UCLA 5

11th-ranked Oregon scored six runs in the first two innings, only to see the 12th-ranked Bruins battle back with one in the third and four in the fourth, including a three-run homer by sophomore B.B. Bates, but UCLA fell one run short in a 6-5 loss to the Ducks on Thursday at Howe Field.

Bates had two hits, as did junior Andrea Harrison, as the Bruins posted eight as a team. Senior Donna Kerr (12-8) struck out eight and allowed six runs (five earned) and nine hits in six innings.

The Ducks took advantage of some Bruin mistakes on defense in the bottom of the first to score twice. Courtney Ceo led off with a slap single that bounced off the third-base bag and stole second. Kelsey Chambers then laid down a bunt to senior GiOnna DiSalvatore at third, but her throw to first went into right field, allowing Ceo to score and Chambers to move to second. Kaylan Howard followed with a bunt single to third and stole second to put a pair of runners in scoring position.

One out later, Monique Fuiava tried to squeeze home Chambers, but Kerr flipped to freshman Alyssa Tiumalu at the plate for the second out. Kaitlin Vitek then grounded a ball to DiSalvatore, but it was bobbled, allowing Howard to score the Ducks' second run.

In the second, the Ducks got four runs on one swing of the bat. Oregon loaded the bases on singles by Alexa Peterson and Kailee Cuico and another single one out later by Ceo. One out later, Howard hit a slam just inside the left-field foul pole to make it 6-0.

The Bruins got a run back in the third. With one out, Bates slapped a single to third and freshman Kellie Fox walked. Harrison followed with a single to left to plate Bates with the Bruins' first run.

UCLA climbed back in it with four in the fourth, but not without a scary moment to lead off the inning. On an 0-1 pitch, junior Dani Yudin was hit on the back of the helmet by a Jessica Moore pitch. She stayed down on the field for about 20 minutes and was taken away by ambulance to a nearby hospital for precautionary reasons. She never lost consciousness and was released later Thursday.

Following the delay, the Bruins came back with a spirited rally. With junior Katie Schroeder running for Yudin, she moved to second on a groundout by Tiumalu and advanced to third on a single up the middle by Hall. One out later with DiSalvatore at the plate, Moore lost a grip on the ball during her windup, throwing it behind her and allowing Schroeder to score on a wild pitch to make it 6-2. After DiSalvatore walked, Bates went the opposite way on a 2-0 pitch for her ninth homer of the season to make it 6-5.

The Bruins had four baserunners in the final three innings, but were unable to complete the comeback.

HARRISON NAMED PAC-10 POW FOR SECOND TIME IN 2011

Junior Andrea Harrison has been named Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Week (April 12) for the second time in three weeks

after a fantastic five-game effort that saw her hit .833 with nine runs batted in, eight runs scored and two home runs.

Harrison had 10 hits in 12 at-bats to help the Bruins to a 5-0 record during the week. The junior slugged 1.500 for the five games and had an .842 on base percentage. She added a pair of doubles, four walks and was hit twice. Defensively, Harrison did not commit an error in 22 chances between her time at first and in left field.

In Wednesday's doubleheader against UC Santa Barbara, Harrison scored twice in the opener, walking once and also getting hit by a pitch. In the nightcap, the junior reached in all four plate appearances. After getting hit and walked in her first two trips to the dish, Harrison launched a three-run homer off the fair pole in right field in the fourth inning to give the Bruins an 8-3 lead. She would go on to single in her final at-bat in the sixth.

In Friday's Pac-10 opener against Oregon State, Harrison posted her second-career, four-hit game. After doubling in the first inning, she singled in three successive at-bats from the third through the fifth, scoring a run in the fourth.

On Saturday in the middle game, Harrison added two more hits and scored three times. The junior walked and scored in the first inning and singled and scored in the third. She led off the fifth with a double and came around to score another run.

In the weekend finale on Sunday, Harrison had a grand ending to a wonderful series. She got the Bruins on the board in the first inning with an RBI single and followed that with a scoring fly ball in the second. After the junior walked in the fourth, Harrison capped off the weekend with a walk-off, grand slam in the bottom of the fifth to give the Bruins a 12-2 victory.

The six-RBI effort was a historic performance for Harrison, who not only became the 14th Bruin to drive in a half a dozen in a game, but became the first player to do it three times at UCLA.

Harrison was named Pac-10 POW for the first time this season on March 15 after she hit .750 with 10 RBI, five runs, two homers and five doubles at the Long Beach Marriott Invitational.

Her award is the third for the Bruins this season. Freshman Alyssa Tiumalu received the accolade on March 1. Harrison is now a three-time, Pac-10 POW honoree after also earning the award on May 3, 2010. The Bruins have 64 Pac-10 POW awards all-time.

ALYSSA TIUMALU NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Freshman Alyssa Tiumalu was named Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Week on March 1 after posting hits in all six games for the Bruins last week, going 10-for-16 (.625) with two home runs, five RBI and five runs scored in helping UCLA to a 4-2 record.

