UCLA welcomes its Pac-10 home opener this weekend, with a Friday game at Easton Stadium against Oregon State followed by a weekend set against the Oregon Ducks. The Bruins and Beavers met earlier this season when OSU posted a two-run seventh inning for a come-from-behind win over UCLA at the Clovis Auto Row Classic in Fresno, CA. The Beavers have a 6-65 all-time record against UCLA, including that win. The Ducks hold an 8-53 record against UCLA, including a win in Eugene last season.

BRUINS FALL TO HUSKIES IN WASHINGTON

A solo shot that was part of a 3-for-3 day by **Claire Sua** was not enough on Friday afternoon at Husky Softball Stadium, as the Bruins fell to No. 8 Washington by a 3-1 margin. The news didn't get any better on Saturday, as a lead-off home run by **Caitlin Benyi** and an RBI single by **Jodie Legaspi** in the first paired with an RBI walk by Sua in the second inning put the Bruins on top by a 3-0 margin. The Huskies got on the board in the bottom of the second with a lead-off shot by Kristen Rivera before UCLA scored two more runs in the top of the fifth inning. Unfortunately, the Huskies roared back with a five-run bottom of the fifth inning to take a 6-5 lead to account for the final margin in the Washington win.

For the weekend, UCLA left 22 runners on base in 14 innings of play, including 14 runners left in Saturday's game alone. **Claire Sua** was UCLA's top hitter in the two games, going 4-for-6 (.667) with a home run, two walks, two RBIs and a 1.167 slugging percentage with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage on 13 chances.

TWO BRUINS AMONG USA SOFTBALL'S 25 PLAYER OF THE YEAR FINALISTS

ASA/USA Softball announced its 25-player list of finalists for the third annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award on April 7. The list included two Bruin seniors, **Keira Goerl** and **Stephanie Ramos**. Goerl was on the initial watch list, and Ramos, who was added to the list after proving herself as UCLA's top hitter so far this season. Former UCLA great Stacey Nuveman won the inaugural award following the 2002 season. This award, which is considered the Heisman Trophy in women's collegiate softball, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

ENQUIST IS NCAA DIVISION I'S WINNINGEST COACH

The 2004 season marks Sue Enquist's 16th campaign as head coach of the Bruin softball program. It is her 25th year as part of UCLA's softball coaching staff and her 29th year of involvement with the program as either a coach or player. Enquist has a **777-142-1 (.845)** coaching record, the highest winning percentage for an active NCAA Division I head coach, and **1,204 wins** in her Bruin softball career as a player, assistant coach and head coach, combined. As a player from 1975-78, Enquist became UCLA's first All-American while establishing the Bruin career batting average record of .401. She was the only UCLA player to complete her career with a batting average over .400 until Stacey Nuveman completed her senior year in 2002 (with a .466 average), a span of 24 years.

KEIRA GOERL CLIMBS NCAA CAREER VICTORIES LIST; CURRENTLY RANKS 10TH

Junior All-American pitcher **Keira Goerl** reached an impressive career milestone on Feb. 7 vs. Washington, becoming the first Bruin and the 32nd player in NCAA Division I history to win 100 games. She is the NCAA's active victories leader with a record of **114-17 (.870)**, and is currently tied for 10th on the NCAA's all-time list.

The NCAA career record of 151 wins (Courtney Blades, 1997-2000) is out of Goerl's reach, but 120 wins would land her in the NCAA's all-time top-five. The 2003 Pac-10 Pitcher of the Year, Goerl was named the Pac-10's Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 17, 2004, after going 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA in wins over No. 8 Michigan, No. 9 Nebraska and Wisconsin. Goerl no-hit Wisconsin on Feb. 14, her 10th career no-hitter and the 89th no-hitter in program history. For the week, she struck out 20, walked four, and allowed one unearned run while holding opposing batters to a .161 batting average at the UNLV Classic.

BRUINS BASHING HOME RUNS AT RECORD PACE

Through the first 32 games of the 2004 season, UCLA has crushed 51 home runs as a team, led by 12 from sophomore leadoff hitter **Caitlin Benyi** and nine from **Stephanie Ramos**. The UCLA single-season record for team home runs is 95 (1.377/game), set by UCLA's 1999 NCAA Championship team that played a school record 69 games and was led by NCAA career home run record holder Stacey Nuveman's 31 home runs. That 1999 UCLA team had 44 home runs through its first 32 games, and recorded 83 home runs through its 61-game regular season, hitting the final 12 during eight games of postseason play. This year's Bruins are on pace to hit **77** home runs, a rate of **1.594/game**, for a 48-game regular season (assumes 4/2 rainout at ASU will not be made up).

This season, UCLA has homered in 27 of its 32 games thus far. Breaking it down, UCLA has five homer-less game games, **13** games with one home run, **nine** games with two home runs, **two** game with three home runs, **two** with four home runs, and **one** game with a school-record six home runs. The 1999 Bruins had **17** homerless games, **25** one-HR games, **17** two-HR games, **five** three-home run games, **four** games with four HRs and **one** game with five home runs.