Tiumalu began the week at Cal State Northridge on Wednesday, reaching in all three plate appearances on a double, a walk and a hit by pitch. She also scored a run. Then against some of the toughest competition in the nation at the Cathedral City Classic

#5 UCLA 16, #4 Florida 3 (6 inn.) - Women's College World Series - June 3, 2010

The fifth-seeded Bruins broke the school record for home runs in a single season with three more bombs on Thursday and also scored the most runs ever in a UCLA postseason contest in a 16-3, six-inning victory over #4 Florida in the first game of the Women's College World Series at ASA Hall of Fame Stadium.

Sophomore Andrea Harrison went 2-for-5 with a pair of three-run homers, driving in a career-high six. Senior Megan Langenfeld went 4-for-4 with four RBI, four runs scored and a home run. Sophomore Samantha Camuso also had a two-hit game, as the Bruins had 11 hits as a team. The season-high 16 runs were the most scored by UCLA in an NCAA Tournament game, bettering the 14 against Creighton in 1999.

Langenfeld also earned the win in the circle, pitching 4 2/3 scoreless innings of relief to improve to 12-1 on the season. She struck out three and allowed four hits, striking out a pair in the fourth and retiring the side in order in the sixth.

The Bruins (46-11), playing as the visiting team, got on the board in the first inning. With one out, junior Monica Harrison walked, moved to second on an illegal pitch by Florida's Stephanie Brombacher and advanced to third on a single to right by Langenfeld. Andrea Harrison then hit a 2-2 pitch out to left, her 14th home run of the season, to put UCLA ahead 3-0.

The Gators (48-9) tied it up in the bottom of the second. Florida loaded the bases to open the inning on a hit by pitch of Francesca Enea, a single to left by Brittany Schutte and a walk to Megan Bush. Tiffany DeFelice followed with a bases-clearing double to left-center to even the game at three. UCLA was able to keep the damage to three runs though. Following a sacrifice bunt for the first out, Langenfeld came in the game to pitch and retired Brittany Walker on a groundout to third and Michelle Moultrie on a foul out to left.

UCLA scored three runs in the third to re-take the lead. Junior GiOnna DiSalvatore walked to open the inning, moved to second on an illegal pitch and advanced to third on a sacrifice bunt by Monica Harrison. Langenfeld followed with a double down the right-field line to plate Harrison to make it 4-3. Langenfeld then moved to third on another illegal pitch, this time by Florida's Ensley Gammel, and one out later, sophomore Dani Yudin walked to put runners at the corners. Camuso made it 5-3 with a double to left to plate Langenfeld and Yudin came home on another illegal pitch by Gammel to extend the advantage to 6-3.

The Bruins added another run in the fourth. Freshman B.B. Bates and Monica Harrison each walked to open the inning and Langenfeld drove in Bates with a single to left-center to increase the margin to 7-3.

The Gators threatened in the fourth, but came up empty. With one out, DeFelice singled to left and Corrie Brooks singled to right, as DeFelice advanced to third on the play. Lauren Heil came in to run for Brooks and stole second to put a pair of runners in scoring position. Walker then chopped a ball to shortstop, with Monica Harrison leaping high in the air to snag it and throw home to get the force on DeFelice for the second out. Langenfeld ended the threat with a strikeout of Moultrie to maintain the four-run lead.

The Bruins busted it open in the sixth, sending 12 to the plate and scoring nine times. Monica Harrison led off with a double to center, Langenfeld was hit by a pitch and Andrea Harrison hit her second homer of the day and 15th of the season on a 1-0 pitch to make it 10-3. The Bruins then loaded the bases when Yudin reached on an error, Camuso doubled to center and senior Julie Burney walked. Senior Kaila Shull followed with a double down the right-field line to bring in junior Amy Crawford, who was running for Yudin, and freshman Devon Lindvall, who was in for Camuso, to increase the lead to 12-3.

UCLA wasn't done though. One out later, DiSalvatore singled to center to plate Burney, and when the ball was misplayed in the outfield, Shull came home for the Bruins' 14th run. Following the second out of the inning, Langenfeld launched her team-leading 17th home run of the season to left on a 3-1 offering to give the Bruins a 16-3 advantage.

Kelly Inouye-Perez, beginning her fifth season as the Bruins' head coach in 2011, led the UCLA softball program to its 12th national title and 11th NCAA championship in 2010. The Bruins went a perfect 10-0 in the postseason, including 5-0 at the Women's College World Series. UCLA set numerous WCWS records, including the most home runs in one tournament with 14. Megan Langenfeld was named the Most Outstanding Player of the WCWS, while Samantha Camuso and GiOnna DiSalvatore were each named All-Tournament honors. Following the season, Inouye-Perez and her staff were honored as the NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year.

The Bruins went 50-11 in 2010, bringing Inouye-Perez's career record to 183-49 (.789 winning percentage) in four campaigns. UCLA set single-season school records for home runs, slugging, on base percentage and walks. Langenfeld and GiOnna DiSalvatore were each named to the NFCA All-America first-team. The Bruins also had three players named to the All-Region team and 10 honored by the Pac-10.

In 2009, she led the Bruins to a Pacific-10 Conference Championship, as UCLA went 45-11 overall and 16-5 in league play. She was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year and earned her 100th career victory on Feb. 22 against Maryland. In 2008, the Bruins went 51-9 and advanced to the Women's College World Series, finishing second in the Pac-10 with a 17-4 record. In her first season at the helm of UCLA in 2007, Inouye-Perez posted a 37-18 overall record and a 12-9 Pac-10 mark (t-3rd).

Over Inouye-Perez's four seasons, the Bruins have earned 11 All-American awards, 18 All-Region honors and 33 All-Pac-10 accolades.

Inouye-Perez, just the third head coach in UCLA softball history, officially took over the reins from Sue Enquist on Jan. 1, 2007. Enquist announced her retirement as head coach on Sept. 26, 2006.

No stranger to the Bruin dugout, Inouye-Perez starts her 23rd straight season in Westwood in 2011. She is a link to four decades of Bruin softball success, joining the UCLA softball program as a freshman in 1989. Inouye-Perez's time is highlighted by seven NCAA Championships and eight Pac-10 titles in her previous 22 years, spending five campaigns as a player and 13 as an assistant.

Over Inouye-Perez's 13 seasons (1994-2006) as an assistant coach, UCLA was 617-150-1 (.804) and appeared in the NCAA title game seven times, winning the NCAA Championship in the 1999, 2003 and 2004 seasons. The Bruins also won three Pac-10 titles during that span (1999, 2002, 2006) and in 2004 were named the National Coaching Staff of the Year by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

Inouye-Perez's primary responsibility as an assistant coach was guiding the Bruin pitchers and catchers, a list which includes many of the most honored and recognizable names in collegiate softball. Behind the dish, where Inouye-Perez also starred as a three-time All-Pac-10 honoree during her playing days at UCLA, she helped mold and influence arguably the best catcher in the history of USA Softball in Stacey Nuveman. Under Inouye-Perez's tutelage, Nuveman became a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Year, four-time, first-team All-American and the NCAA's all-time single season

and career home run leader.

Since the Pac-10 Conference began issuing a Pitcher of the Year Award, UCLA has been honored with two winners, Courtney Dale in 1999 and Keira Goerl in 2003. Among the other pitching highlights accomplished by the Bruins over her 13 years as an assistant included at least one All-American award earned by a UCLA pitcher in 12 of those campaigns, including DeeDee Weiman, four-time Olympian Tanya Harding and two-time Olympian Amanda Freed.

In addition, nearly every UCLA pitching record has been set during the time Inouye-Perez has overseen the Bruin battery and the top four pitchers on UCLA's career wins list, Goerl, Selden, Freed and B'Ann Burns, were coached by her.

Inouye-Perez was an exceptionally strong fielder behind the dish for the Bruins. She made her mark immediately as a collegiate player, earning first-team All-Pac-10 as a true freshman and second-team as a sophomore, leading the Bruins to the 1989 and 1990 NCAA Championships before receiving a medical redshirt in 1991 due to shoulder surgery.

She came back strong in 1992, picking up second-team All-Pac-10 honors as the Bruins once again won the national championship and finished with a 54-2 record, the fewest losses in a season in program history. Inouye-Perez also was named to the 1992 All-Women's College World Series Team, going 5-for-12 (.417) with four RBI during WCWS play. She wrapped up her career as a fifth-year senior in 1993 with an NCAA runner-up finish. Impressively, Inouye-Perez did not commit a single fielding error during her final two seasons.

Among the UCLA pitchers during her five seasons as a player were Lisa Longaker and Lisa Fernandez, both of whom were named to the NCAA's 25th Anniversary All-WCWS Team. During her UCLA career, Inouye-Perez played in 22 Women's College World Series games, a mark that is tied for third-best in UCLA history behind only Lisa Fernandez and Kristy Howard (23). Inouye-Perez graduated from UCLA in 1993 with a B.A. in psychology and earned her master's degree in physical education from Azusa Pacific University in 2004.

Prior to college, Inouye-Perez was one of the top players during her ASA days, winning four national championships, with the Panthers (1984, '85 and '89) and the Raiders (1986). She also competed on an international level in Japan in 1985 and in Peru in 1987 (Pan American Tournament) and followed her collegiate career with time playing on the NPF Pro Tour.

Inouye-Perez and her husband, Gerardo Perez, currently reside in Cerritos. Along with Kelly's exploits on the diamond, Gerardo competed as a catcher/DH for Cerritos College from 1988-90 and helped lead the Falcons to the 1989 Junior College National Championship. After a stellar career at Cerritos, he went on to compete at Loyola Marymount, earning first-team All-West Coast Conference honors his junior and senior seasons. He currently teaches health and coaches baseball at Gahr High School in Cerritos. The couple has two children, Michael (11) and Kylie (6).