CAITLIN BENYI BENYI EMBRACES LEADOFF SPOT

In her second season as a Bruin, **Caitlin Benyi** has taken over the leadoff spot in the batting order from last year's Honda Broderick Cup winner and current Olympian Natasha Watley. As UCLA's first hitter of the game, she has a .455 batting average (10-for-22) through the team's first 32 games with eight walks and a hit-by-pitch for a .612 on-base percentage. She has also reached on an error in one game, which means she has run the bases to start UCLA's first offensive inning in 19 of the team's 30 games, including **four lead-off home runs** (against Wisconsin, Tennessee, Oregon State 3/14 and 4/10 at Washington).

STEPHANIE RAMOS NAMED PAC-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Stephanie Ramos, a senior from Elk Grove, Calif., hit .800 for the week at the Stacy Winsberg Memorial Tournament, going 8-for-10 with four runs scored, a double, three home runs, six RBI, a 1.800 slugging percentage and .750 on-base percentage. Her totals for hits, HR, RBI, SLG% and OB% led the team for the weekend as the Bruins improved to 16-0 on the year. In UCLA's first game of the weekend against UCSB, Ramos went 2-for-3 with an RBI and a run scored. In the second game of the day, she doubled in her first at-bat of the game, then homered in consecutive at-bats in the third and fifth innings before finishing her day at the plate with a walk in the sixth inning. In that game, she finished with a 3-for-3 day with two runs scored, three RBI and a walk. On Sunday, Ramos went 3-for-4 with a home run, her fifth of the season, and two singles.

For the season, Ramos is UCLA's top hitter with a .418 batting average (41-for-98) with seven doubles, nine home runs, 25 RBIs and 26 runs scored. In early April, she was named to USA Softball's 25-player list of finalists for the Collegiate Player of the Year award.

BRUINS SET HOME RUN RECORDS AT UNLV CLASSIC

UCLA set a new single-game record for home runs on Feb. 13 against then-No. 9 Nebraska at the UNLV Classic. The Bruins totalled six home runs in the game, including a two-home run contest by sophomore catcher **Emily Zaplatosch**. Home runs were hit by **Caitlin Benyi**, **Andrea Duran**, **Zaplatosch**, **Jodie Legaspi** and **Lisa Dodd**. Zaplatosch recorded a three-run home run in the bottom of the first inning and a two-run shot in the bottom of the fifth, recording five RBIs in the game. Two home runs in a single game ties UCLA's single-game record, while five RBIs ties for fifth-best in Bruin history since the start of the 1997 season. Zaplatosch went on to hit a third home run on the day with a sixth inning two-run home run against then-No. 13 DePaul.

The following day, sophomore **Caitlin Benyi** duplicated Zaplatosch's single-game feat, hitting a lead-off home run against Wisconsin and following with a two-run home run in the bottom of the fourth inning. Benyi also recorded the game-ending hit in the bottom of the fifth inning, pushing UCLA's eighth run across the plate to invoke the mercy rule as the Bruins won 8-0 in five innings. As a team, seven Bruins combined for 12 home runs during the team's five games at the UNLV Classic.

LISA DODD FEATURED IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED ON CAMPUS

UCLA freshman P/2B **Lisa Dodd** was featured in the inaugural issue of Sports Illustrated On Campus as one of the magazine's Freshman 15, a "Faces in the Crowd" feature. The March 25 issue of the magazine (page 13) included a follow-up story on the Freshman 15, focusing on Dodd.

Dodd has started 31 of UCLA's 32 games this season, missing one game at the Palm Springs Classic after taking a ground ball to the mouth while playing second base against Northwestern. She has two grand slams this season, one against Baylor at the UNLV Classic and one against UCSB in the first game of UCLA's doubleheader with the Gauchos at Easton Stadium on Feb. 28. She has pitched 13 games for the Bruins, all complete games with eight shutouts, and has struck out 32 batters while walking just 13 in her 86.2 innings in the circle. She has an 11-2 record in the circle and offensively she has four home runs and three doubles among her 21 hits on the season.

FRESHMAN JODIE LEGASPI TAKES OVER SHORTSTOP POSITION

Freshman **Jodie Legaspi** had enormous shoes to fill defensively this season, as she became the first player other than U.S. Olympian Natasha Watley to field the position of shortstop for UCLA since early in the 2000 season. Since a particularly rocky weekend at the Palm Springs Classic in Cathedral City, CA, Legaspi has rebounded admirably, posting a .964 fielding percentage with 16 putouts, 37 assists and just two errors over 17 games.

Offensively, Legaspi is UCLA's top hitter among freshmen and the second-best hitter by average on the team, checking in with a .363 batting average for the season with four home runs, six doubles, a triple, 12 runs scored and 19 RBI with a .582 slugging percentage. Legaspi started the season hitting sixth in the Bruin lineup, but has since moved to the five spot, hitting behind senior slugger Claire Sua.
